OAKLAND ATHLETICS (23-48) VS. KANSAS CITY ROYALS (25-43)

FRIDAY, JUNE 24, 2022 — KAUFFMAN STADIUM — 7:10 CT LHP COLE IRVIN (2-4, 3.14) VS. RHP ZACK GREINKE (0-4, 5.05) NBCSCA — A'S CAST — A'S RADIO NETWORK (BLOOMBERG 960 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three straight, five of the last six and 18 of the last 21 games...are 8-28 (.222) over the last 36 games and 23-48 (.324) overall, which is the lowest winning percentage in the majors behind the Reds (23-46, .333)...are 25 games under .500 for the first time since Oct. 1, 2016 when they were 68-93...have not been 26 games under .500 since Sept. 30, 2016 (67-93)...have the second worst record in Oakland history after 71 games to the 1979 club (22-49, lost games 72 through 79)...finished 54-108 that year, which is the only 100-loss season in Oakland history...have been in sole possession of last place in the American League West every day dating back to May 27 and have held at least a share of last every day except one dating back to May 4 (fourth on May 25)...trail first place Houston by a season-high 21 games for the second consecutive day, which is the A's largest deficit in the West since finishing the 2017 season 26 games out

SERIES NOTES: The A's have lost the first game of each of the last nine series, which is their longest such streak since Aug. 16-Sept. 8, 1997 when they also had a nine-game streak...the Oakland record is 13 (three times, last: April 11-May 20, 1994)...are 4-18 in the first game of a series and 10-12 in the final game...were swept by Seattle in a three-game series to close out the last homestand, which was the seventh time they were swept this year... have now lost eight consecutive series, which is the A's longest such streak since July 11-August 20, 2008 when they lost 11 straight...are 2-15-1 over the last 18 series.

A's IN JUNE: The A's are 3-16 (.158) in June, which is the lowest winning percentage in the majors (Cubs and Reds, 6-15/.286)...the only time in Oakland history the A's finished with a winning percentage under .241 in any month (min. 6 games) was in June of 1979 when they were 5-24 (.172)...went 10-21 (.323) in May, which was the 13th month in Oakland history with 20 or more losses...rank last in the majors in batting (.196), on-base percentage (.250), slugging (.320), OPS (.570) and runs (45) in June...the lowest single-month batting average in Athletics history in a month with more than 15 games is .207 in August of 1906 and the lowest on-base percentage is .258 in September of 1908...are averaging 2.37 runs per game in June...have averaged fewer than three runs in a game in a month three times in Oakland history (2.50 in Aug. 1978, 2.73 in Aug. 2008, 2.96 in June 1977)...have a 5.25 ERA (96 er in 164.2 ip) this June, which is the highest in the American League and fourth highest in the majors

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a 10-game road trip to Kansas City (three games), New York-AL (three games) and Seattle (four games) tonight...it is their second of two 10-game road trips this year (April 9-17) and is part of a stretch from June 7-July 3 where they are scheduled play 19 of 25 games on the road...went 2-7 on the last road trip to Atlanta (0-2), Cleveland (1-3) and Boston (1-2) and are 15-20 (.429) on the road compared to 8-28 (.222) at home...have the lowest home winning percentage in the majors...went 1-5 on the last homestand against Kansas City (1-2) and Seattle (0-3)...won three of four from Baltimore in the first home series of the season but have lost each of the 10 home series since then...it is the first time the A's have lost 10 or more consecutive home series since June 20, 1916 to May 8, 1917 when they lost 17 straight (final 14 of 1916, first three of 1917)...won the first two home games against Baltimore but have not put together back-toback home wins since then...are batting .219 (255-for-1165) with 134 runs scored (3.8 per game) and 34 home runs in 35 games on the road compared to .198 with 86 runs (2.4 per game) and 15 home runs in 36 home games.

OFFENSE: The A's have been held to one run or fewer in six of the last nine games and have scored 14 runs total over that span...have been shutout nine times, which is tied for fourth most in the majors and is the most by an A's team since 2016 (11)...have scored one run or fewer in 26 of 71 (36.6%) games and have 220 runs for the season, which is second fewest in the majors (Tigers, 198)...are batting .194 (131-for-677) with 47 runs scored over the last 21 games (2.2 runs per game)...rank last in the majors in batting (.209), on-base percentage (.272), slugging percentage (.598) and OPS (.598)...have finished last in the majors in all four categories once in Athletics history (1943)...have the second fewest home runs (49) and extra base hits (166) in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.35 ERA (187 er in 314.2 ip) over the last 36 games and have a 4.40 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (Royals, 4.99)...have the third highest opponents batting average (.254), on-base percentage (.327), slugging percentage (.415) and OPS (.741)...have the third fewest strikeouts (536) and have issued the fourth most walks (236).

STARTING PITCHING: Frankie Montas tossed 8.0 scoreless innings yesterday, which marks the second time an A's starter has tossed 8.0 innings without allowing a run this year (Blackburn, June 10 at Cleveland)...both times the starter has ended up with a no decision...starters are 4-21 with a 4.86 ERA (111 er in 205.2 ip) over the last 39 games dating back to May 12...are 15-35 with a 4.36 ERA for the season...the losses are tied with the Reds for second most in the majors (Nationals, 40)...have the fourth fewest wins and fourth highest ERA in the American League and are tied for the fourth most innings pitched (371.1).

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen is 1-7 with one save, six blown saves and a 6.75 ERA (62 er in 82.2 ip) over the last 25 games dating back to May 26...has a 4.46 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (Royals, 4.74)...is 14-for-25 (56.0%) in save opportunities...has the third lowest save percentage and third fewest saves.

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 42-of-51 (82.4%) stolen base attempts, which is the third best percentage in the American League...are tied for fourth in steals...A's opponents are 23-for-37 (62.2%) in stolen base attempts, which is the lowest success rate in the American League and the majors...rank third in the AL in fewest stolen bases allowed (23) and most caught stealing (14)...A's pitchers have five pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed one error in the last five games after making at least one error in nine consecutive games...have 47 errors for the season, which is tied for second most in the American League...rank second in the AL in double plays (63) and tied for second in fewest outfield assists (6).

PLAYER NOTES: The A's have used 46 players, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...employed 50 players last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season...have used 27 pitchers, which is fourth most in the AL and matches the A's season total from last year...21 of the 46 players have been rookies, which ties the Oakland record for most rookies in a season (21 in 2008)...have set the Oakland record for rookie pitchers with 13 (previous: 12 in 2009, 12, 15 and 16)...10 of the rookies have made their Major League debut, which is the A's most since 2016 when they set the Oakland record with 15...currently have nine rookies on the roster, including six pitchers...have used nine starting pitchers, which matches the season total from each of the previous two years...have used three different position players as pitchers for the first time in Oakland history (Bethancourt, Neuse, Pinder).

THIS AND THAT: Yesterday, the A's lost for the fourth time this year when leading after eighth innings, which is tied with the Phillies for the most in the majors...are 19-10 (.655) when scoring first and 4-38 (.095) when the opponent scores first...have the second lowest winning percentage in the majors when the opponent scores first (Cubs, 2-22/.083)...have seven comefrom-behind wins, which is third fewest in the majors (Cubs and Twins, 6)... are 0-2 in extra inning games and are one of two teams in the majors without an extra inning win (Dodgers, 0-5)...the two extra inning games are tied for the fewest in the majors...are averaging 3 hours and 2 minutes per game, which is fourth quickest in the American League and the majors.

A's vs. ROYALS: The A's trail in the season series 1-2 after losing two of three in Oakland last weekend...won the season series last year as they went 5-2 against the Royals for the third consecutive season series...won three of four in Oakland and two of three in Kansas City...are now 25-12 (.676) against the Royals dating back to 2016, which includes 12-8 in Oakland and 13-4 in Kansas City...all-time, the A's are 333-271 (.551) against the Royals...the only American League team the A's have a better record against is Tampa Bay (.583)...are 181-122 in Oakland and 152-149 in Kansas City.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Seth Brown is tied for fourth in the American League in go-ahead home runs (7) and tied for eight in go-ahead RBI (12)... Sean Murphy is tied for second among AL catchers in RBI (26) and ranks third in home runs (8)...he leads AL catchers in games started (52), total chances (439) and putouts (416), is tied for the lead in assists (22) and ranks second in fielding percentage (.998).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1979 Rickey Henderson steals the first base of his career in his Major League debut in the first game of a doubleheader against Texas...he doubles in his first big league at bat and adds a single in three other at bats...in 2012 Derek Norris hits his first Major League home run, a walk-off threerun blast in the A's 4-2 win over San Francisco.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (2-4, 3.14 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 15-day injured list May 22 and is 0-3 with a 3.31 ERA (13 er in 35.1 ip) in six starts since his return...the three-game losing streak is one short of his career high of four (twice, last: May 9-30, 2021)...was 2-1 with a 2.93 ERA in five starts when he was placed on the IL May 6 retroactive to May 2 with left shoulder tendinitis...made one rehab start with Low-A Stockton on May 17 against Modesto and was the winning pitcher in the Ports 4-3 win (5.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 6 so, 1 hr).

DON'T WALK: Has walked 15 batters in 63.0 innings, an average of 2.14 per nine innings...walked just 42 batters in 178.1 innings last year and his average of 2.12 walks per nine innings was eighth lowest in the American League...has walked two batters or fewer in each of his 11 starts this year and 42 of his 46 career starts...has walked just 71 batters in 286.2 career innings (2.23 per nine innings).

OR STRIKEOUT: Has struck out just 43 batters in 63.0 innings, an average of 6.14 per nine innings...last year, he fanned just 125 batters and his average of 6.31 strikeouts per nine innings was third lowest in the AL and the majors...has struck out four batters or fewer in nine of his 11 starts this year.

THE FIRST INNING: Has allowed 10 of his 24 runs in the first inning and has a 6.55 ERA (8 er in 11.0 ip) and .333 (16-for-48) opponents batting average... has a 1.23 ERA (6 er in 44.0 ip) and .213 (34-for-160) opponents average over innings two through five...has a 9.00 ERA (8 er in 8.0 ip) and .314 (11-for-35) opponents average from the sixth inning on.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-1 with a 1.57 ERA (6 er in 34.1 ip) and .220 (28-for-127) opponents batting average in six starts at home compared to 1-3 with a 5.02 ERA (16 er in 28.2 ip) and .284 (33-for-116) opponents average in five starts on the road...has allowed all seven of his home runs on the road.

THIS AND THAT: Has made eight of his 11 starts in day games...last year he made 17 of his 32 starts during the day, which tied for the most in the majors...has a .297 (27-for-91) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .194 (18-for-93) the second time and .272 (16-for-59) after that... five of the seven home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...has yielded three home runs to the first hitter in the order...the opponents number three hitter in the order is 4-for-31 (.129) against him.

2022 HIGHLIGHTS: Faced his former team in his first start on April 9 at Philadelphia and was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss...yielded a career-high tying three home runs...then went 2-0 with a 2.01 ERA over his next four starts...tossed a season-high 6.1 innings for the win in his second start on April 14 at Tampa Bay, a 6-3 A's win...retired 14 consecutive batters at one point...allowed one run or fewer in three consecutive starts from April 19-30...walked a season-high two batters in four consecutive starts from April 19-May 22...struck out exactly four batters in five consecutive starts from April 19-May 27...that matched the longest streak of consecutive starts with exactly four strikeouts in Athletics history (Brandon McCarthy, April 11-May 2, 2012)...combined with Jackson, Snead and Jiménez on a four-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Texas April 24 in Oakland...tossed five of the innings and allowed just one hit while walking two...the blanked Cleveland over the first three innings on April 30 to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 12 innings...was 2-1 with a 2.93 ERA in five starts when he was placed on the 15-day injured list May 6 retroactive to May 2 with left shoulder tendinitis.. made one rehab start with Low-A Stockton on May 17 against Modesto and was the winning pitcher in the Ports 4-3 win (5.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 6 so, 1 hr)... was reinstated on May 22 and started and lost that day at Los Angeles (AL)... allowed a season-high eight hits...left his start on May 27 against Texas with a 5-2 lead but the bullpen blew the save...walked a season-high tying two batters in 5.2 innings in a 5-4 loss to Houston on June 1...struck out a seasonhigh six batters in 5.1 innings in a no decision at Atlanta on June 7...allowed a season-high five runs in 5.2 innings in a 6-3 loss at Cleveland on June 12.

LAST START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 2-0 loss to Kansas City on Saturday in Oakland...matched his season highs in innings pitched (6.1), walks (2) and strikeouts (6)...shut out the Royals on two hits and two walks over the first six innings...had retired nine straight when he allowed a one-out triple to Taylor in the seventh...was relieved by Acevedo who allowed the runner to score...the A's were shut out on two hits by Keller and the Kansas City bullpen.

2021 RECAP: Was acquired by the A's from Philadelphia for cash considerations on Jan. 30, 2021 and went 10-15 with a 4.24 ERA in 32 starts...his 15 losses were the most in the American League, tied for third most in the majors and matched the most by an A's pitcher over the last 13 years (Jesse Chavez, 2015)...is the first Athletic to lead the league in losses since Tom Candiotti in 1998...tied for the AL lead in games started and ranked 10th in innings pitched (178.1)...had a .281 opponents batting average and his 195 hits allowed were the most in the AL and second most in the majors. his 94 runs were fifth most in the AL and his nine hit batters tied for 10th most...averaged 15.0 pitches per inning, which was the fewest in the AL and fourth fewest in the majors...struck out just 125 batters and his average of 6.31 strikeouts per nine innings was third lowest in the AL and the majors... allowed 23 home runs and ranked seventh in the AL in fewest home runs per nine innings (1.16)...his opponents batting average broke down to .270 (143-for-530) with a .739 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .289 (52-for-180) with a .767 OPS against left-handers...surrendered 18 of his 23 home runs to righties...17 of the home runs were solo shots...allowed a .324 average with runners in scoring position, which was the highest in the majors and fifth highest in Oakland history...was 1-10 with a 6.60 ERA and .890 OPS in 12 starts on four days rest compared to 9-4 with a 2.84 ERA and .657 OPS in 19 starts on five days rest or more...led the majors in losses and highest ERA on four days rest and had the second highest OPS...tied for third in the AL in wins on five days rest or more, ranked fourth in ERA and sixth in OPS...opponents hit .440 with a 1.462 OPS when putting his curveball in play...the OPS was the highest in the majors among pitchers with 75 or more curveballs in play...had 20 assists, which tied for sixth most among AL pitchers...left with the lead only to have the pen blow the save in five of his starts...went 10-3 in 18 starts with more than two runs of support, 0-12 in 14 starts with support of two runs or fewer.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER nig (1-2, 6.59): Was selected from Triple-A Las Ve

LHP Jared Koenig (1-2, 6.59): Was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas June 8 and is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season and his career...tossed 5.2 scoreless innings for his first Major League win in his last start, a 4-0 win over Kansas City last Sunday in Oakland (21 h, 4 bb, 0 so), after allowing 10 runs in 8.0 innings over his first two starts, both losses...was 4-2 with a 2.21 ERA in nine games, including eight starts, with Triple-A Las Vegas...struck out 61 batters in 53.0 innings...at the time of his June 8 promotion to Oakland, he ranked second in the Pacific Coast League in ERA (2.21), tied for second in strikeouts (61 and tied for third in wins (4)...pitched in independent leagues from 2017-19 and combined for a 22-10 record and a 3.40 ERA in 53 games, including 47 starts, in three seasons of independent ball...was signed by the A's as a free agent on Jan. 14, 2020 and is 11-7 with a 2.94 ERA in 33 games, including 39 starts, in two seasons in the minors.
