ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost four of the last five games and 17 of the last $20 . .$. are 8-27 (.229) over the last 35 games and 23-47 (.329) overall, which is the lowest winning percentage in the majors behind the Reds ( $23-45, .338$ )...are 24 games under .500 for the first time since finishing the 2016 season 6993 ... have not been 25 under since Oct. 1, 2016 when they were 68 -93...have the second worst record in Oakland history after 70 games (21-49 in 1979, won game 71)...have been in sole possession of last place in the American League West every day dating back to May 27 and have held at least a share of last every day except one dating back to May 4 (fourth on May 25)...trail first place Houston by a season-high 21 games, which is the A's largest deficit in the West since finishing the 2017 season 26 games out.
HOME AND AWAY: The A's have lost the first two games of this series and have now lost 10 consecutive home series since taking three of four from Baltimore in the first home series of the season...this is the first time the A's have lost 10 or more consecutive home series since June 20, 1916 to May 8, 1917 when they lost 17 straight (final 14 of 1916, first three of 1917)...are 1-4 on this six-game homestand against Kansas City (1-2) and Seattle (0-2)... these are the A's only six home games over a 25 -game stretch from June 7-July 3...went 1-9 on the last homestand and are now 8-27 (.229) at home compared to 15-20 (.429) on the road...the home winning percentage is the lowest in the majors and matches the 1956 Kansas City A's for the lowest in Athletics history over the first 35 home games of the season...it is tied for sixth lowest by an American League or National League team since 1901... are batting 199 (221-for-1110) with 85 runs scored ( 2.4 per game) and 15 home runs in 35 games at home compared to .219 with 134 runs ( 3.8 per game) and 34 home runs in 35 games on the road...rank last in the majors in batting and runs at home and second to last in home runs (Guardians, 14)... went 2-7 on the last road trip to Atlanta ( $0-2$ ), Cleveland ( $1-3$ ) and Boston (1-2)...leave following the game today for a 10-game road trip to Kansas City (three games), New York-AL (three games) and Seattle (four games).
MONTH-BY-MONTH: The A's have clinched a losing record in June for the first time since 2017 (12-16) as they are 3-15 (.167) with eight games remaining... have the lowest winning percentage in the majors in June behind the Cubs and Reds (6-14, .300)...went 10-21 (.323) in May, which was third worst in the majors and fifth worst in Oakland history in May...the 21 losses tied for third most in any month in Oakland history and were the most since May of 1997 (9-21)...had a 10-11 (.476) record in April.
SERIES: The A's have lost the first two games of this series and have now lost eight consecutive series...that is the A's longest such streak since July 11-August 20, 2008 when they lost 11 straight...are 2-15-1 over the last 18 series...have lost the first game of each of the last nine series, which is their longest such streak since Aug. 16-Sept. 8, 1997 when they also had a ninegame streak...the Oakland record is 13 (three times, last: April 11-May 20, 1994)...are $4-18$ in the first game of a series and 10-11 in the final game.

OFFENSE: The A's were shutout for the ninth time last night, which is tied for fourth most in the majors and is the most by an A's team since 2016 (11)... have scored one run or fewer in 25 of $70(35.7 \%$ ) games.... had just 21 games with one run or fewer all last year...have scored 219 runs for the season, which is second fewest in the majors (Tigers, 198)....are batting . 195 (126-for-646) with 46 runs scored over the last 20 games ( 2.3 runs per game)... rank last in the majors in batting (.209), on-base percentage (.272) and OPS (.600) and second to last in slugging (.328), home runs (49) and extra base hits (165).
PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.45 ERA ( 185 er in 305.2 ip) over the last 35 games and have a 4.44 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have the second highest opponents on-base percentage (.328) and third highest batting average (.256), slugging percentage (.419) and OPS (.747)...have the third fewest strikeouts (527) and have issued the fourth most walks (230).
STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are $4-21$ with a 5.05 ERA (111 er in 197.2 ip) over the last 38 games dating back to May 12....are 15-35 with a 4.46 ERA for the season...the losses are second most in the majors (Nationals, 40)... have the fourth fewest wins and fourth highest ERA in the American League and rank fifth in innings pitched (363.1).
THE BULLPEN: The A's is 1-6 with one save, five blown saves and a 6.61 ERA ( 60 er in 81.2 ip ) over the last 24 games dating back to May 26 ...has a 4.41 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...is 24-for-34 (58.3\%) in save opportunities and has the fourth lowest save percent-
age... has allowed 36 -of-137 ( $26.3 \%$ ) inherited runners to score, which is the fifth lowest percentage in the AL....the 137 inherited runners are third most.
ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 41-of-50 (82.0\%) stolen base attempts, which is the third best percentage in the American League...rank fifth in steals....'s opponents are 22 -for-36 ( $61.1 \%$ ) in stolen base attempts, which is the lowest success rate in the majors...rank third in the AL in fewest stolen bases allowed (22) and third in most caught stealing (14)...A's pitchers have five pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most in the AL.
DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed one error in the last four games after making at least one error in nine consecutive games...have 47 errors for the season, which is tied with the Orioles and White Sox for the most in the American League...rank second in the AL in double plays (63) and tied for second in fewest outfield assists (6).
PLAYER NOTES: Sheldon Neuse became the 27th player to pitch for the A's this year, which is fourth most in the American League and matches the A's season total from last year... he is the third position player to pitch (Pinder, Bethancourt), which marks the first time in Oakland history the A's have used three position players as a pitcher in one season... have used 46 players, which is tied for fourth most in the AL...employed 50 players last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season.... 21 of the 46 players have been rookies, which ties the Oakland record for most rookies in a season (21 in 2008)...have set the Oakland record for rookie pitchers with 13 (previous: 12 in 2009, 12, 15 and 16)... 10 of the rookies have made their Major League debut, which is the A's most since 2016 when they set the Oakland record with 15 ...currently have nine rookies on the roster, including six pitchers.
THIS AND THAT: The A's are 19-9 (.679) when scoring first and 4-38 (.095) when the opponent scores first...have the second lowest winning percentage in the majors when the opponent scores first (Cubs, 2-21/.087)...have seven come-from-behind wins, which is third fewest in the majors (Cubs and Twins, 6)... are 0-2 in extra inning games and are one of two teams in the majors without an extra inning win (Dodgers, 0-5)...the two extra inning games are tied for the fewest in the majors....are averaging 3 hours and 3 minutes per game, which is fourth quickest in the American League and the majors.
A's vs. MARINERS: The A's are 2-3 against the Mariners...won two of three in Seattle from May 23-25 but have lost the first two games in Oakland...now have an eight-game home losing streak, which matches the A's longest such streak against the Mariners (July 6, 2007-April 17, 2008)...the two wins in Seattle snapped the A's 13 -game losing streak against the Mariners, which was their longest ever against Seattle and matched their longest against any team in Oakland history...the two wins also snapped a seven-game road losing streak, which matched A's longest in Seattle...lost the season series last year $15-4$ and the 15 losses were the A's most against one team since they went 2-16 against Chicago in 1964...went 3-7 in Seattle and 1-8 in Oakland...the home record matched the A's worst against the Mariners (2007 and 2016)... have lost seven of the previous nine season series and are 68$99(.407)$ against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2013 season, which is the A's worst mark against any American League team over that span...all-time, the A's are 372-323 against the Mariners...that includes 198146 in Oakland, 173-174 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 97-110 at T-Mobile Park.

## TODAY'S TIDBITS

Seth Brown is tied for fourth in the American League in go-ahead home runs (7) and tied for seventh in go-ahead RBI (12)...Sean Murphy is tied for second among AL catchers in RBI (26) and ranks third in home runs (8)...he leads AL catchers in games started (52), total chances (439) and putouts (416), is tied for the lead in assists (22) and ranks second in fielding percentage (.998).

## THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1978 Tim Conroy becomes the youngest Oakland pitcher to start a game at the age of 18 years, 81 days.... he had a no decision in the A's $5-4$ win at Kansas City ( $3.1 \mathrm{ip}, 2 \mathrm{~h}, 2 \mathrm{r}, 1 \mathrm{er}, 5 \mathrm{bb}, 1 \mathrm{so}$ )...in 1979, four days after turning their second triple play of the season, the A's turn their third against Texas, tying a major league record...in 1992 the A's score 10 runs in the third inning of a 12-7 win against Seattle... Harold Baines has five RBI in the inning with a two-run double and a three-run homer and has seven RBI for the day...in 1997 Jason Giambi extends his hitting streak to an Oakland record 25 games in a 6-5 loss at Seattle, breaking the mark of 24 set by Carney Lansford in 1984.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (3-7, 3.53 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Went 2-1 with a 3.63 ERA over his first three starts but is 1-6 with a 3.50 ERA ( 25 er in 64.1 ip ) in 11 starts since then...the A's have been shut out in three of his starts and have scored one run four times... he has allowed two runs or fewer in eight of his 14 starts, including no runs twice and one run twice...has allowed two earned runs or fewer nine times...the A's have lost in all four of his no decisions and are 3-12 (.200) in his starting assignments.

RUN SUPPORT: Received one run of support in his last start and has support of one run or fewer in 10 of his 14 starts, including four starts with no run support...has support of four runs or more in his other four starts ( $4,5,6,7$ )... has 28 runs of support in his 14 starts this year ( $81.2 \mathrm{ip}, 3.09$ RSA).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for the American League lead in games started (14), tied for sixth in innings pitched (81.2) and tied for seventh in strikeouts (84)...is tied for third in losses (7).

STRIKEOUTS: Struck out 11 batters on May 26 against Texas after fanning 12 batters on May 15 against Los Angeles (AL)...now has nine career 10-strikeout games, which is tied for third most in Oakland history...has one game with 13 strikeouts, one with 12 and two with $11 \ldots$ has 84 strikeouts this year, which is tied for seventh in the American League...had 207 strikeouts last year, which ranked fourth in the AL and was the second highest single-season total in
 Oakland history.
HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-5 despite a 2.72 ERA (17 er in 56.1 ip ) in nine starts at home compared to $2-2$ with a 5.33 ERA ( 15 er in 25.1 ip ) in five starts on the road...is tied for the Major League lead in losses at home...in six seasons with the A's, he is $17-16$ with a 3.40 ERA ( 105 er in 277.2 ip) in 57 games at home, 17-12 with a 4.22 ERA ( 111 er in 237.0 ip) in 52 games on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is $2-2$ with a 3.08 ERA ( 13 er in 38.0 ip ) in seven starts at night compared to 1-5 with a 3.92 ERA ( 19 er in 43.2 ip ) in seven starts during the day...leads the majors in losses in day games...now has a career record of 21-14 at night and 13-16 during the day.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is $0-3$ with a 2.17 ERA ( 7 er in 29.0 ip ) in five starts against American League West teams, 3-4 with a 4.27 ERA ( 25 er in 52.2 ip) in nine starts against all other teams.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .237 batting average against both lefthanded and right-handed hitters... has yielded six home runs in 156 at bats against left-handed hitters, three in 152 against right-handers....has issued 14 of his 20 walks to lefties...six of the nine home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...opponents are batting .157 with two strikes.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today....is 2-4 with a 1.71 ERA ( 10 er in 52.2 ip ) and .188 (36-for-192) opponents batting average in eight starts on four days rest, 1-2 with a 6.38 ERA (17 er in 24.0 ip ) and .326 (31-for-95) opponents average in five starts on five days rest...in his career, he is 13-13 with a 2.64 ERA ( 62 er in 211.1 ip) in 35 starts on four days rest, 18-13 with a 4.22 ERA ( 114 er in 243.1 ip ) in 44 starts on five days rest or more.

THE THIRD INNING: Has allowed nine of his 38 runs in the third inning for a 6.23 ERA ( 9 er in 13.0 ip )...has a 2.60 ERA ( 8 er in 27.2 ip ) over innings $1-2$ and a 2.66 ERA ( 12 er in 40.2 ip ) in innings 4-7...has yielded three runs in the eighth inning ( 0.1 ip )...last year, he allowed 20 of his 79 runs ( $25.3 \%$ ) in the third inning for a 5.68 ERA, .316 opponents batting average and .854 OPS.

2022 HIGHLIGHTS: Made his second career Opening Day start on April 8 at Philadelphia and was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-5 loss... his other Opening Day start came in 2020 and he is now $0-1$ with a 6.00 ERA ( $9.0 \mathrm{ip}, 9 \mathrm{~h}, 6$ $\mathrm{r}, 6 \mathrm{r}, 4 \mathrm{bb}, 11 \mathrm{so}$ ) in two openers...the loss was his first since Aug. 16, 2021 as he finished the 2021 season with a four-game winning streak....allowed a season-high five runs in 5.0 innings...then won consecutive starts on April 13 at Tampa Bay and April 18 against Baltimore...was 2-1 with a 3.63 ERA over his first three starts through April 18...then had a career-high five-game losing streak from April 23 to June 5 (previous: 3, two times, last: May 1929, 2021)...compiled a 2.87 ERA and 214 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which spanned nine starts...logged a season-high 7.1 innings on April 23 against Texas but took the loss in a 2-0 decision...it was his first start over 7.0 innings since June 20, 2019 against Tampa Bay when he pitched 8.0 innings and it snapped an Athletics record streak of 47 consecutive starts of seven innings or fewer...did not allow a hit until K. Calhoun singled in the fifth and had a one-hit shutout entering the eighth inning... retired the first batter before allowing back-to-back singles to Garcia and W . Calhoun...was relieved by Acevedo, who allowed both runs to score...Perez and three Texas relievers combined to shut out the A's on three hits...it was the first of three times the A's were shut out in one of his starts (May 4 vs.

Tampa Bay, May 10 at Detroit)...had a no decision in the A's 9-8 loss to Cleveland in Oakland on April 29...struck out Franmil Reyes to end the fifth inning for his 500th career strikeout...walked a season-high four batters, allowed a season-high two home runs and matched his highs in runs (5)...left with a 6-5 lead but the pen allowed four runs in the seventh inning for the blown save...finished April 2-2 with a 4.25 ERA but held the opposition to a . 194 batting average...tied for third in the American League in strikeouts (31) and had the sixth lowest opponents batting average...then went 0-3 despite a 2.31 ERA and .219 opponents batting average in six starts in May...threw a season-high 105 pitches in a 6-0 loss at Detroit in the first game of the May 10 doubleheader...struck out a season-high 12 batters in a 4-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on May 15 in Oakland...had a no decision in his next start on May 21 at Los Angeles (AL) after leaving the game with two outs in the second inning after being hit in the hand by a Rengifo line drive...the 1.2 innings pitched matched the shortest start of his career (Aug. 18, 2020 at Arizona)... struck out 11 in 7.0 innings on May 26 against Texas, his ninth career game of 10 or more strikeouts...went over the 500 innings pitched mark in his career...snapped his career-high five game losing streak in the A's $10-5$ win at Cleveland on June 11, despite allowing a season-high tying five runs in 6.0 innings.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to Kansas City last Friday in Oakland....llowed a season-high tying five runs on a season-high 10 hits in 5.0 innings....yielded single runs in each of the first three innings on a Perez RBI double, a Benintendi RBI single and a Perez solo home run. was also charged with two unearned runs in the fifth inning on a Melendez sacrifice fly and a Taylor RBI single following a Davidson error.
