# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (20-37) VS. ATLANTA BRAVES (29-27)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost seven straight, 10 of the last 12 and 17 of the last 22 games to fall a season-low 17 games under . 500 at 20-37 (.351)...that is the second lowest winning percentage in the majors ahead of the Royals (17-37, . 315 ) and it marks the first time the A's have been 17 games under . 500 since Sept. 17, 2017 when they were $66-83$...have not been 18 games under since they were $65-83$ on Sept. 16, 2017...have the third worst record in Oakland history after 57 games ( 17 -40 in 1994, 18-39 in 1979)...have been swept in each of the previous two series and five times this year...are 2-10-1 over the previous 13 series...are in fifth place in the AL West and have spent 34 of the last 35 days with at least a share of last....have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, six days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 32 days in fifth...trail first place Houston by a season-high $16 \frac{1}{2}$ games, which is their largest deficit in the West since finishing the 2017 season 26 games back.
SEVEN-GAME LOSING STREAK: The A's have lost each of their last seven games, which is two short of their longest losing streak of the season ( 9 , April 29-May 8)...this marks the first time the A's have two losing streaks of seven or more games in the same season since 2005 when they had two eight-game losing streaks...have been outscored 36-12 during the current losing streak...are batting. 165 (36-for-218) with one home run...the pitching staff has a 4.79 ERA ( 33 er in 62.0 ip ).
PLAYER NOTES: Yesterday, Matt Davidson became the 44th player to appear in a game for the A's this year, which is tied for second most in the American League to the Twins (46)...today, Jared Koenig will become number 45...employed 50 players last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season... Koenig will become the 20th rookie, which ties the 2017 A's for second most in Oakland history...the record is 21 in 2008...Koenig will be the 13th rookie pitcher, which breaks the Oakland record of 12 (2009, 12, 15 and 16)...he will be the ninth rookie to make his Major League debut...currently have eight rookies on the roster, including five pitchers.
HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on this nine-game road trip to Atlanta ( $0-1$ ), Cleveland (four games) and Boston (three games)...this trip starts a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 19 of 25 games on the road...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Seattle (2-1) and have a 13-14 (.481) record on the road...are 7-23 (.233) at home, which is the worst home record in the majors....went 1-9 on the last homestand against Texas ( $1-3$ ), Houston ( $0-3$ ) and Boston ( $0-3$ ), which matched the second worst homestand of six or more games in Oakland history....also went 1-9 on a 10-game homestand from July 6-15, 1979 and the worst homestand was 0-6 earlier this year from April 29-May 4...have now lost 20 of the last 23 home games... have a 3.57 ERA ( 92 er in 231.2 ip) on the road compared to 4.72 at home... are batting 218 (195-for-894) with 107 runs and 22 home runs in 27 games on the road compared to .200 with 78 runs and 12 home runs in 30 games at home.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 2-4 in interleague plays (1-2 vs. Philadelphia; 1-1 vs. San Francisco, 0-1 vs. Atlanta)...in addition to this two-game series at Atlanta, the A's will also travel to Washinton (Aug. 30-Sept. 1) and host San Francisco (Aug. 6-7), Miami (Aug. 22-24), Atlanta (Sept. 6-7) and New York (Sept. 23-25)...went 11-9 against the National League last year, which marked the 15th time in 25 seasons of interleague play the A's finished with a winning record.
OFFENSE: The A's rank last in the majors in batting (.209), on-base percentage (.274), slugging percentage (.321) and OPS (.595) and have the second fewest runs scored (185) and home runs (34)...have gone homerless in a season-high tying four consecutive games (also May 4-8) and have homered just once in the last eight games... have homered two times or fewer in each of the last 52 games and 55 of 56 this year... have been shut out seven times, which is tied for second most in the majors (Royals, 8) and matches the A's season total from last year.... have been held to one run or fewer 20 times, which is the most in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.38 ERA (116 er in 194.0 ip) over the last 22 games after posting a 2.25 ERA over the previous 11 contests... have a 4.19 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (Royals, 5.19).... have the third highest opponents batting average (.247) and fourth highest on-base percentage (.318), slugging percentage (.401) and OPS (.719)...have issued the fourth most walks (179) and have the fifth fewest strikeouts (442).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are $0-6$ with a 5.01 ERA ( 26 er in 46.2 ip) over the last nine games and 1-13 with a 4.98 ERA ( 69 er in 124.2 ip) over the last 24 contests...the only win by a starter dating back to May 12 is by Paul Blackburn on May 25 at Seattle...starters are 12-27 with a 4.27 ERA for the season...the losses are the most in the American League and third most in the majors.... have the fourth highest ERA in the AL and the fourth most innings pitched (295.1).
THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen is 1-4 with no saves, three blown saves and a 7.34 ERA ( 31 er in 38.0 ip) over the last 11 games...now has a 4.08 ERA for the season, which is fourth highest in the American League...has allowed 25 -of$109(22.9 \%)$ inherited runners to score, which is the third lowest percentage in the AL...the 109 inherited runners are second most...has the second lowest batting average against first batters faced in the AL (.206)...has surrendered just 16 home runs, which is fifth fewest...has converted 13 -of-21 (61.9\%) save opportunities.

ON THE BASES: The A's are 12 -for- 12 in stolen base attempts over the last 13 games and 37 -for- 43 ( $86.0 \%$ ) for the season... have the second best stolen base percentage in the American League and rank third in steals...A's opponents are 19 -for- 2309 ( $63.3 \%$ ) in stolen base attempts, which is the third lowest success rate in the AL...the 11 caught stealings are tied for second most and the 19 stolen bases allowed are fourth fewest...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most.
DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 36 errors, which is tied for third most in the American League...however, have just 15 unearned runs, which is second fewest (Yankees, 8)...rank second in double plays (54).
ONE-RUN AND TWO-RUN DECISIONS: The A's fell to 4-10 (.286) in one-run games with the 3-2 loss yesterday...are tied for the American League lead in one-run losses and have the second worst record (Rangers, 3-10/.231)... are 13-17 (.433) in games decided by two runs or fewer...the 17 losses are second most in the AL (Orioles, 18) and the 30 games are tied for second most (Orioles, 33 ).
THIS AND THAT: The A's played their fastest game of the season last night (2:19)...are averaging 3 hours and 3 minutes per game, which is fourth quickest in the American League and the majors...are 16-5 (.762) when scoring first and 4-32 (.111) when the opponent scores first....have the fifth best record in the AL when scoring first and have the worst record in the majors when the opponent scores first...have six come-from-behind wins, which is tied for second fewest in the majors (Twins, 5)...are 4-14 in the first game of a series, 8-9 in the final game...have lost seven of their last eight games in which the opponent starts a left-hander...are 7-11 (.389) for the season compared to 13-26 (.333) when the opponents starts a right-hander... are 0-5 in June after going 10-21 (.323) in May...the A's May record was fifth lowest in Oakland history in the month of May...the 21 losses tied for third most in any month in Oakland history and were the most since May of 1997 (9-21).
A's vs. BRAVES: The A's lost the first meeting of 2022 last night and now have an eight-game losing streak against the Braves, which is their longest ever against a National League team...last defeated Atlanta on May 17, 2008 (54)...prior to this year, last met in 2017 when Oakland was swept in a threegame series in the Coliseum, June 30-July 2...this is the A's first visit to Truist Park...last met in Atlanta Aug. 15-17, 2014, and were swept in a three-game series...are 4-12 (.250) all-time against the Braves, which is the A's worst record against any team....are 1-5 in Oakland and 3-7 in Atlanta.

## TODAY'S TIDBITS

Dany Jiménez is 10 -for-11 ( $90.9 \%$ ) in save chances...ranks fifth in the American League in save percentage and tied for seventh in saves...leads AL rookies in saves...Ramón Laureano extended his hitting streak to an A's season-high 11 games yesterday ( 15 -for- $45, .333$ ).

## THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1933 Jimmie Foxx homers in his first three at bats in the A's 14-10 win over New York...he had homered in his last at bat the day before to give him four consecutive home runs...in 1965 Rick Monday is chosen by the Kansas City A's as the first player ever taken in baseball's free agent draft... in 1975 Ken Holtzman one-hits the Detroit Tigers in the A's $4-0$ win... Claudell Washington homers twice and drives in all four Oakland runs....in 2008 Mark Ellis hits the fifth walk-off grand slam in Oakland history to lift the A's to a $7-3$ win over Los Angeles in 12 innings.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jared Koenig (Major League Debut)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas today and will be making his Major League debut...will become the 20th rookie to appear in a game for the A's this year, which ties the 2017 A's for second most in Oakland history...the record is 21 in 2008.... he is the 13th rookie pitcher, which breaks the Oakland record of 12 (2009, 12, 15, 16)...will become the ninth rookie to make his Major League debut.... will become the 55th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the third this year (Oller, April 12; Martinez, May 10)...the last to win was Adrian Martinez at Detroit earlier this year on May 10...the last to strike out 10 or more batters was Aaron Harang on May 25, 2002 against Tampa Bay...the last to toss at least seven innings was Rich Harden on July 21, 2003 at Kansas City...the last complete game was by Mike Morgan June 11, 1978 against Baltimore and the only shutout is by Mike Norris April 10, 1975 against Chicago...the 54 pitchers to start in their debut have combined for a 16-18 record and a 4.07 ERA.

WITH LAS VEGAS: Was 4-2 with a 2.21 ERA in nine games, including eight starts, with Triple-A Las Vegas...struck out 61 batters in 53.0 innings, an average of 10.36 per nine innings....walked just 15 ( 2.55 per nine innings) and surrendered four home runs ( 0.68 per nine innings).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Leads the Pacific Coast League in opponents on-base percentage (.261) and pitches per game (91.8), ranks second in ERA (2.21), tied for second in strikeouts (61), third in opponents batting average (.203), slugging percentage (.318) and OPS (.579), tied for third in wins (4), fourth in innings pitched (53.0) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.07), fifth in fewest walks per nine innings (2.55) and sixth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.68).

FOUR-GAME WINNING STREAK: Went $4-0$ with a 1.64 ERA ( 7 er in 38.1 ip ) and . 187 (26-for-139) opponents batting average over his final six starts...struck
out 48 batters in 38.1 innings, walked just eight and surrendered two home runs...was 0-2 with a 3.68 ERA over his first three games.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Held the opposition to a 203 batting average, includ ing. 200 (31-for-155) against right-handed hitters and .216 (8-for-37) against left-handers...surrendered all four of his home runs to righties...three were solo shots.... had a .191 opponents batting average the first time through the order, .129 the second time and .315 after that....held the opposition to a .127 batting average with two strikes

THIS AND THAT: Did not allow a run in the first ( 8.0 ip ) or second ( 8.0 ip ) innings and compiled a 0.55 ERA ( 2 er in 33.0 ip ) over innings one through four...had a 4.95 ERA (11 er in 20.0 ip) from the fifth inning on...allowed all four of his home run at home where he compiled a 2.20 ERA and .184 op ponents batting average in five games...the Aviators were 6-2 (.750) in his starting assignments
2022 DAY-BY-DAY: Made his only relief appearance in his first outing on April 8 against Reno when he tossed 4.0 innings....made his firsty start on April 16 at Salt Lake and allowed a season-high three runs and walked a season-high four batters in 5.2 innings in a $5-1$ loss...lost again on April 22 against El Paso but then won each of his next four starts from April 30 to May 19...finished April 1-2 with a 3.54 ERA and 240 opponents batting average in four games, three starts...then went $3-0$ with a 1.35 ERA and .177 opponents average in four starts in May...tied for the Pacific Coast League lead in wins in May, ranked second in opponents OPS (.468) and strikeouts (34), third in batting average and fourth in ERA...struck out a season-high 10 batters in back-toback starts on May 7 at Sacramento and May 13 against Salt Lake...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in the 13-0 win over the River Cats...logged a season-high 8.0 innings, allowed one run and did not walk a batter in a $5-2$ win over the Bees...allowed a season-high tying three runs on a season-high nine hits on May 19 at Reno but picked up the win in a 5-3 decision...loggeed a seasonhigh 108 pitches and tossed 7.0 scoreless innings on May 25 at Tacoma but had a no decision in the Aviators 3-1 win

LAST START: He had a no decision in the Aviators 4-2 win over Sacramento a week ago today in Las Vegas...the Aviators scored twice in the bottom of the second and he allowed his only run in the third inning on lead off home run by Bryce Johnson...retired 10 of the final 11 batters he faced and was relieved by Adam Kolarek to start the seventh with Las Vegas leading 2-1...Jake Lem oine allowed a run in the eighth for the blown save.


2021 RECAP: Spent his first season in the A's organization and in affiliated baseball at Double-A Midland and was 7-5 with a 3.26 ERA in 24 games, including 21 starts...led the Double-A Central in ERA, opponents batting average (.240) and innings pitched (121.1), ranked second in winning percentage (.583), tied for second in wins, third in on-base percentage (.314), tied for fourth in games started and fifth in slugging percentage (.400) and OPS (.714)...ranked second in the A's farm system in ERA and innings pitched fourth in strikeouts (100) and tied for fourth in wins...his opponents batting average broke down to .203 (26-for-128) against left-handed hitters com pared to .255 (82-for-322) against right-handers...surrendered 13 of his 14 home runs to righties and had a . 767 OPS (. 582 vs. lefties)...held the opposi tion to $a .195$ batting average with runners in scoring position and .145 with two strikes.

CAREER: Was selected by the Chicago White Sox in the 35th round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft out of Central Arizona College but did not sign. also attended Old Dominion and Cal State Monterey Bay...pitched in independent leagues from 2017-19...had stops in Monterey (Pecos), Salina (American Association), Birmingham-Bloomfield (United Shore) and San Ra fael (Pacific Association) in 2017, San Rafael in 2018 and Lake Erie (Frontier) in 2019...combined for a 22-10 record and a 3.40 ERA in 53 games, including 47 starts, in three seasons of independent ball...was signed by the A's as a free agent on Jan. 14, 2020 and is 11-7 with a 2.94 ERA in 33 games, including 29 starts, in two seasons in the minors.
