OAKLAND ATHLETICS (19-30) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (22-23)

SUNDAY, MAY 29, 2022 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 1:07 PT RHP JAMES KAPRIELIAN (0-2, 4.50) VS. RHP DANE DUNNING (1-3, 4.32) NBCSCA — A'S CAST — A'S RADIO NETWORK (BLOOMBERG 960 AM) — EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM, KATD 990 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three straight, six of the last eight and 10 of the last 14 games to fall a season-high 11 games under .500 at 19-30...it is the first time the A's have been more than 10 games under .500 since finishing the 2017 season 12 under (75-87)...the A's .388 winning percentage is third lowest in the American League...have lost the first three games of this four-game series and are now 2-8-1 over the last 11 series...have been swept three times this year, all in three-game series...were swept in a four-game series twice last year, both in Oakland (April 1-4 vs. Houston, Sept. 20-23 vs. Seattle)...are in fifth place in the AL West and have spent 24 of the last 25 days with at least a share of last...have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, six days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 22 days in fifth...trail first place Houston by a season-high 11 games for the third consecutive day, which is the A's largest deficit in the West since Aug. 10, 2019 when they were also 11 back...have not been 12 back since June 16, 2019.

A's IN MAY: The A's are 9-19 (.321) in the month of the May, which marks the first time they have lost 19 games in a month since going 8-19 in September of 2015...have lost 20 or more games in a month 12 times in Oakland history, most recently in August of 2008 (10-20)...the record is 24 in June of 1979... are scheduled to play 31 games this month, which would be the A's most in any month since July of 1990 when they also had 31...have the second worst record in the majors in May (Marlins, 7-17/.292)...have a 4.48 ERA (123 er in 247.0 ip), which is fourth highest in the American League...are batting .211 (190-for-900), which is the lowest mark in the majors...the lowest single month batting average in Oakland history (min. 10 games) is .210 in April of 1979 and May of 2012...also have the lowest slugging percentage in the majors (.318) and the second lowest on-base percentage (.275) and OPS (.593)... have the second fewest home runs (15) and the fourth fewest runs scored (86)...have 21 stolen bases, which is tied for second most in the majors to the Rangers (23) and the most by an A's team in May since they had 22 in 2012.

PLAYER NOTES: Yesterday, Austin Pruitt became the 41st player to appear in a game for the A's this year, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...today, the A's added three players to the roster, including two who have yet to appear in a game for Oakalnd (Markel and Tapia)...Oakland employed 50 players all last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season...the A's have used 18 rookies and Markel would become the 19th...are currently tied for the sixth most rookies in a season in Oakland history and Markel would move that into a tie for third most...the two highest rookie toitals in a season in Oakland history are 21 in 2008 and 20 in 2017...Markel would be the 12th rookie pitcher, which would tie the Oakland record (2009, 12, 15 and 16)...eight of the rookies have made their Major League debut... currently have nine rookies on the roster, including six pitchers.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .253 (96-for-380) with 44 runs scored and 11 home runs over the last 11 games (4.0 runs per game) after hitting .181 with 57 runs and eight home runs over the previous 24 contests (2.4 runs per game)...overall, rank last in the majors in batting (.212) and on-base percentage (.276) and second to last in slugging percentage (.330) and OPS (.606)...have the fourth fewest runs scored (167) and the fifth most strikeouts (425)...are tied for the third most sacrifice hits (7).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have homered 10 times in the last six games after homering seven times over the previous 22 contests...have 33 home runs for the season, which is tied for third fewest in the majors...however, nine of the home runs have come with at least two runners on base, which is tied for second most in the majors...17 of the home runs have put the A's ahead, which is tied for the ninth most go-ahead home runs in the majors...have homered two times or fewer in each of the last 45 games and 48 of 49 this

ON THE BASES: The A's have stolen a base in a season-high five consecutive games (eight stolen bases total), which is the second longest streak by an A's team over the last 10 years...had a six-game streak last year from Aug. 18-23...are 33-for-39 (84.2%) in stolen base attempts for the season...have the second best stolen base percentage in the American League and rank third in steals...A's opponents are 16-for-25 (64.0%) in stolen base attempts, which is the third lowest success rate in the AL...the 16 stolen bases allowed are fourth fewest...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is tied for third most in the AL

PITCHING: The A's allowed 18 hits yesterday, which matched their most in a game over the last four years (Apri 21, 2021 vs. Minnesota)...however, it was the first time the A's allowed 18 or more hits in a game and lost since July 1, 2018 against Cleveland...have a .246 opponents batting average for the season, which is fifth highest in the American League...have the fourth highest on-base percentage (.316) and slugging percentage (.394) and the fifth highest OPS (.710)...have a 5.71 ERA (78 er in 123.0 ip) over the last 14 games after posting a 2.25 ERA over the previous 11 contests...have a 4.09 ERA for the season, which is fourth highest in the AL.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 1-8 with a 5.27 ERA (47 er in 80.1 ip) over the last 16 contests...are 12-22 with a 4.23 ERA for the season... the losses are the most in the American League and tied for third most in the majors...have the fifth highest ERA in the AL

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has compiled 6.98 ERA (31 er in 40.0 ip) over the last 10 games...has allowed 18-of-84 (21.4%) inherited runners to score, which is tied with the Tigers for the lowest percentage in the American League...the 84 inherited runners are fourth most...has the second lowest batting average against first batters faced in the AL (.201), the third lowest on-base percentage (.294) and the fourth lowest slugging percentage (.309)...has surrendered just 13 home runs, which is third fewest in the Al is 13-for-19 (68.4%) in save opportunities and is tied for fifth in saves...ranks fourth in holds (34)

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 30 errors, which is tied for second most in the American League (Orioles, 36)...however, have just 12 unearned runs, which is second fewest (Yankees, 8)...rank second in double

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-3 on this 10-game homestand against Texas (0-3), Houston (three games) and Boston (three games)...it is the first of two 10-game homestands (Aug. 19-28)...went 2-5 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-3) and Minnesota (1-2) and have lost 14 of the last 16 home games...are 6-17 (.261) at home for the season, which is the worst home record in the majors behind the Nationals (8-18, .308)...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Seattle (0-1) and are 13-13 (.458) on the road...have a 4.63 ERA (107 er in 208.0 ip) at home compared to 3.58 on the road...have the second highest home ERA in the American League...are hitting .201 (146-for-725) with 62 runs and 11 home runs in 23 games at home compared to .220 with 105 runs and 22 home runs in 26 games on the road...have the lowest home batting average in the majors, the fewest runs and are tied for the second fewest home runs.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are in a stretch that began on May 13 and runs through Wednesday in which they are scheduled to play 17 of 20 games against American League West competition...are 5-11 (.313) in intradivision play, which is the worst record in the AL and tied for second worst in the ma-...have played each AL West foe except the Astros, who they will face for the first time with a three-game set beginning tomorrow.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's are 1-5 against the Rangers this year...have lost the first three games of this series after losing two of three in Oakland from April 22-24 to open the season series...have not been sweept by the Rangers in a four-game series since July 7-10, 2011 and have not been swept in a four-game series in Oakland since Sept. 23-25 1977...won the season series last year, 10-9...went 5-4 in Oakland and 5-5 in Texas...it was the A's fifth consecutive season series win from Texas, which is the longest streak by the A's against the Rangers/Senators...are 55-37 (.598) against the Rangers over the last six years, including 31-15 (.674) in Oakland...are 396-390 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 209-185 in Oakland and 187-205 in Texas...are 9-8 at Globe Life Field...have an all-time record of 493-472 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Dany Jiménez is the sixth rookie in Oakland history with 10 or more saves (last: Ryan Cook, 14 in 2012)...leads American League rookies and ranks fourth among all AL pitchers with 10 saves...his saves are the most among AL closers without a blown save... A.J. Puk ranks fifth among AL relievers with a 0.95 ERA.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1909 Frank Baker hits the first home run at Shibe Park...in 1990 Rickey Henderson breaks Ty Cobb's American League stolen base record with his 893rd career steal...in 2000 Randy Velarde turns the 10th regular season unassisted triple play in major league history but the A's lose at New York, 4-1.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: James Kaprielian (0-2, 5.48 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the injured list May 1 and is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...allowed five runs in 5.0 innings in his last start after yielding five runs in 16.0 innings over his previous three starts... has allowed four hits or fewer in four of his five starts...began the season on the 10-day IL with an inflamed right AC joint...did not pitch during the spring...this is his third season in the majors, all with the A's.

THIS AND THAT: Has a .125 (5-for-40) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .319 (15-for-47) with all four of his home runs allowed after that...had a .189 batting average the first time through the order last year, .261 with 15 of his 19 home runs after that...has a 0.90 ERA (1 er in 10.0 ip) over the first two innings, a 9.00 ERA (13 er in 13.0 ip) from the third inning on...last year, he had a 1.93 ERA over the first two innings, a 5.24 ERA from the third inning on...opponents are 4-for-24 (.167) with runners in scoring position...three of the four home runs he has allowed have been solo shots

REHAB ASSIGNMENT: Went 1-1 with a 7.24 ERA (13.2 ip, 15 h, 11 r, 11 er, 5 bb, 13 so, 3 hr) on a three-start rehab assignment...had 52 pitches in his first start, 78 in his second and 84 in his third...made one start for Low-A Stockton on April 15 against Modesto and picked up the win in a 14-10 decision (5.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 6 so, 2 hr)...his final two starts came with Triple-A Las Vegas... had a no decision in a 12-5 win against El Paso on April 20 (4.2 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 1 hr) and then took the loss in a 12-5 decision on April 26 against Tacoma (4.0 ip, 3 h, 5 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 2 so).

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss to Cleveland on May 1 in Oakland...tossed 2.0 innings, which was the shortest start of his career... walked a career-high tying four batters...allowed a RBI double to Maile in the second and then walked the bases loaded to start the third inning...was relieved by Lemoine, who allowed all three runners to score.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 1-0 loss at Minnesota on May 7...blanked the Twins on two hits and two walks over the first five innings and retired the first two batters he faced in the sixth...then allowed a home run to Polanco for the only run of the game...was relieved by Jackson following the homer and finished with 5.2 innings...Gray and three relievers combined to shut out the A's on three hits.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-3 win at Detroit on May 12... Oakland scored three times in the first and he blanked the Tigers on a hit and a walk over the first four innings...then allowed two runs in the fifth inning on a Barnhart RBI double and a Grossman RBI ground out...was relieved by Acevedo to start the sixth inning with the A's leading 3-2 but Acevedo allowed a run for the blown save.

FOURTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-2 win over Minnesota on May 17 in Oakland...blanked the Twins on two hits and a walk over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Lewis in the fifth...surrendered a one-out home run to Sanchez in the sixth and was relieved by Moll following the home run with the scored tied 2-2.

LAST START: He had his third consecutive no decision in an A's victory, a 7-5 win at Seattle on Tuesday...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a two-run double to France in the third inning...had a 4-2 lead when he yielded three runs in the fifth inning on a France ground out and a Rodriguez two-run home run... Oakland tied the game with a run in the sixth and he was relieved by Moll to start the bottom of the sixth.

lead in all three of his no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save... the first no decision came in the A's 5-3 loss at Texas on June 23...allowing a RBI double to Heim in the fifth and a solo home run to Garcia in the sixth... left with a 3-2 lead but the bullpen blew the blown save...then took the loss in a 5-4 A's loss in Oakland on June 29...allowed a two-out solo home run to Gallo in the fourth and two runs more in the sixth...had a no decision in the

2021 RECAP: Was the Opening Day starter for Triple-A Las Vegas on May 6 but that would be his only start with the Aviators...was recalled by Oakland on May 12 and spent the remainder of the season with the A's, going 8-5 with a 4.07 ERA and .233 opponents batting average in 24 games, including 21 starts, in his rookie campaign...tied for fifth among American League rookies in wins, tied for sixth in innings pitched (119.1), ranked seventh in strikeouts (123) and eighth in games started...based on a minimum of 0.5 innings per team game, he ranked fifth in opponents batting average, sixth in ERA, seventh in on-base percentage (.302), ninth in OPS (.732) and 10th in slugging (.430)...his 123 strikeouts were eighth most in Oakland history by a rookie and were the most since Sean Manaea had 124 in 2016...his 21 starts were the most since Jharel Cotton had 24 in 2017...went 5-3 with a 2.65 ERA, .202 opponents batting average and .657 OPS over his first 12 starts through July 20...then posted a 3-2 record with a 5.96 ERA, .271 opponents average and .825 OPS over his final 12 games (nine starts) beginning on July 27.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average broke down to .201 (46-for-229) with a .602 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .266 (59-for-222) with a .860 OPS against left-handers...issued 31 of his 41 walks to lefties...had the third lowest batting average and OPS against right-handers in the AL among pitchers with 100 or more innings pitched...opponents were 1-for-15 (.067) with two walks with the bases loaded...had a .189 opponents batting average and .569 OPS the first time through the order, .285 with a .907 OPS the second time and .221 with a .710 OPS after that...yielded 10 of his 19 home runs the second time through the order...allowed a .083 average against the opponent's number five hitter...surrendered six of his 19 home runs to the clean-up hitter...opponents hit .107 when putting his curveball in play, which was fifth lowest in the AL among pitchers with 150 or more curveballs.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Began the season with 21 starts and was 8-5 with a 3.80 ERA and .720 OPS before being moved to the bullpen following his start on Sept. 18...had no decisions, a 7.88 ERA and .890 OPS in three relief appearances...tossed at least 2.0 innings in each of his three relief appearances...first batters faced were 0-for-2 with a hit by pitch and he did not inherit any runners.

THIS AND THAT: Had a 1.93 ERA over the first two innings, a 5.24 ERA from the third inning on...was 5-3 with a 3.28 ERA in 11 games at home, 3-2 with a 4.82 ERA in 13 games on the road...had a 4-3 record and a 3.16 ERA in 10 day games, a 4-2 record and a 4.76 ERA in 14 night games...allowed 15 of his 19 home runs at night...was 1-2 with a 5.68 ERA in three interleague starts... logged a 7-3 record and a 3.86 ERA in 21 games against AL competition...left with the lead and was the pitcher of record in four of his eight no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save...the A's were 11-10 (.524) in his starting assignments...allowed two runs or fewer in 13 of his 21 starts and five hits or fewer 16 times.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Paul Blackburn (5-0, 1.70 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season...has allowed nine runs over his first nine starts and has a 1.70 ERA, which is fourth lowest in the American League among pitchers with 40 or more innings...has won each of his first five decisions for a career-high five-game winning streak (previous: 3, July 31, 2017-June 7, 2018)...that is tied for the second longest winning streak in the AL this year...is the first A's starting pitcher on an Opening Day roster to start the season 5-0 since Trevor Cahill won his first six decisions in 2011...has allowed just one home run over his first nine starts (47.2 ip)...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 4-2 A's win at Seattle last Wednesday (5.1 ip, 1 h, 5 bb, 2 so)...is 0-2 with a 13.50 ERA (13.1 ip, 26 h, 21 r, 20 er, 5 bb, 3 so, 5 hr) in four career appearances, including three starts, against Houston...was 0-1 with a 9.00 ERA (7.0 ip, 10 h, 7 r, 7 er, 2 bb, 3 so, 3 hr) in two starts last year.
