# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (21-43) VS. BOSTON RED SOX (34-29)

THURSDAY, JUNE 16, 2022 — FENWAY PARK — 1:35 ET RHP PAUL BLACKBURN (5-2, 2.31) VS. LHP RICH HILL (2-3, 4.38) NBCSCA — A'S CAST — A'S RADIO NETWORK (BLOOMBERG 960 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost 13 of the last 14 games and are 6-23 (.207) over the last 29 contests...are 21-43 (.328) overall, which is the worst record in the majors...are 22 games under .500 for the first time since Sept. 5, 2017 when they were 58-80...have not been 23 or more games under .500 since Oct. 2, 2016 (69-93)...are tied for the second worst record in Oakland history after 64 games (19-45 in 1979, 21-43 in 1994)...are 2-13-1 over the previous 16 series...are in fifth place in the AL West and have spent 42 of the last 43 days with at least a share of last...have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, six days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 40 days in fifth... trail first place Houston by a season-high 18½ games, which is the A's largest deficit in the West since finishing the 2017 season 26 games out...snapped their 10-game losing streak on Saturday...it was the A's longest losing streak since May 30-June 9, 2011 when they also lost 10 straight...also had a ninegame losing streak this year (April 29-May 8) and this is the first time the A's have two losing streaks of nine or more game in one season since 1978.

PLAYER NOTES: Tuesday, Jonah Bride became the 46th player to appear in a game for the A's this year, which is tied for third most in the American League...employed 50 players last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season...he became the A's 21st rookie, which ties the Oakland record for most rookies in a season (21 in 2008)...have set the Oakland record for rookie pitchers with 13 (previous: 12 in 2009, 12, 15 and 16)...he was the 10th rookie to make his Major League debut, which is the A's most since 2016 when they set the Oakland record with 15...currently have 10 rookies on the roster, including seven pitchers.

OFFENSE: The A's were held to one run last night and have scored one run or fewer 22 times this year, which is the most in the majors...have been shut out seven times, which is tied for sixth most in the majors and matches the A's season total from last year...are batting .196 (89-for-455) with 35 runs scored over the last 14 games (2.5 runs per game)...are hitting .211 for the season, which is the lowest mark in the majors...also have the lowest onbase percentage (.275), the second lowest slugging percentage (.333) and OPS (.608) and the second fewest runs scored (208)...have homered in a season-high six consecutive games (12 home runs total) after going homerless in a season-high five consecutive games...have 46 home runs for the season, which is second fewest in the majors ahead of the Tigers (31).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 6.72 ERA (49 er in 65.2 ip) over the first eight games of the road trip and now have a 5.79 ERA (162 er in 251.2 ip) over the last 29 games...have a 4.50 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (Royals, 5.12)...have the third highest opponents batting average (.255), slugging percentage (.417) and OPS (.741) and fourth highest on-base percentage (.324)...have issued the fourth most walks (201) and have the third fewest strikeouts (478).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 1-10 with a 5.64 ERA (52 er in 83.0 ip) over the last 16 games and 2-17 with a 5.26 ERA (97 er in 166.0 ip) over the last 32 contests...the only win by starters over that stretch, which dates back to May 12, came on May 25 (Blackburn) and June 11 (Montas)... starters are 13-31 with a 4.50 ERA for the season...the losses are the most in the American League and third most in the majors (Nationals 37, Reds, 31). rank fourth in the AL in fewest wins, highest ERA and most innings pitched (331.2)

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has not allowed a run in two of the last four games (5 er in 13.2 ip, 3.29 ERA) but is 1-6 with no saves, five blown saves and a 7.74 ERA (51 er in 59.1 ip) over the last 18 contests dating back to May 26...now has a 4.57 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League to the Royals (4.74)...is 23-for-33 (56.5%) in save opportunities and has the third lowest save percentage in the AL...has the fourth lowest batting average against first batters faced in the AL (.214)...however, is tied for the most first batter walks (25)...has allowed 30-of-122 (24.6%) inherited runners to score, which is the fourth lowest percentage in the AL...the 122 inherited runners are third most...has yielded 22 home runs, which is tied for fifth fewest in the AL.

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 41-of-49 (83.7%) stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the American League...rank third in steals (41)...A's opponents are 20-for-33 (60.6%) in stolen base attempts, which is the lowest success rate in the AL and the majors...are tied for second in the AL in caught stealing (13) and rank tied for second in fewest stolen bases (20)...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most in the AL.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed one error in each of the last seven games and nine of the last ten...now have 43 errors for the season, which is third most in the American League...however, have just 20 unearned runs, which is tied for third fewest...rank second in double plays (59)...are tied for the third fewest outfield assists (6).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-7 on this nine-game road trip to Atlanta (0-2), Cleveland (1-3) and Boston (0-2)...this trip starts a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 19 of 25 games on the road...went 3-3 on the last road trip and have a 14-20 (.412) record on the road compared to 7-23 (.233) at home...have the worst home record in the majors...return home following the game today for a six-game homestand against Kansas City (three games) and Seattle (three games)...went 1-9 on the last homestand against Texas (1-3), Houston (0-3) and Boston (0-3), which matched the second worst homestand of six or more games in Oakland history...also went 1-9 on a 10-game homestand from July 6-15, 1979 and the worst homestand was 0-6 earlier this year from April 29-May 4...have now lost 20 of the last 23 home games...have a 4.29 ERA (138 er in 289.1 ip) on the road compared to 4.72 at home...are batting .220 (248-for-1129) with 130 runs and 34 home runs in 34 games on the road compared to .200 with 78 runs and 12 home runs in 30 games at home.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 4-11 (.267) in one-run games...are tied with the Mariners and Rangers for the American League lead in one-run losses and have the second worst record to the Rangers (3-11/.214)...are 13-18 (.419) in games decided by two runs or fewer...the 18 losses are third most in the AL and the 31 games are tied for third most...are 0-2 in extra inning games and are one of two teams in the majors without an extra inning win (Dodgers, 0-4)...the two extra inning games are tied for the fewest in the majors

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 17-10 (.630) when scoring first and 4-34 (.108) when the opponent scores first...have the second worst record in the majors when the opponent scores first (Cubs, 2-17/.105)...have seven come-frombehind wins, which is third fewest in the majors (Cubs and Twins, 6)...are 1-11 (.083) in June after going 10-21 (.323) in May...have the worst record in June in the majors...the A's May record was fifth lowest in Oakland history in the month of May...the 21 losses tied for third most in any month in Oakland history and were the most since May of 1997 (9-21)...are averaging 3 hours and 2 minutes per game, which is fourth quickest in the American League and the majors

A's vs. RED SOX: The A's have lost the season series for the second time in the last three season series and fourth time in the last seven season series as they are 0-5 with one game remaining...have never gone winless in a season series against the Red Sox...lost the first game in Boston Tuesday night after being swept in Oakland June 3-5...it was the first time the A's were swept by the Red Sox in Oakland in a series of three or more games since Sept. 6-8, 2004...the only other times the A's went winless against Boston in the season series in Oakland were in 2002 and 2004 (both 0-3)...split the season series last year, 3-3...lost two of three in Oakland and won two of three in Boston...are 16-27 against the Red Sox dating back to 2015...are 250-308 against Boston since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 151-128 in Oakland, 98-179 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 892-1089 against the Red Sox.

# TODAY'S TIDBITS

Christian Bethancourt is batting .343 (12-for-35) with all four of his home runs and seven RBI in 10 games in June...his most home runs in a season is six in 2016... Seth Brown has three home runs on the road trip and now has eight home runs for the season, all of which have come on the road...Dany Jiménez has 10 saves, which is tied for eighth in the American League and is the most among AL rookies...is the sixth rookie in Oakland history with 10 or more saves.

In 1934 Bob Johnson collects six hits in the second game of a double header against Chicago...in **1971** Mike Epstein homers in his first two at bats after homering in his final two at bats the day before to give him four home runs in four at bats, tying a major league record for consecutive home runs...in 1996 Mark McGwire ties an Oakland record with three doubles at Milwaukee and drives in his 790th career run, breaking Sal Bando's Oakland career RBI record.

# **TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Paul Blackburn (5-2, 2.31 ERA)**

FOR STARTERS: Is 0-2 with a 3.86 ERA (8 er in 18.2 ip) over his last three starts after going 5-0 with a 1.70 ERA over his first nine starts...the five-game winning streak was a career high and he became the first starting pitcher on an A's Opening Day roster to start the season 5-0 since Trevor Cahill won his first six decisions in 2011.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for 13th in the American League in games started (12), ranks seventh in ERA (2.31), eighth in opponents slugging percentage (.333) and OPS (.602), 10th in batting average (.214), tied for 12th in wins (5) and 11th in on-base percentage (.268)...has allowed just three home runs and his average of 0.41 home runs per nine innings is fourth lowest in the AL...is averaging tied fourth fewest pitches per inning (14.6).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-0 with a 0.91 ERA (4 er in 39.2 ip), .187 (26-for-139) opponents batting average and .491 OPS in seven starts on the road compared to 1-2 with a 4.39 ERA (13 er in 26.2 ip), .250 (26-for-104) opponents average and .749 OPS in five starts at home...has the lowest road ERA in the majors and is tied for the lead in road wins...has not allowed a home run in 39.2 innings on the road.

*OPPONENTS BATTING:* Has allowed a .185 (23-for-124) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .244 (29-for-119) against left-handers...has surrendered two of his three home runs and issued 10 of his 15 walks to lefties for a .680 OPS (.525 vs. righties)...opponents are 8-for-48 (.167) with runners in scoring position...entered the season with a .328 career opponents average with RISP...has allowed a .130 opponents batting average with two strikes...the number five hitter in the order is 2-for-26 (.077) against him.

BASES ON BALLS: Has walked 12 batters in 35.1 innings over his last six starts (3.06 per nine innings) after issuing just three free passes in 31.0 innings over his first six starts (0.87 per nine innings)...has walked 15 batters in 66.1 innings overall (2.04 per nine innings) and has issued two walks or fewer in 11 of his 12 starts...has four starts with no walks and four with just one...is averaging 2.33 walks per nine innings in his career (53 bb in 204.1 ip).

CAREER BESTS: Has a career-high five wins...had just six wins in 30 games over his first five seasons...also has career highs in games (12), games started (12), strikeouts (47) and innings pitched (66.1).

THIS AND THAT: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 2-0 with a 1.57 ERA (5 er in 28.2 ip) in five starts on five days rest compared to 2-2 with a 3.31 ERA (12 er in 32.2 ip) in six starts on four days rest...is3-0 with a 1.34 ERA (5 er in 33.2 ip) in six starts at night, 2-2 with a 3.31 ERA (12 er in 32.2 ip) in six starts during the day...the A's are 3-2 in his no decisions and are 8-4 (.667) in his starting assignments...has allowed two runs or fewer in nine of his 12 starts

2022 HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed 5.0 scoreless inning and struck out a career-high seven batters in a 13-2 win at Tampa Bay in his first start on April 11...had a no decision in the A's 7-5 win in his second start on April 16 at Toronto... left with a 5-2 lead but the bullpen allowed three runs for the blown save... it was the first of two times he left with a lead only to have the pen blow the save (June 10 at Cleveland)...won back-to-back starts on April 21 against Baltimore and April 27 at San Francisco...combined with five A's relievers on a three-hit, 1-0 shutout in the win over the Giants...tossed five of the innings and allowed all three of the hits while walking one...finished April 3-0 with a 1.35 ERA in four starts...walked just two batters in 20.0 innings and held the opposition to a .197 batting average...it was his first career three-win month and he tied for third in the American League in wins in April...based on a minimum of 20.0 innings, he had the second lowest opponents OPS (.459), ranked third in slugging (.239) and was fourth in ERA and on-base percentage (.219)...combined with Jackson and Jiménez on a four-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Detroit on May 9...tossed 6.2 innings, yielded all four of the hits and did not walk a batter...tossed 5.1 scoreless innings and allowed just one hit in a 4-2 win at Seattle on May 25...however, walked a career-high five batters...was charged with his first loss of the season on May 30 against Houston when he allowed a season-high four runs in 6.2 innings...did not allow a run over the first three innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 10.0 innings...allowed a season-high tying four runs on a season-high seven hits in a season-low 4.0 innings in an 8-0 loss to Boston on June 4 in Oakland.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2 loss at Cleveland last Friday... tossed a career-high 8.0 scoreless innings, walked one and allowed four hits...retired each of the final eight batters he faced and 17 of the last 18... was relieved by Jimenez to start the ninth with a 2-0 lead and Jimenez allowed three runs for the blown save and loss.

**2021 RECAP:** Began the season at Triple-A Las Vegas and was 4-7 with a 4.97 ERA in 17 games, including 16 starts, when he was selected by Oakland on Aug. 18...spent the balance of the season with the A's and went 1-4 with a 5.87 ERA in nine starts...has spent parts of each of the last five seasons with Oakland and his nine starts were the second most of his career (10 in 2017)... had career highs in strikeouts (26), losses (4), runs (26), earned runs (25) and home runs (8) and matched his high in hit batters (2) and wild pitches (1).

WITH OAKLAND: Allowed a .319 opponents batting average but walked just 10 batters in 38.1 innings (2.35 walks per nine innings) for a .366 opponents on-base percentage...his opponents batting average broke down to .309 (29-for-94) with an .858 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .333 (23-for-69) with a .953 OPS against left-handers...opponents hit .333 with runners in scoring position...was 0-1 with a 4.03 ERA and .720 opponents OPS in five starts at home, 1-3 with an 8.44 ERA and 1.115 OPS in four starts on the road...yielded seven of his eight home runs on the road...was 1-1 with a 3.38 ERA in four starts during the day, 0-3 with an 8.24 ERA in five starts at night...allowed a .533 batting average to the opponents number nine hitter and .438 average to the seven hitter...the A's were 3-1 in his no decisions and went 4-5 (.444) in his starting assignments...tossed fewer than six innings in all nine starts, including fewer than five innings four times.

WITH LAS VEGAS: His seven losses with the Aviators were his most as a minor leaguer and his .311 opponents batting average was a career high...surrendered just eight home runs in 88.2 innings, an average of 0.81 per nine innings...his opponents batting average broke down to .300 (61-for-203) with an .824 OPS against lefthanded hitters and .323 (53-for-164) with a .776 OPS against right-handers...yielded six of his eight home runs and issued 18 of his 27 walks to lefties...opponents hit .311 with the bases empty, .311 with runners on...six of the eight home runs he allowed were solo shots...had a .296 opponents average and allowed one home run the first time through the order, .307 with three home runs the second time and .337 with four home runs after that...went 2-3 with a 4.24 ERA, .287 opponents batting average and .737 OPS in nine starts at home, 2-4 with a 5.79 ERA, .333 opponent average and .867 OPS on the road...tossed six innings or fewer in each of his 17 appearances...the Aviators were 5-11 (.313) in his starting assignments.

RHP Frankie Montas (3-6, 3.40 ERA): Snapped his career-high five-game losing streak in his last start, a 10-5 A's win at Cleveland last Saturday (6.0 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 2 so)...is now 3-6 with a 3.40 ERA in 13 starts...the A's have been shut out in three of his starts and have scored one run three times...he has allowed two runs or fewer in eight of his 13 starts...has received one run of support or fewer in nine of his 13 starts and 27 runs of support in his 13 starts this year (76.2 ip, 3.17 RSA)...is 1-4 with a 2.45 ERA and .194 opponents batting average in eight starts at home compared to 2-2 with a 5.33 ERA and .273 opponents batting average in five starts on the road...has allowed eight of his 33 runs (24.2%) in the third inning for a 6.00 ERA...is 2-1 with a 3.08 ERA (26.1 ip, 27 h, 10 r, 9 er, 3 bb, 20 so, 3 hr) in five career appearances, including four starts, against Kansas City...was 0-1 with a 5.59 ERA (9.2 ip, 13 h, 7 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 12 so, 1 hr) in two starts last year.

- Is tied for sixth in the American League in holds (10)...is eighth among AL relievers in strikeouts (34).
- Has a .207 opponents batting average but has issued 18 walks for a .353 on-base percentage...the walk are tied for second most among Major League relievers (Coleman, KC 21).
- Has faced the Red Sox once in his career and it came earlier this month in Oakland on June 5 (1.0 ip, 2 so).

Last Year: Split his season between Double-A Midland and Triple-A Las Vegas and combined for a 2-2 record, a career-high tying six saves and a 2.57 ERA in 25 relief appearances before a right hip labral tear ended his season in mid-July.
