# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (18-27) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (18-26)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three of the last four, four of the last six and seven of the last 10 games and are nine games under .500 at 18-27 (.400)...that is the third worst record in the American League...are 1-7-1 over the previous nine series....are 10-21 (.323) over the last 31 games after starting the year $8-6$ (.571)...have spent 20 of the last 21 days in fifth place in the AL West and have held at least a share of last every day dating back to May 4 ... have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, five days in fourth, two days tied for fourth and 20 days in fifth...trail first place Houston by a season-high 101/2 games for the third consecutive day, which is their largest deficit in the West since Sept. 9, 2019 when they were also $10 \frac{1}{2}$ back.
A's IN MAY: The A's have clinched a losing record in the month of May for the first time since 2017 (12-15) as they are 8-16 (.333) with seven games remaining...the 16 losses are the A's most in any month since going 11-16 in August of 2017... have the fourth worst record in the American League this month (Mariners, 7-16/.304)...are batting .210 (161-for-766) in May, which is the second lowest mark in the majors....also have the lowest slugging percentage (.305) and second lowest OPS (.581) and on-base percentage (.276)... the lowest single-month marks in Oakland history (min. 10 games) are .210 for batting (April, 1979; May, 2012), . 267 for on-base percentage (July, 2015), . 298 for slugging (April, 1968) and . 572 for OPS (April, 1968)...rank last in the majors in home runs (10), have the sixth fewest extra base hits (49) and have the fourth fewest runs scored (72).
OFFENSE: The A's are batting 256 ( 63 -for-246) with 30 runs scored over the last seven games ( 4.3 runs per game) after hitting .181 with 57 runs over the previous 24 contests ( 2.4 runs per game)...overall, rank last in the majors in batting (.211) and on-base percentage (.276) and are second to last in slugging percentage (.325) and OPS (.601)...have the fourth fewest runs scored (153), are tied for the fifth fewest extra base hits (102) and have the fifth most strikeouts (390)....are tied for the third most sacrifice hits (7)...have scored one run or fewer 16 times, which is three more than any other team... have been shut out six times, which is tied with the Mariners and Pirates for the most in the majors....were blanked just seven times all last year.
THE LONG BALL: The A's have homered two times or fewer in each of the last 41 games and 44 of 45 this year...have 28 home runs for the season, which is third fewest in the majors to the Tigers (22) and Nationals (27)...however, nine of the home runs have come with at least two runners on base, which is tied with the Mariners and Yankees for the most in the majors... 16 of the home runs have put the A's ahead, which is tied for the seventh most goahead home runs in the majors.
PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.59 ERA ( 54 er in 87.0 ip ) over the last 10 games after posting a 2.25 ERA over the previous 11 contests...now have a 3.91 ERA for the season, which is sixth highest in the American League... have the fifth highest opponents batting average (.240) and slugging percentage (.387) and the sixth highest OPS (.698)...are tied for fourth in shutouts (4)... along with the Mariners, have issued the fourth most walks (140).
STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are $0-7$ with a 5.74 ERA (41 er in 64.1 ip ) over the last 13 games and the streak of 13 consecutive games without a win from a starter is the longest single-season streak by the A's since a 17-game streak from June 3-22, 2016...are 3-13 with a 4.75 ERA ( 71 er in 134.2 ip) over the last 26 contests...are 11-21 with a 4.34 ERA for the season... the losses are the most in the American League and third most in the majors...rank fifth in the AL in innings pitched (230.0).
THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has allowed 14 runs in the last six games ( 14 er in 25.0 ip, 5.04 ERA ) after yielding just 10 runs over the previous 14 contests (1.65 ERA)...has the lowest average (.190) and slugging percentage (.285) against first batters faced in the American League and the second lowest on-base percentage (.282)...has allowed 16-of-77 (20.8\%) inherited runners to score, which is the third lowest percentage in the AL...the 77 inherited runners are fourth most... has surrendered three home runs in the last four games after yielding just one over the previous 17 contests... has allowed 11 home runs for the season, which is tied for second fewest in the American League...is tied for fifth in saves (12) and tied for third in holds (30).
ON THE BASES: The A's are 27 -for- $33(81.8 \%)$ in stolen base attempts... have the second best stolen base percentage in the American League and are tied for second in steals...A's opponents are 12 -for-21 (57.1\%) in stolen base attempts, which is tied for the lowest success rate in the majors (Astros, 12-for-21, $57.1 \%$ )...the 12 stolen bases allowed are tied for fewest (Yankees, 12)...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is tied for third most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed seven errors in the last 11 games after making just two errors over the previous 11 contests... have 29 errors for the season, which is second most in the American League (Orioles, 32)...however, the errors have led to just 11 unearned runs, which is third fewest in the AL...rank third in the AL in double plays turned (41)...are tied for the third fewest outfield assists (4).
HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-3 on this six-game road trip to Los AngelesAL (1-2) and Seattle (1-1)...went 4-4 on the last road trip to Minnesota (0-3) and Detroit (4-1) and are 12-13 (.480) on the road...return home following the game tomorrow for a 10-game homestand against Texas (four games), Houston (three games) and Boston (three games)...it is the first of two 10game homestands (Aug. 19-28)...went 2-5 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-3) and Minnesota (1-2) and have lost 11 of the last 13 home games...are 6-14 (.300) at home for the season, which is the second worst home record in the majors (Nationals, $5-17 / .227$ )...have compiled a 3.61 ERA ( 86 er in 214.2 ip ) on the road compared to 4.23 at home.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are in a stretch that runs from May 13 to June 1 where they are scheduled to play 17 of 20 games against American League West competition...are 4-8 (.333) in intradivision play, which is the third worst mark in the American League...the 12 games are tied second fewest in the majors to the Mariners (11)...this series is the A's first with the Mariners and Oakland will face the Astros for the first time with a three-game set from May 30-June 1.
ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 3-8 (.273) in one-run games...the losses are tied for the most in the American League and tied for third most in the majors...the record is second worst in the AL (Rangers, $2-6 / .250$ )... 14 of the A's 27 losses have been by two runs or fewer, which is tied for second most in the majors (Marlins, 15)...have one walk-off win, which is tied for fewest in the AL.
SCORING CHANGES: Official scorers have made three scoring changes in recent A's games...in the sixth inning of the May 2 game against Tampa Bay, Franco is now credited with a base hit instead of reaching base on an Andrus error...in the fifth inning of the May 15 game against Los Angeles (AL), Ohtani is now credited with a base hit instead of reaching base on a Kemp error...in the day game on May 14 against the Angels, Romine is now credited with a sacrifice bunt in the eighth inning.
A's vs. MARINERS: The A's win last night snapped a 13 -game losing streak against the Mariners, which matched the longest against any team in Oakland history....nine of the 13 losses were by two runs or fewer....also snapped a seven-game road losing streak, which matched the A's longest in Seattle... also had a seven-game losing streak at Safeco Field (May 3-Oct. 1, 2009) and two seven-game streaks at the Kingdome...lost the season series last year $4-15$ and the 15 losses were the A's most against one team since they went 2-16 against Chicago in 1964...went 3-7 in Seattle and 1-8 in Oakland...the home record matched the A's worst against the Mariners (2007 and 2016)... have lost six straight and 10 of the last 12 in Oakland....have lost seven of the previous nine season series and are 67-97 (.409) against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2013 season, which is the A's worst mark against any American League team over that span...all-time, the A's are 371-321 against the Mariners...that includes 198-144 in Oakland, 172-174 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 96-110 at T-Mobile Park.

## TODAY'S TIDBITS

Dany Jiménez has converted each of his nine save opportunities for the first nine saves of his career...leads AL rookies and ranks tied for fourth among all AL pitchers in saves...is one of three AL closers without a blown save...Jed Lowrie has a .287 career average in 120 games against the Mariners ( 125 -for- 435 ) and is batting 282 ( 68 -for-241) in 64 career games at T-Mobile Park...Tony Kemp is a career . 341 (26-for-81) hitter with five doubles, three home runs and nine walks in 30 games at T-Mobile Park.

## THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1931 the A's win their 17th consecutive game in a 16-4 win over the Yankees in the second game of a doubleheader at Philadelphia...the winning streak remained a franchise record until 2002 when the A's won a then-American League record 20 consecutive games...in 1975 Gene Tenace connects for the 6000th home run in the history of the Athletics franchise in the A's 6-3 win in the first game of a doubleheader at Cleveland...in 2015 Jesse Hahn tosses a four-hit shutout against Detroit to become the first Athletic with a Memorial Day shutout since 1947.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Paul Blackburn (4-0, 1.91 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season.... has allowed nine runs over his first eight starts and has a 1.91 ERA, which is seventh lowest in the American League among pitchers with 40 or more innings...has not allowed a run in three of his eight starts and has yielded three runs or fewer in all eight starts...is in his sixth season in the majors, all with the A's, but is on his first Opening Day roster....pitched in 30 games over his first five seasons with Oakland, all but three of which came as a starter.

4-0: Has won each of his first four decisions for a career-high four-game winning streak (previous: 3, July 31, 2017-June 7, 2018)...is the first A's starting pitcher on an Opening Day roster to start the season 4-0 since Sonny Gray in 2015...the last to begin the year at least $5-0$ is Trevor Cahill, who won his first six decisions in 2011...the four wins are tied for fifth most in the American League and are a career high... had just three wins in 30 career appearances entering the season.
DON'T WALK: Has walked two batters in each of his last two starts (4 bb in 11.1 ip ) after walking three batters in 31.0 innings over his first six starts... has three starts without a walk and three with one.... has issued just seven free passes in 42.1 innings and his average of 1.49 walks per nine innings is fourth lowest in the American League among pitchers with 40 or more innings.... has issued just 17 free passes in 80.2 innings over the last two years ( 1.90 per nine innings) and is averaging 2.25 walks per nine innings in his carer ( 45 bb in 180.1 ip ).

DON'T HOMER: Has allowed just one home run over his first eight starts ( 42.1 innngs) and his average of 0.21 home runs per nine innings is fifth lowest in the American League among pitchers with 40 or more innings...yielded eight home runs in 38.1 innings last year and entered the season with 18 home runs in 138.0 career innings ( 1.17 per nine innings).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 5-for-29 (.172) with runners in scoring position...entered the season with a .328 career opponents average with RISP...has a 194 (13-for-67) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .275 (19-for-69) the second time and $.150(3$-for-20) the third time...has allowed a .149 opponents batting average with two strikes.

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed six of his nine runs over the first two innings of the game ( 6 er in 16.0 ip, 3.38 ERA)... has a 1.03 ERA ( 3 er in 26.1 ip ) from the third inning on... is $3-0$ with a 1.37 ERA ( 4 er in 26.1 ip) in five starts on the road, 1 -0 with a 2.81 ERA ( 5 er in 16.0 ip ) in three starts at home...the A's are 3-1 in his no decisions and are 7-1 (.875) in his starting assignments.

2022 HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed 5.0 scoreless inning and struck out a career-high seven batters in a 13-2 win at Tampa Bay in his first start on April 11...had a no decision in the A's 7-5 win in his second start on April 16 at Toronto... left with a 5-2 lead but the bullpen allowed three runs for the blown save... won back-to-back starts on April 21 against Baltimore and April 27 at San Francisco...combined with five A's relievers on a three-hit, 1-0 shutout in the win over the Giants...tossed five of the innings and allowed all three of the hits while walking one...finished April 3-0 with a 1.35 ERA in four starts... walked just two batters in 20.0 innings and held the opposition to a .197 batting average...it was his first career three-win month and he tied for third in the American League in wins in April...based on a minimum of 20.0 innings, he had the second lowest opponents OPS (.459), ranked third in slugging (.239) and was fourth in ERA and on-base percentage (.219)...allowed a season-high three runs on a season-high six hits in a season-low 4.1 innings on May 3 against Tampa Bay...had a no decision in the A's 10-7, 10-inning loss....combined with Jackson and Jiménez on a four-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Detroit on May 9 ...tossed a season-high 6.2 innings, yielded all four of the hits and did not walk a batter...extended his scoreless streak to a career-high 9.0 innings...logged a season-high 6.2 innings for the second consecutive start in the day game on May 14 against Los Angeles (AL) but had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win.

LAST START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's $4-2$ win at Los Angeles (AL) last Friday....allowed a season-high tying six hits in 4.2 innings...Oakland scored a run in the first but he allowed a Rendon RBI single in the bottom of the first....also yielded a RBI double to Trout in the third and was relieved by Moll with a runner on second and two outs in the fifth inning with the A's leading 3-2.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Was 0-1 with a 9.35 ERA ( $8.2 \mathrm{ip}, 13 \mathrm{~h}, 9 \mathrm{r}, 9 \mathrm{er}, 5 \mathrm{bb}$ 5 so, 0 hr ) in three games, including two starts...opponents were 13 -for- 37 (.351) and he issued five walks in 8.2 innings...allowed at least two runs in each of his three appearances.
2021 RECAP: Began the season at Triple-A Las Vegas and was 4-7 with a 4.97 ERA in 17 games, including 16 starts, when he was selected by Oakland on Aug. 18...spent the balance of the season with the A's and went 1-4 with a 5.87 ERA in nine starts...has spent parts of each of the last five seasons with Oakland and his nine starts were the second most of his career ( 10 in 2017).. had career highs in strikeouts (26), losses (4), runs (26), earned runs (25) and home runs (8) and matched his high in hit batters (2) and wild pitches (1).

WITH OAKLAND: Allowed a 319 opponents batting average but walked just 10 batters in 38.1 innings ( 2.35 walks per nine innings) for a .366 opponents on-base percentage...his opponents batting average broke down to .309 (29-for-94) with an .858 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .333 (23-for-69) with a . 953 OPS against left-handers...opponents hit . 333 with runners in scoring position...was $0-1$ with a 4.03 ERA and .720 opponents OPS in five starts at home, 1-3 with an 8.44 ERA and 1.115 OPS in four starts on the road....yielded seven of his eight home runs on the road.... was $1-1$ with a 3.38 ERA in four starts during the day, 0-3 with an 8.24 ERA in five starts at night...allowed a .533 batting average to the opponents number nine hitter and .438 average to the seven hitter...the A's were 3-1 in his no decisions and went 4-5 (.444) in his starting assignments...tossed fewer than six innings in all nine starts, including fewer than five innings four times.
WITH LAS VEGAS: His seven losses with the Aviators were his most as a minor leaguer and his .311 opponents batting average was a career high...surrendered just eight home runs in 88.2 innings, an average of 0.81 per nine innings ...his opponents batting average broke down to .300 (61-for-203) with an .824 OPS against lefthanded hitters and .323 ( 53 -for-164) with a .776 OPS against right-handers...yielded six of his eight home runs and issued 18 of his 27 walks to lefties...opponents hit .311 with the bases empty, . 311 with runners on...six of the eight home runs he allowed were solo shots...had a . 296 opponents average and allowed one home run the first time through the order, .307 with three home runs the second time and .337 with four home runs after that...went 2-3 with a 4.24 ERA, .287 opponents batting average and .737 OPS in nine starts at home, 2-4 with a 5.79 ERA, .333 opponent average and . 867 OPS on the road...tossed six innings or fewer in each of his 17 appearances...the Aviators were 5-11 (.313) in his starting assignments.
