# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (23-46) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (30-39)

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 22, 2022 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:40 PT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Are 2-3 over the last five games but have lost 16 of the last 19 contests...are 8-26 (.235) over the last 34 games and 23-46 (.333) overall, which is the lowest winning percentage in the majors behind the Reds (23-44, .343)...are a season-low tying 23 games under .500 (22-45 on June 18)...have not been more than 23 games under .500 since finishing the 2016 season 24 games under (69-93)...have the second worst record in Oakland history after 69 games (20-49 in 1979, lost game 70)...have been in sole possession of last place in the American League West every day dating back to May 27 and have held at least a share of last every day except one dating back to May 4 (fourth on May 25)...trail first place Houston by a season-ligh 20 games, which is the A's largest deficit in the West since finishing the 2017 season 26 games out.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-3 on this six-game homestand against Kansas City (1-2) and Seattle (0-1)...these are the A's only six home games over a 25-game stretch from June 7-July 3...went 1-9 on the last homestand and are now 8-26 (.235) at home compared to 15-20 (.429) on the road...the home winning percentage is the lowest in the majors and matches the 1956 Kansas City A's for the lowest in Athletics history over the first 34 home games of the season...are batting .199 (214-for-1077) with 85 runs scored (2.5 per game) and 15 home runs in 34 games at home compared to .219 with 134 runs (3.8 per game) and 34 home runs in 35 games on the road...rank last in the majors in batting and runs at home and second to last in home runs (Guardians, 15)...went 2-7 on the last road trip to Atlanta (0-2), Cleveland (1-3) and Boston (1-2)...leave following the game tomorrow for a 10-game road trip to Kansas City (three games), New York-AL (three games) and Seattle (four games)...won the first two home games since then...won three of four from the Orioles but have lost each of the nine home series since then.

**MONTH-BY-MONTH:** The A's have clinched a losing record in June for the first time since 2017 (12-16) as they are 3-14 (.176) with nine games remaining... have the lowest winning percentage in the majors in June behind the Cubs (5-14, .263)...went 10-21 (.323) in May, which was third worst in the majors and fifth worst in Oakland history in May...the 21 losses tied for third most in any month in Oakland history and were the most since May of 1997 (9-21)... had a 10-11 (.476) record in April.

*SERIES:* With the loss last night, the A's have now lost the first game of each of the last nine series...that is their longest such streak since Aug. 16-Sept. 8, 1997 when they also had a nine-game streak...the Oakland record is 13 (three times, last: April 11-May 20, 1994)...are 4-18 in the first game of a series...have lost each of the previous seven series, which is the A's longest such streak since July 11-August 20, 2008 when they lost 11 straight...are 2-14-1 over the previous 17 series

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .194 (119-for-613) with 46 runs scored over the last 19 games (2.4 runs per game)...rank last in the majors in batting (.209), on-base percentage (.273) and OPS (.602), second to last in slugging (.330), home runs (49) and runs scored (219) and have the third fewest extra base hits (165)...have been shutout eight times, which is tied for fifth most in the majors and is the most by an A's team since 2016 (11)...have scored one run or fewer in 24 of 69 (34.8%) games this year...had just 21 games with one run or fewer all last year.

**PITCHING:** The A's have a 2.80 ERA (14 er in 45.0 ip) over the last five games but a 5.33 ERA (176 er in 296.2 ip) over the last 34 contests...have a 4.37 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have the third highest opponents batting average (.255), on-base percentage (.327), slugging percentage (.415) and OPS (.742)...have the third fewest strikeouts (518) and have issued the fourth most walks (225).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 4-20 with a 4.83 ERA (104 er in 193.2 ip) over the last 37 games dating back to May 12...are 15-34 with a 4.33 ERA for the season...the losses are the most in the American League and tied with the Reds for second most in the majors (Nationals, 39)...have the fourth fewest wins and fourth highest ERA in the AL and rank fifth in innings pitched (359.1).

**THE BULLPEN:** The A's is 1-6 with one save, five blown saves and a 6.81 ERA (58 er in 76.2 ip) over the last 23 games dating back to May 26...had its first save since May 25 at Seattle last Thursday at Boston...has a 4.43 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...is 24-for-34 (58.3%) in save opportunities and has the fourth lowest save percentage...has allowed 33-of-134 (24.6%) inherited runners to score, which is the fourth lowest percentage in the AL...the 134 inherited runners are third most.

**ON THE BASES:** The A's have been successful in 41-of-49 (83.7%) stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the American League...rank fifth in steals...A's opponents are 21-for-35 (60.0%) in stolen base attempts, which is the lowest success rate in the majors...rank third in the AL in fewest stolen bases allowed (21) and tied for third in most caught stealing (14)...A's pitchers have five pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most in the AL.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed at least one error in 12 of the last 15 games (13 errors total) and have 47 errors for the season, which is tied with the White Sox for the most in the American League...rank second in the AL in double plays (63) and tied for second in fewest outfield assists (6).

**PLAYER NOTES:** The A's have used 46 players, which is tied for third most in the American League...employed 50 players last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season...21 of the 46 players have been rookies, which ties the Oakland record for most rookies in a season (21 in 2008)...have set the Oakland record for rookie pitchers with 13 (previous: 12 in 2009, 12, 15 and 16)...10 of the rookies have made their Major League debut, which is the A's most since 2016 when they set the Oakland record with 15...currently have nine rookies on the roster, including six pitchers...have used nine starting pitchers, which matches the season total from each of the previous two years.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 5-11 (.313) in one-run games...have the third lowest winning percentage in one-run games in the American League and are tied for the third most losses...are 14-19 (.424) in games decided by two runs or fewer...the 19 losses are third most in the AL and the 33 games are tied for fifth most...are 0-2 in extra inning games and are one of two teams in the majors without an extra inning win (Dodgers, 0-5)...the two extra inning games are tied for the fewest in the majors.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 19-9 (.679) when scoring first and 4-37 (.048) when the opponent scores first...have the second lowest winning percentage in the majors when the opponent scores first (Cubs, 2-21/.087)...have seven come-from-behind wins, which is third fewest in the majors (Cubs and Twins, 6)...are averaging 3 hours and 2 minutes per game, which is fourth quickest in the American League and the majors.

**SCORING CHANGE:** Major League Baseball has made a scoring change in A's game at Boston last Thursday...in the third inning, Cristian Pache was originally credited with a double but that has been changed to an error on second baseman Trevor Story...that makes one of the A's three runs in that inning unearned.

**A's vs. MARINERS:** The season series is even at two games each...the A's won two of three in Seattle from May 23-25 but lost the first game in Oakland last night...now have a seven-game home losing streak, which matches the A's second longest such streak against the Mariners (July 5, 2015-May 4, 2016)...the longest is an eight-game streak from July 6, 2007-April 17, 2008... the two wins in Seattle snapped the A's 13-game losing streak against the Mariners, which was their longest ever against Seattle and matched their longest against any team in Oakland history...the two wins also snapped a seven-game road losing streak, which matched A's longest in Seattle...lost the season series last year 15-4 and the 15 losses were the A's most against one team since they went 2-16 against Chicago in 1964...went 3-7 in Seattle and 1-8 in Oakland...the home record matched the A's worst against the Mariners (2007 and 2016)...have lost seven of the previous nine season series and are 68-98 (.410) against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2013 season, which is the A's worst mark against any American League team over that span...all-time, the A's are 372-322 against the Mariners... that includes 198-145 in Oakland, 173-174 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 97-110 at T-Mobile Park.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Jonah Bride made his Major League debut June 14 at Boston and went 0-for-3 in a start at third base...has hit safely in each of his six games since then (8-for-21, .381)...Seth Brown is tied for fourth in the American League in go-ahead home runs (7) and tied for seventh in go-ahead RBI (12)...Sean Murphy is tied for second among AL catchers in home runs (8) and RBI (26).

## THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1969** Sal Bando, Ted Kubiak and Reggie Jackson all hit solo homers in the third inning of the A's 7-3 win against Minnesota in the first game of a doubleheader...it is the first three-homer inning in Oakland history...in **1979**, twelve days after Jim Essian's inside-the-park grand slam, Larry Murray hits an inside-the-park home run in the A's 6-5 win over Texas.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Paul Blackburn (6-2, 2.26 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Has allowed one run over his last two starts (1 er in 13.1 ip, 0.68 ERA)...is 1-2 with a 3.38 ERA (9 er in 24.0 ip) over his last four starts after going 5-0 with a 1.70 ERA over his first nine starts...the five-game winning streak was a career high and he became the first starting pitcher on an A's Opening Day roster to start the season 5-0 since Trevor Cahill won his first six decisions in 2011.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Ranks fourth in the American League in ERA (2.26), tied for fourth in winning percentage (.750), ninth in opponents slugging percentage (.337), tied for ninth in wins (6) and 10th in OPS (.616)...has allowed just three home runs and his average of 0.38 home runs per nine innings is third lowest in the AL...is averaging the seventh fewest pitches per inning (14.9)...has 51 strikeouts and his average of 6.40 per nine innings is fifth lowest

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .191 (26-for-136) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .260 (34-for-131) against left-handers...has surrendered two of his three home runs and issued 12 of his 17 walks to lefties for a .711 OPS (.523 vs. righties)...opponents batting .145 (8-for-55) with runners in scoring position, which is fourth lowest in the American League...entered the season with a .328 career opponents average with RISP...has allowed a .125 opponents batting average with two strikes, which is fourth lowest in the AL...the number five hitter in the order is 2-for-29 (.067) against him.

**BASES ON BALLS:** Has walked 14 batters in 40.2 innings over his last seven starts (3.10 per nine innings) after issuing just three free passes in 31.0 innings over his first six starts (0.87 per nine innings)...has walked 17 batters in 71.2 innings overall (2.13 per nine innings) and has issued two walks or fewer in 12 of his 13 starts...has four starts with no walks and four with just one...is averaging 2.36 walks per nine innings in his career (55 bb in 209.2 ip).

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 5-0 with a 1.00 ERA (5 er in 45.0 ip), .209 (34-for-163) opponents batting average and .531 OPS in seven starts on the road compared to 1-2 with a 4.39 ERA (13 er in 26.2 ip), .250 (26-for-104) opponents average and .749 OPS in five starts at home...has the lowest road ERA in the majors and is tied for the lead in road wins...has not allowed a home run in 45.0 innings on the road.

**CAREER BESTS:** Has a career-high six wins...had just six wins in 30 games over his first five seasons...also has career highs in games (13), games started (13), strikeouts (51), innings pitched (71.2), hits (60) and walks (17).

**THIS AND THAT:** Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 3-0 with a 1.59 ERA (6 er in 34.0 ip) in six starts on five days rest compared to 2-2 with a 3.31 ERA (12 er in 32.2 ip) in six starts on four days rest...is 3-0 with a 1.34 ERA (5 er in 33.2 ip) in six starts at night, 3-2 with a 3.08 ERA (13 er in 38.0 ip) in seven starts during the day...the A's are 3-2 in his no decisions and are 9-4 (.692) in his starting assignments...has allowed two runs or fewer in 10 of his 13 starts.

2022 HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed 5.0 scoreless inning and struck out a career-high seven batters in a 13-2 win at Tampa Bay in his first start on April 11...had a no decision in the A's 7-5 win in his second start on April 16 at Toronto... left with a 5-2 lead but the bullpen allowed three runs for the blown save... it was the first of two times he left with a lead only to have the pen blow the save (June 10 at Cleveland)...won back-to-back starts on April 21 against Baltimore and April 27 at San Francisco...combined with five A's relievers on a three-hit, 1-0 shutout in the win over the Giants...tossed five of the innings and allowed all three of the hits while walking one...finished April 3-0 with a 1.35 ERA in four starts...walked just two batters in 20.0 innings and held the opposition to a .197 batting average...it was his first career three-win month and he tied for third in the American League in wins in April...based on a minimum of 20.0 innings, he had the second lowest opponents OPS (.459), ranked third in slugging (.239) and was fourth in ERA and on-base percent-age (.219)...combined with Jackson and Jiménez on a four-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Detroit on May 9...tossed 6.2 innings, yielded all four of the hits and did not walk a batter...tossed 5.1 scoreless innings and allowed just one hit in a 4-2 win at Seattle on May 25...however, walked a career-high five batters...was charged with his first loss of the season on May 30 against Houston when he allowed a season-high four runs in 6.2 innings...did not allow a run over the first three innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 10.0 innings...allowed a season-high tying four runs in a season-low 4.0 innings in an 8-0 loss to Boston on June 4 in Oakland...tossed a career-high 8.0 scoreless innings, walked one and allowed four hits on June 10 at Cleveland but had a no decision in the A's 3-2 loss...the pen allowed three runs in the ninth inning

**LAST START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-3 victory at Boston last Thursday...allowed a season-high eight hits in 5.1 innings...did not allow a run over the first two innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high tying 10.0 innings...Oakland scored three times in the top of the third and

2021 RECAP: Began the season at Triple-A Las Vegas and was 4-7 with a 4.97 ERA in 17 games, including 16 starts, when he was selected by Oakland on Aug. 18...spent the balance of the season with the A's and went 1-4 with a 5.87 ERA in nine starts...allowed a .319 opponents batting average with the A's but walked just 10 batters in 38.1 innings (2.35 walks per nine innings) for a .366 opponents on-base percentage...his opponents batting average broke down to .309 (29-for-94) with an .858 OPS against right-handed hit-ters compared to .333 (23-for-69) with a .953 OPS against left-handers...opponents hit .333 with runners in scoring position...was 0-1 with a 4.03 ERA and .720 opponents OPS in five starts at home, 1-3 with an 8.44 ERA and 1.115 OPS in four starts on the road...yielded seven of his eight home runs on the road...was 1-1 with a 3.38 ERA in four starts during the day, 0-3 with an 8.24 ERA in five starts at night ... allowed a .533 batting average to the opponents number nine hitter and .438 average to the seven hitter...the A's were 3-1 in his no decisions and went 4-5 (.444) in his starting assignments... tossed fewer than six innings in all nine starts, including fewer than five innings four times...his seven losses with the Aviators were his most as a minor leaguer and his .311 opponents batting average was a career high...surrendered just eight home runs in 88.2 innings, an average of 0.81 per nine innings...his opponents batting average broke down to .300 (61-for-203) with an .824 OPS against left-handed hitters and .323 (53-for-164) with a .776 OPS against right-handers...yielded six of his eight home runs and issued 18 of his 27 walks to lefties...six of the eight home runs he allowed were solo shots...went 2-3 with a 4.24 ERA, .287 opponents batting average and .737 OPS in nine starts at home, 2-4 with a 5.79 ERA, .333 opponent average and .867 OPS on the road...tossed six innings or fewer in each of his 17 appearances...the Aviators were 5-11 (.313) in his starting assignments.

*RHP Frankie Montas (3-7, 3.53 ERA):* Went 2-1 with a 3.63 ERA over his first three starts but is 1-6 with a 3.50 ERA in 11 starts since then...the A's have been shut out in three of his starts and have scored one run four times...he has allowed two runs or fewer in eight of his 14 starts, including no runs twice and one run twice...has allowed two earned runs or fewer nine times... is tied for the American League lead in games started (14) and tied for sixth in strikeouts (84)...is 1-5 despite a 2.72 ERA in nine starts at home compared to 2-2 with a 5.33 ERA in five starts on the road...is tied for the Major League lead in losses at home...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 5-1 A's loss to Kansas City last Friday here in Oakland (5.0 ip, 10 h, 5 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 4 so)...is 2-2 with a 3.04 ERA (47.1 ip, 38 h, 23 r, 16 er, 15 bb, 70 so, 6 hr) in 10 career appearances, including seven starts, against Seattle...went 0-1 with a 3.50 ERA (18.0 ip, 14 h, 9 r, 7 er, 5 bb, 28 so, 4 hr) in three starts last year

- Has allowed five runs in 7.0 innings over his first eight outings in June (6.43 ERA) after compiling a 1.29 ERA and .146 opponents batting average in 13 games in May.
- Is tied for fourth in the Majors and is tied for the the AL lead in games pitched (31).
- Opponents are 6-for-35 (.171) with runners in scoring position.
- Has pitched on exactly one day of rest in 16 of his 31 appearances and has a 4.91 ERA (8 er in 14.2 ip) in those games...has a 2.81 ERA (5 er in 16.0 ip) in his other 15 appearances.
