OAKLAND ATHLETICS (23-45) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (29-39)

TUESDAY, JUNE 21, 2022 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:40 PT RHP JAMES KAPRIELIAN (0-4, 6.31) VS. LHP MARCO GONZALES (3-7, 3.41) NBCSCA — A'S CAST — A'S RADIO NETWORK (BLOOMBERG 960 AM) — EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM, KATD 990 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Are 2-2 over the last four games but have lost 15 of the last 18 contests...are 8-25 (.242) over the last 33 games and 23-45 (.338) overall, which is the lowest winning percentage in the majors behind the Nationals (24-46, .343)...are 22 games under .500, which is one short of the season high of 23 (22-45 on June 18)...have lost each of the last seven series, which is the A's longest such streak since July 11-August 20, 2008 when they lost 11 straight...are 2-14-1 over the last 17 series...have the second worst record in Oakland history after 68 games (20-48 in 1979, lost game 69)...have been in sole possession of last place in the American League West every day dating back to May 27 and have held at least a share of last every day except one dating back to May 4 (fourth on May 25)...trail first place Houston by a season-high 19 games for the fourth consecutive day, which is the A's largest deficit in the West since finishing the 2017 season 26 games out.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's snapped their season-high eight-game home losing streak on Sunday...the streak tied for the fourth longest home losing streak in Oakland history and was the longest since June 19-July 3, 2017 when they also lost eight straight...won the first two home games of the season (April 18-19 vs. Baltimore) but have not won back-to-back home games since then...won three of four from the Orioles but have lost each of the nine home series since then...are 8-25 (.242) at home compared to 15-20 (.429) on the road...the home winning percentage is the lowest in the majors and tied with the 1954 Kansas City A's for second lowest in Athletics history after 33 home games...the 1920 Philadelphia A's started the year 7-25 (.219) at home (had one tie)...are 1-2 on this six-game homestand against Kansas City (1-2) and Seattle (three games)...these are the A's only six home games over a 25-game stretch from June 7-July 3...went 1-9 on the last homestand, which matched the second worst homestand of six or more games in Oakland history...the worst was 0-6 earlier this year from April 29-May 4...are batting .198 (207-for-1044) with 83 runs scored (2.5 per game) and 14 home runs in 33 games at home compared to .220 with 134 runs (3.8 per game) and 34 home runs in 35 games on the road...rank last in the majors in batting and runs at home and are tied with the Guardians for last in home runs...went 2-7 on the last road trip to Atlanta (0-2), Cleveland (1-3) and Boston (1-2).. leave following the game Thursday for a 10-game road trip to Kansas City (three games), New York-AL (three games) and Seattle (four games).

MONTH-BY-MONTH: The A's are 3-13 (.188) in June and with one more loss will clinch a losing record in June for the first time since 2017 (12-16)...have the lowest winning percentage in the majors in June behind the Cubs (5-13, .278)...went 10-21 (.323) in May, which was third worst in the majors and fifth worst in Oakland history in May...the 21 losses tied for third most in any month in Oakland history and were the most since May of 1997 (9-21)...had a 10-11 (.476) record in April.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .195 (113-for-580) with 44 runs scored over the last 18 games (2.4 runs per game)...are hitting .210 for the season, which is the lowest mark in the majors... also have the lowest on-base percentage $% \left(1\right) =\left(1\right) \left(1\right$ (.274) and OPS (.604), the second lowest slugging percentage (.330), second fewest runs (217), are tied for the second fewest home runs (48) and have the third fewest extra base hits (164)...have been shutout eight times, which is tied for fifth most in the majors and is the most by an A's team since 2016 (11)...have scored one run or fewer in 24 of 68 (35.3%) this year...had just 21 games with one run or fewer all last year.

PITCHING: The A's had their fifth shutout of the season on Sunday, their first since May 11...have allowed just six earned runs over the last four games (36.0 ip, 1.50 ERA) but have a 5.26 ERA (168 er in 287.2 ip) over the last 33 contests...have a 4.32 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have the third highest opponents batting average (.254), on-base percentage (.325), slugging percentage (.410) and OPS (.735)...have the third fewest strikeouts (509) and have issued the fourth most walks

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-19 with a 4.87 ERA (102 er in 188.1 ip) over the last 36 games dating back to May 12...are 15-33 with a 4.35 ERA for the season...the losses are the most in the American League and tied with the Reds for second most in the majors (Nationals, 39)...are tied for the fourth fewest wins in the AL and rank fifth in innings pitched (354.0) and highest ERA.

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has a 1.98 ERA (6 er in 27.1 ip) over the last eight games but is 1-6 with one save, five blown saves and a 6.41 ERA (52 er in 73.0 ip) over the last 22 contests dating back to May 26...had its first save since May 25 at Seattle last Thursday at Boston...has a 4.27 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...is 24-for-34 (58.3%) in save opportunities and has the fourth lowest save percentage...has allowed 32-of-132 (24.2%) inherited runners to score, which is the third lowest percentage in the AL...the 132 inherited runners are third most.

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 41-of-49 (83.7%) stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the American League...rank fifth in steals...A's opponents are 21-for-34 (61.8%) in stolen base attempts, which is the lowest success rate in the majors...rank third in the AL in fewest stolen bases allowed (21) and tied for third in most caught stealing (13)...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is tied for fifth most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in 12 of the last 14 games (13 errors total) and have 47 errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and fourth most in the majors...rank second in the AL in double plays (61) and tied for second in fewest outfield assists (6).

PLAYER NOTES: The A's have used 46 players, which is tied for third most in the American League...employed 50 players last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season...21 of the 46 players have been rookies, which ties the Oakland record for most rookies in a season (21 in 2008)...have set the Oakland record for rookie pitchers with 13 (previous: 12 in 2009, 12, 15 and 16)...10 of the rookies have made their Major League debut, which is the A's most since 2016 when they set the Oakland record with 15...currently have nine rookies on the roster, including six pitchers...have used nine starting pitchers, which matches the season total from each of the previous two

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 5-11 (.313) in one-run games...have the third lowest winning percentage in one-run games in the American League and are tied for the third most losses...are 14-19 (.424) in games decided by two runs or fewer...the 19 losses are third most in the AL and the 33 games are tied for third most...are 0-2 in extra inning games and are one of two teams in the majors without an extra inning win (Dodgers, 0-5)...the two extra inning games are tied for the fewest in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 19-9 (.679) when scoring first and 4-36 (.100) when the opponent scores first...have the second lowest winning percentage in the majors when the opponent scores first (Cubs, 2-20/.091)...have seven come-from-behind wins, which is third fewest in the majors (Cubs and Twins, 6)...are 4-17 in the first game of a series...are averaging 3 hours and 2 minutes per game, which is fourth quickest in the American League and the majors.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's lead the season series 2-1 after taking two of three in Seattle May 23-25...the two wins snapped the A's 13-game losing streak against the Mariners, which was their longest ever against Seattle and matched their longest against any team in Oakland history...the two wins also snapped a seven-game road losing streak, which matched A's longest in Seattle...have lost six straight and 10 of the last 12 in Oakland...lost the season series last year 15-4 and the 15 losses were the A's most against one team since they went 2-16 against Chicago in 1964...went 3-7 in Seattle and 1-8 in Oakland...the home record matched the A's worst against the Mariners (2007 and 2016)...have lost seven of the previous nine season series and are 68-97 (.412) against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2013 season, which is the A's worst mark against any American League team over that span...all-time, the A's are 372-321 against the Mariners...that includes 198-144 in Oakland, 173-174 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 97-110 at T-Mobile Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Christian Bethancourt has four home runs and nine RBI in 13 games in June...his most home runs in a season is six in 2016... Seth Brown is tied for fourth in the American League in go-ahead home runs (7) and tied for seventh in go-ahead RBI (12)... Sean Murphy hit his eighth home run of the season Sunday, which is tied for the most among AL catchers (Heim, TEX; Raleigh, SEA)...ranks second with 26 RBI (Vazquez, BOS 28).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1971 Vida Blue improves his record to 15-2 and strikes out 13 as the A's defeat the Twins at Minnesota, 3-2...in 1989 Rickey Henderson returns to Oakland when the A's send Greg Cadaret, Eric Plunk and Luis Polonia to the Yankees...in **2000** Eric Chavez becomes the first player to hit for the cycle in the Coliseum as the A's defeat Baltimore, 10-3...at the age of 22 years, 197 days, Chavez becomes the eighth youngest player in major league history to hit for the cycle...in 2002 Billy Koch records the save in the A's 5-3 win at Cincinnati, making him the first pitcher in Oakland history with five saves in five consecutive team games.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: James Kaprielian (0-4, 6.31 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 0-2 with a 7.71 ERA (20 er in 23.1 ip), .313 (30-for-96) opponents batting average and .963 OPS over his last five starts after going 0-2 with a 4.50 ERA, .197 opponents batting average and .697 OPS over his first four starts...has started the season 0-4, which is the longest losing streak of his career...is the first A's pitcher to start the season 0-4 since Kendall Graveman lost each of his first five decisions in 2018...began the season on the 10-day injured list with an inflamed right AC joint and was reinstated on May 1.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has held right-handed hitters to a .222 (18-for-81) batting average and .741 OPS...left-handers are batting .309 (25-for-81) with a .966 OPS...his career marks are .205 with a .636 OPS against righties, .280 with a .904 OPS against lefties...has issued 11 of his 19 walks this year and 42 of 62 in his career to lefties.

THROUGH THE ORDER: Has a .181 (13-for-72) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .333 (30-for-80) with eight of his 10 home runs allowed after that...his career numbers and are .186 the first time through the order, .278 with 25 of his 31 home runs after that

...AND INNING BY INNING: Has a 2.50 ERA (5 er in 18.0 ip) over the first two innings of a game, a 9.26 ERA (24 er in 23.1 ip) from the third inning on...now has a 2.10 career ERA (14 er in 60.0 ip) in innings one and two and a 6.21 ERA (72 er in 104.1) from the third inning on

THIS AND THAT: His 6.31 ERA is second highest in the American League among pitchers with 40 or more innings pitched (Bradish, BAL 6.86)...has allowed nine home runs in his last six starts and 10 in 41.1 innings for the season (2.18 per nine innings)...eight of the 10 home runs have been solo shots...the A's have won four of his five no decisions and are 4-5 (.444) in his starting assignments.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Did not pitch during the spring and began the season on the 10-day injured list with an inflamed right AC joint...was sent to Low-A Stockton on April 15 to begin a rehab assignment and picked up the win in a 14-10 Ports win that day against Modesto (5.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 6 so, 2 hr)...was moved up to Triple-A Las Vegas and had a no decision in a 12-5 win against El Paso on April 20 (4.2 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 1 hr)...then took the loss in a 12-5 decision on April 26 against Tacoma (4.0 ip, 3 h, 5 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 2 so)...was 1-1 with a 7.24 ERA (13.2 ip, 15 h, 11 r, 11 er, 5 bb, 13 so, 3 hr) in three starts overall when he reinstated from the IL on May 1...took the loss in each of his first two starts...logged 2.0 innings and walked four batters in his first start, a 7-3 loss to Cleveland on May 1 in Oakland...it was the shortest start of his career...then lost a 1-0 decision at Minnesota on May 7, allowing a Polanco home run in the sixth for the only run of the game... tossed a season-high 5.2 $\,$ innings and struck out a season-high seven batters while logging a seasonhigh 99 pitches...Gray and three relievers combined to shut out the A's on three hits...left his start on May 12 at Detroit with a 3-2 lead but the bullpen blew the save in a game the A's would come back to win 5-3...it was the first of two times the pen blew the save in one of his starts (June 9 at Cleveland)... allowed five runs on a season-high seven hits in 5.0 innings on May 24 at Seattle but had a no decision in the As 7-5 win.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-1 loss at Boston last Wednesday...walked a career-high six batters, allowed a career-high tying six runs and a season-high tying seven hits in 3.2 innings...yielded a Verdugo RBI ground out in the first, a Devers two-run hone run in the second, a Verdugo RBI single in the third and a Story RBI single in the fourth.

2021 RECAP: Was the Opening Day starter for Triple-A Las Vegas on May 6 but that would be his only start with the Aviators...was recalled by Oakland on May 12 and spent the remainder of the season with the A's, going 8-5 with a 4.07 ERA and .233 opponents batting average in 24 games, including 21 starts, in his rookie campaign...tied for fifth among American League rookies in wins, tied for sixth in innings pitched (119.1), ranked seventh in strikeouts (123) and eighth in games started...based on a minimum of 0.5 innings per team game, he ranked fifth in opponents batting average, sixth in ERA, seventh in on-base percentage (.302), ninth in OPS (.732) and 10th in slugging (.430)...his 123 strikeouts were eighth most in Oakland history by a rookie and were the most since Sean Manaea had 124 in 2016...his 21 starts were the most since Jharel Cotton had 24 in 2017...went 5-3 with a 2.65 ERA, .202 opponents batting average and .657 OPS over his first 12 starts through July 20...then posted a 3-2 record with a 5.96 ERA, .271 opponents average and .825 OPS over his final 12 games (nine starts) beginning on July 27.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average broke down to .201 (46-for-229) with a .602 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .266 (59-for-222) with a .860 OPS against left-handers...issued 31 of his 41 walks to lefties...had the third lowest batting average and OPS against right-handers in the AL among pitchers with 100 or more innings pitched...opponents were 1-for-15 (.067) with two walks with the bases loaded...had a .189 opponents batting average and .569 OPS the first time through the order, .285 with a .907 OPS the second time and .221 with a .710 OPS after that...yielded 10 of his 19 home runs the second time through the order...allowed a .083 average against the opponent's number five hitter...surrendered six of his 19 home runs to the clean-up hitter...opponents hit .107 when putting his curveball in play, which was fifth lowest in the AL among pitchers with 150 or more curveballs.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Began the season with 21 starts and was 8-5 with a 3.80 ERA and .720 OPS before being moved to the bullpen following his start on Sept. 18...had no decisions, a 7.88 ERA and .890 OPS in three relief appearances...tossed at least 2.0 innings in each of his three relief appearances...first batters faced were 0-for-2 with a hit by pitch and he did not inherit any runners.

THIS AND THAT: Had a 1.93 ERA over the first two innings, a 5.24 ERA from the third inning on...was 5-3 with a 3.28 ERA in 11 games at home, 3-2 with a 4.82 ERA in 13 games on the road...had a 4-3 record and a 3.16 ERA in 10 day games, a 4-2 record and a 4.76 ERA in 14 night games...allowed 15 of his 19 home runs at night...was 1-2 with a 5.68 ERA in three interleague starts... logged a 7-3 record and a 3.86 ERA in 21 games against AL competition...left with the lead and was the pitcher of record in four of his eight no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save...the A's were 11-10 (.524) in his starting assignments...allowed two runs or fewer in 13 of his 21 starts and five hits or fewer 16 times.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Paul Blackburn (6-2, 2.26 ERA): Has allowed one run over his last two starts (0.68 ERA)...is 1-2 with a 3.38 ERA over his last four starts after going 5-0 with a 1.70 ERA over his first nine starts...ranks fifth in the American League in ERA (2.26), tied for ninth in wins (6) and 10th in opponents slugging percentage (.337) and OPS (.616)...has allowed a .191 batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .260 against left-handers...has surrendered two of his three home runs and issued 12 of his 17 walks to lefties for a .711 OPS (.523 vs. righties)...opponents are 8-for-55 (.145) with runners in scoring position...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 4-3 A's win at Boston on June 16 (5.1 ip, 8 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...is 2-2 with a 4.70 ERA (25.0 ip, 25 h, 14 r, 13 er, 9 bb, 14 so, 2 hr) in five career appearances, all starts, against Seattle...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 4-2 A's victory at Seattle on May 25 (5.1 ip, 1 h, 5 bb, 2 so).
