TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 3-team, 10-game, 10-day homestand today with the third (1-1) of four games against the Oakland Athletics...will also face Los Angeles-AL (Aug. 4-6) and Colorado (Aug. 7-9) on this homestand...went 3-4 on a recently-completed road trip to Houston (1-3) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1)...tonight's game will be broadcast live on ROOT SPORTS NW, 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network.
ODDS AND ENDS...lost last night, are 3-1 in their last four games and 4-3 in their last 7 games...are playing their ninth (4-5) of 20 consecutive games to open the 2020 season...are next scheduled to have an off-day on Aug. 13.

- Extras - The Mariners found themselves in extra innings for the first time this season in last night's game, falling, $3-2$, to the A's in the 10th inning...in 2019, the Mariners went 9-4 in extra innings games.
- Bring the Bats - In wins, the Mariners are batting . 303 (43×142) this season, the 2nd-highest average in the Majors in team wins...in losses, the Mariners are batting . 204 ( $34 \times 167$ ), the 15th-best average in the Majors in team losses.
- 25 and under - 40 of the Mariners 77 hits this season have come from players 25 -years old or younger (Kyle Lewis-16, J.P. Crawford-12, Shed Long Jr.-7 and Evan White-5).
-Rule 5 Guy - RHP Yohan Ramirez (5th pick) is one of 5 players selected in the Major League phase of the 2019 Rule 5 Draft to break Summer Camp with the big league team...Ramirez pitched in 2 games at Houston, throwing 3.0 scoreless innings and striking out 4 without allowing a hit.
FOR STARTERS...Mariners starters have gone $2-0$ while posting a 0.00 ERA (0 ER, 19.1 IP) with 23 strikeouts and 4 walks over their last three games...went 0-4 with a 10.55 ERA ( 25 ER, 21.1 IP) the first time through the rotation ( 6 games), highest ERA in the Majors during that span...the streak of 3 consecutive starts without allowing an earned run ranks T2nd in club history (4x, last: June 28 - July 1, 2015), trailing only 5 consecutive games from Sept. 8-19, 2001.
HOT START...Kyle Lewis leads the Major Leagues with 16 hits...Lewis' 16 hits are tied for the most by a Mariner in the team's first 9 games of a season in club history (also: David Segui in 1998)...only Endy Chavez has tallied more than 16 hits through the club's first 10 games in a single season, tallying 17 hits in 10 games during the 2009 campaign.
LET'S GO STREAKING...Kyle Lewis has hit safely in each of the first 9 games of the season (.444/16x36, 6 R, 2 HR, 8 RBI, 4 BB )...recorded a multi-hit contest in 6 straight games from July 26-31...his 9-game hitting streak is tied with Dansby Swanson-ATL for the longest in the Majors this season...Lewis leads the Majors in hits (16), and multi-hit games (6), while ranking T2nd in times on base (20), 2nd in average (.444), T2nd in on-base percentage (.500) and T8th in total bases (2).
DOMINATE THE ZONE...Mariners hitters rank 7th in the Majors with 120 plate appearances that ended while the batter was ahead in the count...in those plate appearances, the Mariners rank third in the Majors with a .318 ( $28 \times 88$ ) batting average and are tied for 6th-best in the Majors with a .500 on-base percentage... when trailing in the count, the Mariners batters rank 19th in the Majors in batting (.181) and 22nd in on-base percentage (.179).
SIMPLY SEAGER...Kyle Seager has reached base safely in 8 of 9 games this season, including 5 games in which he has reached base safely multiple times...Seager's 4 doubles rank T2nd in the Majors (also: 10 others), trailing only Christian Walker (5)...among American League leaders, he ranks 2nd with 10 RBI and T10th in extra-base hits with 5 (also: 23 others).
RBI GUY...Kyle Seager has tallied 10 RBI through 9 games this season, ranking T4rd in the Majors behind only Donovan Solano (13), Nelson Cruz (11) and Dansby Swanson (11)...his 10 RBI through the club's first 9 games of the season are tied for 10th-most in club history (also: 4 others)....becomes only the 2nd player (also: Domingo Santana, 13 in 2019) to record 10+ RBI before the 10th game of the season since Adrian Beltre accomplished the feat in 2007.
TABLESETTER...J.P. Crawford has hit leadoff in each of the club's last 4 games...Crawford has reached base safely in 9 of his 19 plate appearances for a .474 on-base percentage over the Mariners last 4 games...he is 7 -for-17 (.412) with 7 runs scored, 4 RBI, 2 walks and 2 stolen bases in the last 4 games, having recorded a multi-hit game in 3 of the 4 contests...the Mariners are 3-0 in their last 4 games.
OFF TO THE RACES ...the Mariners rank 2nd in the Majors with 8 stolen bases...trail only San Diego (14) while ranking ahead of Houston (6)...five different Mariners have recorded a stolen base this season: J.P. Crawford (2), Shed Long Jr. (2), Tim Lopes (2), Kyle Seager (1) and Mallex Smith (1)...the Mariners are one of three Major League clubs to have at least three players with 2 or more steals, joined by Texas (3 players: Joey Gallo, Isiah Kiner-Falefa and Nick Solak) and San Diego (4 players: Trent Grisham, Tommy Pham, Jurickson Profar and Fernando Tatis Jr).
YOUTH MOVEMENT ...the Mariners fielded the youngest Opening Day roster in the Majors with an average age of 27 years, 259 days (ages on 7/24)...ranked ahead of San Diego (27.349), Miami (28.017), Detroit (28.029) and Kansas City (28.047)...Seattle's roster includes just 5 players with at least 4 years of MLB service time and features 14 players with less than 1 year of MLB service.
MARINERS MILESTONES...Kyle Seager recorded his 600th run scored on Wednesday night against the Angels...becomes the 6th player in franchise history to score at least 600 runs as a Mariner, joining Edgar Martinez $(1,219)$, Ichiro Suzuki $(1,181)$, Ken Griffey Jr. $(1,113)$, Jay Buhner $(790)$ and Alex Rodriguez $(627)$.
-Enters tonight's game with 199 career home runs... with his next homer, will become one of four
Mariners in club history to reach 200 career home runs (Griffey Jr., 417; Martinez, 309; Buhner, 307).
- Enters tonight's game with 1,228 career hits, 27 shy of tying Jay Buhner $(1,255)$ for 4th in club history.

AS YOU KNOW... 40 of the Mariners 77 hits this season have been by players age 25 or younger...BUT DID YOU KNOW?...Mariners players under 25 years old hold a .379 on-base percentage this season?... on pace for the 3rd-highest on-base percentage by Mariners players age 25 or younger in club history, trailing only the 2000 club (.389) and the 1996 club (.381)...by tallying 40 hits after only 9 games this season, 2020 Mariners youngsters have already surpassed the full-season totals for the 2018 club (18) and are closing in on the 2002 club (51) for hits by players age 25 or younger in a single season.

- Signed by Seattle as a free agent on Nov 26 2019
- Native of Birmingham, AL...attended Mississippi State University from 2009 to 2013... needs just eight credits to graduate with a degree in mechanical engineering
- Originally selected by Miami in the 36th round of the 2012 MLB Draft, but did not sign...was drafted by Toronto in the 8th round of the 2013 MLB Draft out of Mississippi State.
- Made his MLB debut with the Blue Jays on Sept. 5, 2014 at Boston.
- Was traded to Oakland as part of the deal that sent Josh Donaldson to Toronto on Nov. 28, 2014.
- Spent 4 seasons in Oakland (2015-18), going 23-29 with a 4.38 ERA (226 ER, 441.1 IP), while making a pair of Opening Day starts (2017-18)...had his 2018 campaign cut short by Tommy John Surgery on July 30
