TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners begin a 3-team, 10-game, 10-day homestand tonight with the first of four games against the Oakland Athletics... will also face Los Angeles-AL (Aug. 4-6) and Colorado (Aug. 7-9) on this homestand...went 3-4 on a recently-completed road trip to Houston (1-3) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1)...tonight's game will be broadcast live on ROOT SPORTS NW, 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network.
ODDS AND ENDS...won yesterday, are 2-0 in their last two games and 3-2 in their last 5 games...are playing their eighth (3-4) of 20 consecutive games to open the 2020 season....are next scheduled to have an off-day on Aug. 13.
-Walk This Way - in his last 4 starts against Oakland, spanning May 8, 2015 - Sept. 30, 2016, Taijuan Walker is $1-1$ with a 2.59 ERA ( 7 ER, 24.1 IP) with 19 strikeouts and 8 walks...each of Walker's 7 career starts against the A's has come in a Mariners uniform.

- Multi-Hit Madness - the Mariners rank T2nd in the Majors (also: San Francisco) with 17 player multi-hit games...trail only Boston (20).
- 25 and under - 32 of the Mariners 63 hits this season have come from players 25-year or younger (Kyle Lewis-13, J.P. Crawford-9, Shed Long Jr.-6 and Evan White-4).
- Young \& Old - third baseman Kyle Seager (32 years, 271 days) is the oldest player on the Mariners active roster...left-handed pitcher Nick Margevicius (24 years, 43 days) is the youngest player on the Mariners active roster.
- Rule 5 Looking Good - RHP Yohan Ramirez (5th pick) is one of 5 players selected in the Major League phase of the 2019 Rule 5 Draft to break Summer Camp with the big league team...Ramirez pitched in 2 games at Houston, whom Seattle selected him from, throwing 3.0 scoreless innings and striking out 4 without allowing a hit.
- 2019 in Review - Completed the 2019 season 68-94 (.420), finishing 5th in the AL West (39.0 games behind division-winner Houston)...went 35-46 (.432) at home and 33-48 (.407) on the road. WALK ON...Taijuan Walker is making his 2nd career start in a Mariners home opener tonight...the righthander tossed 6.0 innings and allowed 2 runs on 7 hits while striking out 4 in a 3-2 Mariners loss on April 8, 2016 at T-Mobile Park...Walker becomes the 10th pitcher in club history make multiple starts in Mariners home openers (including season openers)...he joins Randy Johnson (5), Jamie Moyer (5), Félix Hernández (4), Glenn Abbott (3), Mike Moore (3), Scott Bankhead (2), Jeff Fassero (2), Freddy García (2) and James Paxton (2) in starting at least 2 home openers.
YOUTH MOVEMENT ...the Mariners fielded the youngest Opening Day roster in the Majors with an average age of 27 years, 259 days (ages on 7/24)...ranked ahead of San Diego (27.349), Miami (28.017), Detroit (28.029) and Kansas City (28.047)...Seattle's roster includes just 5 players with at least 4 years of MLB service time and features 14 players with less than 1 year of MLB service.
HOME OPENERS...the Mariners have won three home openers in a row and are 6-1 in home openers since 2013...overall, the Mariners are 27-16 (.628) all-time in home openers, including 10-6 (.625) after opening the regular season schedule on the road...HOME OPENERS VS. OAKLAND...the Mariners are 5-4 (.556) in home openers against Oakland....have lost their last three home openers against the A's (2010, 2012 and 2016)...HOME OPENERS IN JULY...marks the first home opener in July in club history... previously, the latest home opener in club history was April 27, 1995...HOME OPENERS ON FRIDAYS.. the Mariners are 1-5 (.167) in home openers on Fridays...earned their lone win on April 16, 1982 with a 5-0 victory over the Athletics...HOME OPENERS IN NIGHT GAMES...the Mariners are playing their 31st nighttime home opener...the Mariners are 19-11 (.633) when opening their home schedule at night...the Mariners played their first 21 home openers at night, spanning 1977-1997...marks their 7th home opener since 2011; are 3-3 in their last 6 home openers since 2011.
HOME SWEET HOME...the Mariners 2020 home opener, presented by T-Mobile, against the Oakland Athletics is tonight at 6:40 pm at T-Mobile Park...the game will be broadcast on ROOT SPORTS NW, 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network...while there won't be fans at the ballpark, there will still be an Opening Day pregame ceremony featuring many of the elements that have become a Mariners tradition, whether they are previously videotaped or live at T-Mobile Park...the pregame ceremony will begin at $6: 00 \mathrm{pm}$ and will be carried live on ROOT SPORTS NW...the program begins with a special performance by Seattle-based singer-songwriter Ben Gibbard, lead vocalist for Death Cab for Cutie and the Postal Service...the National Anthem will be performed by Madisen Hallberg, a Portland State University senior, and Emmanuel Henreid, a Portland-based opera singer...6-year old Lily of Snohomish will complete the ceremonial First Run Around the Bases...delivery of the game ball will get an assist from health care workers who sent in video of themselves passing a ball on and off screen...Washington Governor Jay Inslee will be on the mound at T-Mobile Park to throw out the ceremonial first pitch live.
LET'S GO STREAKING...Kyle Lewis has hit safely in each of the first 7 games of the season (.448/13x29, 5 R, 2 HR, 7 RBI, 3 BB )...has recorded a multi-hit contest in his last 5 straight games (.500/11×22, 3 R, 5 RBI, 2 BB)...his 7 -game hitting streak is tied with Adam Eaton-WAS and Dansby Swanson-ATL for the longest in the Majors this season...Lewis leads the Majors in hits (13), while ranking T1st in multi-hit games (5), T2nd in times on base (16), 4th in average (.448), T7th in on-base percentage (.500) and T6th in total bases (19).
MARINERS MILESTONES...Kyle Seager recorded his 600th run scored on Wednesday night against the Angels...becomes the 6th player in franchise history to score at least 600 runs as a Mariner, joining Edgar Martinez (1,219), Ichiro Suzuki (1,181), Ken Griffey Jr. (1,113), Jay Buhner (790) and Alex Rodriguez (627).
- Enters tonight's game with 199 career home runs... with his next homer, will become one of four

Mariners in club history to reach 200 career home runs (Griffey Jr., 417; Martinez, 309; Buhner, 307).

- Enters tonight's game with 1,226 career hits, 29 shy of tying Jay Buhner $(1,255)$ for 4th in club history.

AS YOU KNOW...Kyle Lewis leads the Major Leagues with 13 hits...BUT DID YOU KNOW? ...that Lewis' 13 hits are tied for the most by a Mariner in the club's first 7 games of season?...Lewis is the 5th player in club history to record 13 hits in the Mariners first 7 team games, joining Richie Zisk (1982), Hall of Famer Ken Griffey Jr. (1997), David Segui (1998) and Ichiro Suzuki (2005)...via STATS Inc.

- 27-year-old right-hander is making his 99th career appearance, his 96th career Major League start \& his 2nd start this season.
- Mariners supplemental first round selection (43rd overall) in the 2010 MLB First-Year Player Draft on of Yucaipa High School.
- Made his Major League debut with the Mariners on Aug. 30, 2013 at Houston; picked up the win, tossing 5.0 innings and allowing only 1 run on 2 hits with 1 walk and 2 strikeouts...at 21 years, 17 days old, was the youngest Mariners starter to win his debut in club history
- Pitched in the 2011 and 2012 MLB SiriusXM All-Star Futures game...also named to the Southern League All-Star team in 2012 (starting pitcher) and 2013 (DNP).
- Named Mariners MiLB Pitcher of the Year in 2011 \& 2013
- Traded to Arizona Diamondbacks along with Ketel Marte (inf) in exchange for Zac Curtis (lhp), Mitch Haniger (of) and Jean Segura (inf) on Nov. 23, 2016.
- Signed with Seattle as a free agent on Feb. 12, 2020.

SPRING RECAP...made only 1 Cactus League start for the Mariners on March 3 , tossing 3.0 innings and allowing 1 run on 4 hits with no walks and 4 strikeouts...also made one intrasquad start, tossing 2.0 innings with 2 strikeouts.

SUMMER CAMP RECAP...made 2 intrasquad starts at Mariners Summer Camp, tossing 5.1 scoreless innings with 4 walks and 9 strikeouts...picked up the win in his last Summer Camp start, tossing 3.1 scoreless innings, while walking 3 and striking out 6 .
LAST TIME OUT...made his return to Seattle on July 25 at Houston...took the loss as he lasted just 3.1 innings and allowed 5 runs on 7 hits ( 1 HR ), with 1 BB and 1 SO...marked his first start in a Mariners uniform since Sept. 30, 2016 vs. Oakland.

VS. OAKLAND...will be facing the Athletics for the first time since Sept. 30, 2016, his final start as a Mariner before the eventual trade to Arizona...for his career, the right-hander is $1-2$ with a 4.54 ERA ( $18 \mathrm{ER}, 35.2 \mathrm{IP}$ ) with 28 strikeouts to just 12 walks over 7 games ( 5 starts).

RECOVERY...missed most of the 2019 season recovering from Tommy John surgery... performed by Dr. David Altchek on April 25, 2018...suffered the original injury (torn right ulnar collateral ligament) on April 14, 2018...appeared in only 4 Major League games between the 2018 \& 2019 seasons combined.
1-HITTER...recorded a 1-hitter on July 31, 2015 at Minnesota ( $9.0,1,1,1,1,11, \mathrm{HR}$ ) ...was the 12th 1-hitter (11th of the 9-inning variety) and the 15th start allowing 1 or 0 hits in Mariners history...became the 3rd-youngest pitcher to toss a 1-hitter in club history at 22 years, 352 days old, trailing only Félix Hernández-21.003, and Gil Meche-21.279).
WITH THE SNAKES...appeared in 3 seasons in the Diamondbacks organization (2017-19), going 9-9 with a 3.47 ERA (66 ER, 171.1 IP), while striking out 156 and walking 66...posted a career-best 3.49 ERA ( 61 ER, 157.1 IP) over 28 starts in 2017 , while striking out 146 and walking 61 ...in 2018 , made three starts before injuring his throwing elbow and requiring Tommy John Surgery...missed the rest of 2018 and all of 2019, until finally returning to the mound on Sept. 29 vs. SD, where he threw just 1.0 IP , allowing 1 hit and striking out 1.
WELCOME BACK...signed with the Mariners as a free agent to a one-year deal on Feb. 12, 2020...was originally drafted by the Mariners in the first round (43rd overall) in the 2010 First-Year Player Draft out of Yucaipa High School (CA)...traded to Arizona on Nov. 23 , 2016 along with Ketel Marte (inf) in exchange for Zac Curtis (lhp), Mitch Haniger (of) and Jean Segura (inf).
THE YOUNG VET...leads all Mariners starters with 531.2 innings pitched despite being the 3rd-youngest pitcher in the Mariners Opening Day rotation..at age 27.346 on Opening Day, Walker was younger than Yusei Kikuchi (29.037, 161.2 IP), Kendall Graveman (29.216, 446.0 IP) and Marco Gonzales (28.159 447.0 IP)...Justus Sheffield was the youngest pitcher in the Mariners Opening Day rotation at age 24.072 with 38.2 IP, trailed only by Justin Dunn (24.305, 6.2 IP)....Walker entered the season with the 4th-most service time on the Mariners Opening Day roster with a mark of 5 years, 142 days, trailing only Kyle Seager (8.085), Bryan Shaw (8.081) and Dee Gordon (7.154)
HE WILL REMEMBER HIS FIRST... at 21 years, 17 days old, Walker was the youngest Mariners starting pitcher to win his MLB debut (8/30/13 at HOU)... was the 11th pitcher in Mariners history to win his starting debut and the 2nd (Pat Rice, 5/18/91 @NYY) to allow 0 ER AND earn a win...Erik Hanson (9/5/88 @MIN) is the only other starter to allow 0 ER in his debut, but he lost 2-0.
10 WINS...in 2015, became just the 4th Mariners starter to post a 10-win season before his age-23 season...was the first since Félix Hernández won 14 as a 21-year-old in 2007...others to win 10 games before 23: Félix Hernández (12 wins in 2006 at age 20; 14 wins in 2007 at age 21), Dave Fleming (17 wins in 1992 at age 22) and Freddy García (17 wins in 1999 at age 22).
EVEN YOUNG FOR HIS AGE... at 22 years, 289 days at the time of his start vs Cleveland on May 29, he became the 3rd-youngest pitcher in club history to record an outing of 8.0+ innings, 0 runs allowed with 8 or more strikeouts...only Félix Hernández accomplished the feat a younger age: $2 x$, June 21, 2007 vs. PIT at $21.074(8.0,6,0,0,1,9)$ and April 2, 2007 vs. OAK at 20.359 ( $8.0,3,0,0,2,12$ ).
CAREER...has appeared in parts of 7 Major League seasons with Seattle (2013-16 \& 2020) and Arizona (2017-19), going 31-32 with a 4.01 ERA (237 ER 531.2 IP), while striking out 479 and walking 166...was originally selected by the Mariners in the first round (43rd overall) in the 2010 MLB First-Year Player Draft...made Major League debut with Seattle on Aug. 30, 2013 at Houston.

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER: LHP YUSEI KIKUCHI (0-0, 12.27 ERA)

29-year-old left-hander is making his 2nd start of the season, his 34th Major League start and his 5th career start against the A's...2020: Made his season debut on July 26 at Houston...did not factor into the decision despite allowing 5 runs on 5 hits over just 3.2 innings in an eventual 7-6 win...2019 Recap...went 6-11 with a 5.46 ERA ( 98 ER, 161.2 IP ) with 50 walks and 116 strikeouts in first Major League season...led American rookies with 161.2 innings pitched, ranking 4th in strikeouts (116)...Historic Debut...with his start March 21, 2019 at Oakland in the Tokyo Dome, became the first Japanese-born player to make his Major League debut in Japan...was just his second career start (3rd appearance) as a professional in the Tokyo Dome...while with the Seibu Lions, started against the Yomiuri Giants on June 8, 2018 at the Tokyo Dome; earned the win, going 7.0 scoreless innings and scattering 2 hits and 3 walks while striking out 3...in 2011, made a 1.0 -inning relief appearance against the Giants in a preseason game...vs. OAK: Making his 5th career start against the Athletics...went 0-2 in 2019 with a 4.29 ERA (10 ER, 21.0 IP), with 14 strikeouts to just 5 walks...made his MLB debut against these Athletics in his native Japan (see above note).
