# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (22-45) VS. KANSAS CITY ROYALS (23-41)

ABOUT THE A's: Have lost the first two games of this series and have now lost seven consecutive series, which is the A's longest such streak since July 11-August 20, 2008 when they lost 11 straight...are 2-14-1 over the last 17 series...have lost five of the last six games and 15 of the last 17...are 7-25 (.219) over the last 32 contests and 22-45 (.328) overall, which is the worst record in the majors behind the Nationals (23-46, .333)...are 23 games under .500 for the first time since finishing the 2016 season 24 games under (6993)... have the second worst record in Oakland history after 67 games (19-48 in 1979, won game 68)... have been in sole possession of last place in the American League West every day dating back to May 27 and have held at least a share of last every day except one dating back to May 4 (fourth on May 25)...trail first place Houston by a season-high 19 games for the second consecutive day, which is the A's largest deficit in the West since finishing the 2017 season 26 games out.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's extended their home losing streak to a seasonhigh eight games yesterday, which is tied for the fourth longest home losing streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since June 19-July 3, 2017 when they also lost eight straight... have not lost more than eight straight in Oakland since a nine-game losing streak from June 4-20, 1982...are 0-2 on this six-game homestand against Kansas City (0-2) and Seattle (three games)... these are the A's only six home games over a 25 -game stretch from June 7-July 3 ...went 1-9 on the last homestand, which matched the second worst homestand of six or more games in Oakland history...the worst was 0-6 earlier this year from April 29-May 4...won three of four from Baltimore in the first home series of the season but have lost each of the nine home series since then...are 7-25 (.219) at home compared to 15-20 (.429) on the road... the home record is the worst in the majors and second worst in Athletics history after 32 games...the 1920 Philadelphia A's started the year 6-25-1 (.188) at home (won home game 33 in 1920)...are batting. 195 (198-for-1013) with 79 runs scored ( 2.5 per game) and 12 home runs in 32 games at home compared to .220 with 134 runs ( 3.8 per game) and 34 home runs in 35 games on the road...rank last in the majors in batting, runs and home runs at home... went 2-7 on the last road trip to Atlanta ( $0-2$ ), Cleveland ( $1-3$ ) and Boston (1-2).

MONTH-BY-MONTH: The A's are 2-13 (.133) in June and with one more loss will clinch a losing record in June for the first time since 2017 (12-16)...have the lowest winning percentage in the majors in June behind the Pirates (412/.250)...went 10-21 (.323) in May, which was third worst in the majors and fifth worst in Oakland history in May...the 21 losses tied for third most in any month in Oakland history and were the most since May of 1997 (9-21)...had a 10-11 (.476) in April.
FATHER'S DAY: The A's have a 31-25 (.554) record on Father's Day since moving to Oakland in 1968...are 19-11 (.633) at home and 12-14 (.462) on the road...will play at home on Father's Day for the 10th time in the last 12 years...are 3-0 against the Royals, with the last meeting coming in 2000 in a 21-3 victory.
OFFENSE: The A's were shut out for the eighth time this year yesterday, which is tied for fourth most in the majors and is the most by an A's team since 2016 (11)...have scored one run or fewer in four of the last five games and 24 of 67 ( $35.8 \%$ ) this year... had just 21 games with one run or fewer all last year... have scored 213 runs for the season, which is second fewest in the majors to the Tigers (183)....were held to a season-low two hits yesterday for the fifth time this year...the five games with two hits or fewer match the most by an A's team over the last 43 years...are batting. 189 (104-for-549) with 40 runs scored over the last 17 games ( 2.4 runs per game)...are hitting . 208 for the season, which is the lowest mark in the majors....also have the lowest onbase percentage (.273) and OPS (.601), the second lowest slugging percentage (.323) and second fewest home runs (46).
PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.43 ERA (168 er in 278.2 ip) over the last 32 games...have a 4.38 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League to the Royals (4.97).... have the third highest opponents batting average (.256), on-base percentage (.325), slugging percentage (.414) and OPS (.739)...have issued the fourth most walks (213) and have the fourth fewest strikeouts (505).
STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are $3-19$ with a 5.03 ERA (102 er in 182.2 ip) over the last 35 games dating back to May 12...are 14-33 with a 4.42 ERA for the season...the losses are the most in the American League and second most in the majors (Nationals, 39)...rank fourth in the AL in innings pitched (348.1), highest ERA and fewest wins.

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has a 2.25 ERA ( 6 er in 24.0 ip) over the last seven games but is $1-6$ with one save, five blown saves and a 6.72 ERA ( 52 er in 69.2 ip) over the last 21 contests dating back to May 26 .... had its first save since May 25 at Seattle on Thursday at Boston... has a 4.33 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League to the Royals (4.62)...is 24 -for-34 (58.3\%) in save opportunities and has the fourth lowest save percentage.... has allowed 32 -of-129 $(24.8 \%)$ inherited runners to score, which is the fifth lowest percentage in the AL...the 129 inherited runners are third most.

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 41-of-49 (83.7\%) stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the American League (White Sox, 93.9\%)...rank fourth in steals...A's opponents are 21-for-34 $(61.8 \%)$ in stolen base attempts, which is the second lowest success rate in the AL and the majors (Yankees, 61.5\%)...rank third in the AL in fewest stolen bases allowed (21) and most caught stealing (13)...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's had their streak of nine consecutive games with an error end yesterday, which was the A's longest such streak since an 11game streak from April 6-18, 2017...have 10 errors in the last 10 games and 46 for the season, which is the most in the American League and fourth most in the majors...rank second in the AL in double plays (61) and tied for third in fewest outfield assists (6).
PLAYER NOTES: The A's have used 46 players, which is tied for third most in the American League...employed 50 players last year and 38 in the pandem-ic-shortened 2020 season... 21 of the 46 players have been rookies, which ties the Oakland record for most rookies in a season (21 in 2008)... have set the Oakland record for rookie pitchers with 13 (previous: 12 in 2009, 12, 15 and 16)... 10 of the rookies have made their Major League debut, which is the A's most since 2016 when they set the Oakland record with 15...currently have 10 rookies on the roster, including seven pitchers....have used nine starting pitchers, which matches the season total from each of the previous two years.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 5-11 (.313) in one-run games.... have the third lowest winning percentage in one-run games in the American League and are tied for the third most losses....are 14-19 (.424) in games decided by two runs or fewer...the 19 losses are third most in the AL and the 33 games are tied for third most....are 0-2 in extra inning games and are one of two teams in the majors without an extra inning win (Dodgers, 0-5)...the two extra inning games are tied for the fewest in the majors.
THIS AND THAT: The A's are 18-9 (.667) when scoring first and 4-36 (.100) when the opponent scores first... are tied for the worst record in the majors when the opponent scores first (Cubs, 2-18/.100)...have seven come-frombehind wins, which is third fewest in the majors (Cubs and Twins, 6)...are $4-17$ in the first game of a series....are averaging 3 hours and 3 minutes per game, which is fourth quickest in the American League and the majors.
A's vs. ROYALS: The A's have lost the first two meetings of 2022 and have not been swept by the Royals since June 26-28, 2015....won the season series last year as they went 5-2 against the Royals for the third consecutive season series...won three of four in Oakland and two of three in Kansas City... are now 24-12 (.667) against the Royals dating back to 2016, which includes 11-8 in Oakland and 13-4 in Kansas City....all-time, the A's are 332-271 (.551) against the Royals...the only American League team the A's have a better record against is Tampa Bay (.583)...are 180-122 in Oakland and 152-149 in Kansas City.

Christian Bethancourt has four home runs and nine RBI in 13 games in June...his most home runs in a season is six in 2016...Seth Brown is tied for fourth in the American League in go-ahead home runs (6) and tied for eighth in go-ahead RBI (11)...Dany Jiménez has 11 saves, which is tied for eighth in the American League and is the most among AL rookies... is the sixth rookie in Oakland history with 10 or more saves.

## THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1979 Wayne Gross, Dave Revering and Mike Heath hit consecutive homers in the fourth inning of the A's 6-5 win against Kansas City...Gross, Mike Edwards and Revering also turn a triple play, the second of the A's major league recording tying three triple plays in 1979...in 2003 Miguel Tejada ties an Oakland record with five hits as the A's defeat Texas, 9-2.

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas June 8 and is scheduled to make his third start of the season and his career...has taken the loss in each of his first two starts and is the first A's pitcher to lose each of first two career games since Daniel Gossett in 2017...only three pitchers in Oakland history have lost each of their first three games (Daniel Mengden, 2016; Brady Rigby, 1997; Mike Morgan, 1978).

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in his Major League debut, a start and loss in a 13-2 decision at Atlanta on June 8...became the 55th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the third this year (Oller, April 12; Martinez, May 10)...struck out Contreras in the second inning for his first strikeout...blanked the Braves on two hits over the first three innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed an Albies sacrifice fly in the fourth...then yielded a two-run triple to Harris in the fifth and was relieved by Acevedo, who allowed Harris to score.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-1 loss at Boston on Monday...allowed single runs in each of the first three innings, including a Bogaerts RBI single in the first, a Refsnyder sacrifice fly in the second and a Martinez leadoff home run in the the third...then surrendered a three-run home run to Devers in the fourth...was relieved by Oller to start the fifth with the A's trailing 6-0.

KOENIG vs. KANSAS CITY: Is making his first career appearance.


WITH LAS VEGAS: Was 4-2 with a 2.21 ERA in nine games, including eight starts, with Triple-A Las Vegas...struck out 61 batters in 53.0 innings, an average of 10.36 per nine innings....walked just 15 ( 2.55 per nine innings) and surrendered four home runs ( 0.68 per nine innings).

AMONG THE LEADERS: At the time of his June 8 promotion to Oakland, he led the Pacific Coast League in opponents on-base percentage (.261) and pitches per game (91.8), ranked second in ERA (2.21), tied for second in strikeouts (61), third in opponents batting average (.203), slugging percentage (.318) and OPS (.579), tied for third in wins (4), fourth in innings pitched (53.0) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.07), fifth in fewest walks per nine innings (2.55) and sixth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.68).
FOUR-GAME WINNING STREAK: Went $4-0$ with a 1.64 ERA (7 er in 38.1 ip ) and . 187 (26-for-139) opponents batting average over his final six starts...struck out 48 batters in 38.1 innings, walked just eight and surrendered two home runs...was 0-2 with a 3.68 ERA over his first three games.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Held the opposition to a .203 batting average, including . 200 (31-for-155) against right-handed hitters and 216 (8-for-37) against left-handers...surrendered all four of his home runs to righties...three were solo shots...had a . 191 opponents batting average the first time through the order, . 129 the second time and .315 after that....held the opposition to a . 127 batting average with two strikes
THIS AND THAT: Did not allow a run in the first (8.0 ip) or second (8.0 ip) innings and compiled a 0.55 ERA (2 er in 33.0 ip) over innings one through four...had a 4.95 ERA ( 11 er in 20.0 ip ) from the fifth inning on...allowed all four of his home run at home where he compiled a 2.20 ERA and . 184 opponents batting average in five games...the Aviators were 6-2 (.750) in his starting assignments
2022 DAY-BY-DAY: Made his only relief appearance in his first outing on April 8 against Reno when he tossed 4.0 innings...made his first start on April 16 at Salt Lake and allowed a season-high three runs and walked a season-high four batters in 5.2 innings in a 5-1 loss...lost again on April 22 against El Paso but then won each of his next four starts from April 30 to May 19...finished April 1-2 with a 3.54 ERA and . 240 opponents batting average in four games, three starts...then went 3-0 with a 1.35 ERA and .177 opponents average in four starts in May...tied for the Pacific Coast League lead in wins in May, ranked second in opponents OPS (.468) and strikeouts (34), third in batting average and fourth in ERA...struck out a season-high 10 batters in back-toback starts on May 7 at Sacramento and May 13 against Salt Lake...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in the 13-0 win over the River Cats...logged a season-high 8.0 innings, allowed one run and did not walk a batter in a 5-2 win over the Bees...allowed a season-high tying three runs on a season-high nine hits on May 19 at Reno but picked up the win in a 5-3 decision...logged a seasonhigh 108 pitches and tossed 7.0 scoreless innings on May 25 at Tacoma but

2021 RECAP: Spent his first season in the A's organization and in affiliated baseball at Double-A Midland and was 7-5 with a 3.26 ERA in 24 games, including 21 starts...led the Double-A Central in ERA, opponents batting average (.240) and innings pitched (121.1), ranked second in winning percentage (.583), tied for second in wins, third in on-base percentage (.314), tied for fourth in games started and fifth in slugging percentage (.400) and OPS (.714)...ranked second in the A's farm system in ERA and innings pitched, fourth in strikeouts (100) and tied for fourth in wins...his opponents batting average broke down to . 203 (26-for-128) against left-handed hitters compared to .255 (82-for-322) against right-handers...surrendered 13 of his 14 home runs to righties and had a .767 OPS (. 582 vs. lefties)...held the opposition to a .195 batting average with runners in scoring position and .145 with two strikes...compiled a 1.25 ERA in May, 4.08 in June, 2.01 in July, 5.70 in August and 1.93 in September...was 6-4 at home, 1-1 on the road.

CAREER: Was selected by the Chicago White Sox in the 35th round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft out of Central Arizona College but did not sign... also attended Old Dominion and Cal State Monterey Bay....pitched in independent leagues from 2017-19...had stops in Monterey (Pecos), Salina (American Association), Birmingham-Bloomfield (United Shore) and San Rafael (Pacific Association) in 2017, San Rafael in 2018 and Lake Erie (Frontier) in 2019...combined for a 22-10 record and a 3.40 ERA in 53 games, including 47 starts, in three seasons of independent ball...was signed by the A's as a free agent on Jan. 14, 2020 and is 11-7 with a 2.94 ERA in 33 games, including 29 starts, in two seasons in the minors.

- Has a 1.98 ERA (3 er in 13.2 ip) and . 11 (5-for-45) opponents batting average in 14 games on the road compared to a 7.36 ERA and .292 opponents average in 12 games at home.
- Yesterday was his first career outing against the Royals.

Last Year: Was with the A's during Spring Training after being selected in the Rule 5 draft but was returned to Toronto March 15...spent the entire regular season with Triple-A Buffalo and was 3-3 with three saves and a 2.22 ERA in 39 games, including one start.
