LEADING OFF: Today, the Angels play the third game of a four game series at Oakland to open the 2020 regular season...The team will return to Southern California following the series and play the Home Opener on Tuesday night vs. Seattle...2020 represents the Angels' 60th MLB season as a franchise.

IT'S SHO-TIME: Today, RHP Shohei Ohtani is scheduled to make his first start as a pitcher since Sept. 2, 2018 at Houston...Ohtani was the Angels Opening Day DH and went 1-for-5 in last night's contest...The 2018 A.L. Rookie of the Year went 4-2 with a 3.31 ERA (51.2 IP - 19 ER) in his 10 starts as a pitcher.

HE'S ON FIERS: In 35 career plate appearances against today's Athletics starter Mike Fiers, Angels OF Mike Trout is batting .345 (10/29) with four doubles, four home runs, 10 RBI and a 1.354 OPS...Trout and Andrew McCutchen are tied for the most homers Fiers has allowed to any opposing batter in his career.

STRAIGHT A'S: Mike Trout owns a career .299 (158/528) average against Oakland with 34 home runs and 83 RBI (142 G)...His 34 HR vs. A's rank second among all active players behind only Nelson Cruz (35)...In his 23 career games vs. Oakland as a hitter, Shohei Ohtani owns a .303 average (27/89) with six home runs and 19 RBI.

NEW HALOS IN 2020: Yesterday, Dylan Bundy made his Angels debut and earned the victory (6.2 IP, 3 H, 1 ER, 0 BB, 7 SO)...He became the third pitcher to toss 6+ innings and allow four-or-fewer baserunners in his Angels debut, joining Don Lee (June 8, 1962) and Shohei Ohtani (April 1, 2018), who also did so against the A's...On Opening Day, five players made their Angels debuts: Jason Castro, Mike Mayers, Jacob Barnes, Ryan Buchter and Hoby Milner.

CLUTCH CASTRO: With his game-tying home run in the 9th inning on Friday, Jason Castro became the 32nd player in Angels history to homer in his Angels debut...Four of the last five players to do so have been catchers (also, Carlos Perez, José Briceño and Francisco Arcia).

A TRADITION UNLIKE ANY OTHER: The Angels are opening the season with a series against the Athletics for the fourth straight season and eighth time overall...Angels become first team all-time to play four consecutive Opening Day games in the same road ballpark (STATS LLC)...Angels are now 12-14 all-time opening on the road and 0-5 when opening in Oakland (1982, 2017-20).

SHORTENED SEASON: 2020 represents the fifth officially shortened season in Angels history and the 10th season playing fewer than 162 games...The four previous officially shortened seasons were due to player strikes:
1972 – 155 games
1981 – 110 games
1994 – 115 games
1995 – 145 games

The Angels had an additional five seasons where postponed games were not made up: Halos played 161 games four times (1963, 1967, 1975, 1996) and 160 games in 1980.

JOE'S BACK: After spending the first 30 seasons of his professional baseball career as a member of the Angels organization, Joe Maddon returns as the new Angels manager for the 2020 season...He owns a 1252-1068 (.540) career managerial record during his time with the Rays (2006-14), Cubs (2015-19) and interim managerial stints with the Angels in 1996 (8-14) and 1999 (19-10).

RACK UP(TON) THE NUMBERS: Justin Upton could reach several personal milestones in 2020: He needs one more home run to reach 300, 10 more runs to reach 1,000 and three more stolen bases to reach 150...With his next HR, he would become the ninth active player with 300 career homers: (A. Pujols, M. Cabrera, E. Encarnacion, N. Cruz, R. Braun, R. Cano, J. Bruce & G. Stanton)

ANTHONY THE ANGEL: On Dec. 13, 2019, the Angels signed Anthony Rendon to a seven-year contract...In 2019, he finished third in National League Most Valuable Player voting and was named to his first All-Star team, in addition to earning his second Silver Slugger Award and helping lead the Nationals to a World Series championship...Rendon did not play (oblique) during Angels Summer Camp Exhibitions, or during the first two games of the regular season.

298 DAY DROUGHT: Opening Day marked the Angels first regular season game since Sept. 29, 2019 vs. HOU...The 298-day span without a regular season game is the longest in franchise history (previous was 258 days between the 1994 and 1995 seasons).

VS. OAKLAND: Angels are 1-1 vs. Oakland in 2020 following the first two of 10 total meetings this season (seven at the Coliseum and three at The Big A)...Halos went 6-13 vs. A's in 2019, dropping the season series for the first time since 2013...Since 2014, Angels hold a 62-54 advantage in the head-to-head series.

20 IN 2020: Friday, Albert Pujols became the fifth player all-time to make an Opening Day start in each of his first 20 Major League seasons, joining: Pete Rose, Carl Yastrzemski, Eddie Murray and Frank Robinson.

MACHINE PRODUCTION: Albert Pujols ranks in the Top 10 all-time in several offensive categories, including: doubles (7th; 661), home runs (6th; 656), RBI (3rd (ELIAS); 2075), extra-base hits (5th; 1333) and total bases (5th; 5863).

SUMMER CAMP: The Angels went 1-2 in their three exhibition games against the San Diego Padres (1-1) and Los Angeles Dodgers (0-1) following Summer Camp practices at Angel Stadium and Blair Field (Long Beach State University).

MVP, MVP, MVP: OF Mike Trout is now in his 10th Major League season (ninth full year) with the Angels in 2020...Last season, Trout earned his third career MVP award (also 2014 and 2016)...He is one of 11 players to win at least three MVP awards and was the sixth to win three times in the American League, joining Yogi Berra, Joe DiMaggio, Jimmie Foxx, Mickey Mantle and Alex Rodriguez...The only player to win more than three MVP Awards in a career is Barry Bonds (7)...His 72.8 career bWAR is the best ever by a player before their age-28 season, ahead of Ty Cobb (68.9) and Mickey Mantle (67.9).

FISH FEED: Mike Trout ranks in the top five in Angels history in several offensive categories and is just 14 home runs away from becoming the franchise's all-time home run leader.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER - RHP SHOHEI OHTANI

Making first pitching appearance since Sept. 2, 2018

- WELCOME BACK TO THE SHO:** Making first start of the season as a pitcher and first regular season pitching appearance since Sept. 2, 2018 at Houston...Did not pitch during 2019 season, while recovering from Tommy John surgery, but appeared in 106 games for Angels as a hitter, batting .286 (110/384) with 18 HR and 62 RBI.
- TWO-WAY, YEAR 2:** With today's start, becomes third player in the last 80 years to make starts as a pitcher and non-pitcher in multiple MLB seasons...He joins Pittsburgh's Dick Hall in 1955 (13 pitching starts, 2 in CF) and 1956 (9 pitching starts, 1 at 1B) and the New York Giants' Clint Hartung in 1947 (20 pitching starts, 7 in LF) and 1950 (8 pitching starts, 1 in LF). (ELIAS).
- ON THE LINE TODAY:** With seven strikeouts today, would become fourth Japanese-born pitcher with 70+ strikeouts through his first 11 Major League games, joining Hideo Nomo (96), Masahiro Tanaka (88) and Yu Darvish (73).
- ANGELS STRIKEOUT RECORDS:** Has recorded 63 career strikeouts, which is an Angels record through a pitcher's first 10 career games...The 63 strikeouts are already tied with **Griffin Canning** for club record through 11 games; needs one strikeout today to claim sole possession of that leaderboard.
- LAST TIME ON THE MOUND:** Last pitching outing came in Angels intrasquad game last Sunday at Angel Stadium.
- DAY & NIGHT:** In MLB career, is 4-0 with a 2.18 ERA (33 IP – 8 ER) and 44 strikeouts in day games (5 GS) compared with an 0-2 record and a 5.30 ERA (18.2 IP – 11 ER) and 19 strikeouts in night games (5 GS).
- VS. OAKLAND:** Tonight marks third career game as a pitcher vs. Athletics...The two previous pitching starts were his first two big league pitching outings; is 2-0 with a 2.08 ERA (13 IP – 3 ER) with 18 strikeouts against the A's...Finest pitching performance of big league career came vs. Oakland on Apr. 8, 2018 at Angel Stadium (W; 7 IP, 1 H, 0 R, 1 BB, 12 SO) and carried a perfect game into the 7th inning...
- AT OAKLAND COLISEUM:** Only previous pitching appearance at the Coliseum was first big league start on April 1, 2018 (W; 6 IP, 3 H, 3 ER, 1 BB, 6 SO)...All three runs allowed in that contest came on three-run HR by Matt Chapman in second inning...Retired 14 of final 15 batters faced at the Coliseum.
- SWING AND A MISS:** Led Major League starters (min. 10 GS) with a 35.1% swing and miss rate in 2018...Recorded 57 of 63 (90.5%) strikeouts in 2018 on a swinging strike three.
- THE SPLITTER:** Held opponents to an .036 (2/55) batting average against his splitter in 2018...Opponents had a swing and miss rate of 56.4% against the splitter and he recorded 35 of 63 strikeouts with the pitch
- BRINGING THE HEAT:** Had average fastball velocity of 96.7 MPH in 2018...Topped 98 MPH with 110 of 396 fastballs, including seven pitches at 100+ MPH...Fastest pitch of the year was 101.1 MPH on May 30 at DET.
- ALL BY MYSELF:** In 2018, was first player in MLB history with 15+ home runs and 50+ pitching strikeouts in a season.
- JAPANESE HALOS:** Is one of five Japanese-born players to play for Angels, along with Shigetoshi Hasegawa, Hideki Matsui, Hisanori Takahashi and Junichi Tazawa.
- AT THE PLATE:** For additional batting notes, please see hitters section of the game notes.
- PITCHING CAREER IN JAPAN:** In 85 career games (82 starts) as a pitcher for Nippon-Ham Fighters in Japanese Pacific League, went 42-15 with a 2.52 ERA (543 IP – 152 ER) and 624 strikeouts...Named a NPB All-Star each of his five professional seasons in Japan.
- MLB CAREER NOTES:** Signed with Angels as international free agent, Dec. 10, 2017...Made Major League debut as a DH on March 29, 2018 at Oakland and had first start as a pitcher on April 1, 2018 at Oakland...Named the 2018 American League Rookie of the Year...In 2018, joined Babe Ruth (1918 & 1919) as the only players since 1900 with 10+ HR and 4+ wins as a pitcher in a single campaign.

Making season debut and first pitching appearance since Aug. 18, 2019 vs. White Sox...Tossed six scoreless innings on Monday at Petco Park in Summer Camp exhibition vs. Padres...Made 18 appearances (17 starts) in rookie season last year, going 5-6 with a 4.58 ERA (90.1 IP - 46 ER) and 96 strikeouts...Held left-handers to a .204 (33/162) batting average in 2019...Limited to one Cactus League start (Feb. 26 at Dodgers) after suffering right elbow injury during the game, but was able to return to pitching regularly when Summer Camp began...In three career starts vs. Oakland, is 1-1 with a 3.50 ERA (18 IP - 7 ER) and 19 strikeouts (most SO against any opponent).
