OAKLAND ATHLETICS (26-55) VS. TORONTO BLUE JAYS (44-36)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight, six of the last seven and 10 of the last 13...are 6-25 (.194) dating back to May 30 and 11-35 (.239) since winning the day game of the May 14 doubleheader...are 26-55 (.321) overall, which is the lowest winning percentage in the majors behind the Reds (27-51, .346)...are 29 games under .500 for the first time since finishing the 1997 season 32 games under (65-97)...have the second lowest winning percentage in Oakland history after 81 games to the 1979 club (23-58, lost games 82 and 83)...have been in sole possession of last place in the American League West every day dating back to May 27 and have held at least a share of last every day except one dating back to May 4 (fourth on May 25)...trail first place Houston by a season-high 26½ games, which is the A's largest deficit in the West since Sept. 7, 2017 when they were 27 games back...have been more than 27 games out of first just once over the last 43 years and that was on Sept. 30, 2016 when they were 28 back.

THE HALF-WAY MARK: The A's played their 81st game of the season yesterday, which is the half-way mark of the season...are on pace to go 52-110, which would break the Oakland record for most losses in a season...the only 100-loss season in Oakland history is 1979 (54-108)...have lost more than 108 games twice in Athletics history (36-117 in 1916 and 43-109 in 1915)...are batting .212 with a .273 on-base percentage, .329 slugging percentage and .602 OPS...all four marks are currently the lowest in Oakland history (.225 in 2020, .302 in 1979, .343 in 1968, .647 in 1968)...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the American League record for lowest batting average in a season is .211 by the 1910 Chicago White Sox while the lowest on-base percentage is .274 with the 1905 Washington Senators...are on pace to set Oakland records for fewest runs (pace: 510, record 532 in 1978) and walks (pace: 402, record 433 in 1978) in a full season...are on pace to hit 112 home runs, which would be fifth fewest (94 in 1968, 100 in 1978, 108 in 1979, 109 in 2020)...in the designated hitter era, the only AL team to score fewer than 532 runs in a season is the 2010 Seattle Mariners (513)...individually, the A's are on pace to challenge some of the lowest team-leading totals by a player in a full season in Oakland history...Sean Murphy leads the A's with 29 runs (pace: 58...low is 62 by Mitchell Page in 1978) and 59 hits (pace: 118...low is 136 by Dave Revere in 1979)...Seth Brown tops the club with 10 home runs (pace: 20...low is 16 by Kevin Kouzmanoff in 2010) and 36 RBI (pace: 72...low is 70 by Mitchell Page in 1978)...Tony Kemp leads the club with 25 walks (pace: 50...low is 51 by Marcus Semien in 2016).

SERIES NOTES: The A's have lost the first game of each of the last 12 series, which is one short of the longest such streak in Oakland history...have three 13-game streaks (April 11-May 20, 1994; Aug. 23, 1982-April 4, 1993; June 26-Aug. 6, 1979)...are 4-21 in the first game of a series and 11-14 in the final game...have lost 10 of the last 11 series and are 3-17-1 over the last 21 series.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a six-game homestand against Toronto (three games) and Houston (three games) tonight...went 1-5 on the last homestand against Kansas City (1-2) and Seattle (0-3)...won three of four from Baltimore in the first home series of the season but have lost each of the 10 home series since then...it is the first time the A's have lost 10 or more consecutive home series since June 20, 1916 to May 8, 1917 when they lost 17 straight (final 14 of 1916, first three of 1917)...won the first two home games against Baltimore but have not put together back-to-back home wins since then...are 8-28 (.222) at home compared to 18-27 (.400) on the road...have the lowest home winning pitcher in the majors...the lowest home winning percentage in Oakland history is .383 in 1979 (31-50)...went 3-7 on the last road trip to Kansas City (2-1), New York-AL (0-3) and Seattle (1-3) to conclude a stretch where they played 19 of 25 games on the road...are batting .198 (226-for-1141) with 86 runs (2.4 per game) and 15 home runs in 36 home games compared to .222 with 169 runs scored (3.8 per game) and 41 home runs in 45 games on the road...rank last in the majors in batting, runs and home runs at home.

OFFENSE: The A's rank last in the majors in batting (.212), on-base percentage (.273), slugging percentage (.329) and OPS (.602), have the second fewest runs (255), home runs (56) and extra base hits (190) and the third fewest walks (201)...have been shutout nine times, which is tied for fifth most in the majors and is the most by an A's team since 2016 (11)...have scored one run or fewer in 30 of 81 (37.0%) games.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.11 ERA (226 er in 397.2 ip) over the last 46 games after posting a 3.44 ERA over the first 35 contests...have a 4.38 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have the second highest opponents on-base percentage (.324), slugging percentage (.417) and OPS (.741) and fourth highest batting average (.251)...have issued the third most walks (269) and the fourth fewest strikeouts (611).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have one win over the last 13 games (Kaprielian, July 1 at Seattle) and are 5-26 with a 4.87 ERA (139 er in 257.0

ip) over the last 49 games dating back to May 12...are 16-40 with a 4.43 ERA for the season...the losses are tied with the Reds for second most in the majors (Nationals, 42)...have the third fewest wins in the American League, the fourth highest ERA and the fifth most innings pitched (422.1).

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen is 3-9 with four saves, nine blown saves and a 5.75 ERA (73 er in 114.1 ip) over the last 33 games dating back to May 26...has a 4.31 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...is 17-for-31 (54.8%) in save opportunities, which is the third lowest save percentage...is tied with four other teams for the fewest saves...has allowed 14-of-22 (63.6%) inherited runners to score over the last 12 games.

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 51-of-64 (79.7%) stolen base attempts, which is tied for the third best percentage in the American League...are also tied for third in steals...A's opponents are 28-for-43 (65.1%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second lowest success rate in the AL...have allowed the third fewest stolen bases...A's pitchers have six pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed six errors in the last 13 games but have 53 for the season, which is tied for second most in the American League...rank second in double plays (72).

PLAYER NOTES: The A's have used 48 players, which is fourth most in the American League and two short of the season total from last year...have used 27 pitchers, which is fourth most in the AL and matches the A's season total from last year...21 of the 48 players have been rookies, which ties the Oakland record for most rookies in a season (21 in 2008)...have set the Oakland record for rookie pitchers with 13 (previous: 12 in 2009, 12, 15 and 16)...10 of the rookies have made their Major League debut, which is the A's most since 2016 when they set the Oakland record with 15...currently have seven rookies on the roster, including six pitchers.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 22-12 (.647) when scoring first and 4-43 (.085) when the opponent scores first...have the lowest winning percentage in the majors when the opponent scores first...have eight come-from-behind wins, which is tied with the Cubs and Royals for the fewest in the majors...are 0-2 in extra inning games and are the only team in the majors without an extra inning win...the two extra inning games are tied with the Tigers and Reds for the fewest in the majors.

THE FOURTH OF JULY: The A's are 31-20 on the 4th of July since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 18-8 at home and 13-12 on the road...had their eight game winning streak on the 4th of July snapped last year with a 1-0 loss to Boston...have played at home for nine of the last 10 games on the 4th of July but this will be the first home night game on July 4 since 2003...this will be the fourth game between the A's and Blue Jays on July 4 and all have come in Oakland...have won two of the previous three, including 1-0 in the last meeting in 2014

A's vs. BLUE JAYS: The A's lost two of three in Toronto in April to open the season series...lost the season series last year, 2-5...split four games in Oakland but were swept in a three-game series at Toronto...have lost 13 of the last 16 games and are 16-26 against the Blue Jays dating back to 2015...have won just one season series over that span (7-0 in 2018)...have lost eight of the last nine games at Rogers Centre and are 6-20 in Toronto dating back to 2014...are 227-208 all-time against the Blue Jays, including 114-102 in Oakland, 113-104 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas...are 72-72 in Rogers Centre.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Seth Brown is tied for fifth in the American League in go-ahead home runs (7)...is tied for the AL lead in game winning RBI (10) and is tied for eighth in go-ahead RBI (13)...**Zach Jackson** is tied for second among AL relievers in holds (14), ranks third in opponents slugging percentage (.214) and tied for fifth in strikeouts (43).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1905** Rube Waddell defeats Boston's Cy Young in a 20-inning marathon in the afternoon game of a doubleheader, 4-2...A's catcher Ossee Schreckengost works all 29 innings of the doubleheader to set a major league record...in **1974** California's Winston Llenas hits a pinch hit home run off Vida Blue in the sixth inning to end Oakland's club record streak of 136 2/3 innings without allowing a home run...in **1988** Mark McGwire homers in the 16th inning for the second consecutive day as the A's defeat the Cleveland Indians 4-2...McGwire has a solo shot in the 16th inning the day before at Toronto as the A's have a two-day span where they play 32 innings and 9 hours and 54 minutes of baseball in two cities.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (2-6, 3.58 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 15-day injured list May 22 and is 0-5 with a 3.97 ERA (21 er in 47.2 ip) in eight starts since his return...the five-game losing streak is a career high (previous: 4, twice, last: May 9-30, 2021)...was 2-1 with a 2.93 ERA in five starts when he was placed on the IL May 6 retroactive to May 2 with left shoulder tendinitis...made one rehab start with Low-A Stockton on May 17 against Modesto and was the winning pitcher in the Ports 4-3 win (5.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 6 so, 1 hr).

NINE STARTS, NINE TEAM LOSSES: Is 0-5 with a 3.69 ERA (22 er in 53.2 ip) over his last nine starts, all A's losses...is the third pitcher in Oakland history to appear in nine consecutive team losses, with all nine appearances being starts...the other two are Frankie Montas (April 23-June 5, 2022) and Mike Morgan (June 11, 1978-July 24, 1979)...in Athletics history, the only pitcher with a longer such streak is Rollie Naylor, who appeared in 11 consecutive losses, all starts, for the 1920 Philadelphia A's from May 24-July 3...the A's are 3-10 (.231) in Irvin's starting assignments this year.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-1 with a 1.57 ERA (6 er in 34.1 ip) and .220 (28-for-127) opponents batting average in six starts at home compared to 1-5 with a 5.27 ERA (24 er in 41.0 ip) and .280 (46-for-164) opponents average in seven starts on the road...has allowed all 11 of his home runs on the road...his home ERA is second lowest among American League pitchers with 30 or more innings at home.

DON'T WALK: Has walked 18 batters in 75.1 innings, an average of 2.15 per nine innings...walked just 42 batters in 178.1 innings last year and his average of 2.12 walks per nine innings was eighth lowest in the AL...has walked two batters or fewer in each of his 13 starts this year and 44 of his 48 career starts...has walked just 74 batters in 299.0 career innings (2.23 per nine innings).

OR STRIKEOUT: Has struck out just 52 batters in 75.1 innings, an average of 6.38 per nine innings...that is fifth lowest among American League pitchers with 70 or more innings...last year, he fanned just 125 batters and his average of 6.31 strikeouts per nine innings was third lowest in the AL and the majors...has struck out four batters or fewer in 10 of his 13 starts this year.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 1-1 with a 2.35 ERA (6 er in 23.0 ip) in four starts against American League West teams compared to 1-5 with a 4.13 ERA (24 er in 52.1 ip) in nine starts against all other teams...last year, he went 4-12 with a 5.29 ERA in 19 starts against AL West competition, 6-3 with a 2.88 ERA in 13 starts against everyone else...his 12 intradivision losses matched the most in the majors over the last 34 years (last: Porcello, BOS in 2017) and set an Athletics record, topping the previous mark of 11 by Brian Kingman (1980) and Rick Langford (1977 and 1979)...his 5.29 intradivision ERA was fourth highest in the majors last year.

THE FIRST INNING: Has allowed 12 of his 32 runs in the first inning and has a 6.92 ERA (10 er in 13.0 ip) and .333 (19-for-57) opponents batting average...has a 1.90 ERA (11 er in 52.0 ip) and .216 (41-for-190) opponents average over innings two through five...has a 7.84 ERA (9 er in 10.1 ip) and .318 (14-for-44) opponents average from the sixth inning on.

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed just two extra base hits to left-handed hitters, both home runs...has made nine of his 13 starts in day games...last year he made 17 of his 32 starts during the day, which tied for the most in the majors...has a .294 (32-for-109) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .202 (22-for-109) the second time and .274 (20-for-73) after that...the opponents number three hitter in the order is 6-for-37 (.162) against him.

2022 HIGHLIGHTS: Faced his former team in his first start on April 9 at Philadelphia and was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss...yielded a career-high tying three home runs...then went 2-0 with a 2.01 ERA over his next four starts...allowed one run or fewer in three consecutive starts from April 19-30...walked a season-high two batters in four consecutive starts from April 19-May 22 and had a total of seven starts with two walks...struck out exactly four batters in five consecutive starts from April 19-May 27...that matched the longest streak of consecutive starts with exactly four strikeouts in Athletics history (Brandon McCarthy, April 11-May 2, 2012)...combined with Jackson, Sned and Jiménez on a four-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Texas April 24 in Oakland...tossed five of the innings and allowed just one hit while walking two...the blanked Cleveland over the first three innings on April 30 to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 12 innings...was 2-1 with a 2.93 ERA in five starts when he was placed on the 15-day injured list May 6 retroactive to May 2 with left shoulder tendinitis...made one rehab start with Low-A Stockton on May 17 against Modesto and was the winning pitcher in the Ports 4-3 win (5.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 6 so, 1 hr)...was reinstated on May 22 and started and lost that day at Los Angeles (AL)...allowed a season-high eight hits...left his start on May 27 against Texas with a 5-2 lead but the bullpen blew the save...struck out a season-high six batters in 5.1 innings in a no decision at Atlanta on June 7...allowed a season-high five runs in 5.2

innings in a 6-3 loss at Cleveland on June 12...struck out a season-high tying six batters in a 2-0 loss to Kansas City on June 18...finished June 0-4 with a 4.08 ERA and .254 opponents batting average in six starts...tied for the American League lead in losses in June...it was the second time in his career he lost four games in a month (May, 2021).

LAST START: He lost his fourth consecutive start in the A's 5-3 loss at New York (AL) last Wednesday...tossed a career-high 103 pitches in a season-high 7.0 innings and allowed a season-high tying five runs...the A's scored three times in the first, but he allowed a two-run home run to Judge in the bottom of the first...then surrendered a three-run home run to Stanton in the third.

IRVIN vs. TORONTO: Is 1-1 with a 6.97 ERA (10.1 ip, 11 h, 8 r, 8 er, 1 bb, 11 so, 2 hr) in two career starts, both last year...the win came in the A's 4-1 victory in Oakland on May 4...had career highs in innings pitched (8.0) and strikeouts (9)...faced the minimum over the first five innings as his only base runner, a Biggio single to lead off the third, was erased on a double play...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the sixth inning on a Semien RBI double...then retired seven of the final eight batters he faced...took the loss in an 8-0 decision at Toronto on Sept. 5...allowed a career-high tying seven runs in a career-low 2.1 innings...yielded a two-run triple to Gurriel and a Grichuk RBI double in the second inning...then surrendered a leadoff home run to Semien and a three-run home run to Kirk in the third inning.

2021 RECAP: Was acquired by the A's from Philadelphia for cash considerations on Jan. 30, 2021 and went 10-15 with a 4.24 ERA in 32 starts...his 15 losses were the most in the American League, tied for third most in the majors and matched the most by an A's pitcher over the last 13 years (Jesse Chavez, 2015)...is the first Athletic to lead the league in losses since Tom Candiotti in 1998...tied for the AL lead in games started and ranked 10th in innings pitched (178.1)...had a .281 opponents batting average and his 195 hits allowed were the most in the AL and second most in the majors...his 94 runs were fifth most in the AL and his nine hit batters tied for 10th most...averaged 15.0 pitches per inning, which was the fewest in the AL and fourth fewest in the majors...struck out just 125 batters and his average of 6.31 strikeouts per nine innings was third lowest in the AL and the majors...allowed 23 home runs and ranked seventh in the AL in fewest home runs per nine innings (1.16)...surrendered 18 of his 23 home runs to righties...17 of the home runs were solo shots...allowed a .324 average with runners in scoring position, which was the highest in the majors and fifth highest in Oakland history...was 1-10 with a 6.60 ERA and .890 OPS in 12 starts on four days rest compared to 9-4 with a 2.84 ERA and .657 OPS in 19 starts on five days rest or more...led the majors in losses and highest ERA on four days rest and had the second highest OPS...left with the lead only to have the pen blow the save in five of his starts...went 10-3 in 18 starts with more than two runs of support, 0-12 in 14 starts with support of two runs or fewer.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Adrián Martínez (1-2, 6.59): Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas last Thursday for his second stint with the A's this year and started and lost that night at Seattle in the A's 8-6 loss (4.2 ip, 10 h, 7 r, 7 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...was recalled for the first time on May 10 as the 27th man for the doubleheader at Detroit...made his Major League debut with a start and win that day in the second game and was returned to Las Vegas after the game...was 4-3 with a 5.63 ERA in 13 starts with Las Vegas, including 4-1 with a 4.84 ERA in eight starts following his first stint with Oakland...ranked eighth in the Pacific Coast League in strikeouts (73) and tied for eighth in games started (13) at the time of his June 30 promotion...was acquired from the San Diego Padres on April 3 with minor league infielder Euribel Angeles for pitcher Sean Manaea and minor league pitcher Aaron Holiday...is 25-21 with three saves and a 4.52 ERA in 113 games, including 61 starts, as a minor leaguer
