# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (21-41) VS. BOSTON RED SOX (32-29)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost 10 of the last 11 games and are 6-21 (.222) over the last 27 contests...are 21-41 (.339) overall, which is the second worst record in the majors ahead of the Royals (20-40, .333)...the 20 games under .500 matches the season low (20-40 on June 10)...have not been 21 games under .500 since they were $59-80$ on Sept. 6, 2017....have the third worst record in Oakland history after 58 games (19-43 in 1979 and 1994)...are 2-12-1 over the last 15 series...are in fifth place in the AL West and have spent 40 of the last 41 days with at least a share of last...have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, six days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 38 days in fifth...trail first place Houston by $161 / 2$ games, which is one-half game short of the season high of 17 (last on June 12)...have not been more than 17 games back since finishing the 2017 season 26 games out...snapped their 10-game losing streak on Saturday...it was the A's longest losing streak since May 30-June 9, 2011 when they also lost 10 straight...also had a nine-game losing streak this year (April 29-May 8) and this is the first time the A's have two losing streaks of nine or more game in one season since 1978.

PLAYER NOTES: The A's recalled Jonah Bride from Triple-A Las Vegas today and he will become the 46th player to appear in a game for the A's this year...the current total of 45 players is tied for third most in the American League... employed 50 players last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season...Bride will become the 21st rookie, which will tie the Oakland record for most rookies in a season (21 in 2008)...have set the Oakland record for rookie pitchers with 13 (previous: 12 in 2009, 12, 15 and 16)...Bride will be the 10th rookie to make his Major League debut, which is the A's most since 2016 when they set the Oakland record with 15...currently have 10 rookies on the roster, including seven pitchers.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting . 199 (78-for-391) with 33 runs scored over the last 12 games ( 2.8 runs per game)...are hitting .212 for the season, which is the lowest mark in the majors...also have the lowest on-base percentage (.277), the second lowest slugging percentage (.344) and OPS (.611) and the third fewest runs scored (206)...hit three home runs Sunday and four on Saturday after hitting two home runs or fewer in 59 of the first 60 games... homered in all four games at Cleveland ( 10 home runs total) after going homerless in a season-high five consecutive games...have 44 home runs for the season, which is second fewest in the majors ahead of the Tigers (31)...have been shut out seven times, which is tied for fifth most in the majors and matches the A's season total from last year...have been held to one run or fewer 20 times, which is the most in the majors.
PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.62 ERA (147 er in 235.2 ip) over the last 27 games after posting a 2.25 ERA over the previous 11 contests... have a 4.38 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (Royals, 5.18)...have the third highest opponents batting average (.252) and OPS (.733) and fourth highest on-base percentage (.320) and slugging percentage (.413)...have issued the fifth most walks (190) and have the fourth fewest strikeouts (465).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 1-8 with a 4.90 ERA (41 er in 75.1 ip) over the last 14 games and 2-15 with a 4.89 ERA (86 er in 158.1 ip) over the last 30 contests...the only win by starters over that stretch, which dates back to May 12, came on May 25 (Blackburn) and June 11 (Montas)... starters are 13-29 with a 4.31 ERA for the season...the losses are the most in the American League and third most in the majors (Nationals 35, Reds, 31)...rank fourth in the AL in fewest wins (13), highest ERA and most innings pitched (324.0).

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen is 1-6 with no saves, five blown saves and an 8.29 ERA ( 47 er in 51.0 ip) over the last 16 games dating back to May $26 \ldots$ now has a 4.49 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League to the Royals (4.86)...is 23 -for- 33 ( $56.5 \%$ ) in save opportunities... has the third lowest save percentage in the AL and is tied for the fifth most blown saves (10)...has the fourth lowest batting average against first batters faced in the AL (.221)...however, has the second most first batter walks (24)...has allowed 30 -of- 120 ( $25.0 \%$ ) inherited runners to score, which is the fourth lowest percentage in the AL...the 120 inherited runners are third most....have yielded 21 home runs, which is tied for fourth fewest in the AL.
ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 41-of-49 (83.7\%) stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the American League...rank third in steals (41)...A's opponents are 20-for-33 (60.6\%) in stolen base attempts, which is the lowest success rate in the AL and the majors...are tied for second in the AL in caught stealing (13) and rank third in fewest stolen
base (20)...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most in the AL.
DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed one error in each of the last five games and seven of the last eight...now have 41 errors for the season, which is third most in the American League...however, have just 19 unearned runs, which is third fewest...rank second in double plays (57)...are tied for the third fewest outfield assists (6).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-5 on this nine-game road trip to Atlanta (02 ), Cleveland (1-3) and Boston (three games)...this trip starts a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 19 of 25 games on the road...went 3-3 on the last road trip and have a 14-18 (.438) record on the road compared to 7-23 (.233) at home...have the worst home record in the majors...return home following the game Thursday for a six-game homestand against Kansas City (three games) and Seattle (three games)...went 1-9 on the last homestand against Texas (1-3), Houston (0-3) and Boston ( $0-3$ ), which matched the second worst homestand of six or more games in Oakland history...also went 1-9 on a 10-game homestand from July 6-15, 1979 and the worst homestand was 0-6 earlier this year from April 29-May 4...have now lost 20 of the last 23 home games...have a 4.05 ERA ( 123 er in 273.1 ip) on the road compared to 4.72 at home...are batting . 222 (237-for-1067) with 128 runs and 32 home runs in 32 games on the road compared to .200 with 78 runs and 12 home runs in 30 games at home.
CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 4-11 (.267) in one-run games... are tied with the Mariners for the American League lead in one-run losses and have the second worst record to the Rangers (3-10/.231)...are 13-18 (.419) in games decided by two runs or fewer...the 18 losses are third most in the AL and the 31 games are tied for third most... are 0-2 in extra inning games and are one of two teams in the majors without an extra inning win (Dodgers, 0-4)...the two extra inning games are tied for second fewest in the majors (Reds, 1-0)

THIS AND THAT: The A's have scored first in each of the last six games but have lost five of those games...are 17-9 (.654) when scoring first for the season, compared to 4-32 (.111) when the opponent scores first....have the second worst record in the majors when the opponent scores first (Cubs, 2-17/.105)...have seven come-from-behind wins, which is third fewest in the majors (Cubs and Twins, 6)...are 1-9 (.100) in June after going 10-21 (.323) in May...have the worst record in June in the majors behind the Angels (2-10/.167)...the A's May record was fifth lowest in Oakland history in the month of May...the 21 losses tied for third most in any month in Oakland history and were the most since May of 1997 (9-21)...are averaging 3 hours and 2 minutes per game, which is fourth quickest in the American League and the majors.
A's vs. RED SOX: The A's trail in the season series, 0-3...were swept in Oakland June 3-5, which marked the first time they were swept by the Red Sox in Oakland in a series of three or more games since Sept. 6-8, 2004...the only other times the A's went winless against Boston in the season series in Oakland were in 2002 and 2004 (both 0-3)...split the season series last year, 3-3... lost two of three in Oakland and won two of three in Boston...have won just two season series over the last seven meetings and are 16-25 against the Red Sox dating back to 2015...are 250-306 against Boston since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 151-128 in Oakland, 98-177 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 892-1087 against the Red Sox.

## TODAY'S TIDBITS

Christian Bethancourt is batting . 407 (11-for-27) with all four of his home runs and seven RBI in eight games in June... his most home runs in a season is six in 2016...Seth Brown has homered in three consecutive games for the second time in his career (May 20-23, 2021)...has nine RBI over his last four games...Dany Jiménez has 10 saves, which ranks eighth in the American League and is the most among AL rookies...is the sixth rookie in Oakland history with 10 or more saves.

In 1964 Jim Gentile drives in four runs, including the game winning home run in the top of the $10^{\text {th }}$ inning in a 6-5 win at Cleveland...in 1969 the A's defeat the Boston Red Sox 21-7, setting what was then a club record for most runs in a game...Oakland scores five times in the fifth, seventh and eighth innings...Reggie Jackson is 5 for 6 with two doubles, two homers and a club record 10 RBI...in 1975 Campy Campaneris steals his 500th career base in the A's 3-2 loss at Detroit.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jared Koenig (0-1, 9.00 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas last Wednesday and made his Major League debut that day with a start at Atlanta...became the 13th rookie to pitch for the A's this year, which breaks the Oakland record for most rookie pitchers in a season ( 12 in 2009, 12, 15, 16)...is the 55th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the third this year (Oller, April 12; Martinez, May 10).

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in his Major League debut, a start and loss in a 13-2 decision at Atlanta last Wednesday...struck out Contreras in the second inning for his first strikeout....blanked the Braves on two hits over the first three innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed an Albies sacrifice fly in the fourth...then yielded a two-run triple to Harris in the fifth and was relieved by Acevedo, who allowed Harris to score.

KOENIG vs. BOSTON: Is making his first career appearance.


WITH LAS VEGAS: Was 4-2 with a 2.21 ERA in nine games, including eight starts, with Triple-A Las Vegas...struck out 61 batters in 53.0 innings, an average of 10.36 per nine innings....walked just 15 ( 2.55 per nine innings) and surrendered four home runs ( 0.68 per nine innings).

AMONG THE LEADERS: At the time of his June 8 promotion to Oakland, he led the Pacific Coast League in opponents on-base percentage (.261) and pitches per game (91.8), ranked second in ERA (2.21), tied for second in strikeouts (61), third in opponents batting average (.203), slugging percentage (.318) and OPS (.579), tied for third in wins (4), fourth in innings pitched (53.0) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.07), fifth in fewest walks per nine innings (2.55) and sixth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.68).

FOUR-GAME WINNING STREAK: Went $4-0$ with a 1.64 ERA (7 er in 38.1 ip ) and . 187 (26-for-139) opponents batting average over his final six starts...struck out 48 batters in 38.1 innings, walked just eight and surrendered two home runs...was 0-2 with a 3.68 ERA over his first three games.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Held the opposition to a 203 batting average, including. 200 (31-for-155) against right-handed hitters and .216 (8-for-37) against left-handers...surrendered all four of his home runs to righties...three were solo shots...had a .191 opponents batting average the first time through the order, .129 the second time and .315 after that....held the opposition to a .127 batting average with two strikes

THIS AND THAT: Did not allow a run in the first (8.0 ip) or second (8.0 ip) innings and compiled a 0.55 ERA ( 2 er in 33.0 ip ) over innings one through four...had a 4.95 ERA ( 11 er in 20.0 ip) from the fifth inning on...allowed all four of his home run at home where he compiled a 2.20 ERA and .184 opponents batting average in five games...the Aviators were 6-2 (.750) in his starting assignments

2022 DAY-BY-DAY: Made his only relief appearance in his first outing on April 8 against Reno when he tossed 4.0 innings.... made his first start on April 16 at Salt Lake and allowed a season-high three runs and walked a season-high four batters in 5.2 innings in a 5-1 loss...lost again on April 22 against El Paso but then won each of his next four starts from April 30 to May 19...finished April 1-2 with a 3.54 ERA and . 240 opponents batting average in four games, three starts...then went $3-0$ with a 1.35 ERA and .177 opponents average in four starts in May...tied for the Pacific Coast League lead in wins in May, ranked second in opponents OPS (.468) and strikeouts (34), third in batting average and fourth in ERA...struck out a season-high 10 batters in back-toback starts on May 7 at Sacramento and May 13 against Salt Lake...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in the 13-0 win over the River Cats...logged a season-high 8.0 innings, allowed one run and did not walk a batter in a $5-2$ win over the Bees...allowed a season-high tying three runs on a season-high nine hits on May 19 at Reno but picked up the win in a 5-3 decision...logged a seasonhigh 108 pitches and tossed 7.0 scoreless innings on May 25 at Tacoma but had a no decision in the Aviators 3-1 win...left his start on June 1 against Sacramento after six innings with a 2-1 lead but ended up with a no decision after the bullpen allowed a run in the eighth for the blown save.

2021 RECAP: Spent his first season in the A's organization and in affiliated baseball at Double-A Midland and was 7-5 with a 3.26 ERA in 24 games, including 21 starts...led the Double-A Central in ERA, opponents batting average (.240) and innings pitched (121.1), ranked second in winning percentage (.583), tied for second in wins, third in on-base percentage (.314), tied for fourth in games started and fifth in slugging percentage (.400) and OPS (.714)...ranked second in the A's farm system in ERA and innings pitched, fourth in strikeouts (100) and tied for fourth in wins...his opponents batting average broke down to . 203 (26-for-128) against left-handed hitters compared to .255 (82-for-322) against right-handers...surrendered 13 of his 14 home runs to righties and had a . 767 OPS (. 582 vs. lefties)...held the opposition to a .195 batting average with runners in scoring position and .145 with two strikes...compiled a 1.25 ERA in May, 4.08 in June, 2.01 in July, 5.70 in August and 1.93 in September...was 6-4 at home, 1-1 on the road.

CAREER: Was selected by the Chicago White Sox in the 35th round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft out of Central Arizona College but did not sign... also attended Old Dominion and Cal State Monterey Bay...pitched in independent leagues from 2017-19...had stops in Monterey (Pecos), Salina (American Association), Birmingham-Bloomfield (United Shore) and San Rafael (Pacific Association) in 2017, San Rafael in 2018 and Lake Erie (Frontier) in 2019...combined for a 22-10 record and a 3.40 ERA in 53 games, including 47 starts, in three seasons of independent ball...was signed by the A's as a free agent on Jan. 14, 2020 and is 11-7 with a 2.94 ERA in 33 games, including 29 starts, in two seasons in the minors.

RHP James Kaprielian (0-3, 5.73 ERA): Was reinstated from the injured list May 1 and is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season...has allowed 15 runs in 19.2 innings over his last four starts (6.86 ERA) after allowing nine runs in 18.0 innings over his first four starts (4.50 ERA)...has started the season 0-3, which is the longest losing streak of his career...has a .167 opponents batting average the first time through the order, .316 with seven of his nine home runs allowed after that....has a 1.13 ERA over the first two innings of a game, a 9.14 ERA from the third inning on...had a no decision in his last start, an 8-4 loss at Cleveland last Thursday ( $5.0 \mathrm{ip}, 5 \mathrm{~h}, 2 \mathrm{r}, 2 \mathrm{er}, 3$ so, 2 hr )...is 1-2 with a 3.12 ERA ( $17.1 \mathrm{ip}, 14 \mathrm{~h}, 6 \mathrm{r}, 6 \mathrm{er}, 6 \mathrm{bb}, 17 \mathrm{so}, 1 \mathrm{hr}$ ) in three career appearances, all starts, against Boston...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 7-23 A's loss in Oakland on June 3 ( $5.0 \mathrm{ip}, 5 \mathrm{~h}, 2 \mathrm{r}, 2 \mathrm{er}, 3$ so)...began the season on the 10-day IL with an inflamed right AC joint.

- Has a . 207 opponents batting average but has issued 18 walks for a . 353 on-base percentage...the walk are tied for second most among Major League relievers (Coleman, KC 21).
- Has faced the Red Sox once in his career and it came earlier this month in Oakland on June 5 (1.0 ip, 2 so).
Last Year: Split his season between Double-A Midland and Triple-A Las Vegas and combined for a 2-2 record, a career-high tying six saves and a 2.57 ERA in 25 relief appearances before a right hip labral tear ended his season in mid-July.

- Has allowed 11 runs over his last six games (4.2 ip, $7 \mathrm{~h}, 11 \mathrm{r}, 11 \mathrm{er}, 6 \mathrm{bb}, 3$ so, 21.21 ERA) and has a win, three losses and two blown saves over that span...yielded just one earned run over his first 18 games (0.49 ERA) and converted each of his 10 save opportunities while posting a 1-1 record.
- Is 10 -for-12 (83.33\%) in save chances...ranks eighth in the American League in saves...leads AL rookies in saves and is the sixth rookie in Oakland history with 10 or more saves (last: Ryan Cook, 14 in 2012).
- Has a 2.19 ERA (3 er in 12.1 ip ) and . 100 (4-for-40) opponents batting average in 13 games on the road compared to a 7.59 ERA and .283 opponents average in 11 games at home.
- Has faced Boston once in his career and it came earlier this month on June 5 in Oakland (1.0 ip).
