# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (26-53) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (37-42)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won last night to snap a four-game losing streak.... have lost eight of the last 11...are 6-23 (.207) dating back to May 30 and 11-33 (.250) since winning the day game of the May 14 doubleheader...are 26-53 (.329) overall, which is the lowest winning percentage in the majors behind the Reds ( $26-50, .342$ )...are 27 games under .500 ... have not been more than 28 games under .500 since finishing the 1997 season 32 games under (65-97)... have the second lowest winning percentage in Oakland history after 79 games to the 1979 club (22-57, won game 80)...finished 54-108 that year, which is the only 100 -loss season in Oakland history...have been in sole possession of last place in the American League West every day dating back to May 27 and have held at least a share of last every day except one dating back to May 4 (fourth on May 25)...trail first place Houston by $241 / 2$ games, which is the A's largest deficit in the West since finishing the 2017 season 26 games out...won back-to-back games last Saturday and Sunday at Kansas City for the first time since May 24-25 at Seattle.
A's IN JUNE: The A's went 5-21 (.192) in June, which was the lowest winning percentage in the majors (Reds, $9-18 / .333$ )...it was the second lowest winning percentage in a month of five or more games in Oakland history... the lowest is . 172 (5-24) in June of 1979...it was the 14th month in Oakland history with 20 or more losses and the 21 losses tied for third most...went $10-21$ in May and have lost 21 or more games in consecutive months for the first time since 1954 when the Philadelphia A's went 7-23 in July and 9-23 in August...it is the third time in Oakland history the A's lost 20 or more games in consecutive months (Aug. and Sept. 1978, June and July 1979)... ranked last in the majors in on-base percentage (.263), slugging (.332), OPS (.595) and runs (75) and second to last in batting average (.210)...the on-base percentage was second lowest in Athletics history in a month of more than 15 games (. 256 in Sept. 1908)...the OPS was third lowest in Oakland history (. 572 in April 1968, . 581 in April 1979)...the batting average when rounded to four decimals (.2102) was third lowest in Oakland history (. 2099 in April 1979, . 2101 in May 2012)...averaged 2.88 runs per game, which was third lowest in Oakland history (2.50 in Aug. 1978, 2.73 in Aug. 2008)...had a 5.25 ERA, which was the highest in the American League and third highest in the majors.
SERIES NOTES: With the loss Thursday night, the A's have now lost the first game of each of the last 12 series...that is one short of the longest such streak in Oakland history (13, three times, last: April 11-May 20, 1994)...are $4-21$ in the first game of a series and 11-13 in the final game...were swept by New York (AL) to start the week, which was the eighth time the A's were swept this year....won two of three at Kansas City last weekend for their first series win since taking two of three at Seattle, May 23-25...it snapped an eight-series losing streak, which was the A's longest such streak since July 11-August 20,2008 when they lost 11 straight...are 3-16-1 over the previous 20 series.
HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-5 on this 10-game road trip to Kansas City (2-1), New York-AL ( $0-3$ ) and Seattle (1-1)...it is their second of two 10-game road trips this year (April 9-17) and is part of a stretch from June 7 -July 3 where they are scheduled play 19 of 25 games on the road...went 2-7 on the last road trip to Atlanta ( $0-2$ ), Cleveland (1-3) and Boston (1-2) and are 18-25 (.419) on the road compared to $8-28(.222)$ at home.... have the lowest home winning percentage in the majors...return home following the game Sunday for a six-game homestand against Toronto (three games) and Houston (three games)....went 1-5 on the last homestand against Kansas City (1-2) and Seattle ( $0-3$ )....are batting . 226 ( 327 -for-1449) with 167 runs scored ( 3.9 per game) and 40 home runs in 43 games on the road compared to .198 with 86 runs ( 2.4 per game) and 15 home runs in 36 home games.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting 254 ( 66 -for-252) with 32 runs over the last seven games after hitting. 190 with 18 runs scored over the previous 11 contests...rank last in the majors in batting (.214), on-base percentage (.275) and OPS (.607) and second to last in slugging percentage (.332)...have finished last in the majors in all four categories once in Athletics history (1943)...have the second fewest runs (253), home runs (55) and extra base hits (189) and the third fewest walks (197)....have been shut out nine times, which is tied for fifth most in the majors and is the most by an A's team since 2016 (11)... have scored one run or fewer in 28 of 79 (35.4\%) games.
PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.23 ERA ( 222 er in 381.2 ip) over the last 44 games after posting a 3.44 ERA over the first 35 contests...have a 4.43 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League... have the highest opponents slugging percentage (.417), second highest on-base percentage (.326) and OPS (.743) and third highest batting average (.251)... have issued the third most walks (267), have the fourth fewest strikeouts (593) and the fourth most home runs (87).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 1-6 with a 5.28 ERA ( 36 er in 61.1 ip ) over the last 11 games and $5-25$ with a 4.97 ERA ( 138 er in 249.2 ip ) over the last 47 games dating back to May 12...are 16-39 with a 4.49 ERA for the season...the losses are tied for second most in the majors (Nationals, 41)...have the third fewest wins in the American League, the fourth highest ERA and the fourth most innings pitched (415.1).
THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen is 3-7 with four saves, eight blown saves and a 5.96 ERA ( 70 er in 105.2 ip ) over the last 33 games dating back to May 26...has a 4.35 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...is 17 -for-30 $(56.7 \%)$ in save opportunities... has the fourth lowest save percentage and is tied for the third fewest saves... has allowed 14-of-20 (70.0\%) inherited runners to score over the last 10 games.

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 49-of-61 (80.3\%) stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the American League...are tied for third in steals....A's opponents are 27 -for-41 (65.9\%) in stolen base attempts, which is the third lowest success rate in the AL.... have allowed the third fewest stolen bases...A's pitchers have six pickoffs, which is tied for third most in the AL, and lead the majors in pitcher pickoff attempts.
DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed four errors in the last 11 games but have 51 for the season, which is third most in the American League...rank second in double plays (68).
PLAYER NOTES: Skye Bolt and Vimael Machín made their 2022 debuts on Thursday and the A's have now used 48 players this year, which is tied for third most in the American League...employed 50 players last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season....have used 27 pitchers, which is fourth most in the AL and matches the A's season total from last year... 21 of the 48 players have been rookies, which ties the Oakland record for most rookies in a season (21 in 2008)...have set the Oakland record for rookie pitchers with 13 (previous: 12 in 2009, 12, 15 and 16)... 10 of the rookies have made their Major League debut, which is the A's most since 2016 when they set the Oakland record with $15 . . . c u r r e n t l y$ have seven rookies on the roster, including six pitchers.
THIS AND THAT: The A's are 22-11 (.667) when scoring first and 4-42 (.087) when the opponent scores first... have the lowest winning percentage in the majors when the opponent scores first (Royals, 6-38/.136)... have eight come-from-behind wins, which is tied for fewest in the majors...are 0-2 in extra inning games and are the only team in the majors without an extra inning win...the two extra inning games are tied with the Tigers and Reds for the fewest in the majors.
A's vs. MARINERS: The A's are 3-5 against the Mariners....are 3-2 in Seattle and $0-3$ in Oakland.... have lost 17 of the last 20 games...have dropped eight of the last 11 in Seattle and snapped a nine-game home losing streak last night... was the A's longest ever against the Mariners....lost the season series last year $15-4$ and the 15 losses were the A's most against one team since they went 2-16 against Chicago in 1964...went 3-7 in Seattle and 1-8 in Oakland...the home record matched the A's worst against the Mariners (2007 and 2016)... have lost seven of the previous nine season series and are 69-101 (.406) against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2013 season, which is the A's worst mark against any American League team over that span...alltime, the A's are 373-325 against the Mariners...that includes 198-147 in Oakland, 174-175 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 98-111 at T-Mobile Park.

## TODAY'S TIDBITS

Nick Allen is 10 -for-34 (.294) with a home run and five RBI in 10 starts since being recalled on June 21...Sheldon Neuse has hit safely in seven straight games and is batting 385 over that span....he is 13 -for- 38 (.342) in 11 games since being recalled on June 21...Lou Trivino has picked up the save in each of his last three appearances and has not allowed a run in his last five outings ( $5.2 \mathrm{ip}, 6 \mathrm{~h}, 3 \mathrm{bb}, 8 \mathrm{so}$ )...Paul Blackburn has the lowest road ERA in the majors and is tied for second in road wins.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY
In 1969 Reggie Jackson hits three home runs in the A's 5-0 win against Seattle...the three-homer game is the first in Oakland history and it gives Reggie 33 round trippers in the A's first 72 games....in 1996 Mark McGwire hits his $303^{\text {rd }}$ career home run to break Jimmie Foxx's all-time Athletics record of $302 \ldots$...also, Jason Giambi is a perfect 5 for 5 in the A's 11-6 victory at Seattle...he has three singles and a pair of doubles...in 2019 Chris Herrmann becomes the first player in Athletics history to hit a grand slam in his A's debut.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Paul Blackburn (6-3, 3.12 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 1-3 with a 5.18 ERA (19 er in 33.0 ip) and . 285 (39-for-137) opponents batting average over his last six starts after going 5-0 with a 1.70 ERA and . 211 opponents average over his first nine starts...the five-game winning streak was a career high and he became the first starting pitcher on an A's Opening Day roster to start the season 5-0 since Trevor Cahill won his first six decisions in 2011...is tied for 10th in the American League in wins (6) and in winning percentage (.667).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-0 with a 1.44 ERA (8 er in 50.0 ip), 214 (39-for-182) opponents batting average and .576 OPS in nine starts on the road compared to $1-3$ with a 5.87 ERA ( 20 er in 30.2 ip ), 286 ( 36 -for- 126 ) opponents average and 865 OPS in six starts at home...has the lowest road ERA in the majors and is tied for the second in road wins.

BY MONTH: Has seen his ERA and OPS increased in each month of the season...went 3-0 with a 1.35 ERA and .459 OPS in four starts in April, 2-1 with a 2.62 ERA and .669 OPS in six starts in May and 1-2 with a 5.13 ERA and . 872 OPS in five starts in June...the three wins in April were his most ever in a month.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a . 213 (33-for-155) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .275 (42-for-153) against lefthanders... has surrendered five of his seven home runs and issued 12 of his 21 walks to lefties for a .798 OPS (. 592 vs. righties)....opponents are batting .175 (11-for-63) with runners in scoring position, which is eighth lowest in the American League...entered the season with a .328 career opponents average with RISP...has allowed a .142 opponents batting average with two strikes, which is 10th lowest in the AL....the number five hitter in the order is 3 -for-32 (.094) against him.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed two home runs in each of his last two starts ( 9.0 ip ) after surrendering just three home runs over his first 13 starts (71.2 ip)...has yielded seven home runs overall and his average of 0.78 home runs per nine innings is eighth lowest in the American League...five of the seven home runs have come at home...three have been hit by the clean-up hitter.
BASES ON BALLS: Has walked 18 batters in 49.2 innings over his last nine starts ( 3.26 per nine innings) after issuing just three free passes in 31.0 innings over his first six starts ( 0.87 per nine innings)...has walked 21 batters in 80.2 innings overall ( 2.34 per nine innings) and has issued two walks or fewer in 14 of his 15 starts...has four starts with no walks and four with just one...is averaging 2.43 walks per nine innings in his career ( 59 bb in 218.2 ip ).
THIS AND THAT: Has career highs in every category except losses and home runs...has six wins this year after tallying just six wins in 30 games over his first five seasons...his 15 starts, 80.2 innings and 62 strikeouts top his previous highs of 10 starts (2017), 58.2 innings (2017) and 26 strikeouts (2021)... has left with the lead in three of his starts only to have the bullpen blow the save...the A's are 3-3 in his no decisions and are 9-6 (.600) in his starting assignments...has allowed two runs or fewer in 10 of his 15 starts...has a 4.20 ERA (21 er in 45.0 ip) in odd numbered innings, a 1.77 ERA (7 er in 35.2 ip ) in even numbered innings.
2022 HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed 5.0 scoreless inning and struck out a career-high seven batters in a 13-2 win at Tampa Bay in his first start on April 11...had a no decision in the A's 7-5 win in his second start on April 16 at Toronto...left with a 5-2 lead but the bullpen allowed three runs for the blown save...it was the first of three times he left with a lead only to have the pen blow the save (June 10 at Cleveland, June 27 at New York-AL)...won back-to-back starts on April 21 against Baltimore and April 27 at San Francisco...combined with five A's relievers on a three-hit, 1-0 shutout in the win over the Giants...tossed five of the innings and allowed all three of the hits while walking one...finished April 3-0 with a 1.35 ERA in four starts...walked just two batters in 20.0 innings and held the opposition to a . 197 batting average...it was his first career three-win month and he tied for third in the American League in wins in April.... based on a minimum of 20.0 innings, he had the second lowest opponents OPS (.459), ranked third in slugging (.239) and was fourth in ERA and on-base percentage (.219)...combined with Jackson and Jiménez on a four-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Detroit on May 9...tossed 6.2 innings, yielded all four of the hits and did not walk a batter...tossed 5.1 scoreless innings and allowed just one hit in a 4-2 win at Seattle on May 25 ...however, walked a career-high five batters...was charged with his first loss of the season on May 30 against Houston when he allowed four runs in 6.2 innings... did not allow a run over the first three innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 10.0 innings....allowed four runs in a season-low 4.0 innings in an 8-0 loss to Boston on June 4 in Oakland...tossed a career-high 8.0 scoreless innings, walked one and allowed four hits on June 10 at Cleveland but had a no decision in the A's 3-2 loss...the pen allowed three runs in the ninth inning...did not allow a run over the first two innings of his next start on June 16 at Boston to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high tying 10.0
innings...allowed a season-high seven runs on a career-high tying 10 hits in a season-low tying 4.0 innings in a 9-0 loss to Seattle on June 22 in Oakland.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's $9-5$ loss at New York (AL) on Monday...struck out a career-high tying seven batters in 5.0 innings....allowed a solo home run to Rizzo in the first and Oakland scored five times in the third to take a 5-1 lead....also yielded a lead off home run to Stanton in the fourth and a RBI single to Judge in the fifth...was relieved by Oller to start the sixth with the A's leading 5-3 but the pen allowed six runs in the seventh inning for the blown save and loss.

2021 RECAP: Began the season at Triple-A Las Vegas and was 4-7 with a 4.97 ERA in 17 games, including 16 starts, when he was selected by Oakland on Aug. 18...spent the balance of the season with the A's and went 1-4 with a 5.87 ERA in nine starts... allowed a . 319 opponents batting average with the A's but walked just 10 batters in 38.1 innings ( 2.35 walks per nine innings) for a .366 opponents on-base percentage...his opponents batting average broke down to .309 with an .858 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .333 with a .953 OPS against left-handers...opponents hit .333 with runners in scoring position...was 0-1 with a 4.03 ERA and . 720 opponents OPS in five starts at home, 1-3 with an 8.44 ERA and 1.115 OPS in four starts on the road...yielded seven of his eight home runs on the road...surrendered just eight home runs in 88.2 innings with Las Vegas, an average of 0.81 per nine innings...his opponents batting average broke down to .300 with an . 824 OPS against left-handed hitters and .323 with a .776 OPS against righthanders...yielded six of his eight home runs and issued 18 of his 27 walks to lefties...six of the eight home runs he allowed were solo shots.
