OAKLAND ATHLETICS (20-39) VS. CLEVELAND GUARDIANS (27-26)

FRIDAY, JUNE 10, 2022 — PROGRESSIVE FIELD -- 7:10 ET RHP PAUL BLACKBURN (5-2, 2.62) VS. RHP TRISTON MCKENZIE (3-5, 3.10) NBCSCA — A'S CAST — A'S RADIO NETWORK (BLOOMBERG 960 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost nine straight, 12 of the last 13 and 19 of the last 24 games to fall a season-low 19 games under .500 at 20-39 (.339)...that is tied for the lowest winning percentage in the majors with the Royals (19-37, .339) and it marks the first time the A's have been 19 games under .500 since Sept. 9, 2017 when they were 61-80...have not been 20 games under since they were 60-80 on Sept. 8, 2017...have the third worst record in Oakland history after 59 games (18-41 in 1994, 19-40 in 1979)...have been swept in each of the last three series and six times this year...are 2-11-1 over the last 14 series...are in fifth place in the AL West and have spent 36 of the last 37 days with at least a share of last...have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, six days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 34 days in fifth...trail first place Houston by a season-high 17 games, which is their largest deficit in the West since finishing the 2017 season 26 games back.

NINE-GAME LOSING STREAK: The A's have lost each of their last nine games, which is tied for their longest losing streak of the season (also 9, April 29-May 8)...this marks the first time the A's have two losing streaks of nine or more games in one season since 1978 when they had losing streaks of 11 games and nine games...have not lost 10 consecutive games since a 10-game skid May 30-June 9, 2011...have been outscored 57-18 during the current losing streak...are batting .183 (52-for-284) with two home runs...the pitching staff has a 5.88 ERA (51 er in 78.0 ip).

PLAYER NOTES: Wednesday, Jared Koenig became the 45th player to appear in a game for the A's this year, which is second most in the AL to the Twins (46)...Koenig became the 20th rookie, which ties the 2017 A's for second most in Oakland history...the record is 21 in 2008...he is the 13th rookie pitcher, which breaks the Oakland record of 12 (2009, 12, 15 and 16)...he is the ninth rookie to make his Major League debut...currently have eight rookies on the roster, including five pitchers...Koenig is the ninth pitcher to start a game for the A's, which matches their season total from each of the previous two years...Christian Bethancourt also pitched Wednesday night and the A's have now used 26 pitchers, which is fourth most in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-3 on this nine-game road trip to Atlanta (0-2), Cleveland (0-1) and Boston (three games)...this trip starts a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 19 of 25 games on the road...went 3-3 on the last road trip and have a 13-16 (.448) record on the road...are 7-23 (.233) at home, which is the worst home record in the majors...went 1-9 on the last homestand against Texas (1-3), Houston (0-3) and Boston (0-3), which matched the second worst homestand of six or more games in Oakland history...also went 1-9 on a 10-game homestand from July 6-15, 1979 and the worst homestand was 0-6 earlier this year from April 29-May 4...have now lost 20 of the last 23 home games...have a 4.00 ERA (110 er in 247.2 ip) on the road compared to 4.72 at home...are batting .220 (211-for-960) with 113 runs and 23 home runs in 29 games on the road compared to .200 with 78 runs and 12 home runs in 30 games at home.

OFFENSE: The A's rank last in the majors in batting (.210), on-base percentage (.276), and OPS (.599) and have the second lowest slugging percentage (.323), second fewest home runs (35), and third fewest runs scored (191)...have homered just twice in the last nine games (both by Christian Bethancourt)...have homered two times or fewer in each of the last 54 games and 57 of 58 this year...have been shut out seven times, which is tied for second most in the majors (Royals, 8) and matches the A's season total from last year...have been held to one run or fewer 20 times, which is the most in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.59 ERA (136 er in 219.0 ip) over the last 25 games after posting a 2.25 ERA over the previous 11 contests...have a 4.37 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (Royals, 5.17)...have the third highest opponents batting average (.252) and and OPS (.734), and fourth highest on-base percentage (.321) and slugging percentage (.413)...have surrendered 11 home runs in the last four games...have allowed 64 for the season, which is tied for fourth most in the AL...have issued the fourth most walks (185) and have the fifth fewest strikeouts (453).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 0-7 with a 5.37 ERA (32 er in 53.2 ip) over the last 10 games and 1-14 with a 5.05 ERA (75 er in 133.2 ip) over the last 26 contests...the only win by a starter dating back to May 12 is by Paul Blackburn on May 25 at Seattle...starters are 12-28 with a 4.32 ERA for the season...the losses are the most in the American League and third most in the majors (Washington, 33) and Cincinnati (30)...have the third highest ERA in the AL and the fourth most innings pitched (304.1).

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen is 1-5 with no saves, three blown saves and a 8.60 ERA (43 er in 45.0 ip) over the last 13 games...now has a 4.53 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...has the fifth lowest batting average against first batters faced in the AL (.219) and the eighth lowest on-base percentage (.314)...has allowed 29-of-116 (25.0%) inherited runners to score, which is tied the fifth lowest percentage in the AL...the 116 inherited runners are third most...allowed four home runs Wednesday night, which were the most by the bullpen since June 13, 2018 when they also allowed four against Houston...have surrendered six home runs in the last four games after yielding just 14 over the first 55...has converted 13-of-21 (61.9%) save opportunities.

ON THE BASES: The A's had their streak of 12 consecutive stolen bases without a caught stealing snapped Wednesday night...are now 37-for-45 (82.2%) for the season, which is tied second best stolen base percentage in the American League...rank tied for third in steals...A's opponents are 20-for-32 (63.5%) in stolen base attempts, which is the lowest success rate in the AL...the 12 caught stealings are tied for the most and the 20 stolen bases allowed are fourth fewest...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 38 errors, which is third most in the American League...however, have just 18 unearned runs, which is tied for third fewest...rank second in double plays (55).

THIS AND THAT: The A's scored first in each of the last three games but lost... have a four-game losing streak when scoring first but are 16-7 (.696) for the season, compared to 4-32 (.111) when the opponent scores first...have the worst record in the majors when the opponent scores first...are 0-7 in June after going 10-21 (.323) in May...are the only team in the majors without a win in June...the A's May record was fifth lowest in Oakland history in the month of May...the 21 losses tied for third most in any month in Oakland history and were the most since May of 1997 (9-21)...are averaging 3 hours and 3 minutes per game, which is fourth quickest in the American League and the majors (Cleveland is 2nd quickest, 2:59).

A's vs. GUARDIANS: The A's trail in the season series 0-4 after being swept in Oakland, April 29-May 1...it was the first time the A's were swept by Cleveland since July 29-31, 2016 and the first time in Oakland since April 10-12, 2000...won the season series last year 4-2 and have won each of the previous four season series...are 17-12 against Cleveland over the last five seasons...after last night's loss, have dropped the season series for the first time since going 2-4 in 2016...went 1-2 in Oakland last year and 3-0 in Cleveland... snapped an eight-game winning streak at Progressive Field, which was the longest road winning streak in Athletics history against Cleveland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 287-248 against Cleveland...that breaks down to 151-111 in Oakland and 136-137 in Cleveland...including 51-68 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 922-1041 against Cleveland.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Elvis Andrus is a .394 (63-for-160) career hitter at Progressive Field, which is the best batting average by any player in this ballpark with a minimum of 100 plate appearances... Dany Jiménez is 10-for-11 (90.9%) in save chances...ranks fourth in the American League in save percentage (of pitchers with at least 9 saves) and tied for sixth in saves...is one of seven AL pitchers with at least 10 saves...leads AL rookies in saves...Christian Bethancourt has hit each of Oakland's last two home runs...his two home runs are the most he has hit in a season since hitting six homers in 2016 as a member of the Padres...his maximum exit velocity is 113.4 MPH, which he recorded on a single last night for the third hardest hit ball by an A's player this season...Bethancourt has 5 of the 10 hardest hit balls by an Athletic in 2022... his max exit velocity ranks in the 92nd percentile of MLB hitters.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1979 Jim Essian hits an inside-the-park grand slam in the A's 12-1 win against Toronto...in 1992 Mark McGwire hits his 200th career home run off Chris Bosio in the A's 5-2 win at Milwaukee...he becomes the third Oakland Athletic to reach the 200 mark, joining Reggie Jackson and Jose Canseco... in 1997 Damon Mashore has three assists at Detroit to set an Oakland record for assists by an outfielder...in 2017 the A's set an Oakland record for hits in a doubleheader with 32 against Tampa Bay...Yonder Alonso had seven hits, to become the second Oakland player with seven hits in one day.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Paul Blackburn (5-2, 2.62 ERA)

LAST TWO AND FIRST NINE: Is 0-2 with a 6.75 ERA (8 er in 10.2 ip) and .273 (12-for-444) opponents batting average over his last two starts after going 5-0 with a 1.70 ERA and .211 opponents batting average over his first nine starts...the five-game winning streak was a career high and he became the first starting pitcher on an A's Opening Day roster to start the season 5-0 since Trevor Cahill won his first six decisions in 2011.

CAREER BESTS: Has a career-high five wins, which is tied for eighth in the American League...had just six wins in 30 games over his first five seasons... also has career highs in games (11), games started (11) and strikeouts (44)... his 58.1 innings pitched are 0.1 innings shy of his 58.2 from his rookie campaign of 2017.

QUALIFICATIONS: Has 58.1 innings pitched and is 0.2 innings short of qualifying for the league leaders...based on a minimum of 50 innings pitched, he ranks tenth in the American League in ERA (2.62)...has allowed just three home runs and his average of 0.46 home runs per nine innings is sixth lowest in the AL using the 50 inning minimum.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-0 with a 1.14 ERA (4 er in 31.2 ip) and .198 (22-for-111) opponents batting average in six starts on the road compared to 1-2 with a 4.39 ERA (13 er in 26.2 ip) and .250 (26-for-104) opponents average in five starts at home...is tied for the American League lead in road wins and ranks second in ERA...has not allowed a home run in 31.2 innings on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held right-handed hitters to a .194 (21-for-108) batting average...left-handers are hitting .252 (27-for-107) against him with nine of his 14 walks...opponents are 8-for-43 (.186) with runners in scoring position...entered the season with a .328 career opponents average with RISP...has a .198 (18-for-91) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .253 (23-for-91) the second time and .212 (7-for-33) after that...has allowed a .135 opponents batting average with two strikes and opponents are 1-for-14 on an 0-2 count...the number five hitter in the order is 2-for-23 (.087) against him.

BASES ON BALLS: Has walked 11 batters in 27.1 innings over his last five starts (3.62 per nine innings) after issuing just three free passes in 31.0 innings over his first six starts (0.87 per nine innings)...has walked 14 batters in 58.1 innings overall (2.16 per nine inning) and has issued two walks or fewer in 10 of his 11 starts...has four starts with no walks and three with just one...is averaging 2.38 walks per nine innings in his career (52 bb in 196.1 ip).

THIS AND THAT: Is is 3-0 with a 1.75 ERA (5 er in 25.2 ip) in five starts at night, 2-2 with a 3.31 ERA (12 er in 32.2 ip) in six starts during the day...the A's are 3-1 in his no decisions and are 8-3 (.727) in his starting assignments...has allowed two runs or fewer in eight of his 11 starts.

2022 HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed 5.0 scoreless inning and struck out a career-high seven batters in a 13-2 win at Tampa Bay in his first start on April 11...had a no decision in the A's 7-5 win in his second start on April 16 at Toronto...left with a 5-2 lead but the bullpen allowed three runs for the blown save...won back-to-back starts on April 21 against Baltimore and April 27 at San Francisco...combined with five A's relievers on a three-hit, 1-0 shutout in the win over the Giants...tossed five of the innings and allowed all three of the hits while walking one...finished April 3-0 with a 1.35 ERA in four starts...walked just two batters in 20.0 innings and held the opposition to a .197 batting average...it was his first career three-win month and he tied for third in the American League in wins in April...based on a minimum of 20.0 innings, he had the second lowest opponents OPS (.459), ranked third in slugging (.239) and was fourth in ERA and on-base percentage (.219)...combined with Jackson and Jiménez on a four-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Detroit on May 9.. tossed a season-high 6.2 innings, yielded all four of the hits and did not walk a batter...logged a season-high 6.2 innings for the second consecutive start in the day game on May 14 against Los Angeles (AL) but had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win...tossed 5.1 scoreless innings and allowed just one hit in a 4-2 win at Seattle on May 25...however, walked a career-high five batters...was charged with his first loss of the season on May 30 against Houston when he allowed a season-high four runs in a season-high tying 6.2 innings...did not allow a run over the first three innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 10.0 innings.

LAST START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 8-0 loss to Boston last Saturday in Oakland...allowed a season-high tying four runs on a season-high seven hits in a season-low 4.0 innings...yielded three runs in the third inning on a Vazquez RBI double and a Devers two-run single...also allowed a RBI double to Verdugo in the fourth and was relieved by Trivino in the fifth inning with no outs, runners on first and second and the A's trailing 4-0...Trivino did not allow any of the inherited runners to score...Pivetta and the Red Sox bullpen combined to shut out the A's on four hits.

2021 RECAP: Began the season at Triple-A Las Vegas and was 4-7 with a 4.97 ERA in 17 games, including 16 starts, when he was selected by Oakland on Aug. 18...spent the balance of the season with the A's and went 1-4 with a 5.87 ERA in nine starts...has spent parts of each of the last five seasons with Oakland and his nine starts were the second most of his career (10 in 2017)... had career highs in strikeouts (26), losses (4), runs (26), earned runs (25) and home runs (8) and matched his high in hit batters (2) and wild pitches (1).

WITH OAKLAND: Allowed a .319 opponents batting average but walked just 10 batters in 38.1 innings (2.35 walks per nine innings) for a .366 opponents on-base percentage...his opponents batting average broke down to .309 (29-for-94) with an .858 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .333 (23-for-69) with a .953 OPS against left-handers...opponents hit .333 with runners in scoring position...was 0-1 with a 4.03 ERA and .720 opponents OPS in five starts at home, 1-3 with an 8.44 ERA and 1.115 OPS in four starts on the road...yielded seven of his eight home runs on the road...was 1-1 with a 3.38 ERA in four starts during the day, 0-3 with an 8.24 ERA in five starts at night...allowed a .533 batting average to the opponents number nine hitter and .438 average to the seven hitter...the A's were 3-1 in his no decisions and went 4-5 (.444) in his starting assignments...tossed fewer than six innings in all nine starts, including fewer than five innings four times.

WITH LAS VEGAS: His seven losses with the Aviators were his most as a minor leaguer and his .311 opponents batting average was a career high...surrendered just eight home runs in 88.2 innings, an average of 0.81 per nine innings...his opponents batting average broke down to .300 (61-for-203) with an .824 OPS against lefthanded hitters and .323 (53-for-164) with a .776 OPS against right-handers...yielded six of his eight home runs and issued 18 of his 27 walks to lefties...opponents hit .311 with the bases empty, .311 with runners on...six of the eight home runs he allowed were solo shots...had a .296 opponents average and allowed one home run the first time through the order, .307 with three home runs the second time and .337 with four home runs after that...went 2-3 with a 4.24 ERA, .287 opponents batting average and .737 OPS in nine starts at home, 2-4 with a 5.79 ERA, .333 opponent average and .867 OPS on the road...tossed six innings or fewer in each of his 17 appearances...the Aviators were 5-11 (.313) in his starting assignments.

RHP Frankie Montas (2-6, 3.06 ERA): Is 0-5 despite a 2.87 ERA and .214 opponents batting average over his last nine starts...the five-game losing streak is a career high...the A's have been shut out three times during the losing streak and have scored one run three times...he has allowed no runs twice during the streak, one run once and two runs three times...the A's have been shut out in three of his 12 starts and he has received one run of support or fewer nine times, including each of his last seven starts...has 20 runs of support his 12 starts this year (2.55 RSA)...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 5-2 A's loss to Boston last Sunday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 7 so)...is 1-2 with a 3.43 ERA (39.1 ip, 39 h, 16 r, 15 er, 13 bb, 44 so, 2 hr) in nine career appearances, including six starts, against Cleveland...had a no decision in his only start this year, a 9-8 A's loss in Oakland on April 29 (5.0 ip, 5 h, 5 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 6 so).

- Before last night, had faced the Guardians once in his career and it came earlier this year on April 30 (1.2 ip, 1 bb, 3 so).
