OAKLAND ATHLETICS (17-27) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (18-25)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three straight, four of the last five and seven of the last nine games to fall to a season-high 10 games under .500 at 17-27 (.386)...that is the third worst record in the American League and it marks the first time the A's have been 10 games under .500 since finishing the 2017 season 12 games under (75-87)...are 1-7-1 over the previous nine series...are 9-21 (.300) over the last 30 games after starting the year 8-6 (.571)...have spent 19 of the last 20 days in fifth place in the AL West and have held at least a share of last every day dating back to May 4...have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, five days in fourth, two days tied for fourth and 19 days in fifth...trail first place Houston by a season-high 10½ games for the second consecutive day, which is their largest deficit in the West since Sept. 9, 2019 when they were also 10½ back.

A's IN MAY: The A's have clinched a losing record in the month of May for the first time since 2017 (12-15) as they are 7-16 (.304) with eight games remaining...the 16 losses are the A's most in any month since going 11-16 in August of 2017...have the second worst record in the majors this month (Marlins, 6-14/.300)...are batting .204 (148-for-727) in May, which is the lowest mark in the majors...also have the lowest slugging percentage (.290) and OPS (.562) in the majors and the second lowest on-base percentage (.271)... the lowest single-month marks in Oakland history (min. 10 games) are .210 for batting (April, 1979; May, 2012), .267 for on-base percentage (July, 2015), .298 for slugging (April, 1968) and .572 for OPS (April, 1968)...rank last in the majors in home runs (8), tied for last in extra base hits (43) and have the fourth fewest runs scored (65).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .261 (54-for-207) with 23 runs scored over the last six games (3.8 runs per game) after hitting .181 with 57 runs over the previous 24 contests (2.4 runs per game)...overall, rank last in the majors in batting (.208), on-base percentage (.274), slugging percentage (.317) and OPS (.591)...have the third fewest runs scored (146) and extra base hits (96) and the fifth most strikeouts (379)...are tied for the third most sacrifice hits (7)...have scored one run or fewer 16 times, which is three more than any other team...have been shut out six times, which is tied with the Mariners for the most in the majors...were blanked just seven times all last year.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have homered two times or fewer in each of the last 40 games and 43 of 44 this year...have 26 home runs for the season, which is second fewest in the majors to the Tigers (22)...however, nine of the home runs have come with at least two runners on base, which is tied with the Mariners and Yankees for the most in the majors...15 of the home runs have put the A's ahead, which is tied for the seventh most go-ahead home runs in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.65 ERA (49 er in 78.0 ip) over the last nine games after posting a 2.25 ERA over the previous 11 contests...now have a 3.89 ERA for the season, which is fifth highest in the American League...have the fourth highest opponents batting average (.240) and the fifth highest slugging percentage (.388) and OPS (.697)...are tied for third in shutouts (4)... have issued the fifth most walks (136).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 0-7 with a 5.46 ERA (36 er in 59.1 ip) over the last 12 games and the streak of 12 consecutive games without a win from a starter is the longest single-season streak by the A's since a 17-game streak from June 3-22, 2016...are 3-13 with a 4.58 ERA (66 er in 129.2 ip) over the last 25 contests...are 11-21 with a 4.24 ERA for the season... the losses are the most in the American League and third most in the majors...rank fourth in the AL in innings pitched (225.0).

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has allowed 14 runs in the last five games (14 er in 21.0 ip, 6.00 ERA) after yielding just 10 runs over the previous 14 contests (1.65 ERA)...has the lowest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the American League (.291) and the second lowest batting average (.194) and on-base percentage (.283)...has allowed 16-of-77 (20.8%) inherited runners to score, which is the third lowest percentage in the AL...the 77 inherited runners are fourth most...has surrendered three home runs in the last three games after yielding just one over the previous 17 contests...has allowed 11 home runs for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...is tied for fifth in saves (11) and holds (28).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 25-for-31 (80.6%) in stolen base attempts...have the second best stolen base percentage in the American League and rank fourth in steals...A's opponents are 12-for-20 (60.0%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second lowest success rate in the majors (Astros, 12-for-

21, 57.1%)...the 12 stolen bases allowed are tied for second fewest (Yankees, 11)...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is tied for third most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed seven errors in the last 10 games after making just two errors over the previous 11 contests...have 30 errors for the season, which is second most in the American League (Orioles, 33)...however, the errors have led to just 11 unearned runs, which is third fewest in the AL...rank second in the AL in double plays turned (41)...are tied for the third fewest outfield assists (4).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-3 on this six-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Seattle (0-1)...went 4-4 on the last road trip to Minnesota (0-3) and Detroit (4-1) and are 11-13 (.458) on the road...return home following the game tomorrow for a 10-game homestand against Texas (four games), Houston (three games) and Boston (three games)...it is the first of two 10game homestands (Aug. 19-28)...went 2-5 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-3) and Minnesota (1-2) and have lost 11 of the last 13 home games...are 6-14 (.300) at home for the season, which is the second worst home record in the majors (Nationals, 5-16/.238)...have compiled a 3.54 ERA (81 er in 205.2 ip) on the road compared to 4.23 at home.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are in a stretch that runs from May 13 to June 1 where they are scheduled to play 17 of 20 games against American League West competition...are 3-8 (.273) in intradivision play, which is the worst mark in the majors...the 11 games are second fewest to the Mariners (10)... this series is the A's first with the Mariners and Oakland will face the Astros for the first time with a three-game set from May 30-June 1.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 3-8 (.273) in one-run games...the losses are the most in the American League and third most in the majors...the record is second worst in the AL (Rangers, 2-6/.250)...14 of the A's 27 losses have been by two runs or fewer, which is tied for second most in the majors (Marlins, 15)...have one walk-off win, which is tied for second fewest in the AL.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's lost the first meeting of 2022 last night and now have a 13-game losing streak against the Mariners, which matches the longest against any team in Oakland history...nine of the 13 losses have been by two runs or fewer...have not lost more than 13 straight games against one team since the Kansas City A's had

a 15-game losing streak against the White Sox from July 17, 1964-May 18, 1965...have a seven-game road losing streak, which matches the A's longest in Seattle...also had a seven-game losing streak at Safeco Field (May 3-Oct. 1, 2009) and two seven-game streaks at the Kingdome...lost the season series last year 15-4 and the 15 losses were the A's most against one team since they went 2-16 against Chicago in 1964...went 3-7 in Seattle and 1-8 in Oakland...the home record matched the A's worst against the Mariners (2007 and 2016)...have lost six straight and 10 of the last 12 in Oakland...have lost seven of the previous nine season series and are 66-97 (.405) against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2013 season, which is the A's worst mark against any American League team over that span...all-time, the A's are 370-321 against the Mariners...that includes 198-144 in Oakland, 171-174 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 95-110 at T-Mobile Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Dany Jiménez leads American League rookies and ranks fifth among all AL pitchers in saves (8)...ranks fifth among AL relievers in ERA (0.55)...is one of three AL closers without a blown save...**A.J. Puk** has a career-high and A's season-high 15.0-inning scoreless streak dating back to April 14 and ranks third among AL relievers in ERA (0.50).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1976** Bert Campaneris sets an Oakland record when he steals five bases in the A's 12-7 win against Minnesota...the A's stole seven bases in the game and an American League record 341 for the season...in **1994** Brent Gates singles in his first four at bats against Seattle after going 4 for 4 the day before to establish an Oakland record with eight consecutive hits... in **1995** Dennis Eckersley pitches the ninth inning in the A's 5-3 win over Baltimore to become the sixth reliever in Major League history to reach 300 saves.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: James Kaprielian (0-2, 4.50 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the injured list May 1 and is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...allowed four runs in 2.0 innings in his first start but has yielded just five runs in 16.0 innings over his last three (2.81 ERA)...has allowed four hits or fewer in each of his four starts and opponents are 13-for-66 (.197)...began the season on the 10-day IL with an inflamed right AC joint...did not pitch during the spring...this is his third season in the majors, all with the A's.

REHAB ASSIGNMENT: Went 1-1 with a 7.24 ERA (13.2 ip, 15 h, 11 r, 11 er, 5 bb, 13 so, 3 hr) on a three-start rehab assignment...had 52 pitches in his first start, 78 in his second and 84 in his third...made one start for Low-A Stockton on April 15 against Modesto and picked up the win in a 14-10 decision (5.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 6 so, 2 hr)...his final two starts came with Triple-A Las Vegas... had a no decision in a 12-5 win against El Paso on April 20 (4.2 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 1 hr) and then took the loss in a 12-5 decision on April 26 against Tacoma (4.0 ip, 3 h, 5 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 2 so).

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss to Cleveland on May 1 in Oakland...tossed 2.0 innings, which was the shortest start of his career... walked a career-high tying four batters...allowed a RBI double to Maile in the second and then walked the bases loaded to start the third inning...was relieved by Lemoine, who allowed all three runners to score.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 1-0 loss at Minnesota on May 7...blanked the Twins on two hits and two walks over the first five innings and retired the first two batters he faced in the sixth...then allowed a home run to Polanco for the only run of the game...was relieved by Jackson following the homer and finished with 5.2 innings...Gray and three relievers combined to shut out the A's on three hits.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-3 win at Detroit on May 12... Oakland scored three times in the first and he blanked the Tigers on a hit and a walk over the first four innings...then allowed two runs in the fifth inning on a Barnhart RBI double and a Grossman RBI ground out...was relieved by Acevedo to start the sixth inning with the A's leading 3-2.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-2 win over Minnesota a week ago today in Oakland...blanked the Twins on two hits and a walk over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Lewis in the fifth...surrendered a one-out home run to Sanchez in the sixth and was relieved by Moll following the home run with the scored tied 2-2.

in 6.1 ip) in two games in Seattle...was 1-0 with a 5.87 ERA (15.1 ip, 13 h, 10 r, 10 er, 5 bb, 12 so, 3 hr) in four games, including two starts, last year...the win came in a start in the A's 6-3 victory in Oakland on May 26...did not allow a run in 7.0 innings and allowed two hits and two walks...retired each of the first eight batters and each of the final 10...then had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 10-inning loss at Seattle on May 31...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed four runs in the fourth inning...surrendered a three-run home run to Walton and a RBI double to Lewis...was relieved by Guerra with two outs in the fourth and a runner on second...Oakland scored once in the fifth and twice in the eighth to get him off the hook...his final two outings came in relief on Sept. 23 in Oakland (2.0 ip, 3 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 so, 1 hr) and Sept. 27 at Seattle (2.2 ip, 3 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 so, 1 hr).

on May 12 and spent the remainder of the season with the A's, going 8-5 with a 4.07 ERA and .233 opponents batting average in 24 games, including 21 starts, in his rookie campaign...tied for fifth among American League rookies in wins, tied for sixth in innings pitched (119.1), ranked seventh in strikeouts (123) and eighth in games started...based on a minimum of 0.5 innings per team game, he ranked fifth in opponents batting average, sixth in slugging (.430)...his 123 strikeouts were eighth most in OAS1 and With 123 strikeouts were eighth most in OAS1 and Were the most since Sean Manaea had 124 in 2016...his 21 starts were the most since Jharel Cotton had 24 in 2017...went 5-3 with a 2.65 ERA, .202 opponents batting average and .657 OPS over his first 12 starts through July 20...then posted a 3-2 record with a 5.96 ERA, .271 opponents average and .825 OPS over his final 12 games (nine starts) beginning on July 27.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average broke down to .201 (46-for-229) with a .602 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .266 (59-for-222) with a .860 OPS against left-handers...issued 31 of his 41 walks to lefties...had the third lowest batting average and OPS against right-handers in the AL among pitchers with 100 or more innings pitched...opponents were 1-for-15 (.067) with two walks with the bases loaded...had a .189 opponents batting average and .569 OPS the first time through the order, .285 with a .907 OPS the second time and .221 with a .710 OPS after that...yielded 10 of his 19 home runs the second time through the order...allowed a .083 average against the opponent's number five hitter...surrendered six of his 19 home runs to the clean-up hitter...opponents hit .107 when putting his curveball in play, which was fifth lowest in the AL among pitchers with 150 or more curveballs.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Began the season with 21 starts and was 8-5 with a 3.80 ERA and .720 OPS before being moved to the bullpen following his start on Sept. 18...had no decisions, a 7.88 ERA and .890 OPS in three relief appearances...tossed at least 2.0 innings in each of his three relief appearances...first batters faced were 0-for-2 with a hit by pitch and he did not inherit any runners.

THIS AND THAT: Had a 1.93 ERA over the first two innings, a 5.24 ERA from the third inning on...was 5-3 with a 3.28 ERA in 11 games at home, 3-2 with a 4.82 ERA in 13 games on the road...had a 4-3 record and a 3.16 ERA in 10 day games, a 4-2 record and a 4.76 ERA in 14 night games...allowed 15 of his 19 home runs at night...was 1-2 with a 5.68 ERA in three interleague starts... logged a 7-3 record and a 3.86 ERA in 21 games against AL competition...left with the lead and was the pitcher of record in four of his eight no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save...the A's were 11-10 (.524) in his starting assignments...allowed two runs or fewer in 13 of his 21 starts and five hits or fewer 16 times.

2021 DAY-BY-DAY: Began the year at Triple-A Las Vegas and went 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA in one start...was the Aviators Opening Day starter on May 6 at Las Vegas and was the losing pitcher in an 8-1 loss to Sacramento (4.2 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 0 hr, 76 pitches)...was recalled by Oakland on May 12 and made his first Major League start that day at Boston...allowed a run on four hits in 5.0 innings to earn his first ML win in the A's 4-1 victory over the Red Sox...would go 4-1 with a 2.84 ERA and .182 opponents batting average over his first seven starts through June 18...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings May 26 against Seattle for his second win...that matched his longest outing as a professional...also tossed 7.0 innings for Single-A Tampa at Charlotte on April 16, 2016, his second professional appearance...pitched 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits on June 12 to defeat Kansas City 11-2...tossed 105 pitches, which were his most as a professional, in a 5-4 loss to Texas on June 29...struck out a career-high 10 batters in a career-high tying 7.0 innings on July 4 against Boston but was the losing pitcher in the A's 1-0 loss...it was the first 10-strikeout game by an A's rookie since Chris Bassitt on Aug. 9, 2015 against Houston (also 10)...combined with Romo, Moll and Guerra on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win over Los Angeles (AL) on July 20 as part of a career-high 12.0-inning scoreless streak from July 10 to 27...singled off Chris Paddack in the third inning on July 27 at San Diego for his first Major League hit...was placed on the 10-day injured list July 31 retroactive to July 28 with a right shoulder impingement...missed just one start, did not have a rehab assignment, and was reinstated from the IL on Aug. 8...went 2-0 with a 3.31 ERA over his first three starts following his return...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits in a 3-1 win at Los Angeles (AL) on Sept. 18...that would be his final start of the season as it brought his season innings pitched total, including Las Vegas, to 116.0...had just 101.0 innings as a professional entering the season...pitched in relief in each of his final three appearances and allowed at least two runs in all three appearances (7.88 ERA).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Paul Blackburn (4-0, 1.91 ERA): Is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season...has allowed nine runs over his first eight starts and has a 1.91 ERA, which is seventh lowest in the American League among pitchers with 40 or more innings...has won each of his first four decisions for a career-high four-game winning streak (previous: 3, July 31, 2017-June 7, 2018)...is the first A's starting pitcher on an Opening Day roster to start the season 4-0 since Sonny Gray in 2015...the four wins are tied for fifth most in the AL and are a career high...the A's are 3-1 in his no decisions and are 7-1 (.875) in his starting assignments...had a no decision in his last start, a 4-2 A's win at Los Angeles (AL) last Friday (4.2 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 5 so)...is 1-2 with a 5.95 ERA (19.2 ip, 24 h, 14 r, 13 er, 4 bb, 12 so, 2 hr) in four career appearances, all starts, against Seattle...went 0-1 with a 4.66 ERA (9.2 ip, 11 h, 6 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 10 so, 1 hr) in two starts last year, both in Oakland.

- Has pitched on one day of rest in 13 of his 20 appearances.
