# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (25-51) VS. NEW YORK YANKEES (55-20)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost each of their last two games after winning their last two in Kansas City...the two-game win streak against the Royals was the first time the A's won consecutive games since May 24-25 at Seattle...have lost six of the last eight games, 11 of the last 15 and 21 of the last 26...are 1031 (.244) over the last 41 games and 25-51 (.329) overall, which is the lowest winning percentage in the majors behind the Reds and Royals (26-47, .356)... are 26 games under .500, which matches the season high (23-49 on June 24)...have the second lowest winning percentage in Oakland history after 76 games to the 1979 club (22-54, lost games 77 through 79)...finished 54-108 that year, which is the only 100-loss season in Oakland history...have been in sole possession of last place in the American League West every day dating back to May 27 and have held at least a share of last every day except one dating back to May 4 (fourth on May 25)...trail first place Houston by $2 w 1 / 2$ games, which is a season high.

SERIES NOTES: With the loss Monday night, the A's have now lost the first game of each of the last 11 series...that is their longest such streak since April 11-May 20, 1994 when they lost the first game of 13 consecutive series, which is the longest streak in Oakland history (three times)...are 4-20 in the first game of a series and 11-12 in the final game...won two of three at Kansas City over the weekend for their first series win since taking two of three at Seattle, May 23-25...it snapped an eight-series losing streak, which was the A's longest such streak since July 11-August 20, 2008 when they lost 11 straight...their loss last night clinches another series loss and they are are 3-16-1 over the previous 19 series.

A's IN JUNE: The A's are 5-19 (.208) in June, which is the lowest winning percentage in the majors (Pirates, $8-18 / .308$ )...the only time in Oakland history the A's finished with a winning percentage under .241 in any month (min. 6 games) was in June of 1979 when they were 5-24 (.172)...went 10-21 (.323) in May, which was the 13th month in Oakland history with 20 or more losses...this is the first time the A's have lost 19 or more games in back-to-back months since 1979 when they went 5-24 in June and 8-20 in July...rank last in the majors in batting (.204), on-base percentage (.258), slugging (.324), OPS (.582) and runs (66) this June...the lowest single-month batting average in Athletics history in a month with more than 15 games is .207 in August of 1906 and the lowest on-base percentage is . 258 in September of 1908...are averaging 2.75 runs per game in June...have averaged fewer than three runs in a game in a month three times in Oakland history ( 2.50 in Aug. 1978, 2.73 in Aug. 2008, 2.96 in June 1977)...have a 5.14 ERA ( 118 er in 206.2 ip) this June, which is fourth highest in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-3 on this 10-game road trip to Kansas City (2-1), New York-AL (0-2) and Seattle (four games)...it is their second of two 10-game road trips this year (April 9-17) and is part of a stretch from June 7-July 3 where they are scheduled play 19 of 25 games on the road... went 2-7 on the last road trip to Atlanta (0-2), Cleveland (1-3) and Boston (1-2) and are 17-23 (.425) on the road compared to 8-28 (.222) at home...have the lowest home winning percentage in the majors...went 1-5 on the last homestand against Kansas City (1-2) and Seattle (0-3)...won three of four from Baltimore in the first home series of the season but have lost each of the 10 home series since then...it is the first time the A's have lost 10 or more consecutive home series since June 20, 1916 to May 8, 1917 when they lost 17 straight (final 14 of 1916, first three of 1917)...won the first two home games against Baltimore but have not put together back-to-back home wins since then... are batting . 221 (295-for-1337) with 155 runs scored ( 3.88 per game) and 36 home runs in 40 games on the road compared to .198 with 86 runs ( 2.4 per game) and 15 home runs in 36 home games.
OFFENSE: The A's have scored 20 runs in the last four games after scoring 18 runs over the previous 11 contests...have scored 241 runs for the season, which is second fewest in the majors (Tigers, 219)...have been shut out nine times, which is tied for fifth most in the majors and is the most by an A's team since 2016 (11)...have scored one run or fewer in 28 of 76 (36.8\%) games...are batting . 201 (171-for-849) with 68 runs scored over the last 26 games ( 2.62 runs per game)...rank last in the majors in batting (.210), on-base percentage (.273), slugging percentage (.327) and OPS (.600)...have finished last in the majors in all four categories once in Athletics history (1943)...have the second fewest home runs (51) and extra base hits (180) in the majors.
PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.27 ERA (209 er in 356.2 ip) over the last 41 games and have a 4.42 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have the second highest opponents on-base percentage (.327), slugging percentage (.417) and OPS (.744) and third highest batting
average (.253)...have issued the third most walks (258), allowed tied for the third most home runs (83) and have the fourth fewest strikeouts (573).
STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are $0-4$ with a 4.74 ERA ( 23 er in 43.2 ip) over the last eight games and $4-23$ with a 4.85 ERA ( 125 er in 232.0 ip) over the last 44 games dating back to May 12...are 15-37 with a 4.39 ERA for the season... have the the fourth highest ERA in the American League and the fourth most innings pitched (397.2).
THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has three blown saves in the last six games and is 3-7 with three saves, eight blown saves and a 6.41 ERA ( 70 er in 98.1 ip) over the last 30 games dating back to May 26 ... has a 4.47 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...is 16-for-29 (55.2\%) in save opportunities... has the second lowest save percentage and third fewest saves... has the fifth lowest opponents batting average against first batters faced (.229).
ON THE BASES: The A's have stolen a base in each of the last six games, which is their longest streak this year...have stolen a base in six consecutive games just one other time the last 10 years (Aug. 18-23, 2021)...have been successful in 48 -of- $59(81.4 \%)$ stolen base attempts overall, which is the second best percentage in the American League...rank third in steals....A's opponents are 27 -for-41 ( $65.9 \%$ ) in stolen base attempts, which is the second lowest success rate in the AL...rank third in the AL in fewest stolen bases allowed and are fifth in most caught stealing (15).
DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's did not commit an error last night...committed two errors Monday night, both on catchers interference by Sean Murphy...it was just the second time in Oakland history the A's had two catchers interference in the same game (April 28, 2017 vs. Houston), but it was the first time in the same inning...now have 50 errors for the season, which is second most in the American League...also rank second in double plays (66) and tied for sixth in fewest outfield assists (9).
PLAYER NOTES: The A's have used 46 players, which is fifth most in the American League...employed 50 players last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season...have used 27 pitchers, which is fourth most in the AL and matches the A's season total from last year... 21 of the 46 players have been rookies, which ties the Oakland record for most rookies in a season (21 in 2008)...have set the Oakland record for rookie pitchers with 13 (previous: 12 in 2009, 12,15 and 16)... 10 of the rookies have made their Major League debut, which is the A's most since 2016 when they set the Oakland record with 15 ...currently have eight rookies on the roster, including six pitchers... have used nine starting pitchers, which matches the season total from each of the previous two years.... have used three different position players as pitchers for the first time in Oakland history (Bethancourt, Neuse, Pinder).

A's vs. YANKEES: The A's lost the first two in this series after losing the season series last year, 3-4...it was the A's first season series loss to NY since 2016 (34)...went 1-2 in New York and 2-2 in Oakland....are 18-17 against the Yankees dating back to 2016...have won 11 of the last 14 games and 23 of the last 32 in Oakland but have dropped 10 of the last 13 games in New York...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 257-289 against the Yankees...that includes 143-130 in Oakland and 114-159 in New York...are 17-28 at Yankee Stadium...all-time, the A's are 798-1155 against the Yankees/Orioles.

Seth Brown is tied for fourth in the American League in go-ahead home runs (7) and tied for sixth in go-ahead RBI (13)...has hit safely in each of his last seven games and is 12 -for- 26 (.462) with three doubles, two home runs and five RBI during the streak...Sean Murphy ranks third among AL catchers in home runs (8) and RBI (28)...leads AL catchers in games started (56) and total chances (475).

## THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1925 Bill Lamar extends his hitting streak to an Athletics franchise record 29 consecutive games...in 1990 Dave Stewart pitches the fifth nohitter in Oakland history in the A's 5-0 win at Toronto...after walking the first two hitters he faced, Stewart retired 25 in a row before a two-out walk in the ninth...in 1996 the A's hit three home runs at California, giving Oakland 18 home runs in their last four games, which ties the American League record...in 2003 Eric Byrnes becomes the fifth player in Oakland history to hit for the cycle and ties an Oakland record with five hits in a 5-2 win at San Francisco.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (2-5, 3.29 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 15 -day injured list May 22 and is 0-4 with a 3.54 ERA ( 16 er in 40.2 ip ) in seven starts since his return...the fourgame losing streak matches his career high (third time, previous: May 9-30, 2021)...was $2-1$ with a 2.93 ERA in five starts when he was placed on the IL May 6 retroactive to May 2 with left shoulder tendinitis...made one rehab start with Low-A Stockton on May 17 against Modesto and was the winning pitcher in the Ports $4-3$ win ( $5.0 \mathrm{ip}, 5 \mathrm{~h}, 1 \mathrm{r}, 1 \mathrm{er}, 6 \mathrm{so}, 1 \mathrm{hr}$ ).

DON'T WALK: Has walked 17 batters in 68.1 innings, an average of 2.24 per nine innings....walked just 42 batters in 178.1 innings last year and his average of 2.12 walks per nine innings was eighth lowest in the American League...has walked two batters or fewer in each of his 12 starts this year and 43 of his 47 career starts... has walked just 73 batters in 292.0 career innings ( 2.25 per nine innings).
OR STRIKEOUT: Has struck out just 47 batters in 68.1 innings, an average of 6.19 per nine innings...last year, he fanned just 125 batters and his average of 6.31 strikeouts per nine innings was third lowest in the AL and the majors.... has struck out four batters or fewer in 10 of his 12 starts this year.
THE FIRST INNING: Has allowed 10 of his 27 runs in the first inning and has a 6.00 ERA ( 8 er in 12.0 ip ) and .327 (17-for-52) opponents batting average... has a 1.50 ERA ( 8 er in 48.0 ip ) and .210 ( 37 -for-176) opponents average over innings two through five.... has a 9.72 ERA ( 9 er in 8.1 ip) and .351 ( 13 -for- 37 ) opponents average from the sixth inning on.
HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-1 with a 1.57 ERA ( 6 er in 34.1 ip) and 220 ( 28 -for127) opponents batting average in six starts at home compared to $1-4$ with a 5.03 ERA ( 19 er in 34.0 ip) and .290 (40-for-138) opponents average in six starts on the road... has allowed all nine of his home runs on the road.

THIS AND THAT: Is scheduled to make his 13th start of the season today, his ninth in a day game...last year he made 17 of his 32 starts during the day, which tied for the most in the majors... has a 290 (29-for-100) opponents batting average the first time through the order, 198 (20-for-101) the second time and .297 (19-for-64) after that...seven of the nine home runs he has allowed have been solo shots.... has yielded three home runs to the first hitter in the order...the opponents number three hitter in the order is 5 -for34 (.147) against him...the A's have lost in each of his last eight starts and are 3-9 (.250) in his starting assignments.

2022 HIGHLIGHTS: Faced his former team in his first start on April 9 at Philadelphia and was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss....yielded a career-high tying three home runs...then went 2-0 with a 2.01 ERA over his next four starts...tossed a season-high 6.1 innings for the win in his second start on April 14 at Tampa Bay, a 6-3 A's win...retired 14 consecutive batters at one point....allowed one run or fewer in three consecutive starts from April 1930...walked a season-high two batters in four consecutive starts from April 19-May 22...struck out exactly four batters in five consecutive starts from April 19-May 27...that matched the longest streak of consecutive starts with exactly four strikeouts in Athletics history (Brandon McCarthy, April 11-May 2, 2012)...combined with Jackson, Snead and Jiménez on a four-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Texas April 24 in Oakland...tossed five of the innings and allowed just one hit while walking two...the blanked Cleveland over the first three innings on April 30 to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 12 innings...was $2-1$ with a 2.93 ERA in five starts when he was placed on the 15-day injured list May 6 retroactive to May 2 with left shoulder tendinitis... made one rehab start with Low-A Stockton on May 17 against Modesto and was the winning pitcher in the Ports $4-3$ win ( $5.0 \mathrm{ip}, 5 \mathrm{~h}, 1 \mathrm{r}, 1 \mathrm{er}, 6 \mathrm{so}, 1 \mathrm{hr}$ )... was reinstated on May 22 and started and lost that day at Los Angeles (AL)... allowed a season-high eight hits...left his start on May 27 against Texas with a 5-2 lead but the bullpen blew the save...walked a season-high tying two batters in 5.2 innings in a $5-4$ loss to Houston on June 1...struck out a seasonhigh six batters in 5.1 innings in a no decision at Atlanta on June 7 ...allowed a season-high five runs in 5.2 innings in a 6-3 loss at Cleveland on June 12... matched his season highs in innings pitched (6.1), walks (2) and strikeouts (6) in a 2-0 loss to Kansas City on June 18.

LAST START: He lost his third consecutive start in the A's 3-1 loss at Kansas City last Friday....walked a season-high tying two batters in 5.1 innings...allowed a lead off home run to Olivares in the third inning but the A's came back to tie the game with a run in the fourth...Olivares also homered to lead off the fifth to put the Royals ahead for good and Irvin yielded a RBI single to Santana in the sixth.

2021 RECAP: Was acquired by the A's from Philadelphia for cash considerations on Jan. 30, 2021 and went 10-15 with a 4.24 ERA in 32 starts...his 15 losses were the most in the American League, tied for third most in the majors and matched the most by an A's pitcher over the last 13 years (Jesse Chavez, 2015)...is the first Athletic to lead the league in losses since Tom Candiotti in 1998...tied for the AL lead in games started and ranked 10th in innings pitched (178.1)...had a 281 opponents batting average and his 195 hits allowed were the most in the AL and second most in the majors... his 94 runs were fifth most in the AL and his nine hit batters tied for 10th most....averaged 15.0 pitches per inning, which was the fewest in the AL and fourth fewest in the majors...struck out just 125 batters and his average of 6.31 strikeouts per nine innings was third lowest in the AL and the majors... allowed 23 home runs and ranked seventh in the AL in fewest home runs per nine innings (1.16)...his opponents batting average broke down to 270 (143-for-530) with a . 739 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .289 ( 52 -for-180) with a .767 OPS against left-handers...surrendered 18 of his 23 home runs to righties... 17 of the home runs were solo shots...allowed a .324 average with runners in scoring position, which was the highest in the majors and fifth highest in Oakland history...was 1-10 with a 6.60 ERA and .890 OPS in 12 starts on four days rest compared to $9-4$ with a 2.84 ERA and .657 OPS in 19 starts on five days rest or more...led the majors in losses and highest ERA on four days rest and had the second highest OPS...tied for third in the AL in wins on five days rest or more, ranked fourth in ERA and sixth in OPS...opponents hit . 440 with a 1.462 OPS when putting his curveball in play...the OPS was the highest in the majors among pitchers with 75 or more curveballs in play... had 20 assists, which tied for sixth most among AL pitchers...left with the lead only to have the pen blow the save in five of his starts...went 10-3 in 18 starts with more than two runs of support, 0-12 in 14 starts with support of two runs or fewer.

- Has a .163 ( 13 -for-80) opponents batting average against right-handed hitters compared to 273 (12-for-44) against left-handers.

Last Year: Made his ML debut and compiled a 3.27 ERA and . 225 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over two stints with the A's'...was also 2-0 with nine saves, a 2.48 ERA and . 186 opponent average in 30 relief appearances with Las Vegas.

- Has allowed no runs in seven of his last 12 appearances, but allowed six runs in the other five....in total over the stretch, he has ( $10.0 \mathrm{ip}, 6 \mathrm{~h}, 6 \mathrm{r}, 6$ er, 11 bb, 16 so, 5.40 ERA).
- Is tied for fourth in the American League in holds (13) and tied for seventh in games pitched (32)...is fourth among AL relievers in strikeouts (42).
- Has a .182 opponents batting average but has issued 24 walks in 29.2 innings for a .344 on-base percentage...the walks are tied for the most among Major League relievers (Coleman, KC)...has walked the first batter faced eight times which is the most in the Majors.
- Has allowed just 1-of-11 (9.1\%) inherited runners to score, which is the 10th lowest percentage in the AL.
Last Year: Split his season between Double-A Midland and Triple-A Las Vegas and combined for a 2-2 record, a career-high tying six saves and a 2.57 ERA in 25 relief appearances before a right hip labral tear ended his season in mid-July.

- Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas June 9 for his third stint with the A's this year and has pitched four times since his return, all in relief (7.1 ip, 8 h, $4 \mathrm{r}, 3 \mathrm{er}, 6 \mathrm{bb}, 3$ so, 3.68 ERA)...each of his first four career appearances were starts (12.27 ERA).
