# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (22-44) VS. KANSAS CITY ROYALS (22-41)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost four of the last five games and 14 of the last 16... are 7-24 (.226) over the last 31 contests and 22-44 (.333) overall, which is the worst record in the majors behind the Nationals (23-45, .338)...are a seasonlow tying 22 games under .500 (also 21-43 on June 15).... have not been more than 22 games under .500 since finishing the 2016 season 24 games under (69-93)...have the second worst record in Oakland history after 66 games (19-47 in 1979, lost game 67)... have lost six consecutive series for the first time since July 11-August 20, 2008 when they lost 11 straight...are 2-13-1 over the previous 16 series...have been in sole possession of last place in the American League West every day dating back to May 27 and have held at least a share of last every day except one dating back to May 4 (fourth on May 25)...trail first place Houston by a season-high 19 games, which is the A's largest deficit in the West since finishing the 2017 season 26 games out... snapped a 10 -game losing streak a week ago today...it was the A's longest losing streak since May 30-June 9, 2011 when they also lost 10 straight... also had a nine-game losing streak this year (April 29-May 8) and this is the first time the A's have two losing streaks of nine or more game in one season since 1978.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on this six-game homestand against Kansas City ( $0-1$ ) and Seattle (three games)...these are the A's only six home games over a 25 -game stretch from June 7 -July 3 ...have a season-high tying seven-game home losing streak (April 29-May 13)...have not lost more than seven straight home games since losing eight in a row from June 19-July $3,2017 \ldots$...went 1-9 on the last homestand against Texas (1-3), Houston (03 ) and Boston ( $0-3$ ), which matched the second worst homestand of six or more games in Oakland history...also went 1-9 on a 10-game homestand from July 6-15, 1979 and the worst homestand was 0-6 earlier this year from April 29-May 4...have now lost 21 of the last 24 home games...are 7-24 (.226) at home compared to 15-20 (.429) on the road...the home record is the worst in the majors and second worst in Athletics history after 31 games...t the 1920 Philadelphia A's started the year 6-24-1 (.194) at home (lost home game 32 in 1920)...are batting . 199 ( 196 -for-985) with 79 runs scored ( 2.6 per game) and 12 home runs in 31 games at home compared to .220 with 134 runs (3.8 per game) and 34 home runs in 35 games on the road...rank last in the majors in batting, runs and home runs at home...went 2-7 on the last road trip to Atlanta ( $0-2$ ), Cleveland ( $1-3$ ) and Boston ( $1-2$ ).
OFFENSE: The A's were held to one run for the third time in the last four games yesterday...have now scored one run or fewer in 23 of the 66 games ( $34.8 \%$ ), which are the most such games in the majors.... had just 21 games with one run or fewer all last year...have been shut out seven times, which is tied for seventh most in the majors and matches the A's season total from last year...have 213 runs for the season, which is third fewest in the majors....are batting . 196 (102-for-521) with 40 runs scored over the last 16 games ( 2.5 runs per game)...are hitting . 210 for the season, which is the lowest mark in the majors.... have the second lowest on-base percentage (.274), slugging percentage (.330) and OPS (.605) and the second fewest home runs (46)...struck out a season-high 16 times last night and have 563 strikeouts for the season, which is third most in the American League.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.54 ERA (166 er in 269.2 ip) over the last 31 games...have a 4.42 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League to the Royals (5.05)...have the third highest opponents batting average (.256), slugging percentage (.415) and OPS (.741) and fourth highest on-base percentage (.325)...have issued the fourth most walks (209) and have the fourth fewest strikeouts (493).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are $2-4$ with a 7.28 ERA ( 24 er in 29.2 ip ) over the last six games and 3-18 with a 5.16 ERA (101 er in 176.1 ip) over the last 34 contests....are 14-32 with a 4.47 ERA for the season...the losses are the most in the American League and second most in the majors (Nationals, 39)...rank fourth in the AL in innings pitched (342.0), highest ERA and fewest wins.

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has not allowed an earned run in four of the last six games ( 5 er in $21.1 \mathrm{ip}, 2.11 \mathrm{ERA}$ ) but is $1-6$ with one save, five blown saves and a 6.85 ERA ( 51 er in 67.0 ip) over the last 20 contests dating back to May $26 \ldots$...had its first save since May 25 at Seattle on Thursday at Boston... has a 4.34 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League to the Royals (4.66)...is 24 -for- 34 ( $58.3 \%$ ) in save opportunities and has the fourth lowest save percentage... has allowed 31-of-126 (24.6\%) inherited runners to score, which is the fourth lowest percentage in the AL...the 126 inherited runners are third most.

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 41-of-49 (83.7\%) stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the American League (White Sox, 93.9\%)...rank fourth in steals...A's opponents are 21-for-34
( $61.8 \%$ ) in stolen base attempts, which is the second lowest success rate in the AL and the majors (Yankees, 61.5\%)...rank third in the AL in fewest stolen bases allowed (21) and most caught stealing (13)...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most in the AL.
DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in each of the last nine games (10 errors total), which is the longest streak by an A's team since an 11-game streak from April 6-18, 2017...now have 46 errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and fourth most in the majors...rank second in double plays (61) and tied for third in fewest outfield assists (6).

PLAYER NOTES: The A's have used 46 players, which is third most in the American League...employed 50 players last year and 38 in the pandemicshortened 2020 season... 21 of the 46 players have been rookies, which ties the Oakland record for most rookies in a season (21 in 2008)...have set the Oakland record for rookie pitchers with 13 (previous: 12 in 2009, 12, 15 and 16)... 10 of the rookies have made their Major League debut, which is the A's most since 2016 when they set the Oakland record with 15...currently have 10 rookies on the roster, including seven pitchers... have used nine starting pitchers, which matches the season total from each of the previous two years.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 5-11 (.313) in one-run games....are tied for the second most one-run losses in the American League and have the third worst record....are 14-18 (.438) in games decided by two runs or fewer...t the 18 losses are third most in the AL and the 32 games are tied for fourth most.... are 0-2 in extra inning games and are one of two teams in the majors without an extra inning win (Dodgers, 0-5)...the two extra inning games are tied for the fewest in the majors.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 17 times this year, which includes eight Covid-19 IL placements...currently have five players on the IL (Bolt, Guerra, Honeywell, Jefferies, Piscotty)...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 18-9 (.667) when scoring first and 4-35 (.103) when the opponent scores first... have the second worst record in the majors when the opponent scores first (Cubs, 2-18/.100)... have seven come-frombehind wins, which is third fewest in the majors (Cubs and Twins, 6)...are 4-17 in the first game of a series...are 2-12 (.143) in June after going 10-21 (.323) in May...have the worst record in June in the majors behind the Angels (3-13/.188)...the A's May record was fifth lowest in Oakland history in the month of May...the 21 losses tied for third most in any month in Oakland history and were the most since May of 1997 (9-21)...are averaging 3 hours and 3 minutes per game, which is fourth quickest in the American League and the majors.

A's vs. ROYALS: The A's lost the first meeting of 2022 last night...won the season series last year as they went 5-2 against the Royals for the third consecutive season series...won three of four in Oakland and two of three in Kansas City...are now 24-11 (.686) against the Royals dating back to 2016 and have outscored Kansas City 212-128 over that span ( 6.1 runs per game to 3.6 )... are 11-7 in Oakland and 13-4 in Kansas City...all-time, the A's are 332-270 (.551) against the Royals...the only American League team the A's have a better record against is Tampa Bay (.583)...are 180-121 in Oakland and 152-149 in Kansas City.

Christian Bethancourt is hitting . 310 (13-for-42) with four home runs and nine RBI in 12 games in June... his most home runs in a season is six in 2016...Seth Brown is tied for third in the American League in go-ahead home runs (6) and tied for seventh in go-ahead RBI (11)...Dany Jiménez has 11 saves, which is tied for eighth in the American League and is the most among AL rookies... is the sixth rookie in Oakland history with 10 or more saves.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY
In 1984 Davey Lopes hits an inside-the park home run in the A's 10-2 win over the Kansas City Royals...in 1993 the A's overcome a then club record eight-run deficit to defeat the Kansas City Royals 10-9....trailing 8-0 entering the bottom of the second, the A's score twice in the second and six times in the fifth before Craig Paquette's two-run seventh inning homer puts the A's ahead for good...in 1996 Mark McGwire homers in the fifth inning of the A's $8-5$ win at Detroit to extend his Oakland record streak of consecutive games reaching base to 62 .

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (2-3, 3.34 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 15-day injured list May 22 and is 0-2 with a 3.72 ERA ( 12 er in 29.0 ip ) in five starts since his return...was 2-1 with a 2.93 ERA in five starts when he was placed on the IL May 6 retroactive to May 2 with left shoulder tendinitis....made one rehab start with Low-A Stockton on May 17 against Modesto and was the winning pitcher in the Ports 4-3 win ( $5.0 \mathrm{ip}, 5 \mathrm{~h}, 1 \mathrm{r}, 1 \mathrm{er}, 6$ so, 1 hr ).

DON'T WALK: Has walked 13 batters in 56.2 innings, an average of 2.06 per nine innings...walked just 42 batters in 178.1 innings last year and his average of 2.12 walks per nine innings was eighth lowest in the American League...has walked two batters or fewer in each of his 10 starts this year and 41 of his 45 career starts...has walked just 69 batters in 280.1 career innings (2.06 per nine innings)

OR STRIKEOUT: Has struck out just 37 batters in 56.2 innings, an average of 5.88 per nine innings...last year, he fanned just 125 batters and his average of 6.31 strikeouts per nine innings was third lowest in the AL and the majors...h has struck out four batters or fewer in nine of his 10 starts.
HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-0 with a 1.61 ERA (5 er in 28.0 ip) and . 238 (25-for105) opponents batting average in five starts at home compared to $1-3$ with a 5.02 ERA ( 16 er in 28.2 ip ) and . 284 ( 33 -for-116) opponents average in five starts on the road...has allowed all seven of his home runs on the road.

THE FIRST INNING: Has allowed 10 of his 23 runs in the first inning and has a 7.20 ERA ( 8 er in 10.0 ip ) and . 356 (16-for-45) opponents batting average... has a 1.35 ERA ( 6 er in 40.0 ip ) and .219 (32-for-146) opponents average over innings two through five...has a 9.45 ERA (7 er in 6.2 ip ) and . 333 (10-for-30) opponents average from the sixth inning on.
THIS AND THAT: Is scheduled to make his 11th start of the season today, his eighth in a day game...last year he made 17 of his 32 starts during the day, which tied for the most in the majors...has a 310 (26-for-84) opponents batting average the first time through the order, . 234 ( 32 -for- 137 ) after that... five of the seven home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...the opponents number three hitter in the order is 3 -for- 28 (.143) against him.
2022 HIGHLIGHTS: Faced his former team in his first start on April 9 at Philadelphia and was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss...yielded a career-high tying three home runs...then went 2-0 with a 2.01 ERA over his next four starts...tossed a season-high 6.1 innings for the win in his second start on April 14 at Tampa Bay, a 6-3 A's win...retired 14 consecutive batters at one point....allowed one run or fewer in three consecutive starts from April 1930...walked a season-high two batters in four consecutive starts from April 19-May 22...struck out exactly four batters in five consecutive starts from April 19-May 27...that matched the longest streak of consecutive starts with exactly four strikeouts in Athletics history (Brandon McCarthy, April 11-May 2, 2012)...combined with Jackson, Snead and Jiménez on a four-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Texas April 24 in Oakland...tossed five of the innings and allowed just one hit while walking two...the blanked Cleveland over the first three innings on April 30 to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 12 innings...was $2-1$ with a 2.93 ERA in five starts when he was placed on the 15-day injured list May 6 retroactive to May 2 with left shoulder tendinitis... made one rehab start with Low-A Stockton on May 17 against Modesto and was the winning pitcher in the Ports $4-3 \mathrm{win}(5.0 \mathrm{ip}, 5 \mathrm{~h}, 1 \mathrm{r}, 1 \mathrm{er}, 6 \mathrm{so}, 1 \mathrm{hr}$ )... was reinstated on May 22 and started and lost that day at Los Angeles (AL)... allowed a season-high eight hits...left his start on May 27 against Texas with a $5-2$ lead but the bullpen blew the save...walked a season-high tying two batters in 5.2 innings in a 5-4 loss to Houston on June 1...struck out a seasonhigh six batters in 5.1 innings in a no decision at Atlanta on June 7.
LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-3 loss at Cleveland last Sunday...allowed a season-high five runs in 5.2 innings of work...Oakland scored a run in the first but he allowed three in the bottom of the first on a two-run double by Ramirez and a Miller RBI single...then retired each of the next 13 batters before Straw singled to start the sixth...Straw scored on a Rosario double and Rosario scored on a Naylor single...left trailing 5-1.


IRVIN vs. KANSAS CITY: Is $1-0$ with a 1.38 ERA ( $13.0 \mathrm{ip}, 11 \mathrm{~h}, 3 \mathrm{r}, 2 \mathrm{er}, 1 \mathrm{bb}$, 9 so, 1 hr ) in two career starts...had a no decision in his only start last year,

2021 RECAP: Was acquired by the A's from Philadelphia for cash considerations on Jan. 30, 2021 and went 10-15 with a 4.24 ERA in 32 starts...his 15 losses were the most in the American League, tied for third most in the majors and matched the most by an A's pitcher over the last 13 years (Jesse Chavez, 2015)...is the first Athletic to lead the league in losses since Tom Candiotti in 1998...tied for the AL lead in games started and ranked 10th in innings pitched (178.1)...had a .281 opponents batting average and his 195 hits allowed were the most in the AL and second most in the majors... his 94 runs were fifth most in the AL and his nine hit batters tied for 10th most....averaged 15.0 pitches per inning, which was the fewest in the AL and fourth fewest in the majors...struck out just 125 batters and his average of 6.31 strikeouts per nine innings was third lowest in the AL and the majors... allowed 23 home runs and ranked seventh in the AL in fewest home runs per nine innings (1.16)...his opponents batting average broke down to 270 (143-for-530) with a .739 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to . 289 ( 52 -for-180) with a .767 OPS against left-handers...surrendered 18 of his 23 home runs to righties... 17 of the home runs were solo shots...allowed a .324 average with runners in scoring position, which was the highest in the majors and fifth highest in Oakland history...was 1-10 with a 6.60 ERA and .890 OPS in 12 starts on four days rest compared to $9-4$ with a 2.84 ERA and . 657 OPS in 19 starts on five days rest or more...led the majors in losses and highest ERA on four days rest and had the second highest OPS...tied for third in the AL in wins on five days rest or more, ranked fourth in ERA and sixth in OPS...opponents hit . 440 with a 1.462 OPS when putting his curveball in play...the OPS was the highest in the majors among pitchers with 75 or more curveballs in play... had 20 assists, which tied for sixth most among AL pitchers...left with the lead only to have the pen blow the save in five of his starts...went 10-3 in 18 starts with more than two runs of support, 0-12 in 14 starts with support of two runs or fewer.

LHP Jared Koenig (0-2, 11.25): Was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas June 8 and is scheduled to make his third start of the season and his career today... has taken the loss in each of his first two starts, including his last outing on Monday at Boston, a 6-1 A's loss ( $4.0 \mathrm{ip}, 9 \mathrm{~h}, 6 \mathrm{r}, 6 \mathrm{er}, 2 \mathrm{bb}, 3 \mathrm{so}, 2 \mathrm{hr}$ )...is the first A's pitcher to lose each of first two career games since Daniel Gossett in 2017...was 4-2 with a 2.21 ERA in nine games, including eight starts, with Tri-ple-A Las Vegas...struck out 61 batters in 53.0 innings....at the time of his June 8 promotion to Oakland, he ranked second in the Pacific Coast League in ERA (2.21), tied for second in strikeouts (61 and tied for third in wins (4)...pitched in independent leagues from 2017-19 and combined for a 22-10 record and a 3.40 ERA in 53 games, including 47 starts, in three seasons of independent ball...was signed by the A's as a free agent on Jan. 14, 2020 and is 11-7 with a 2.94 ERA in 33 games, including 39 starts, in two seasons in the minors.

- Is tied for fourth in the American League in holds (11)...is tied for sixth among AL relievers in strikeouts (36)
- Has a 207 opponents batting average but has issued 18 walks for a .353 on-base percentage...the walk are tied for second most among Major League relievers (Coleman, KC 22).
- Has never faced the Royals in his career.
