OAKLAND ATHLETICS (16-24) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (24-16)

FRIDAY, MAY 20, 2022 — ANGEL STADIUM — 6:38 PT RHP PAUL BLACKBURN (4-0, 1.67) VS. RHP CHASE SILSETH (1-0, 0.00) NBCSCA — A'S CAST — A'S RADIO NETWORK (BLOOMBERG 960 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Lost two of three to Minnesota to close out the last homestand and are now 1-6-1 over the last eight series...have lost five of the last seven games after winning four of the previous five contests...are 8-18 (.308) over the last 26 games after starting the year 8-6 (.571)...are a season-high tying eight games under .500 at 16-24 (.400), which is the fourth worst record in the American League...have spent 15 of the last 16 days in fifth place in the AL West and have held at least a share of last every day dating back to May 4...have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, five days in fourth, two days tied for fourth and 15 days in fifth...trail first place Houston by a season-high 9½ games, which is their largest deficit in the West since finishing the 2019 season 10 games back...had their season-high threegame winning streak snapped a week ago today by Los Angeles (AL).

OFFENSE: The A's had 12 hits on Wednesday after collecting 11 hits on Tuesday and have reached double figures in hits in back-to-back games for the first time this year...however, are batting .198 (117-for-592) with 51 runs scored in 19 games in May (2.7 runs per game)...the lowest batting average in a month of 10 or more games in Oakland history is .210 (April, 1979; May, 2012)...have a .205 batting average for the season, which is the lowest in the majors...also have the lowest on-base percentage (.273), slugging percentage (.314) and OPS (.588) and the fourth fewest runs scored (132)...have scored one run or fewer 15 times, which is four more than any other team in the majors...have been shut out six times, which is tied with the Mariners for the most in the majors...were blanked just seven times all last year...have the third most strikeouts in the AL (342), the third most grounded into double plays (30) and the third fewest extra base hits (86)...are tied for the second most sacrifice hits (7).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have homered just four times in the last 16 games... have hit one home run or fewer in each of the last 26 games, which is tied for the third longest such streak in Oakland history...the only longer streaks are 32 (May 25-June 29, 2011) and 31 (July 21-Aug. 19, 1978)...have not had a multiple homer game since April 21 against Baltimore when Pache and Murphy went deep...have 24 home runs for the season, which is second fewest in the majors to the Tigers (20)...however, nine of the home runs have come with at least two runners on base, which is the most in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's allowed season highs in runs (14) and walks (10) and matched the high in hits (14) on Wednesday against Minnesota...it was the first time the A's issued 10 walks in a game since Aug. 29, 2018 at Houston (10) and the first time they allowed at least 10 hits and 10 walks since June 30, 2016 against San Francisco (14 hits, 11 walks)...had compiled a 2.80 ERA, .226 opponents average and averaged 2.66 walks per nine innings over the previous 15 contests...overall, are tied for third in the American League in shutouts (4) and fewest home runs allowed (34)...have the fourth highest opponents batting average (.239) and the fifth most walks (122).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 0-5 with a 5.54 ERA (23 er in 37.1 ip) over the last seven games and 3-11 with a 4.39 ERA (55 er in 112.2 ip) over the last 21 contests...are 11-19 with a 4.07 ERA for the season...are tied with the Mariners for the most losses in the American League...have the second most innings pitched (208.0).

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen allowed eight runs Wednesday after yielding just 10 runs over the previous 14 games (8 er in 43.2 ip, 1.65 ERA)...have allowed just one home run over the last 16 games and eight for the season, which is tied with the Yankees for the fewest in the majors...have the second lowest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the American League (.287) and the third lowest batting average (.205) and on-base percentage (.295)...have allowed 15-of-68 (22.1%) inherited runners to score, which is the third lowest percentage in the AL...the 68 inherited runners are fifth most...are tied for fourth in holds (26).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 24-for-29 (82.8%) in stolen base attempts...have the second best stolen base percentage in the American League and rank third in steals...A's opponents are 10-for-18 (55.6%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second lowest success rate in the majors (Orioles, 11-for-20, 55.0%)...the 10 stolen bases allowed are tied with the Yankees for the fewest in the majors...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is tied for third most in the AL

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed five errors in the last six games after making just two errors over the previous 11 contests...have 28 errors for the season, which is tied with the Orioles and White Sox for the most in the American League...however, the errors have led to just 11 unearned runs, which is third fewest in the AL...rank second in the AL in double plays turned (38) but are tied for the second fewest outfield assists (3).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a six-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Seattle (three games) tonight...went 4-4 on the last road trip to Minnesota (0-3) and Detroit (4-1) and are 10-10 (.500) on the road...went 2-5 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-3) and Minnesota (1-2) and have lost 11 of the last 13 home games...are 6-14 (.300) at home for the season, which is the second worst home record in the majors (Nationals, 5-15/.250)...have compiled a 3.34 ERA (64 er in 172.2 ip) on the road compared to 4.23 at home...have the third lowest road ERA in the American League and the second highest home ERA.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are in a stretch that runs from May 13 to June 1 where they are scheduled to play 17 of 20 games against American League West competition...this series with the Angels is just the A's third against a divisional foe this year...are 2-5 in intradivision play and the seven games are the fewest in the majors (Rays, Tigers and Mariners, 9)...face the Mariners for the first time with a three-games series beginning Monday and face the Astros for the first time with a three-game set from May 30-June 1.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 3-7 (.300) in one-run games...the losses are tied with the Orioles and Red Sox for the most in the American League and the record is tied for second worst...12 of the A's 24 losses have been by two runs or fewer, which is tied for second most in the AL...had their first walk-off win of the season in the day game last Saturday against the Angels.

PLAYER NOTES: The A's have used 40 players, which is tied for third most in the American League (Angels, 42; Twins, 41)...have employed 18 rookies, which is tied for the sixth most in a season in Oakland history...it is the most since the 2017 A's had 20 rookies and the record is 21 in 2008...eight of the rookies have made their Major League debut...currently have 12 rookies on the roster, including eight pitchers...have used eight starting pitchers after using just nine in each of the previous two seasons...have employed six first basemen after using just five all last year.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 17 times this year, which includes eight Covid-19 IL placements...currently have seven players on the IL (Bolt, Guerra, Honeywell, Irvin, Jefferies, Piscotty, Vogt)...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors.

SCORING CHANGES: Official scorers have made two scoring changes in recent A's games...in the fifth inning of the May 15 game against Los Angeles (AL), Ohtani is now credited with a base hit instead of reaching base on a Kemp error...in the day game on May 14 against the Angels, Romine is now credited with a sacrifice bunt in the eighth inning.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's are 1-3 against the Angels after losing three of four in Oakland last weekend...won the season series last year, 15-4...the 15 wins were their most ever against the Angels and their most against any team since going 15-4 against the Astros in 2013...it was the A's third consecutive season series win after losing each of the previous five...went 7-2 in Oakland and 8-2 in Anaheim...the eight road wins are the most against the Angels and then seven home wins match the most...are 35-17 (.673) against the Angels over the last four years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 472-393 against the Angels...that includes 248-187 in Oakland and 224-206 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 521-470 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Dany Jiménez allowed his first earned run of the season Sunday and now has a 0.59 ERA, which ranks sixth among American League relievers...leads AL rookies and is tied for fifth among all AL pitchers in saves (7)...is one of three AL closers without a blown save... A.J. Puk has a career-high and A's season-high 13.1-inning scoreless streak dating back to April 14 and ranks third among AL relievers in ERA (0.55).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1977 Wayne Gross has five RBI and Earl Williams drives in four as the A's defeat Seattle 14-5...in 2005 Keith Ginter has one hit in one official at bat but drives in five runs on a three-run home run and two sacrifice flies in the A's 8-4 win at San Francisco...in **2011** Mark Ellis singles in the second inning off San Francisco's Ryan Vogelsong for his 1000^{th} career hit to become the 12th player in Oakland history to collect 1000 hits.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Paul Blackburn (4-0, 1.67 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season...has allowed seven runs over his first seven starts...only two starting pitchers in Athletics history (excluding "openers") have allowed fewer runs over their first seven starts in a season...Mike Norris had six in 1980 and Harry Krause had three in 1909 (Norris had seven over his first eight games, Krause had three)...has not allowed a run in three of his six starts and has yielded three runs or fewer in all seven starts...has a 1.67 ERA, which is fourth lowest in the American League among pitchers with 30 or more innings...is in his sixth season in the majors, all with the A's, but is on his first Opening Day roster... pitched in 30 games over his first five seasons with Oakland, all but three of which came as a starter.

4-0: Has won each of his first four decisions for a career-high four-game winning streak (previous: 3, July 31, 2017-June 7, 2018)...is the first A's starting pitcher on an Opening Day roster to start the season 4-0 since Sonny Gray in 2015...the last to begin the year at least 5-0 is Trevor Cahill, who won his first six decisions in 2011...the four wins are tied for second most in the American League and are a career high...had just three wins in 30 career appearances entering the season.

DON'T WALK: Walked two batters in his last start after walking one or fewer in his first six starts...has three starts without a walk and three with one... has issued just five free passes in 37.2 innings and his average of 1.19 walks per nine innings is fifth lowest in the American League among pitchers with 30 or more innings...has issued just 15 free passes in 76.0 innings over the last two years (1.78 per nine innings) and is averaging 2.20 walks per nine innings in his carer (43 bb in 175.2 ip).

DON'T HOMER: Has allowed just one home run over his first seven starts (37.2 innngs) and his average of 0.24 home runs per nine innings is sixth lowest in the American League among pitchers with 30 or more innings... yielded eight home runs in 38.1 innings last year and entered the season with 18 home runs in 138.0 innings (1.17 per nine innings).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .153 (9-for-59) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .260 (20-for-77) against left-handers...has allowed eight of his 10 extra base hits to lefties and has a .384 OPS against righties, .677 against lefties...opponents are 3-for-22 (.136) with runners in scoring position...entered the season with a .328 career opponents average with RISP...has allowed a .113 opponents batting average with two strikes.

THIS AND THAT: Has not allowed a run in the third inning (7.0 ip)...has a 3.21 ERA (5 er in 14.0 ip) over innings 1-2, a 0.77 ERA (2 er in 23.2 ip) from the third inning on...is 3-0 with a 0.83 ERA (2 er in 21.2 ip) in four starts on the road, 1-0 with a 2.81 ERA (5 er in 16.0 ip) in three starts at home...is 3-0 with a 1.29 ERA (3 er in 21.0 ip) in four starts at night, 1-0 with a 2.16 ERA (4 er in 16.2 ip) in three starts during the day...the A's are 6-1 (.857) in his starting assignments.

2022 HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed 5.0 scoreless inning and struck out a career-high seven batters in a 13-2 win at Tampa Bay in his first start on April 11...had a no decision in the A's 7-5 win in his second start on April 16 at Toronto... left with a 5-2 lead but the bullpen allowed three runs for the blown save... won back-to-back starts on April 21 against Baltimore and April 27 at San Francisco...combined with five A's relievers on a three-hit, 1-0 shutout in the win over the Giants...tossed five of the innings and allowed all three of the hits while walking one...finished April 3-0 with a 1.35 ERA in four starts.. walked just two batters in 20.0 innings and held the opposition to a .197 batting average...it was his first career three-win month and he tied for third in the American League in wins in April...based on a minimum of 20.0 innings, he had the second lowest opponents OPS (.459), ranked third in slugging (.239) and was fourth in ERA and on-base percentage (.219)...allowed a season-high three runs on a season-high six hits in a season-low 4.1 innings on May 3 against Tampa Bay...had a no decision in the A's 10-7, 10-inning loss...combined with Jackson and Jiménez on a four-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Detroit on May 9...tossed a season-high 6.2 innings, yielded all four of the hits and did not walk a batter...extended his scoreless streak to a career-high 9.0 innings.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win over Los Angeles (AL) in the day game last Saturday in Oakland...logged a season-high 6.2 innings for the second consecutive start...allowed back-to-back singles to Marsh and Rengifo to start the game and Marsh scored on an Ohtani ground out...that would be the only run he would allow...retired 10 of the last 11 batters he faced...left trailing 1-0 but the A's scored once in the seventh and three times in the ninth for the win.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Was 0-1 with a 9.35 ERA (8.2 ip, 13 h, 9 r, 9 er, 5 bb, 5 so, 0 hr) in three games, including two starts...opponents were 13-for-37 (.351) and he issued five walks in 8.2 innings...allowed at least two runs in each of his three appearances.

2021 RECAP: Began the season at Triple-A Las Vegas and was 4-7 with a 4.97 ERA in 17 games, including 16 starts, when he was selected by Oakland on Aug. 18...spent the balance of the season with the A's and went 1-4 with a 5.87 ERA in nine starts...has spent parts of each of the last five seasons with Oakland and his nine starts were the second most of his career (10 in 2017)... had career highs in strikeouts (26), losses (4), runs (26), earned runs (25) and home runs (8) and matched his high in hit batters (2) and wild pitches (1).

WITH OAKLAND: Allowed a .319 opponents batting average but walked just 10 batters in 38.1 innings (2.35 walks per nine innings) for a .366 opponents on-base percentage...his opponents batting average broke down to .309 (29-for-94) with an .858 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .333 (23-for-69) with a .953 OPS against left-handers...opponents hit .333 with runners in scoring position...was 0-1 with a 4.03 ERA and .720 opponents OPS in five starts at home, 1-3 with an 8.44 ERA and 1.115 OPS in four starts on the road...yielded seven of his eight home runs on the road...was 1-1 with a 3.38 ERA in four starts during the day, 0-3 with an 8.24 ERA in five starts at night...allowed a .533 batting average to the opponents number nine hitter and .438 average to the seven hitter...the A's were 3-1 in his no decisions and went 4-5 (.444) in his starting assignments...tossed fewer than six innings in all nine starts, including fewer than five innings four times.

WITH LAS VEGAS: His seven losses with the Aviators were his most as a minor leaguer and his .311 opponents batting average was a career high...surrendered just eight home runs in 88.2 innings, an average of 0.81 per nine innings...his opponents batting average broke down to .300 (61-for-203) with an .824 OPS against lefthanded hitters and .323 (53-for-164) with a .776 OPS against right-handers...yielded six of his eight home runs and issued 18 of his 27 walks to lefties...opponents hit .311 with the bases empty, .311 with runners on...six of the eight home runs he allowed were solo shots...had a .296 opponents average and allowed one home run the first time through the order, .307 with three home runs the second time and .337 with four home runs after that...went 2-3 with a 4.24 ERA, .287 opponents batting average and .737 OPS in nine starts at home, 2-4 with a 5.79 ERA, .333 opponent average and .867 OPS on the road...tossed six innings or fewer in each of his 17 appearances...the Aviators were 5-11 (.313) in his starting assignments.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHERS

RHP Frankie Montas (2-2, 3.44 ERA): Is 0-3 with a 3.69 ERA and .202 opponents batting average over his last five starts...the three-game losing streak matches his career high (third time, last: May 19-29, 2021)...the A's have been shut out three times during the losing streak and have scored one run once...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 4-1 A's loss to Los Angeles (AL) last Sunday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 r, 1 bb, 12 so)...the 12 strikeouts were the second highest single-game total of his career (13, Sept. 27, 2020 vs. Seattle)...it was his eighth career 10-strikeout game, which is tied for fourth most in Oakland history...now has 53 strikeouts for the season, which is tied for fourth in the American League...is also tied for the AL lead in games started (8) and ranks second in innings pitched (49.0)...is 4-2 with a 2.36 ERA (68.2 ip, 52 h, 22 r, 18 er, 25 bb, 77 so, 5 hr) in 14 career appearances, including 11 starts, against the Angels.
