OAKLAND ATHLETICS (20-32) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (32-18)

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 1, 2022 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 12:37 PT LHP COLE IRVIN (2-2, 3.15) VS. RHP JUSTIN VERLANDER (6-2, 2.03) NBCSCA — A'S CAST — A'S RADIO NETWORK (BLOOMBERG 960 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost five of the last six games, eight of the last 11 and 12 of the last 17 to fall 12 games under .500 for the first time since finishing the 2017 season 12 under (75-87)...are 20-32 (.385), which is the second worst record in the American League ahead of the Royals (16-32, .333)...have lost the first two games of this series and are now 2-9-1 over the last 12 series...are in fifth place in the AL West and have spent 27 of the last 28 days with at least a share of last...have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, six days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 25 days in fifth...trail first place Houston by 13 games, which is the A's largest deficit in the West since finishing the 2017 season 26 games out of first place.

A's IN MAY: The A's finished May with a 10-21 (.323) record, which was second worst in the American League to the Royals (9-20, .310) and fifth worst in Oakland history in the month of May...the 21 losses tied for third most in any month in Oakland history and were the most since the A's went 9-21 in May of 1997...played 31 games in May, which were the A's most in any month since July of 1990 when they also had 31...A's pitchers set an Oakland record for strikeouts in May with 234 (previous: 232 in 2021)...tied for fourth in the AL in strikeouts in May but had the third highest ERA (4.47)...the A's slugged .316 with a .598 OPS, both of which were the lowest May marks in Oakland history (.326 slugging in 1978, .622 OPS in 1968)...it was the first time they finished with an OPS under .600 in any month of 10 or more games since April of 1979 (.581) and it was the A's lowest May OPS since 1917 (.544)...the last time an American League team posted an OPS under .600 in May was in 1972 (Texas, .562; Cleveland, .577)...had a .281 on-base percentage, which was second lowest in Oakland history in May (.277 in 2018), and a .214 batting average, which was third lowest (.210 in 2012, .211 in 2018)...stole 22 bases, which was the most by the A's in May since 2012 (22)...ranked last in the majors in batting, slugging and OPS last month, tied for the fewest home runs (15), had the third lowest on-base percentage and the third fewest runs scored (94)...had the third most steals.

OFFENSE: The A's have scored one run in each of the first two games of this series and have 19 games with one run or fewer this year, which is four more than any other team...have 175 runs scored for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...are batting .249 (120-for-482) with 52 runs scored and 11 home runs over the last 14 games (3.7 runs per game) after hitting .181 with 57 runs and eight home runs over the previous 24 contests (2.4 runs per game)...for the season, the A's rank last in the majors in batting (.213), on-base percentage (.280) and OPS (.608) and second to last in slugging percentage (.328).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have gone homerless in three straight games and have just 33 home runs for the season, which is third fewest in the majors... however, nine of the home runs have come with at least two runners on base, which is tied for fourth most in the majors...have homered two times or fewer in each of the last 48 games and 51 of 52 this year.

ON THE BASES: The A's have nine stolen bases in the last eight games and are 34-for-40 (85.0%) in stolen base attempts for the season...have the second best stolen base percentage in the American League and are tied for second in steals...the 34 steals are the A's most by the end of May since 2012 (41)...A's opponents are 18-for-27 (66.7%) in stolen base attempts, which is the third lowest success rate in the AL...the 18 stolen bases allowed are fourth fewest...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is tied for third most.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.46 ERA (91 er in 150.0 ip) over the last 17 games after posting a 2.25 ERA over the previous 11 contests...have a 4.10 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the American League...have the fourth highest opponents slugging percentage (.394) and fifth highest batting average (.243), on-base percentage (.314) and OPS (.708)...have issued the fourth most walks (162)...have allowed nine home runs in the last four games and 52 for the season, which is fifth most.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 1-10 with a 5.22 ERA (57 er in 98.1 ip) over the last 20 games and are 12-24 with a 4.28 ERA for the season... the losses are the most in the American League and the ERA is third highest... have the third most innings pitched (269.0).

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has compiled 6.24 ERA (34 er in 49.0 ip) over the last 13 games...has allowed 18-of-92 (19.6%) inherited runners to score, which is the lowest percentage in the majors...the 92 inherited runners are fifth most...has the lowest batting average (.191) and slugging percentage (.293) against first batters faced in the American League and the third lowest on-base percentage (.293)...has surrendered just 14 home runs, which is tied for third fewest in the AL...is 13-for-20 (65.0%) in save opportunities...is tied for fourth in holds (34).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed five errors in the last four games and now have 34 for the season, which is third most in the American League...however, have just 12 unearned runs, which is second fewest (Yankees, 8)...rank second in double plays (50).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-5 on this 10-game homestand against Texas (1-3), Houston (0-2) and Boston (three games)...it is the first of two 10-game homestands (Aug. 19-28)...went 2-5 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-3) and Minnesota (1-2) and have lost 16 of the last 19 home games...are 7-19 (.269) at home for the season, which is the worst home record in the majors behind the Cubs (8-17, .320)...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Seattle (0-1) and are 13-13 (.500) on the road...have a 4.60 ERA (120 er in 235.0 ip) at home compared to 3.58 on the road...have the second highest home ERA in the American League...are hitting .206 (170-for-827) with 70 runs and 11 home runs in 26 games at home compared to .220 with 105 runs and 22 home runs in 26 games on the road... have the lowest home batting average in the majors, are tied for the fewest home runs and have the second fewest runs.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost 3-1 yesterday to fall to 13-15 (.464) in games decided by two runs or fewer...the 28 games are second most in the American League and the losses are tied for second most (Orioles, 14-16)...are 4-8 (.333) in one-run games...the losses are tied for the most in the AL, the winning percentage is tied for second lowest and the 12 games are tied for fourth fewest...have six come-from-behind wins, which is tied for second fewest...have two walk-off wins, which is tied for fourth most.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's conclude a 20-game stretch today that began on May 13 in which they played 17 games against American League West competition...are 6-13 (.316) in intradivision play, which is the worst record in the AL and fourth worst in the majors.

PLAYER NOTES: The A's have used 43 players, which is tied for third most in the American League (Angels and Twins, 44)...Oakland employed 50 players last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season...the total includes 19 rookies, which is tied for third most in Oakland history...only the 2008 (21) and 2017 (20) clubs have used more rookies...12 of the rookies have been pitchers, which ties the Oakland record (2009, 12, 15 and 16)...eight of the rookies have made their Major League debut...currently have nine rookies on the roster, including six pitchers.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 17 times this year, which includes eight Covid-19 IL placements...currently have six players on the IL (Bolt, Guerra, Honeywell, Jefferies, Piscotty, Vogt)...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's have lost the first two meetings of 2022...lost the season series last year for the sixth time in the last seven years as they went 8-11 against Houston...were 4-6 in Oakland and 4-5 in Houston...are now 52-74 (.413) against Houston over the last eight years after winning each of their first four season series against the Astros (31-13)...are 83-87 all-time, including 46-43 in Oakland and 37-44 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Elvis Andrus doubled in the second inning last night for his 1,900th career hit...based on his current pace this year, he would finish the season with 1,979 career hits...*Dany Jiménez* is the sixth rookie in Oakland history with 10 or more saves (last: Ryan Cook, 14 in 2012)...leads American League rookies and ranks fourth among all AL pitchers with 10 saves...*Sam Moll* ranks sixth among AL relievers with a 1.04 ERA.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1932** Max Bishop hits a two-run home run in the bottom of the 16th inning in the first game of a doubleheader against New York after the Yankees score once in top of the inning...Lefty Grove pitches eight innings of relief in the A's 8-7 win...in **2006** Barry Zito strikes out Lew Ford in the sixth inning to become the fourth pitcher in Oakland history and the eighth in Athletics history with 1000 career strikeouts...in **2021**, the A's score 10 times in the final three innings to defeat to Seattle 12-6...it is Bob Melvin's 799th win as manager of the A's, which breaks Tony La Russa's Oakland record of 798.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (2-2, 3.15 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 15-day injured list May 22 and is 0-1 with a 3.65 ERA (5 er in 12.1 ip) in two starts since his return...was 2-1 with a 2.93 ERA in five starts when he was placed on the IL May 6 retroactive to May 2 with left shoulder tendinitis...made one rehab start with Low-A Stockton on May 17 against Modesto and was the winning pitcher in the Ports 4-3 win (5.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 6 so, 1 hr).

DON'T WALK: Has walked nine batters in 40.0 innings over his first seven starts, an average of 2.02 per nine innings...walked just 42 batters in 178.1 innings last year and his average of 2.12 walks per nine innings was eighth lowest in the American League...has walked two batters or fewer in each of his seven starts this year and 38 of his 42 career starts...has walked just 65 batters in 263.2 career innings (2.22 per nine innings).

FOUR: Has struck out four batters in each of his last five starts, which matches the longest streak of consecutive starts with exactly four strikeouts in Athletics history (Brandon McCarthy, April 11-May 2, 2012)...has exactly four strikeouts in six of his seven starts this year and has 26 strikeouts in 40.0 innings, an average of 5.85 per nine innings...last year, he fanned just 125 batters and his average of 6.31 strikeouts per nine innings was third lowest in the AL and the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-0 with a 1.61 ERA (4 er in 22.1 ip) in four starts at home compared to 1-2 with a 5.09 ERA (10 er in 17.2 ip) and all five of his home runs in three starts on the road.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 1-1 with a 2.60 ERA (5 er in 17.1 ip) in three starts against American League West teams...last year, he went 4-12 with a 5.29 ERA in 19 starts against AL West competition, 6-3 with a 2.88 ERA in 13 starts against everyone else...his 12 intradivision losses matched the most in the majors over the last 34 years (last: Porcello, BOS in 2017) and set an Athletics record, topping the previous mark of 11 by Brian Kingman (1980) and Rick Langford (1977 and 1979)...his 5.29 intradivision ERA was fourth highest in the majors last year...went 0-5 with an 8.69 ERA in five starts against Seattle and 0-3 with a 7.40 ERA in four starts against Houston.

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed six runs in the first inning for a 6.43 ERA (5 er in 7.0 ip)...has a 1.29 ERA (4 er in 28.0 ip) over innings two through five and a 9.00 ERA (5 er in 5.0 ip) from the sixth inning on...has made five of his seven starts this year in day games...last year he made 17 of his 32 starts during the day, which tied for the most in the majors...has a .209 (9-for-43) opponents batting average against left-handed hitters, .273 (30-for-110) against right-handers...the opponents number three hitter in the order is 3-for-19 (.158).

2022 HIGHLIGHTS: Faced his former team in his first start on April 9 at Philadelphia and was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss...yielded a career-high tying three home runs and had season highs in runs (4) and strikeouts (4)... then went 2-0 with a 2.01 ERA over his next four starts ... tossed a seasonhigh 6.1 innings for the win in his second start on April 14 at Tampa Bay, a 6-3 A's win...retired 14 consecutive batters at one point...allowed one run or fewer in three consecutive starts from April 19-30...walked a season-high two batters in four consecutive starts from April 19-May 22...combined with Jackson, Snead and Jiménez on a four-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Texas April 24 in Oakland...tossed five of the innings and allowed just one hit while walking two...the blanked Cleveland over the first three innings on April 30 to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 12 innings...was 2-1 with a 2.93 ERA in five starts when he was placed on the 15-day injured list May 6 retroactive to May 2 with left shoulder tendinitis...made one rehab start with Low-A Stockton on May 17 against Modesto and was the winning pitcher in the Ports 4-3 win (5.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 6 so, 1 hr)...was reinstated on May 22 and started and lost that day at Los Angeles (AL)...allowed a seasonhigh eight hits.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 8-5 loss to Texas last Friday in Oakland...struck out a season-high tying four batters for the fifth consecutive start...allowed a two-run single to Heim in the first inning but the A's came back with five runs in the third inning...retired 10 straight following the Heim single and blanked the Rangers on two hits over innings two through six...allowed a one-out single to Calhoun in the seventh and was relieved by Grimm with the A's leading 5-2...Grimm allowed the inherited runner to score plus one of his own and the pen allowed another run in the eighth for the blown save.

run in the bottom of the first...then allowed a RBI single to Altuve in the second...was relieved by Trivino with runners on first and second and one out in the fifth and Trivino allowed a three-run home run...then lost his next start on April 8 at Houston, 6-2...allowed a leadoff home run to Correa in the second, a RBI double to Correa in the fourth and a solo home run to Alvarez in the sixth...walked the next batter (Correa) and was relieved by Wendelken with a runner on first and one out in the sixth with the A's trailing 3-0...Wendelken allowed Correa to score plus a run of his own...lost for a third time in an 8-4 decision in Oakland on May 20...allowed three runs in the third inning on a Maldonado RBI double and back-to-back RBI singles by Brantley and Bregman, and two more runs in the fourth on a two-run home run by Maldonado...had a no decision in the final game of the 2021 season, a 7-6 loss at Houston...storedeerd solo home runs to McCormick in the second and Meyers in the third...took a 3-2 lead into the bottom of the sixth and allowed a two-run home run to Tucker...was relieved by Romo to start the seventh.

2021 RECAP: Was acquired by the A's from Philadelphia for cash considerations on Jan. 30. 2021 and went 10-15 with a 4.24 ERA in 32 starts...his 15 losses were the most in the American League, tied for third most in the majors and matched the most by an A's pitcher over the last 13 years (Jesse Chavez, 2015)...is the first Athletic to lead the league in losses since Tom Candiotti in 1998 ... tied for the AL lead in games started and ranked 10th in innings pitched (178.1)...had a .281 opponents batting average and his 195 hits allowed were the most in the AL and second most in the majors... his 94 runs were fifth most in the AL and his nine hit batters tied for 10th most...averaged 15.0 pitches per inning, which was the fewest in the AL and fourth fewest in the majors...struck out just 125 batters and his average of 6.31 strikeouts per nine innings was third lowest in the AL and the majors... allowed 23 home runs and ranked seventh in the AL in fewest home runs per nine innings (1.16)...his opponents batting average broke down to .270 (143-for-530) with a .739 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .289 (52-for-180) with a .767 OPS against left-handers...surrendered 18 of his 23 home runs to righties...17 of the home runs were solo shots...allowed a .324 average with runners in scoring position, which was the highest in the majors and fifth highest in Oakland history...was 1-10 with a 6.60 ERA and .890 OPS in 12 starts on four days rest compared to 9-4 with a 2.84 ERA and .657 OPS in 19 starts on five days rest or more...led the majors in losses and highest ERA on four days rest and had the second highest OPS...tied for third in the AL in wins on five days rest or more, ranked fourth in ERA and sixth in OPS...opponents hit .440 with a 1.462 OPS when putting his curveball in play...the OPS was the highest in the majors among pitchers with 75 or more curveballs in play...had 20 assists, which tied for sixth most among AL pitchers...left with the lead only to have the pen blow the save in five of his starts...went 10-3 in 18 starts with more than two runs of support, 0-12 in 14 starts with support of two runs or fewer.

RHP James Kaprielian (0-2, 5.93 ERA): Was reinstated from the injured list May 1 and is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season...has allowed nine runs in 9.1 innings over his last two starts (8.68 ERA) after allowing nine runs in 18.0 innings over his first four starts (4.50 ERA)...began the season on the 10-day IL with an inflamed right AC joint...did not pitch during the spring...the A's have won each of his four no decisions and are 4-2 (.667) in his starting assignments...has a .143 opponents batting average the first time through the order, .333 with four of his six home runs allowed after that...has a 1.50 ERA over the first two innings, a 9.39 ERA from the third inning on...had a no decision in his last start, a 6-5 A's win over Texas on Sunday here in Oakland (4.1 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 so)...is 1-1 with a 1.50 ERA (12.0 ip, 9 h, 2 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 16 so, 0 hr) in two career appearances against Boston, both starts last year.

- Has a 1.29 ERA (2 er in 14.0 ip), .146 (7-for-48) opponents batting average and has stranded six of his seven inherited runners in 13 games in May... had a 5.59 ERA, .316 opponents average and allowed 4-of-6 inherited runners to score in 10 games in April.
- Is tied for third in MLB in games pitched (23) and is 7th among AL relievers in innings pitched (23.2).
- Opponents are 4-for-25 (.160) with runners in scoring position.

- Has allowed earned runs in his last three outings after 8 previous appearances of not allowing an earned run.
- Became the first pitcher in Oakland history to face 4 batter and walk them all last night.
- Is tied for third in the majors in games (22)...is tied for fifth among AL relievers in strikeouts (29) and is tied for the most walks (17).
- Is holding opposing hitters to a .143 batting average with two strikes (6for-42).
