# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (25-49) VS. NEW YORK YANKEES (53-20) 

MONDAY, JUNE 27, 2022 - YANKEE STADIUM - 7:05 ET

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's are in the midst of a two-game winning streak, having won each of the last two games against the Royals...is the first time the A's won consecutive games since May 24-25 at Seattle...have lost six of the last nine and 20 of the last 24 games....are 10-29 (.256) over the last 39 games and 25-49 (.338) overall, which is the lowest winning percentage in the majors behind the Reds ( $25-47, .347$ )...are 24 games under .500... have been in sole possession of last place in the American League West every day dating back to May 27 and have held at least a share of last every day except one dating back to May 4 (fourth on May 25)...trail first place Houston by 21 games.
SERIES NOTES: The A's won their first series since the May 23-25 series in Seattle... have lost the first game of each of the last 10 series, which is their longest such streak since Aug. 16-Sept. 8, 1997 when they had a nine-game streak...the Oakland record is 13 (three times, last: April 11-May 20, 1994)... are 4-19 in the first game of a series and 11-12 in the final game....were swept by Seattle in a three-game series to close out the last homestand, which was the seventh time they were swept this year...snapped a streak of losing eight consecutive series, which was the A's longest such streak since July 11-August 20,2008 when they lost 11 straight....are 3-15-1 over the last 19 series.

A's IN JUNE: The A's are 5-17 (.227) in June, which is the lowest winning percentage in the majors (Angels, 8-17, .320)...the only time in Oakland history the A's finished with a winning percentage under .241 in any month ( min .6 games) was in June of 1979 when they were 5-24 (.172).... went 10-21 (.323) in May, which was the 13th month in Oakland history with 20 or more losses...rank last in the majors in batting (.206), on-base percentage (.258), slugging (.331), OPS (.590) and runs (60) in June...the lowest single-month batting average in Athletics history in a month with more than 15 games is . 207 in August of 1906 and the lowest on-base percentage is .258 in September of 1908....are averaging 2.73 runs per game in June... have averaged fewer than three runs in a game in a month three times in Oakland history ( 2.50 in Aug. 1978, 2.73 in Aug. 2008, 2.96 in June 1977)...have a 5.15 ERA ( 109 er in 190.2 ip) this June, which is the highest in the American League and fourth highest in the majors.
HOME AND AWAY: The A's continue a 10-game road trip to Kansas City (21), New York-AL (three games) and Seattle (four games) tonight...it is their second of two 10 -game road trips this year (April 9-17) and is part of a stretch from June 7 -July 3 where they are scheduled play 19 of 25 games on the road....went 2-7 on the last road trip to Atlanta (0-2), Cleveland (1-3) and Boston (1-2) and are 17-21 (.447) on the road compared to 8-28 (.222) at home...have the lowest home winning percentage in the majors...went 1-5 on the last homestand against Kansas City (1-2) and Seattle (0-3)...won three of four from Baltimore in the first home series of the season but have lost each of the 10 home series since then...it is the first time the A's have lost 10 or more consecutive home series since June 20, 1916 to May 8, 1917 when they lost 17 straight (final 14 of 1916, first three of 1917)...won the first two home games against Baltimore but have not put together back-toback home wins since then...are batting .222 ( 283 -for-1273) with 149 runs scored ( 3.92 per game) and 36 home runs in 38 games on the road compared to .198 with 86 runs ( 2.4 per game) and 15 home runs in 36 home games.

OFFENSE: The A's have scored 14 runs in their last two games, their most over a two-game span since they scored 14 May 11-12 at Detroit... had been held to one run or fewer in seven of the previous 11 games and scored 15 runs total over that span...have been shutout nine times, which is tied for fourth most in the majors and is the most by an A's team since 2016 (11)...have scored one run or fewer in 27 of 74 ( $36.5 \%$ ) games and have 235 runs for the season, which is second fewest in the majors (Tigers, 216)...rank last in the majors in batting (.211), on-base percentage (.273), slugging percentage (.329) and OPS (.603)...have finished last in the majors in all four categories once in Athletics history (1943)... have the second fewest home runs (51) and extra base hits (177) in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.28 ERA ( 200 er in 340.2 ip) over the last 39 games and have a 4.41 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (Royals, 4.98)... have the third highest opponents batting average (.253) and slugging percentage (.416), and have the second highest OPS (.743) on-base percentage (.327),...have the third fewest strikeouts (558) and are third in most walks (250).

STARTING PITCHING: Frankie Montas tossed 8.0 scoreless innings Thursday, which marks the second time an A's starter has tossed 8.0 innings without allowing a run this year (Blackburn, June 10 at Cleveland)...both times the starter has ended up with a no decision...starters are 4-22 with a 4.89 ERA
(120 er in 221.0 ip) over the last 42 games dating back to May $12 \ldots$ are 15 36 with a 4.40 ERA for the season...have the fourth fewest wins and fourth highest ERA in the American League and have the fourth most innings pitched (385.2).

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen is 3-7 with two saves, seven blown saves and a 6.43 ERA ( 66 er in 92.1 ip) over the last 28 games dating back to May 26 ... has a 4.42 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (Royals, 4.71)...is 16 -for-28 ( $57.1 \%$ ) in save opportunities... has the fourth lowest save percentage and third fewest saves.
ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 45 -of-55 ( $81.8 \%$ ) stolen base attempts, which is the fifth best percentage in the Majors....are tied for eighth in steals...A's opponents are 25 -for-39 ( $64.1 \%$ ) in stolen base attempts, which is the second lowest success rate in the American League and third lowest in the Majors....rank third in the AL in fewest stolen bases allowed (25) and tied for third in most caught stealing (14)...A's pitchers have five pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed two errors in the last eight games after making at least one error in nine consecutive games...have 48 errors for the season, which is third most in the AL...rank second in the AL in double plays (64) and are tied for fourth in fewest outfield assists (8).
PLAYER NOTES: The A's have used 46 players, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...employed 50 players last year and 38 in the pan-demic-shortened 2020 season.... have used 27 pitchers, which is fourth most in the AL and matches the A's season total from last year... 21 of the 46 players have been rookies, which ties the Oakland record for most rookies in a season (21 in 2008)...have set the Oakland record for rookie pitchers with 13 (previous: 12 in 2009, 12, 15 and 16)... 10 of the rookies have made their Major League debut, which is the A's most since 2016 when they set the Oakland record with 15 ...currently have nine rookies on the roster, including six pitchers.... have used nine starting pitchers, which matches the season total from each of the previous two years.... have used three different position players as pitchers for the first time in Oakland history (Bethancourt, Neuse, Pinder).

THIS AND THAT: Are 21-10 (.677) when scoring first and 4-39 (.093) when the opponent scores first... have eight come-from-behind wins....are 0-2 in extra inning games and are one of two teams in the majors without an extra inning win (Dodgers, 0-5)...the two extra inning games are tied for the fewest in the majors....are averaging 3 hours and 2 minutes per game, which is fourth quickest in the American League and the majors.
A's vs. YANKEES: The A's lost the season series against the Yankees last year for the first time since 2016, finishing 3-4 despite winning the last two games... went 1-2 in New York and 2-2 in Oakland....are 18-15 against the Yankees dating back to 2016... have won 11 of the last 14 games and 23 of the last 32 in Oakland but have dropped eight of the last 11 games in New York...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 257-287 against the Yankees...that includes 143-130 in Oakland and 114-157 in New York....are 17-26 at Yankee Stadium...all-time, the A's are 798-1153 against the Yankees/Orioles.

## TODAY'S TIDBITS

Seth Brown is tied for fourth in the American League in go-ahead home runs (7) and in go-ahead RBI (13)... his 10 game-winning RBI are most in the AL...Tony Kemp is batting . 308 ( 8 -for-26) with three home runs, two of which have come at Yankee Stadium, in 10 career games against the Yankees...Sean Murphy is third among AL catchers in RBI (28) and home runs (8)...he leads AL catchers in games started (54), total chances (455) and is second in putouts (431)...is tied for the lead in assists (23) and ranks first in fielding percentage (.998).

## THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1987 Mark McGwire ties a pair of Oakland records by hitting three home runs and scoring five runs in the A's $13-3$ win at Cleveland...McGwire has four hits and drives in five runs...in 1996 the A's hit a franchise record eight home runs in a 18-2 win at California...the A's also collect an Oakland record 44 total bases and 11 extra base hits and score in eight different innings, tying an American League record...in 2002 Miguel Tejada plays in his $348^{\text {th }}$ consecutive game, breaking Alfredo Griffin's Oakland record for consecutive games played...Tejada's streak reached 594 before signing with Baltimore as a free agent.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Paul Blackburn (6-3, 2.97 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 1-3 with a 5.14 ERA ( 16 er in 28.0 ip) and .288 ( 34 -for- 118 ) opponents batting average over his last five starts after going 5-0 with a 1.70 ERA and .211 opponents average over his first nine starts...the five-game winning streak was a career high and he became the first starting pitcher on an A's Opening Day roster to start the season 5-0 since Trevor Cahill won his first six decisions in 2011.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks ninth in the American League in ERA (2.97), tied for ninth in wins (6) and tied for 10th in winning percentage (.667)...has allowed five home runs and his average of 0.59 home runs per nine innings is fourth lowest in the AL).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-0 with a 1.00 ERA (5 er in 45.0 ip), 209 (34-for-163) opponents batting average and . 531 OPS in seven starts on the road compared to $1-3$ with a 5.87 ERA ( 20 er in 30.2 ip), 286 ( 36 -for-126) opponents average and . 865 OPS in six starts at home...has the lowest road ERA in the majors and is tied for the lead in road wins... has not allowed a home run in 45.0 innings on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a 207 (30-for-145) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to . 278 (40-for-144) against lefthanders...has surrendered four of his five home runs and issued 12 of his 19 walks to lefties for a . 792 OPS (. 562 vs. righties)...opponents are batting .164 (10-for-61) with runners in scoring position, which is sixth lowest in the American League...entered the season with a . 328 career opponents average with RISP...has allowed a . 144 opponents batting average with two strikes, which is eighth lowest in the AL...the number five hitter in the order is 3-for31 (.097) against him.
BY MONTH: Went 3-0 with a 1.35 ERA and . 459 OPS in four starts in April, 2-1 with a 2.62 ERA and . 669 OPS in six starts in May and enters his final start in June with a 1-2 record, a 5.06 ERA (12 er in 21.1 ip) and .853 OPS in four starts...the three wins in April were his most ever in a month...has never lost more than two games in a month.
BASES ON BALLS: Has walked 16 batters in 44.2 innings over his last eight starts ( 3.22 per nine innings) after issuing just three free passes in 31.0 innings over his first six starts ( 0.87 per nine innings)...has walked 19 batters in 75.2 innings overall ( 2.26 per nine innings) and has issued two walks or fewer in 13 of his 14 starts...has four starts with no walks and four with just one...is averaging 2.40 walks per nine innings in his career ( 57 bb in 213.2 ip ).
CAREER BESTS: Has a career-high six wins...had just six wins in 30 games over his first five seasons...also has career highs in games (14), games started (14), strikeouts (55), innings pitched (75.2), hits (70), walks (19) and hit by pitches (3) and has matched his highs in earned runs (25) and wild pitches (1).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 3-2 in his no decisions and are 9-5 (.642) in his starting assignments...has allowed two runs or fewer in 10 of his 14 starts... has a 4.07 ERA ( 19 er in 42.0 ip ) in odd numbered innings, a 1.60 ERA ( 6 er in 33.2 ip ) in even numbered innings.

2022 HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed 5.0 scoreless inning and struck out a career-high seven batters in a 13-2 win at Tampa Bay in his first start on April 11...had a no decision in the A's 7-5 win in his second start on April 16 at Toronto... left with a 5-2 lead but the bullpen allowed three runs for the blown save... it was the first of two times he left with a lead only to have the pen blow the save (June 10 at Cleveland)...won back-to-back starts on April 21 against Baltimore and April 27 at San Francisco...combined with five A's relievers on a three-hit, 1-0 shutout in the win over the Giants...tossed five of the innings and allowed all three of the hits while walking one...finished April 3-0 with a 1.35 ERA in four starts...walked just two batters in 20.0 innings and held the opposition to a . 197 batting average...it was his first career three-win month and he tied for third in the American League in wins in April...based on a minimum of 20.0 innings, he had the second lowest opponents OPS (.459), ranked third in slugging (.239) and was fourth in ERA and on-base percentage (.219)...combined with Jackson and Jiménez on a four-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Detroit on May 9...tossed 6.2 innings, yielded all four of the hits and did not walk a batter...tossed 5.1 scoreless innings and allowed just one hit in a 4-2 win at Seattle on May 25...however, walked a career-high five batters...was charged with his first loss of the season on May 30 against Houston when he allowed four runs in 6.2 innings...did not allow a run over the first three innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 10.0 innings....allowed four runs in a season-low 4.0 innings in an 8-0 loss to Boston on June 4 in Oakland...tossed a career-high 8.0 scoreless innings, walked one and allowed four hits on June 10 at Cleveland but had a no decision in the A's 3-2 loss...the pen allowed three runs in the ninth inning...did not allow a run over the first two innings of his next start on June 16 at Boston to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high tying 10.0 innings.
LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-0 loss to Seattle last Wednesday in Oakland...allowed a season-high seven runs on a career-high

2021 RECAP: Began the season at Triple-A Las Vegas and was $4-7$ with a 4.97 ERA in 17 games, including 16 starts, when he was selected by Oakland on Aug. 18...spent the balance of the season with the A's and went 1-4 with a 5.87 ERA in nine starts...allowed a 319 opponents batting average with the A's but walked just 10 batters in 38.1 innings ( 2.35 walks per nine innings) for a . 366 opponents on-base percentage...his opponents batting average broke down to .309 (29-for-94) with an 858 OPS against right-handed hit ters compared to .333 (23-for-69) with a . 953 OPS against left-handers...opponents hit .333 with runners in scoring position...was $0-1$ with a 4.03 ERA and .720 opponents OPS in five starts at home, 1-3 with an 8.44 ERA and 1.115 OPS in four starts on the road...yielded seven of his eight home runs on the road... was 1-1 with a 3.38 ERA in four starts during the day, 0-3 with an 8.24 ERA in five starts at night...allowed a .533 batting average to the opponents number nine hitter and . 438 average to the seven hitter...the A's were 3-1 in his no decisions and went 4-5 (.444) in his starting assignments... tossed fewer than six innings in all nine starts, including fewer than five in nings four times...his seven losses with the Aviators were his most as a minor leaguer and his 311 opponents batting average was a career high...surrendered just eight home runs in 88.2 innings, an average of 0.81 per nine innings...his opponents batting average broke down to .300 (61-for-203) with an . 824 OPS against left-handed hitters and .323 (53-for-164) with a .776 OPS against right-handers...yielded six of his eight home runs and issued 18 of his 27 walks to lefties...six of the eight home runs he allowed were solo shots...went 2-3 with a 4.24 ERA, .287 opponents batting average and .737 OPS in nine starts at home, 2-4 with a 5.79 ERA, .333 opponent average and . 867 OPS on the road...tossed six innings or fewer in each of his 17 appearances...the Aviators were 5-11 (.313) in his starting assignments.
