# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (22-43) VS. KANSAS CITY ROYALS (21-41)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost three of the last four games and 13 of the last 15... are 7-23 (.233) over the last 30 contests and 22-43 (.338) overall, which is the worst record in the majors behind the Royals (21-41, .339)...are 21 games under .500, which is one short of the season low (21-43 on June 15)...are tied with the 1994 A's for the second worst record in Oakland history after 65 games...the worst is 19-46 in 1979...won game 66 in 1994 and lost game 66 in 1979...are 2-13-1 over the last 16 series...have been in sole possession of last place in the American League West every day dating back to May 27 and have held at least a share of last every day except one dating back to May 4 (fourth on May 25)...trail first place Houston by 18 games, which is one-half game short of the season high of 18½ on June 15...snapped a 10-game losing streak last Saturday...it was the A's longest losing streak since May 30-June 9, 2011 when they also lost 10 straight...also had a nine-game losing streak this year (April 29-May 8) and this is the first time the A's have two losing streaks of nine or more game in one season since 1978.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a six-game homestand against Kansas City (three games) and Seattle (three games) tonight...these are the A's only six home games over a 25-game stretch from June 7-July 3...went 1-9 on the last homestand against Texas (1-3), Houston (0-3) and Boston (0-3), which matched the second worst homestand of six or more games in Oakland history...also went 1-9 on a 10-game homestand from July 6-15, 1979 and the worst homestand was 0-6 earlier this year from April 29-May 4...have now lost 20 of the last 23 home games...are 7-23 (.233) at home compared to 15-20 (.429) on the road...the home record is the worst in the majors and second worst in Athletics history after 30 games...the 1920 Philadelphia A's started the year 6-23-1 (.207) at home (lost home game 31 in 1920)...are batting ...200 (191-for-953) with 78 runs scored and 12 home runs in 30 games at home compared to .220 with 134 runs and 34 home runs at home...went 2-7 on the last road trip to Atlanta (0-2), Cleveland (1-3) and Boston (1-2).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .198 (97-for-489) with 39 runs scored over the last 15 games (2.6 runs per game)...are hitting .211 for the season, which is the lowest mark in the majors...also have the lowest on-base percentage (.274), the second lowest slugging percentage (.332) and OPS (.607) and are tied for the second fewest runs scored (212)...had their season-best streak of six consecutive games with a home run end yesterday...have 12 home runs in the last seven games but just 46 for the season, which is tied with the Royals for second fewest in the majors (Tigers, 31)...have been held to one run or fewer in 22 of 65 (33.8%) games this year, which are the most such games in the majors...have been shut out seven times, which is tied for seventh most in the majors and matches the A's season total from last year.

**PITCHING:** The A's compiled a 6.03 ERA in nine games on the last road trip and now have a 5.63 ERA (163 er in 260.2 ip) over the last 30 games...have a 4.44 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League to the Royals (5.12)...have the third highest opponents batting average (.255), slugging percentage (.415) and OPS (.740) and fourth highest on-base percentage (.324)...have issued the fourth most walks (204) and are tied for the third fewest strikeouts (485).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 2-3 with a 7.66 ERA (21 er in 24.2 ip) over the last five games and 3-17 with a 5.15 ERA (98 er in 171.1 ip) over the last 33 contests...are 14-31 with a 4.46 ERA for the season...the losses are the most in the American League and tied with the Reds for second most in the majors (Nationals, 38)...rank fourth in the AL in innings pitched (337.0) and highest ERA and tied for fourth in fewest wins.

**THE BULLPEN:** Yesterday, the A's bullpen had its first save since May 25 at Seattle...the pen has not allowed an earned run in three of the last five games (5 er in 17.1 ip, 2.60 ERA) but is 1-6 with one save, five blown saves and a 7.29 ERA (51 er in 63.0 ip) over the last 19 contests dating back to May 26...has a 4.42 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League to the Royals (4.74)...is 24-for-34 (58.3%) in save opportunities and has the fourth lowest save percentage...has allowed 31-of-126 (24.6%) inherited runners to score, which is the fourth lowest percentage...the 126 inherited runners are third most...has the fifth lowest batting average against first batters faced (.220) but is tied with the Yankees for the most first batter walks (25).

**ON THE BASES:** The A's have been successful in 41-of-49 (83.7%) stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the American League (White Sox, 93.9%)...are tied for third in steals (41)...A's opponents are 20-for-33 (60.6%) in stolen base attempts, which is the lowest success rate in the AL and the majors...are tied for second in the AL in fewest stolen bases

allowed (20) and rank third in most caught stealing (13)...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most in the AL.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's committed two errors yesterday after making one in each of the previous seven games...the streak of eight consecutive games with an error matches the longest by an A's team over the last four years...also had an eight-game streak earlier this year from April 19-27...now have 45 errors for the season, which is tied with the Rangers for the most in the American League...however, have 22 unearned runs, which is fifth fewest...rank second in double plays (59)...are tied for the third fewest outfield assists (6).

**PLAYER NOTES:** The A's have used 46 players this year, which is third most in the American League...employed 50 players last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season...21 of the 46 players have been rookies, which ties the Oakland record for most rookies in a season (21 in 2008)...have set the Oakland record for rookie pitchers with 13 (previous: 12 in 2009, 12, 15 and 16)...10 of the rookies have made their Major League debut, which is the A's most since 2016 when they set the Oakland record with 15...currently have 10 rookies on the roster, including seven pitchers...have used nine starting pitchers, which matches the season total from each of the previous two years.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 5-11 (.313) in one-run games...are tied for the American League lead in one-run losses and have the third worst record...are 14-18 (.438) in games decided by two runs or fewer...the 18 losses are third most in the AL and the 32 games are tied for fourth most...are 0-2 in extra inning games and are one of two teams in the majors without an extra inning win (Dodgers, 0-4)...the two extra inning games are tied for the fewest in the majors.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 17 times this year, which includes eight Covid-19 IL placements...currently have five players on the IL (Bolt, Guerra, Honeywell, Jefferies, Piscotty)...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 18-9 (.667) when scoring first and 4-34 (.105) when the opponent scores first...have the second worst record in the majors when the opponent scores first (Cubs, 2-18/.100)...have seven come-frombehind wins, which is third fewest in the majors (Cubs and Twins, 6)...are 2-11 (.154) in June after going 10-21 (.323) in May...have the worst record in June in the majors behind the Angels (3-12/.200)...the A's May record was fifth lowest in Oakland history in the month of May...the 21 losses tied for third most in any month in Oakland history and were the most since May of 1997 (9-21)...are averaging 3 hours and 2 minutes per game, which is fourth quickest in the American League and the majors.

**A's vs. ROYALS:** The A's won the season series last year as they went 5-2 against the Royals for the third consecutive season series...won three of four in Oakland and two of three in Kansas City...are now 24-10 (.706) against the Royals dating back to 2016 and have outscored Kansas City 211-123 over that span (6.2 runs per game to 3.6)...are 11-6 in Oakland and 13-4 in Kansas City...all-time, the A's are 332-269 (.552) against the Royals...the only American League team the A's have a better record against is Tampa Bay (.583)...are 180-120 in Oakland and 152-149 in Kansas City.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

*Christian Bethancourt* is hitting .333 (13-for-39) with four home runs and nine RBI in 11 games in June...his most home runs in a season is six in 2016...*Seth Brown* is tied for third in the American League in go-ahead home runs (6) and tied for seventh in go-ahead RBI (11)...*Dany Jiménez* has 11 saves, which is tied for eighth in the American League and is the most among AL rookies...is the sixth rookie in Oakland history with 10 or more saves.

#### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1967** the A's and Tigers set an American League record for longest doubleheader with a combined time of nine hours and five minutes...the first game includes a rain delay and the second goes 19 innings before Dave Duncan homers for a 6-5 win...in **1988** Stan Javier's RBI double in the bottom of the 14th inning leads the A's to a 7-6 win over Texas...the A's would play three extra inning games in the three game series with the Rangers... in **1996** Terry Steinbach hits a grand slam in the 10th inning as the A's defeat Detroit, 8-4.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (3-6, 3.40 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Snapped his career-high five-game losing streak in his last start and is now 3-6 with a 3.40 ERA in 13 starts...the A's have been shut out in three of his starts and have scored one run three times...he has allowed two runs or fewer in eight of his 13 starts, including no runs twice and one run twice...has allowed two earned runs or fewer nine times...the A's have lost in all four of his no decisions and are 3-10 (.231) in his starting assignments.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Received seven runs of support in his last start after getting one run of support or fewer in each of his previous seven starts (four runs of support total)...has received one run of support or fewer in nine of his 13 starts and four runs or more in the other four...has 27 runs of support in his 13 starts this year (76.2 ip, 3.17 RSA).

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Is tied for the American League lead in games started (13), tied for fifth in strikeouts (80), ranks sixth in innings pitched (76.2), seventh in opponents on-base percentage (.266) and 10th in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.71)...is tied for fifth in losses (6).

STRIKEOUTS: Struck out 11 batters on May 26 against Texas after fanning 12 batters on May 15 against Los Angeles (AL)...now has nine career 10-strikeout games, which is tied for third most in Oakland history...has one game with 13 strikeouts, one with 12 and two with 11...has 80 strikeouts this year, which is tied for fifth in the American League...had 207 strikeouts last year, which ranked fourth in the AL and was the second highest single-season total in Oakland history.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .186 (11-for-59) batting average with runners in scoring position...has yielded six home runs in 147 at bats against left-handed hitters, two in 138 against right-handers...has issued 12 of his 17 walks to lefties...opponents are batting .146 with two strikes and he has a .161 career average in that situation.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 1-4 with a 2.45 ERA (14 er in 51.1 ip) and .194 (36-for-186) opponents batting average in eight starts at home compared to 2-2 with a 5.33 ERA (15 er in 25.1 ip) and .273 (27-for-99) opponents batting average in five starts on the road...in six seasons with the A's, he is 17-15 with a 3.37 ERA (102 er in 272.2 ip) in 56 games at home, 17-12 with a 4.22 ERA (111 er in 237.0 ip) in 52 games on the road.

**THE THIRD INNING:** Has allowed eight of his 33 runs (24.2%) in the third inning for a 6.00 ERA (8 er in 12.0 ip)...has a 2.10 ERA (6 er in 25.2 ip) over innings 1-2 and a 2.76 ERA (12 er in 38.2 ip) in innings 4-7...has yielded three runs in the eighth inning (0.1 ip)...last year, he allowed 20 of his 79 runs (25.3%) in the third inning for a 5.68 ERA, .316 opponents batting average and .854 OPS.

*DAYS REST*: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 2-4 with a 1.71 ERA (10 er in 52.2 ip) and .188 (36-for-192) opponents batting average in eight starts on four days rest, 1-1 with a 6.63 ERA (14 er in 19.0 ip) and .292 (21-for-72) opponents average in four starts on five days rest...in his career, he is 13-13 with a 2.64 ERA (62 er in 211.1 ip) in 35 starts on four days rest, 18-12 with a 4.19 ERA (111 er in 238.1 ip) in 43 starts on five days rest or more.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 2-1 with a 2.73 ERA (10 er in 33.0 ip) in six starts at night compared to 1-5 with a 3.92 ERA (19 er in 43.2 ip) in seven starts during the day...leads the majors in losses in day games...now has a career record of 21-13 at night and 13-16 during the day.

2022 HIGHLIGHTS: Made his second career Opening Day start on April 8 at Philadelphia and was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-5 loss...his other Open-ing Day start came in 2020 and he is now 0-1 with a 6.00 ERA (9.0 ip, 9 h, 6 r, 6 r, 4 bb, 11 so) in two openers...the loss was his first since Aug. 16, 2021 as he finished the 2021 season with a four-game winning streak...allowed a season-high five runs in 5.0 innings...then won consecutive starts on April 13 at Tampa Bay and April 18 against Baltimore...was 2-1 with a 3.63 ERA over his first three starts through April 18...then had a career-high five-game losing streak from April 23 to June 5 (previous: 3, two times, last: May 19-29, 2021)...compiled a 2.87 ERA and .214 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which spanned nine starts...logged a season-high 7.1 innings on April 23 against Texas but took the loss in a 2-0 decision...it was his first start over 7.0 innings since June 20, 2019 against Tampa Bay when he pitched 8.0 innings and it snapped an Athletics record streak of 47 consecutive starts of seven innings or fewer...did not allow a hit until K. Calhoun singled in the fifth and had a one-hit shutout entering the eighth inning... retired the first batter before allowing back-to-back singles to Garcia and W. Calhoun...was relieved by Acevedo, who allowed both runs to score...Perez and three Texas relievers combined to shut out the A's on three hits...it was the first of three times the A's were shut out in one of his starts (May 4 vs.

Tampa Bay, May 10 at Detroit)...had a no decision in the A's 9-8 loss to Cleve land in Oakland on April 29...struck out Franmil Reyes to end the fifth inning for his 500th career strikeout...walked a season-high four batters, allowed a season-high two home runs and matched his highs in runs (5)...left with a 6-5 lead but the pen allowed four runs in the seventh inning for the blown save...finished April 2-2 with a 4.25 ERA but held the opposition to a .194 batting average...tied for third in the American League in strikeouts (31) and had the sixth lowest opponents batting average...then went 0-3 despite a 2.31 ERA and .219 opponents batting average in six starts in May ... threw a season-high 105 pitches in a 6-0 loss at Detroit in the first game of the May 10 doubleheader...struck out a season-high 12 batters in a 4-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on May 15 in Oakland...had a no decision in his next start on May 21 at Los Angeles (AL) after leaving the game with two outs in the second inning after being hit in the hand by a Rengifo line drive...the 1.2 innings pitched matched the shortest start of his career (Aug. 18, 2020 at Arizona)... struck out 11 in 7.0 innings on May 26 against Texas, his ninth career game of 10 or more strikeouts...went over the 500 innings pitched mark in his career.

LAST START: He snapped his career-high five game losing streak in the A's 10-5 win at Cleveland last Saturday...allowed a season-high tying five runs on a season-high eight hits in 6.0 innings...blanked the Guardians on one hit over the first three innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed four runs in the fourth on a Ramirez RBI double, a Naylor RBI fielders choice, a Miller sacrifice fly a Palacios RBI bunt single...also yielded a RBI double to Miller in the sixth but the A's scored five times in the seventh to take a 7-5 lead...was relieved by Acevedo to start the bottom of the seventh.

LHP Cole Irvin (2-3, 3.34 ERA): Was reinstated from the 15-day injured list May 22 and is 0-2 with a 3.72 ERA in five starts since his return...was 2-1 with a 2.93 ERA in five starts when he was placed on the IL May 6 retroactive to May 2 with left shoulder tendinitis...is 1-0 with a 1.61 ERA and .238 opponents batting average in five starts at home compared to 1-3 with a 5.02 ERA and .284 opponents average in five starts on the road...has not allowed a home run in 28.0 innings at home...is scheduled to make his 11th start of the season tomorrow, his eighth in a day game...last year he made 17 of his 32 starts during the day, which tied for the most in the majors...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 6-3 A's loss at Cleveland last Sunday (5.2 ip, 6 h, 5 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...is 1-0 with a 1.38 ERA (13.0 ip, 11 h, 3 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 9 so, 1 hr) in two career starts against Kansas City...had a no decision in his only start last year, a 4-3 A's win in Oakland on June 11 (6.0 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 4 so).
