# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (17-25) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (25-17)

ABOUT THE A's: Lost two of three to Minnesota to close out the last homestand and are now 1-6-1 over the last eight series... have lost six of the last nine games after winning four of the previous five contests...are 9-19 (.321) over the last 28 games after starting the year 8-6 (.571)...are eight games under .500 at 17-25 (.405), which is the fourth worst record in the American League...have spent 17 of the last 18 days in fifth place in the AL West and have held at least a share of last every day dating back to May 4 ... have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, five days in fourth, two days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth...trail first place Houston by $9 \frac{1}{2}$ games.
OFFENSE: The A's had 12 hits on Wednesday after collecting 11 hits on Tuesday and reached double figures in hits in back-to-back games for the first time this year...however, are batting 200 (132-for-659) with 58 runs scored in 21 games in May ( 2.8 runs per game)...the lowest batting average in a month of 10 or more games in Oakland history is 210 (April, 1979; May, 2012)...have a 206 batting average for the season, which is the lowest in the majors....also have the lowest on-base percentage (.274) and OPS (.591), the second lowers slugging percentage (.317) and are tied for the third fewest runs scored (139)...have scored one run or fewer 15 times, which is three more than any other team in the majors...have been shut out six times, which is tied with the Mariners for the most in the majors...were blanked just seven times all last year...have the third most strikeouts in the AL (360), the third most grounded into double plays (31) and are tied for the third fewest extra base hits (92)....are tied for the second most sacrifice hits (7).

THE LONG BALL: The A's homered twice Friday night for their first multiple home run game since April 21 against Baltimore when Pache and Murphy went deep...had homered just four times in the previous 16 games...snapped a streak in which they hit one home run or fewer in 26 consecutive games, which as tied for the third longest such streak in Oakland history... have 25 home runs for the season, which is second fewest in the majors to the Tigers (20)...however, nine of the home runs have come with at least two runners on base, which is tied for the most in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's allowed season highs in runs (14) and walks (10) and matched the high in hits (14) on Wednesday vs. Minnesota...it was the first time the A's issued 10 walks in a game since Aug. 29, 2018 at Houston (10) and the first time they allowed at least 10 hits and 10 walks since June 30 , 2016 against San Francisco ( 14 hits, 11 walks)...had compiled a 2.80 ERA, . 226 opponents average and averaged 2.66 walks per nine innings over the previous 15 contests...overall, are tied for third in the AL in shutouts (4) and are tied for sixth in fewest home runs allowed (36)...have the fourth highest opponents batting average (.238) and the fifth most walks (128).
STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are $0-5$ with a 5.15 ERA ( 25 er in 43.2 ip ) over the last nine games and $3-11$ with a 4.31 ERA ( 57 er in 119.0 ip) over the last 23 contests....are 11-19 with a 4.03 ERA ( 96 er in 214.1 ip) for the season....are second to the Mariners for the most losses in the American League... have the fourth most innings pitched.
THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen allowed eight runs Wednesday after yielding just 10 runs over the previous 14 games (8 er in 43.2 ip, 1.65 ERA)...has allowed three home runs over the last 18 games and 10 for the season, which is tied for second fewest in the AL.... have the fifth lowest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the American League (.345) but have the third highest on-base percentage (.320) and the fourth highest batting average (.233)...have allowed 16 -of- 74 (21.6\%) inherited runners to score, which is the third lowest percentage in the AL...the 70 inherited runners are fourth most...are tied for fourth in holds (28).
ON THE BASES: The A's are 25 -for- 31 ( $80.6 \%$ ) in stolen base attempts... have the second best stolen base percentage in the American League and rank third in steals...A's opponents are 11-for-19 (57.9\%) in stolen base attempts, which is the third lowest success rate in the majors (Astros, Orioles, 11-for$20,55.0 \%$ )...the 11 stolen bases allowed are tied for second fewest in the majors (Yankees, 10)...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is tied for fifth most in the majors.
DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed five errors in the last eight games after making just two errors over the previous 11 contests... have 28 errors for the season, which is tied with the White Sox for second most in the American League (Orioles, 31)...however, the errors have led to just 11 unearned runs, which is third fewest in the AL...rank second in the AL in double plays turned (39) but are tied for the second fewest outfield assists (3).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's began a six-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-1 + one game) and Seattle (three games) yesterday...went 4-4 on the last road trip to Minnesota ( $0-3$ ) and Detroit ( $4-1$ ) and are 11-11 (.500) on the road... went 2-5 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-3) and Minnesota (1-2) and have lost 11 of the last 13 home games...are 6-14 (.300) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the majors (Nationals, $5-15 / .250$ )...have compiled a 3.37 ERA ( 71 er in 189.2 ip) on the road compared to 4.23 at home... have the third lowest road ERA in the American League and the third highest home ERA.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are in a stretch that runs from May 13 to June 1 where they are scheduled to play 17 of 20 games against American League West competition...this series with the Angels is just the A's third against a divisional foe this year...are 3-6 in intradivision play and the nine games are tied for the fewest in the majors (Mariners)....face the Mariners for the first time with a three-games series beginning Monday and face the Astros for the first time with a three-game set from May 30-June 1.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 3-7 (.300) in one-run games...the losses are tied for the most in the American League and the record is second worst (Rangers, 2-6/.250)... 13 of the A's 25 losses have been by two runs or fewer, which is tied for most in the AL (Orioles)...had their first walk-off win of the season in the day game last Saturday against the Angels.
PLAYER NOTES: The A's have used 40 players, which is tied for third most in the American League (Angels, 42; Twins, 41)...have employed 18 rookies, which is tied for the sixth most in a season in Oakland history...it is the most since the 2017 A's had 20 rookies and the record is 21 in 2008...eight of the rookies have made their Major League debut...currently have 11 rookies on the roster, including eight pitchers... have used eight starting pitchers after using just nine in each of the previous two seasons...have employed six first basemen after using just five all last year.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 17 times this year, which includes eight Covid-19 IL placements...currently have six players on the IL (Bolt, Guerra, Honeywell, Jefferies, Piscotty, Vogt)...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors.

SCORING CHANGES: Official scorers have made two scoring changes in recent A's games...in the fifth inning of the May 15 game against Los Angeles (AL), Ohtani is now credited with a base hit instead of reaching base on a Kemp error...in the day game on May 14 against the Angels, Romine is now credited with a sacrifice bunt in the eighth inning.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's are 2-4 against the Angels after losing three of four in Oakland last weekend....won the season series last year, 15-4...the 15 wins were their most ever against the Angels and their most against any team since going 15-4 against the Astros in 2013...it was the A's third consecutive season series win after losing each of the previous five...went 7-2 in Oakland and 8-2 in Anaheim...the eight road wins are the most against the Angels and then seven home wins match the most....are 36-18 (.667) against the Angels over the last four years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 473-394 against the Angels...that includes 248-187 in Oakland and 225-207 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 522-471 against the Angels.

## TODAY'S TIDBITS

Jed Lowrie is 9 -for-21 (.429) with five walks over his last seven games...Justin Grimm has not allowed an earned run in his seven appearances in May ( $8.1 \mathrm{ip}, 6 \mathrm{~h}, 1 \mathrm{r}, 5 \mathrm{bb}, 4 \mathrm{so}$ ) after posting a 9.64 ERA in six games in April... Elvis Andrus is 9 -for-28 (.321) over his last 10 games and is now batting . 240 (12-for-50) in May.

> THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY
> In 1968 Jim Nash homers, pitches a five hit-shutout and strikes out 10 in the A's 2-0 win over Cleveland...the home run is the 5000th in the history of the A's franchise...in 1996 Geronimo Berroa hits three solo home runs and is 4 for 4 in the A's 5-1 win at New York...he would add another three-homer game later in the season to tie a major league record with two three-homer games...in 1997 George Williams, Matt Stairs and Mark McGwire deliver consecutive pinch hit singles in the A's 10-7 loss at Texas, tying the major league record for consecutive pinch hits in an inning...in 2004 Reggie Jackson becomes the third player in Oakland history to have his number retired when the A's honor him by retiring number 9 .

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (2-1, 2.93 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 15 -day injured list today and is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season....was placed on the IL May 6 retroactive to May 2 with left shoulder tendinitis and made one rehab start with Low-A Stockton on May 17 against Modesto...was the winning pitcher in the Ports $4-3$ win ( $5.0 \mathrm{ip}, 5 \mathrm{~h}, 1 \mathrm{r}, 1 \mathrm{er}, 6 \mathrm{so}, 1 \mathrm{hr}$ ).

BEFORE THE INJURY: Allowed one run or fewer in each of his last three starts before going on the IL (2 er in $16.0 \mathrm{ip}, 1.13$ ERA) and is now 2-0 with a 2.01 ERA ( 5 er in 22.1 ip ) over his last four starts after taking the loss in his first start...has won three straight decisions just once in his career (June 5-27, 2021).

DON'T WALK: Has walked seven batters in 27.2 innings over his first five starts, an average of 2.28 per nine innings...walked just 42 batters in 178.1 innings last year...his average of 2.12 walks per nine innings in 2021 was eighth lowest in the American League...walked two batters or fewer in 29 of his 32 starts last year and has now done so in 36 of his 40 career starts...has walked just 63 batters in 251.1 career innings ( 2.26 per nine innings).
HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-0 with a 1.13 ERA (2 er in 16.0 ip) in three starts at home compared to 1-1 with a 5.40 ERA (7 er in 11.2 ip ) and all four of his home runs in two starts on the road.

AGAINST THE WEST: Picked up the win in his only start against an American League West team on April 24 against Texas...last year, he went 4-12 with a 5.29 ERA in 19 starts against AL West competition, 6-3 with a 2.88 ERA in 13 starts against everyone else...his 12 intradivision losses matched the most in the majors over the last 34 years (last: Porcello, BOS in 2017) and set an Athletics record, topping the previous mark of 11 by Brian Kingman (1980) and Rick Langford (1977 and 1979)...his 5.29 intradivision ERA was fourth highest in the majors last year...went 0-5 with an 8.69 ERA in five starts against Seattle and 0-3 with a 7.40 ERA in four starts against Houston
THIS AND THAT: Has allowed three runs in the first inning for a 5.40 ERA....has a 0.90 ERA (2 er in 20.0 ip ) over ininngs two through five and a 13.50 ERA (4 er in 2.2 ip) from the sixth inning on... has struck out 18 batters in 27.2 innings, an average of 5.86 strikeouts per nine inings...last year, he fanned just 125 batters and his average of 6.31 strikeouts per nine innings was third lowest in the AL and the majors...has made four of his five starts this year in day games...last year he made 17 of his 32 starts during the day, which tied for the most in the majors.

2022 HIGHLIGHTS: Faced his former team in his first start on April 9 at Philadelphia and was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss...yielded a career-high tying three home runs and had season highs in runs (4), hits (7) and strikeouts (4)...is 2-0 with a 2.01 ERA (5 er in 22.1 ip ) in four starts since then... tossed a season-high 6.1 innings for the win in his second start on April 14 at Tampa Bay, a 6-3 A's win...retired 14 consecutive batters at one point... walked a season-high two batters in three consecutive starts from April 1930...combined with Jackson, Snead and Jiménez on a four-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Texas April 24 in Oakland...tossed five of the innings and allowed just one hit while walking two.
LAST MAJOR LEAGUE START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-1 loss to Cleveland on April 30 in Oakland...blanked the Guardians on four hits over the first three innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 12 innings...the scoreless streak ended on a RBI single by Gimenez in the fourth...the A's tied the game on a Neuse home run in the fifth and he was releived by Jackson to start the seventh with the scored tied 1-1...Jiménez allowed two unearned runs in the ninth for the loss.

LAST MINOR LEAGUE START: He was the winning pitcher in Stockton's 4-3 win over Modesto last Tuesday...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the third ining on a two-out solo home run by Edwin Arroyo...the Ports came back with three runs in the fourth and he was relieved by Yehizon Sanchez to start the sixth inning with a 4-1 lead.

came in a 4-2 decision in Oakland on May 30...allowed four runs in the sec ond inning on a leadoff home run by Walsh, a two-run double by Fletcher an a RBI single by Gosselin...those were the only runs he would allow in six innings of work...retired each of the final nine batters and 14 of the last 15 then had a no decision in the A's 8-4 win in Oakland on June 16...allowed three runs in the first inning on RBI singles by Stassi, Ward and Gosselin, and one more run in the second on a solo home run by Ohtani...then retired 12 of the final 16 batters he faced but left trailing 4-2...Oakland scored six times in the bottom of the sixth for the win...the first win came in the A's 4-1 victory in Oakland on July 19...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and allowed seven hits while walking one...Ohtani shut out the A's over the first six innings but Oakland scored three times off the Angels bullpen in the seventh for the win... then took the loss in the A's 1-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) on July 31...allowed his only run in 6.1 innings of work on an Ohtani RBI double in the third in ning...the A's were shut out on six hits by Barria and three Angels relievers... also won in a 5-4 decision at Los Angeles (AL) on Sept. 17...Oakland scored twice in the second but he allowed four runs in the bottom of the second.. only one of the runs was earned, a Suzuki leadoff home run...those were the only runs he would allow in six innings of work and Oakland scored once in the third and twice in the sixth for the win.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 1-1 with a 6.43 ERA (14.0 ip, $20 \mathrm{~h}, 11 \mathrm{r}, 10 \mathrm{er}, 2$ bb, 14 so, 3 hr ) in a team-leading four starts...walked just two batters in 14.0 innings but opponents were 20-for-62 (.323)...tied for second in the Cactus League in hits allowed (20), tied for sixth in most runs (11) and tied for seventh in strikeouts (14)...tied Jefferies for the team lead in innings pitched and strikeouts.

2021 RECAP: Was acquired by the A's from Philadelphia for cash considerations on Jan. 30, 2021 and went 10-15 with a 4.24 ERA in 32 starts...his 15 losses were the most in the American League, tied for third most in the majors and matched the most by an A's pitcher over the last 13 years (Jesse Chavez, 2015)...is the first Athletic to lead the league in losses since Tom Candiotti in 1998...tied for the AL lead in games started and ranked 10th in innings pitched (178.1)...had a . 281 opponents batting average and his 195 hits allowed were the most in the AL and second most in the majors... his 94 runs were fifth most in the AL and his nine hit batters tied for 10th most....averaged 15.0 pitches per inning, which was the fewest in the AL and fourth fewest in the majors...struck out just 125 batters and his average of 6.31 strikeouts per nine innings was third lowest in the AL and the majors... allowed 23 home runs and ranked seventh in the AL in fewest home runs per nine innings (1.16)...his opponents batting average broke down to 270 (143-for-530) with a . 739 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .289 (52-for-180) with a . 767 OPS against left-handers...surrendered 18 of his 23 home runs to righties... 17 of the home runs were solo shots...allowed a .324 average with runners in scoring position, which was the highest in the majors and fifth highest in Oakland history...now has a . 324 career opponents average with RISP...was 1-10 with a 6.60 ERA and .890 OPS in 12 starts on four days rest compared to $9-4$ with a 2.84 ERA and .657 OPS in 19 starts on five days rest or more...led the majors in losses and highest ERA on four days rest and had the second highest OPS...tied for third in the AL in wins on five days rest or more, ranked fourth in ERA and sixth in OPS.. wWas 6-7 with a 3.84 ERA in 15 starts at night compared to $4-8$ with a 4.58 ERA in 17 starts during the day...tied for the most starts during the day in the majors and ranked second in most losses...the losses are the most by an A's pitcher during the day since Tom Candiotti also had 8 in 1998...however, had a .718 opponents OPS during the day, . 779 at night...opponents hit .440 with a 1.462 OPS when putting his curveball in play...the OPS was the highest in the majors among pitchers with 75 or more curveballs in play...had 20 assists, which tied for sixth most among AL pitchers...the A's were $4-3$ in his no decisions and went 14-18 (.438) in his starting assignments...left with the lead only to have the pen blow the save in five of his starts... went 10-3 in 18 starts with more than two runs of support, 0-12 in 14 starts with support of two runs or fewer.

LHP Zach Logue (2-2, 2.04 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas on Friday for his third stint with the A's this year... was optioned to Las Vegas on Wednesday and returned for Daulton Jefferies, who went on the 15-day injured list...is scheduled to make his fifth appearance and fourth start of the season...began the year at Triple-A Las Vegas and was added to Oakland's roster as a substitute player on April 15...picked up the win in relief in his Major League debut on April 19 against Baltimore and was returned to the Aviators the next day...was recalled May 6 and went 1-2 with a 2.20 ERA in three starts during his second stint...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 3-1 A's loss to Minnesota last Monday in Oakland (4.1 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 2 so)...has never faced the Mariners in his career...is $0-0$ with a 5.63 ERA and . 318 opponents batting average in four starts with Las Vegas...was acquired from Toronto prior to the season in the Matt Chapman trade
