# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (20-33) VS. BOSTON RED SOX (24-27)

FRIDAY, JUNE 3, 2022 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:40 PT RHP JAMES KAPRIELIAN (0-2, 5.93) VS. RHP NATHAN EOVALDI (2-2, 3.77) NBCSCA — A'S CAST — A'S RADIO NETWORK (BLOOMBERG 960 AM) — EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM, KATD 990 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Were swept in a three-game series by Houston to start the week and have now lost six of the last seven games and 13 of the last 18...are a season-high 13 games under .500 at 20-33 (.377)...that is the second lowest winning percentage in the American League ahead of the Royals (16-32, .333) and it marks the first time the A's have been 13 games under .500 since Sept. 30, 2017 when they were 74-87...have not been 14 games under since they were 69-83 on Sept. 20, 2017...are 2-9-1 over the previous 12 series... are in fifth place in the AL West and have spent 29 of the last 30 days with at least a share of last...have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, six days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 27 days in fifth...trail first place Houston by a season-high 14 games for the second consecutive day, which is the A's largest deficit in the West since finishing the 2017 season 26 games out of first place.

THE ONE-THIRD MARK: The A's are scheduled to play their 54th game today, which is the one-third mark of the season...are on pace to go 61-101, which would be the second 100-loss season in Oakland history...the Oakland single-season record for losses is 108 in 1979...are batting .212 with a .278 onbase percentage, .328 slugging percentage and .606 OPS...all four marks are currently the lowest in Oakland history (.225 batting average in 2020, .302 on-base percentage in 1979, .343 slugging percentage in 1968, .647 OPS in 1968)...are on pace to score 547 runs, which would be second fewest in a full season in Oakland history (532 in 1978), and hit 104 home runs, which would be third fewest (94 in 1968, 100 in 1978)...individually, the A's are on pace to challenge some of the lowest team-leading totals by a player in a full season in Oakland history...Elvis Andrus and Tony Kemp lead the A's with 39 hits (pace: 119...low is 136 by Dave Revering in 1979)...Seth Brown, Sean Murphy and Chad Pinder top the club with five home runs (pace: 15...low is 16 by Kevin Kouzmanoff in 2010)...Brown has 23 RBI (pace: 70...low is 70 by Mitchell Page in 1978)...Kemp and Murphy lead the club with 17 walks (pace: 52...low is 51 by Marcus Semien in 2016)...Frankie Montas leads the A's with 71 strikeouts and is on pace for 217, which would surpass his total of 207 last year for second most in Oakland history (Blue, 301 in 1971).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .242 (124-for-512) with 56 runs scored and 12 home runs over the last 15 games (3.7 runs per game) after hitting .181 with 57 runs and eight home runs over the previous 24 contests (2.4 runs per game)...for the season, the A's rank last in the majors in batting (.212), on-base percentage (.278) and OPS (.606) and second to last in slugging percentage (.327)...have the fourth fewest runs scored (179).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit one home run in the last four games and have 34 home runs for the season, which is third fewest in the majors...however, nine of the home runs have come with at least two runners on base, which is tied for fifth most in the majors...have homered two times or fewer in each of the last 49 games and 52 of 53 this year.

ON THE BASES: The A's have nine stolen bases in the last nine games and are 34-for-40 (85.0%) in stolen base attempts for the season...have the second best stolen base percentage in the American League and rank third in steals...A's opponents are 18-for-28 (64.3%) in stolen base attempts, which is the third lowest success rate in the AL...the 18 stolen bases allowed are fourth fewest...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is tied for third most.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.43 ERA (96 er in 159.0 ip) over the last 18 games after posting a 2.25 ERA over the previous 11 contests...have a 4.12 ERA for the season, which is fourth highest in the American League...have the fourth highest opponents on-base percentage (.316) and fifth highest batting average (.244), slugging percentage (.394) and OPS (.709)...have issued the fourth most walks (167).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 1-10 with a 5.02 ERA (58 er in 104.0 ip) over the last 21 games and are 12-24 with a 4.23 ERA for the season...the losses are the most in the American League and the ERA is third highest...have the fourth most innings pitched (274.2).

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen is 1-3 with no saves, three blown saves and an 8.37 ERA (22 er in 23.2 ip) in seven games on the homestand...has a 6.54 ERA (38 er in 52.1 ip) over the last 14 games and a 3.96 ERA for the season, which is fifth highest in the American League...has allowed 21-of-99 (21.2%) inherited runners to score, which is the second lowest percentage in the AL... the 99 inherited runners are third most...has the lowest slugging percentage  $\,$ (.298) against first batters faced in the AL, the second lowest batting average (.193) and the third lowest on-base percentage (.292)...has surrendered just 14 home runs, which is tied for third fewest in the AL...is 13-for-21 (61.9%) in save opportunities...is tied for fourth in holds (35).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed five errors in the last five games and have 34 for the season, which is third most in the American League... however, have just 12 unearned runs, which is second fewest (Yankees, 8)... rank second in double plays (51).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-6 on this 10-game homestand against Texas (1-3), Houston (0-3) and Boston (three games)...it is the first of two 10-game homestands (Aug. 19-28)...went 2-5 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-3) and Minnesota (1-2) and have lost 17 of the last 20 home games...are 7-20 (.259) at home for the season, which is the worst home record in the majors behind the Nationals (9-18, .333)...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Seattle (0-1) and are 13-13 (.500) on the road...leave following the game Sunday for a nine-game road trip to Atlanta (two games), Cleveland (four games) and Boston (three games)...beginning with that trip, the A's are scheduled to play 19 of their next 25 games on the road...have a 4.61 ERA (120 er in 244.0 ip) at home compared to 3.58 on the road...have the second highest home ERA in the American League... are hitting .203 (174-for-857) with 74 runs and 12 home runs in 27 games at home compared to .220 with 105 runs and 22 home runs in 26 games on the road...have the lowest home batting average in the majors, the second fewest home runs and the fourth fewest runs.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's fell to 4-9 (.308) in one-run games with a 5-4 loss on Wednesday...the losses are the most in the American League and the winning percentage is second lowest (Rangers, 2-8/.200)...are 13-16 (.448) in games decided by two runs or fewer...the 16 losses and 29 games are second most to the Orioles (17 losses, 31 games)...have six come-from-behind wins, which is tied for second fewest...have two walk-off wins, which is tied for fourth most.

A's IN MAY: The A's finished May with a 10-21 (.323) record, which was second worst in the American League to the Royals (9-20, .310) and fifth worst in Oakland history in the month of May...the 21 losses tied for third most in any month in Oakland history and were the most since the A's went 9-21 in May of 1997...played 31 games in May, which were the A's most in any month since July of 1990 when they also had 31...A's pitchers set an Oakland record for strikeouts in May with 234 (previous: 232 in 2021)...tied for fourth in the AL in strikeouts in May but had the third highest ERA (4.47)...the A's slugged .316 with a .598 OPS, both of which were the lowest May marks in Oakland history (.326 slugging in 1978, .622 OPS in 1968)...it was the first time they finished with an OPS under .600 in any month of 10 or more games since April of 1979 (.581) and it was the A's lowest May OPS since 1917 (.544)...the last time an American League team posted an OPS under .600 in May was in 1972 (Texas, .562; Cleveland, .577)...had a .281 on-base percentage, which was second lowest in Oakland history in May (.277 in 2018), and a .214 batting average, which was third lowest (.210 in 2012, .211 in 2018)...stole 22 bases, which was the most by the A's in May since 2012 (22)...ranked last in the majors in batting, slugging and OPS last month, tied for the fewest home  $\,$ runs (15), had the third lowest on-base percentage and the third fewest runs scored (94)...had the third most steals.

A's vs. RED SOX: The A's and Red Sox split the season series last year, 3-3...the A's lost two of three in Oakland and won two of three in Boston...are 14-12 against the Red Sox dating back to 2017 but are 16-22 dating back to 2015... are 250-303 against Boston since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 151-125 in Oakland, 98-177 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 892-1084 against the Red Sox.

## TODAY'S TIDBITS

Dany Jiménez is the sixth rookie in Oakland history with 10 or more saves (last: Ryan Cook, 14 in 2012)...leads American League rookies and is tied for fourth among all AL pitchers with 10 saves...*A.J. Puk* ranks 10th among AL relievers with a 1.29 ERA.

#### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1929 Lefty Grove tosses a complete game four-hitter in the A's 3-2, 13-inning win over Detroit...Max Bishop walks with the bases loaded in the bottom of the 13th to force in the winning run...in **1980**, the A's trail 4-1 entering the ninth inning at Cleveland when Dave Revering, Mitchell Page and Tony Armas hit consecutive home runs to send the game into extra innings...the A's would go on to lose 6-4 in 10 innings...in 2004 the A's tie an Oakland record by playing their third straight extra inning game, a 2-1 win against Toronto in 11 innings...in 2017 Ryon Healy ties an Athletics record with four extra base hits after going 4-for-4 with two doubles and two home runs against Washington.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: James Kaprielian (0-2, 5.93 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the injured list May 1 and is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season...has allowed nine runs in 9.1 innings over his last two starts (8.68 ERA) after allowing nine runs in 18.0 innings over his first four starts (4.50 ERA)...began the season on the 10-day IL with an inflamed right AC joint...did not pitch during the spring...this is his third season in the majors, all with the A's.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have won each of his four no decisions and are 4-2 (.667) in his starting assignments...has a .143 (7-for-49) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .333 (19-for-57) with four of his six home runs allowed after that...had a .189 batting average the first time through the order last year, .261 with 15 of his 19 home runs after that...has a 1.50 ERA (2 er in 12.0 ip) over the first two innings, a 9.39 ERA (16 er in 15.1 ip) from the third inning on...last year, he had a 1.93 ERA over the first two innings, a 5.24 ERA from the third inning on...five of the six home runs he has allowed have been solo shots.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Did not pitch during the spring and began the season on the 10-day injured list with an inflamed right AC joint...was sent to Low-A Stockton on April 15 to begin a rehab assignment and picked up the win in a 14-10 Ports win that day against Modesto (5.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 6 so, 2 hr)...was moved up to Triple-A Las Vegas and had a no decision in a 12-5 win against El Paso on April 20 (4.2 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 1 hr)...then took the loss in a 12-5 decision on April 26 against Tacoma (4.0 ip, 3 h, 5 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 2 so)... was 1-1 with a 7.24 ERA (13.2 ip, 15 h, 11 r, 11 er, 5 bb, 13 so, 3 hr) in three starts overall when he reinstated from the IL on May 1...took the loss in each of his first two starts...logged 2.0 innings and walked a career-high tying four batters in his first start, a 7-3 loss to Cleveland on May 1 in Oakland...it was the shortest start of his career...then lost a 1-0 decison at Minnesota on May 7, allowing a Polanco home run in the sixth for the only run of the game... tossed a season-high 5.1 innings and struck out a season-high seven batters while logging a season-high 99 pitches...Gray and three relievers combined to shut out the A's on three hits...left his start on May 12 at Detroit with a 3-2 lead but the bullpen blew the save in a game the A's would come back to win 5-3...allowed a season-high five runs on a season-high seven hits in 5.0 innings on May 24 at Seattle but had a no decision in the As 7-5 win.

LAST START: He had his fourth consecutive no decision in an A's victory, a 6-5 win over Texas on Sunday in Oakland...surrendered solo home runs to Seager in the first and Miller in the third...then allowed a two-run single to Miller in the fifth and was relieved by Selman with one out in the fifth inning, runners on first and third and the A's trailing 4-0...Selman escaped the jam and the A's scored three times in the fifth and twice in the eighth to get him off the hook.

KAPRIELIAN vs. BOSTON: Is 1-1 with a 1.50 ERA (12.0 ip, 9 h, 2 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 16 so, 0 hr) in two career appearances, both starts last year...the win was the first of his career on May 12 in the A's 4-1 victory at Boston...allowed a Gon-

zalez double, a Verdugo walk and a Martinez RBI singe to the first three batters he faced...that would be the only run he would allow in five innings of work as he blanked the Red Sox on two hits and a walk over his final four innings...then took the loss in a 1-0 decison in Oakland on July 4...struck out a career-high 10 batters in a career-high tying 7.0 innings...blanked the Red Sox on two hits and a walk over the first five innings before putting runners on first and third to start the sixth inning...got Devers to ground into a double play, but that allowed the only run of the game to score...Pivetta, Whitlock and Barnes shut out the A's on four hits.

but that would be his only start with the Aviators...was recalled by Oakland on May 12 and spent the remainder of the season with the A's, going 8-5 with a 4.07 ERA and .233 opponents batting average in 24 games, including 21 starts, in his rookie campaign...tied for fifth among American League rookies in wins, tied for sixth in innings pitched (119.1), ranked seventh in strikeouts (123) and eighth in games started...based on a minimum of 0.5 innings per team game, he ranked fifth in opponents batting average, sixth in ERA, seventh in on-base percentage (.302), ninth in OPS (.732) and 10th in slugging (.430)...his 123 strikeouts were eighth most in Oakland history by a rookie and were the most since Sean Manaea had 124 in 2016...his 21 starts were the most since Jharel Cotton had 24 in 2017...went 5-3 with a 2.65 ERA, .202 opponents batting average and .657 OPS over his first 12 starts through July 20...then posted a 3-2 record with a 5.96 ERA, .271 opponents average and .825 OPS over his final 12 games (nine starts) beginning on July 27.

2021 RECAP: Was the Opening Day starter for Triple-A Las Vegas on May 6

*OPPONENTS BATTING:* His opponents batting average broke down to .201 (46-for-229) with a .602 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .266 (59-for-222) with a .860 OPS against left-handers...issued 31 of his 41 walks to lefties...had the third lowest batting average and OPS against right-handers in the AL among pitchers with 100 or more innings pitched...opponents were 1-for-15 (.067) with two walks with the bases loaded...had a .189 opponents batting average and .569 OPS the first time through the order, .285 with a .907 OPS the second time and .221 with a .710 OPS after that...yielded 10 of his 19 home runs the second time through the order...allowed a .083 average against the opponent's number five hitter...surrendered six of his 19 home runs to the clean-up hitter...opponents hit .107 when putting his curveball in play, which was fifth lowest in the AL among pitchers with 150 or more curveballs.

**STARTING AND RELIEVING:** Began the season with 21 starts and was 8-5 with a 3.80 ERA and .720 OPS before being moved to the bullpen following his start on Sept. 18...had no decisions, a 7.88 ERA and .890 OPS in three relief appearances...tossed at least 2.0 innings in each of his three relief appearances...first batters faced were 0-for-2 with a hit by pitch and he did not inherit any runners.

THIS AND THAT: Had a 1.93 ERA over the first two innings, a 5.24 ERA from the third inning on...was 5-3 with a 3.28 ERA in 11 games at home, 3-2 with a 4.82 ERA in 13 games on the road...had a 4-3 record and a 3.16 ERA in 10 day games, a 4-2 record and a 4.76 ERA in 14 night games...allowed 15 of his 19 home runs at night...was 1-2 with a 5.68 ERA in three interleague starts... logged a 7-3 record and a 3.86 ERA in 21 games against AL competition...left with the lead and was the pitcher of record in four of his eight no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save...the A's were 11-10 (.524) in his starting assignments...allowed two runs or fewer in 13 of his 21 starts and five hits or fewer 16 times.

- Had a 1.29 ERA (2 er in 14.0 ip), .146 (7-for-48) opponents batting average and has stranded six of his seven inherited runners in 13 games in May... had a 5.59 ERA, .316 opponents average and allowed 4-of-6 inherited runners to score in 10 games in April.
- Is tied for second in MLB in games pitched (24) and is tied for seventh among AL relievers in innings pitched (24.1).
- Opponents are 4-for-25 (.160) with runners in scoring position.
- Has pitched on one day of rest in 14 of his 23 appearances.
- Has never faced the Red Sox in his career.

Last Year: Made his ML debut and compiled a 3.27 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over two stints with the A's...was also 2-0 with nine saves, a 2.48 ERA and .186 opponent average in 30 relief appearances with Las Vegas.

#### 61 RHP ZACH JACKSON (1-1, 3.68)

Inherited Runners/Scored: 9/1 First Hitters: 5-17, 5 bb

- Has allowed earned runs in his last three outings after eight previous appearances of not allowing an earned run.
- Became the first pitcher in Oakland history to face 4 batter and walk them all Saturday night.
- Is tied for seventh in the majors in games (23)...is tied for seventh among AL relievers in strikeouts (29) and is tied for the most walks (17).
- Is holding opposing hitters to a .143 batting average with two strikes (6-for-42).
- Owns a 2.38 ERA (3 er in 11.1 ip) in away games compared to a 5.06 ERA (6 er in 10.2 ip) in home contests.
- Earned his first career win on May 17 against Minnesota.
- Has never faced the Red Sox

**Last Year:** Split his season between Double-A Midland and Triple-A Las Vegas and combined for a 2-2 record, a career-high tying six saves and a 2.57 ERA in 25 relief appearances before a right hip labral tear ended his season in mid-July.

#### **56 RHP DANY JIMENEZ (2-3, 3.92)**

Inherited Runners/Scored: 6/1 First Hitters: 2-16, 5 bb

- Has allowed runs in three consecutive outings for the first time this season and blew his first save of the season on Saturday.
- Recorded his 10th save of the season Wednesday to become the sixth rookie in Oakland history with 10 or more saves (last: Ryan Cook, 14 in 2012).
- Has converted 10 of his 11 save opportunities for the first 10 saves of his career...leads American League rookies and ranks tied for fourth among all AL pitchers in saves.
- Allowed three runs in 0.2 innings for the loss Friday night...prior to that outing, had not allowed a run in eight of his previous 10 games (10.0 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 5 bb, 10 so, 0.96 ERA) and opponents were 2-for-30 (.067) over that span.
- Has allowed a .200 (10-for-50) average against right-handed hitters compared to .179 (5-for-28) against left-handers.
- Opponents are 5-for-23 (.217) with runners in scoring position and .231 (9-for-39) with runners on base.

Last Year: Was with the A's during Spring Training after being selected in the Rule 5 draft but was returned to Toronto March 15...spent the entire regular season with Triple-A Buffalo and was 3-3 with three saves and a 2.22 ERA in 39 games, including one start.
