# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (28-55) VS. TORONTO BLUE JAYS (44-38)

WEDNESDAY, JULY 6, 2022 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 12:37 PT RHP JAMES KAPRIELIAN (1-5, 5.43) VS. RHP JOSÉ BERRÍOS (6-4, 4.74) NBCSCA — A'S CAST — A'S RADIO NETWORK (BLOOMBERG 960 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won back-to-back games for the second time since May 26 (June 25-26) and the two game winning streak is one short of the season high of three (May 10-12)...are 3-2 over the last five games and 5-6 over the last 11...are 8-25 (.242) dating back to May 30 and 13-35 (.271) since winning the day game of the May 14 doubleheader...are 28-55 (.337) overall, which is the lowest winning percentage in the majors behind the Nationals (29-54, .349)...have the second lowest winning percentage in Oakland history after 83 games to the 1979 club (23-60, won game 84)...finished 54-108 that year, which is the only 100-loss season in Oakland history...have been in sole possession of last place in the American League West every day dating back to May 27 and have held at least a share of last every day except one dating back to May 4 (fourth on May 25)...trail first place Houston by a season-high 26½ games for the third consecutive day, which is the A's largest deficit in the West since Sept. 7, 2017 when they were 27 games back...have been more than 27 games out of first just once over the last 43 years and that was on Sept. 30, 2016 when they were 28 back.

SERIES NOTES: The A's have won the first two games of this series and will go into the final game of a series with a chance to sweep for the first time this year...have not swept a series since Sept. 24-26 of last year against Houston and the streak of 27 consecutive series without a sweep is tied for sixth longest in Oakland history...have been swept eight times...have now won two of the last four series after losing eight in a row...are 4-17-1 over the last 22 series...on Monday, the A's won the first game of a series for the first time since May 20 at Los Angeles (AL)...it snapped a streak of 12 consecutive losses in the first game of a series, which fell one short of the longest such streak in Oakland history (13: April 11-May 20, 1994; Aug. 23, 1982-April 4, 1993; June 26-Aug. 6, 1979)...are 5-21 in the first game of a series and 11-14 in the final game.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have won the first two games of this series, which marks the first time they have won back-to-back home games since the first two home games of the season against Baltimore (April 18-19)...have won a home series for the first time since taking three of four from the Orioles, snapping a 10-series home losing streak...that is the longest such streak by an A's team since June 20, 1916 to May 8, 1917 when they lost 17 straight home series (final 14 of 1916, first three of 1917)...are 2-0 on this six-game homestand against Toronto (2-0) and Houston (three games)...went 1-5 on the last homestand against Kansas City (1-2) and Seattle (0-3) and are 10-28 (.263) at home compared to 18-27 (.400) on the road...have the lowest home winning percentage in the majors behind the Nationals (14-31, .311)... the lowest home winning percentage in Oakland history is .383 in 1979 (31-50)...went 3-7 on the last road trip to Kansas City (2-1), New York-AL (0-3) and Seattle (1-3) to conclude a stretch where they played 19 of 25 games on the road...are batting .198 (237-for-1194) with 96 runs (2.5 per game) and 18 home runs in 38 home games compared to .222 with 169 runs scored (3.8 per game) and 41 home runs in 45 games on the road...rank last in the majors in batting, runs and home runs at home.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .234 (85-for-363) with 44 runs scored over the last 11 games after hitting .186 with 15 runs scored over the previous 10 contests...rank last in the majors in batting (.212), on-base percentage (.275), slugging percentage (.330) and OPS (.605)...the lowest batting average by an American League or National League team since 1900 is .211 by the 1910 Chicago White Sox...the lowest on-base percentage by an AL team is .274 by the 1905 Washington Senators...have the second fewest runs (265), home runs (59) and extra base hits (194) in the majors and the third fewest walks (211)...have been shutout nine times, which is tied for fifth most in the majors and is the most by an A's team since 2016 (11)...have scored one run or fewer in 30 of 83 (36.1%) games.

**PITCHING:** The A's pitching staff has not walked a batter in the last three games...this is the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have gone three or more consecutive games without issuing a walk...the record is four (Sept. 8-11, 2000 and Sept. 25-28, 2014)...however, have 269 walks for the season, which is fourth most in the American League...has allowed nine runs over the first five games of July (9 er in 43.0 ip, 1.88 ERA)...however, has compiled a 4.98 ERA (230 er in 415.2 ip) over the last 48 games after posting a 3.44 ERA over the first 35 contests...has a 4.32 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the AL...has the second highest opponents on-base percentage (.322) and OPS (.737), the third highest slugging percentage (.415) and the fourth highest batting average (.250)...has the fourth fewest strikeouts (624).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 3-1 with a 2.05 ERA (6 er in 26.1 ip) in July after going 3-15 with a 5.00 ERA in June...are 7-26 with a 4.77

ERA (143 er in 270.0 ip) over the last 51 games dating back to May 12 and 18-40 with a 4.38 ERA for the season...have the most losses in the American League, the fifth fewest wins and the fifth highest ERA...also rank fifth in innings pitched (435.2).

**THE BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen has a 1.17 ERA (3 er in 23.0 ip) over the last eight games but is 3-9 with five saves, nine blown saves and a 5.51 ERA (73 er in 119.1 ip) over the last 35 games dating back to May 26...has a 4.24 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...is 18-for-31 (56.3%) in save opportunities, which is the fifth lowest save percentage...is tied for the fourth fewest saves.

**ON THE BASES:** The A's have been successful in 51-of-65 (78.5%) stolen base attempts, which is tied for the third best percentage in the American League...are also tied for third in steals...A's opponents are 28-for-44 (63.6%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second lowest success rate in the AL... have allowed the third fewest stolen bases...A's pitchers have six pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most in the AL.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have not committed an error in the last three games and have six over the last 15 games...have 53 for the season, which is tied for second most in the American League...rank second in double plays (72).

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's have lost each of their last four one-run decisions and are 5-15 (.250) for the season, which is the second lowest winning percentage in the American League...are tied for the second most one-run losses and tied for the fourth fewest one-run games...are 18-26 (.409) in games decided by two runs or fewer...the losses are tied with the Pirates for the most in the majors, the winning percentage is third lowest and the 44 games are tied for third most...are 0-2 in extra inning games and are the only team in the majors without an extra inning win...are tied with the Reds and Tigers for the fewest extra inning games.

*THIS AND THAT:* The A's have played three hours or fewer in each of the last seven games and are averaging 3 hours and 1 minutes per game for the season, which is second quickest in the majors (Tigers, 2:57)...are 24-12 (.667) when scoring first and 4-43 (.085) when the opponent scores first...have the lowest winning percentage in the majors when the opponent scores first... have eight come-from-behind wins, which is tied with the Royals for the fewest in the majors...have employed 21 rookies, which ties the Oakland record (2008)...have set the Oakland record for most rookie pitchers with 13... went 5-21 (.192) in June, which was the second lowest winning percentage in a month of five or more games in Oakland history (5-24/.172 in June of 1979)...it was the 14th month in Oakland history with 20 or more losses and the 21 losses tied for third most...went 10-21 in May and have lost 21 or more games in consecutive months for the first time since 1954 when the Philadelphia A's went 7-23 in July and 9-23 in August.

**A's vs. BLUE JAYS:** The A's lead the season series, 3-2...have won just one season series over the last nine years and that was in 2018 when they went 7-0...are 2-0 in Oakland this year and 1-2 in Toronto...lost the season series last year, 2-5...split four games in Oakland but were swept in a three-game series at Toronto...have lost 13 of the last 18 games and are 18-26 against the Blue Jays dating back to 2015...have lost eight of the last nine games at Rogers Centre and are 6-20 in Toronto dating back to 2014...are 229-208 all-time against the Blue Jays, including 116-102 in Oakland, 113-104 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas...are 72-72 in Rogers Centre.

## TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Seth Brown** is tied for sixth in the American League in go-ahead home runs (7)...is tied for the AL lead in game winning RBI (10) and tied for ninth in go-ahead RBI (13)...**Zach Jackson** is tied for second among AL relievers in holds (15) and ranks fourth in strikeouts (45) and opponents slugging percentage (.218).

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1990** the A's hit seven home runs in the second game of a doubleheader to defeat the Cleveland Indians 12-1...Mark McGwire and Rickey Henderson hit two each and Carney Lansford, Jose Canseco and Jamie Quirk chip in one each...in **2001** Mark Mulder takes a perfect game into the eighth inning and finishes with a complete game one-hitter in the A's 3-0 win at Arizona...in **2009** Brett Anderson tosses a two-hit shutout at Fenway Park in a 6-0 A's win and Nomar Garciaparra drives in the go-ahead run in his return to Boston.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: James Kaprielian (1-5, 5.43 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Picked up his first win in his last start after beginning the season 0-5...became the first A's pitcher to start the season 0-5 since Kendall Graveman also lost each of his first five decisions in 2018...the five losses match his high from last year in 24 games (21 starts)...is 1-1 with a 3.24 ERA (6 er in 16.2 ip), .172 (10-for-58) opponents batting average and .628 OPS over his last three starts...was 0-2 with a 4.50 ERA, .197 opponents average and .697 OPS over his first four starts and 0-2 with a 7.71 ERA, .313 opponents average and .963 OPS in five starts in between...began the season on the 10-day injured list with an inflamed right AC joint and was reinstated on May 1.

*FIVE-GAME LOSING STREAK:* Had his career-high five-game losing streak snapped in his last start...compiled a 5.88 ERA and .251 opponents batting during the streak, which spanned 11 starts from May 1-June 26...the streak of 11 consecutive starts without a win was the longest by an A's pitcher since Chris Bassitt had a 15-start streak from Aug. 9, 2015-June 22, 2018

*SIX INNINGS OR FEWER:* Has tossed six innings or fewer in each of his last 23 starts dating back to July 10, 2021...that is the longest such streak by a starting pitcher in Athletics history (previous: 19 by Frankie Montas and Vin Mazzaro)...his longest outing this year is 6.0 innings and he last tossed more than six innings on July 4, 2021 when he logged 7.0 innings against Boston... has tossed seven innings or fewer in each of his 33 career starts, which is tied for the fifth longest such streak in Athletics history.

**THROUGH THE ORDER...:** Has a .158 (15-for-95) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .304 (38-for-125) with eight of his 11 home runs allowed after that...his career numbers and are .178 the first time through the order, .274 with 25 of his 32 home runs after that

...AND INNING BY INNING: Has a 1.88 ERA (5 er in 24.0 ip) over the first two innings of a game, a 6.75 ERA (30 er in 34.0 ip) from the third inning on...now has a 1.91 career ERA (14 er in 66.0 ip) in innings one and two and a 6.10 ERA (78 er in 115.0) from the third inning on.

**THIS AND THAT:** His 5.43 ERA is fourth highest in the American League among pitchers with 50 or more innings pitched...opponents are 9-for-47 (.191) with runners in scoring position...has not allowed a home run in his last two starts after surrendering at least one in seven consecutive starts... has allowed 11 home runs in 58.0 innings for the season (1.71 per nine innings)...nine of the 11 home runs have been solo shots...has left with the lead in three of his starts only to have the bullpen blow the save...last year, he left with the lead and was the pitcher of record in four of his eight no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save...the A's have won five of his six no decisions this year and are 6-6 (.500) in his starting assignments...are 17-16 (.515) in his starting assignments in his career.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Did not pitch during the spring and began the season on the 10-day injured list with an inflamed right AC joint...was sent to Low-A Stockton on April 15 to begin a rehab assignment and picked up the win in a 14-10 Ports win that day against Modesto (5.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 6 so, 2 hr)...was moved up to Triple-A Las Vegas and had a no decision in a 12-5 win against El Paso on April 20 (4.2 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 1 hr)...then took the loss in a 12-5 decision on April 26 against Tacoma (4.0 ip, 3 h, 5 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 2 so)...was 1-1 with a 7.24 ERA (13.2 ip, 15 h, 11 r, 11 er, 5 bb, 13 so, 3 hr) in three starts overall when he reinstated from the IL on May 1...took the loss in each of his first two starts...logged 2.0 innings and walked four batters in his first start, a 7-3 loss to Cleveland on May 1 in Oakland...it was the shortest start of his career...then lost a 1-0 decision at Minnesota on May 7, allowing a Polanco home run in the sixth for the only run of the game...struck out a season-high seven batters while logging a season-high 99 pitches...Gray and three relievers combined to shut out the A's on three hits...left his start on May 12 at Detroit with a 3-2 lead but the bullpen blew the save in a game the A's would come back to win 5-3...it was the first of three times the pen blew the save in one of his starts (June 9 at Cleveland, June 26 at Kansas City)...allowed five runs on a season-high seven hits in 5.0 innings on May 24 at Seattle but had a no decision in the As 7-5 win...walked a career-high six batters, allowed a career-high tying six runs and a season-high tying seven hits in 3.2 innings in a 10-1 loss at Boston on June 15...struck out a season-high tying seven batters in 5.1 innings in an 8-2 loss to Seattle on June 21...pinch ran in the ninth inning on June 28 at New York (AL) to become the first A's pitcher to pinch run since Tim Hudson did it on June 23, 2001 against Texas.

**LAST START:** He snapped his season-opening and career-high five-game losing streak in the A's 3-1 win at Seattle last Friday...tossed a season-high 6.0 innings...shut out the Mariners on a hit and a walk over the first five innings and had a 2-0 lead when Rodriguez tripled and scored on a Winker ground out in the the sixth inning...was relieved by Acevedo to start the seventh with the A's leading 3-1.

2021 RECAP: Was the Opening Day starter for Triple-A Las Vegas on May 6 but that would be his only start with the Aviators...was recalled by Oakland on May 12 and spent the remainder of the season with the A's, going 8-5 with a 4.07 ERA and .233 opponents batting average in 24 games, including 21 starts, in his rookie campaign...tied for fifth among American League rookies in wins, tied for sixth in innings pitched (119.1), ranked seventh in strikeouts (123) and eighth in games started...based on a minimum of 0.5 innings per team game, he ranked fifth in opponents batting average, sixth in ERA, seventh in on-base percentage (.302), ninth in OPS (.732) and 10th in slugging (.430)...his 123 strikeouts were eighth most in Oakland history by a rookie and were the most since Sean Manaea had 124 in 2016...his 21 starts were the most since Jharel Cotton had 24 in 2017...went 5-3 with a 2.65 ERA, .202 opponents batting average and .657 OPS over his first 12 starts through July 20...then posted a 3-2 record with a 5.96 ERA, .271 opponents average and .825 OPS over his final 12 games (nine starts) beginning on July 27...his opponents batting average broke down to .201 (46-for-229) with a .602 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .266 (59-for-222) with a .860 OPS against left-handers...issued 31 of his 41 walks to lefties...had the third lowest batting average and OPS against right-handers in the AL among pitchers with 100 or more innings pitched...began the season with 21 starts and was 8-5 with a 3.80 ERA and .720 OPS before being moved to the bullpen following his start on Sept. 18...had no decisions, a 7.88 ERA and .890 OPS in three relief appearances

### FRIDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**RHP Paul Blackburn (6-3, 2.90 ERA):** Is 1-3 with a 4.35 ERA and .270 opponents batting average over his last seven starts after going 5-0 with a 1.70 ERA and .211 opponents average over his first nine starts...is now 6-3 in his 16 starts...has left with the lead in four of his seven no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save...ranks 10th in the American League in ERA...opponents are batting .167 with runners in scoring position, which is tied for fifth lowest in the AL...has allowed nine of his 28 runs in the fifth inning for a 6.23 ERA...has a 2.67 ERA over the first four innings of a game...has not allowed a run after the fifth inning (10.0 ip)...had a no decision in his last start, a 2-1 A's loss at Seattle last Saturday (6.1 ip, 4 h, 1 bb, 5 so)...is 0-3 with a 10.80 ERA (20.0 ip, 31 h, 25 r, 24 er, 5 bb, 8 so, 7 hr) in five career appearances, including four starts...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 5-1 A's loss in Oakland on May 30 (6.2 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 5 so).

#### 68 RHP DOMINGO ACEVEDO (1-1, 3.19)

Inherited Runners/Scored: 22/7 First Hitters: 6-33, 4 bb

- Had a 4.22 ERA and .158 opponents batting average in 11 games in June after compiling a 1.29 ERA and .146 opponents batting average in 13 games in May.
- Is tied for the American League lead in games pitched (37)...is tied for fifth among AL relievers in most home runs allowed (6).
- Has a .157 (13-for-83) opponents batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .286 (14-for-49) against left-handers.
- Opponents are 7-for-39 (.179) with runners in scoring position.
- Has faced the Blue Jays twice this season, allowing three runs on five hits and two home runs in 1.2 innings of work.

Last Year: Made his ML debut and compiled a 3.27 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over two stints with the A's...was also 2-0 with nine saves, a 2.48 ERA and .186 opponent average in 30 relief appearances with Las Vegas.

#### 61 RHP ZACH JACKSON (2-2, 3.27)

#### Saves/Opportunities: 1-2 Inherited Runners/Scored: 13/1 First Hitters: 6-25, 9 bb

- Has a 4.05 ERA (13.1 ip, 7 h, 6 r, 6 er, 12 bb, 19 so) over his last 15 games after compiling a 2.75 ERA over his first 20 contests.
- Is tied for second in the American League in holds (15) and tied for 7th in games pitched (35)...ranks fourth among AL relievers in strikeouts (45) and ranks fourth in opponents slugging percentage (.218).
- Has not allowed a home run and his 33.0 innings pitched are tied fourth most among AL relievers with no home runs.
- Has a .173 opponents batting average but has issued 25 walks in 33.0 innings for a .328 on-base percentage...the walks are the most among Major League relievers...has walked the first batter faced nine times which is the most in the Majors.
- Has faced the Blue Jays four times this year, allowing one run with three hits, two walks, and two strikeouts in 2.2 innings of work.

Last Year: Split his season between Double-A Midland and Triple-A Las Vegas and combined for a 2-2 record, a career-high tying six saves and a 2.57 ERA in 25 relief appearances before a right hip labral tear ended his season in mid-July.

- Has allowed six earned runs in his last 17 games (12.2 ip, 14 h, 8 r, 6 er, 11 bb, 19 so, 4.26 ERA) after allowing no runs over his first 12 contests (10.0 ip).
- Has a .167 (7-for-42) opponents batting average against left-handed hitters, .244 (10-for-41) against right-handers...has issued 12 of his 16 walks to righties.
- Has allowed 8-of-14 (57.1%) inherited runners to score over his last 12 games after allowing 1-of-6 (16.7%) to score over his first 17 outings...has allowed 9-of-20 (45.0%) to score for the season.
- Has faced the Blue Jays twice this season, allowing one hit and two walks with one strikeout in 2.0 scoreless innings of work.

Last Year: Began the season at Triple-A Reno in the Arizona farm system but had three stints with the A's following a July 2 trade and compiled a 3.48 ERA in eight appearances...had a 4.58 ERA and .231 opponents average in 33 games with Reno and Las Vegas.
