TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 3-team, 10-game, 10-day homestand today with the third (1-1) of four games against the Oakland Athletics...will also face Los Angeles-AL (Aug. 4-6) and Colorado (Aug. 7-9) on this homestand...went 3-4 on a recently-completed road trip to Houston (1-3) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1)...tonight's game will be broadcast live on **ROOT SPORTS NW**, **710 ESPN Seattle** and the **Mariners** Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...lost last night, are 3-1 in their last four games and 4-3 in their last 7 games...are playing their ninth (4-5) of 20 consecutive games to open the 2020 season...are next scheduled to have an off-day on Aug. 13.

- Extras The Mariners found themselves in extra innings for the first time this season in last night's
- game, falling, 3-2, to the A's in the 10th inning...in 2019, the Mariners went 9-4 in extra innings games.

 Bring the Bats In wins, the Mariners are batting .303 (43x142) this season, the 2nd-highest average in the Majors in team wins...in losses, the Mariners are batting .204 (34x167), the 15th-best average in the Majors in team losses.

 •25 and under - 40 of the Mariners 77 hits this season have come from players 25-years old or
- younger (**Kyle Lewis**-16, **J.P. Crawford**-12, **Shed Long Jr.**-7 and **Evan White**-5).

 Rule 5 Guy RHP **Yohan Ramirez** (5th pick) is one of 5 players selected in the Major League phase
- of the 2019 Rule 5 Draft to break Summer Camp with the big league team...Ramirez pitched in 2 games at Houston, throwing 3.0 scoreless innings and striking out 4 without allowing a hit.

FOR STARTERS...Mariners starters have gone 2-0 while posting a 0.00 ERA (0 ER, 19.1 IP) with 23 strikeouts and 4 walks over their last three games...went 0-4 with a 10.55 ERA (25 ER, 21.1 IP) the first time through the rotation (6 games), highest ERA in the Majors during that span...the streak of 3 consecutive starts without allowing an earned run ranks T2nd in club history (4x, last: June 28 - July 1, 2015), trailing only 5 consecutive games from Sept. 8-19, 2001.

HOT START...Kyle Lewis leads the Major Leagues with 16 hits...Lewis' 16 hits are tied for the most by a Mariner in the team's first 9 games of a season in club history (also: David Segui in 1998)...only Endy Chavez has tallied more than 16 hits through the club's first 10 games in a single season, tallying 17 hits in 10 games during the 2009 campaign.

LET'S GO STREAKING...Kyle Lewis has hit safely in each of the first 9 games of the season (.444/16x36, 6 R, 2 HR, 8 RBI, 4 BB)...recorded a multi-hit contest in 6 straight games from July 26-31...his 9-game hitting streak is tied with Dansby Swanson-ATL for the longest in the Majors this season...Lewis leads the Majors in hits (16), and multi-hit games (6), while ranking T2nd in times on base (20), 2nd in average (.444), T2nd in on-base percentage (.500) and T8th in total bases (2).

DOMINATE THE ZONE... Mariners hitters rank 7th in the Majors with 120 plate appearances that ended while the batter was ahead in the count...in those plate appearances, the Mariners rank third in the Majors with a .318 (28x88) batting average and are tied for 6th-best in the Majors with a .500 on-base percentage... when trailing in the count, the Mariners batters rank 19th in the Majors in batting (.181) and 22nd in on-base percentage (.179).

SIMPLY SEAGER...Kyle Seager has reached base safely in 8 of 9 games this season, including 5 games in which he has reached base safely multiple times...Seager's 4 doubles rank T2nd in the Majors (also: 10 others), trailing only Christian Walker (5)...among American League leaders, he ranks 2nd with 10 RBI and T10th in extra-base hits with 5 (also: 23 others).

RBI GUY...Kyle Seager has tallied 10 RBI through 9 games this season, ranking T4rd in the Majors behind only Donovan Solano (13), Nelson Cruz (11) and Dansby Swanson (11)...his 10 RBI through the club's first 9 games of the season are tied for 10th-most in club history (also: 4 others)...becomes only the 2nd player (also: Domingo Santana, 13 in 2019) to record 10+ RBI before the 10th game of the season since Adrian Beltre accomplished the feat in 2007.

TABLESETTER...J.P. Crawford has hit leadoff in each of the club's last 4 games...Crawford has reached base safely in 9 of his 19 plate appearances for a .474 on-base percentage over the Mariners last 4 games...he is 7-for-17 (.412) with 7 runs scored, 4 RBI, 2 walks and 2 stolen bases in the last 4 games, having recorded a multi-hit game in 3 of the 4 contests...the Mariners are 3-0 in their last 4 games.

OFF TO THE RACES...the Mariners rank 2nd in the Majors with 8 stolen bases...trail only San Diego (14) while ranking ahead of Houston (6)...five different Mariners have recorded a stolen base this season: J.P. Crawford (2), Shed Long Jr. (2), Tim Lopes (2), Kyle Seager (1) and Mallex Smith (1)...the Mariners are one of three Major League clubs to have at least three players with 2 or more steals, joined by Texas (3 players: Joey Gallo, Isiah Kiner-Falefa and Nick Solak) and San Diego (4 players: Trent Grisham, Tommy Pham, Jurickson Profar and Fernando Tatis Jr).

YOUTH MOVEMENT...the Mariners fielded the youngest Opening Day roster in the Majors with an average age of 27 years, 259 days (ages on 7/24)...ranked ahead of San Diego (27.349), Miami (28.017), Detroit (28.029) and Kansas City (28.047)...Seattle's roster includes just 5 players with at least 4 years of MLB service time and features 14 players with less than 1 year of MLB service.

MARINERS MILESTONES...Kyle Seager recorded his 600th run scored on Wednesday night against the Angels...becomes the 6th player in franchise history to score at least 600 runs as a Mariner, joining Edgar Martinez (1,219), Ichiro Suzuki (1,181), Ken Griffey Jr. (1,113), Jay Buhner (790) and Alex Rodriguez (627).

- Enters tonight's game with 199 career home runs...with his next homer, will become one of four Mariners in club history to reach 200 career home runs (Griffey Jr., 417; Martinez, 309; Buhner, 307).
- Enters tonight's game with 1,228 career hits, 27 shy of tying Jay Buhner (1,255) for 4th in club history.

AS YOU KNOW...40 of the Mariners 77 hits this season have been by players age 25 or younger...BUT DID YOU KNOW?...Mariners players under 25 years old hold a .379 on-base percentage this season?... on pace for the 3rd-highest on-base percentage by Mariners players age 25 or younger in club history, trailing only the 2000 club (.389) and the 1996 club (.381)...by tallying 40 hits after only 9 games this season, 2020 Mariners youngsters have already surpassed the full-season totals for the 2018 club (18) and are closing in on the 2002 club (51) for hits by players age 25 or younger in a single season.

- Spent 4 seasons in Oakland (2015-18), going 23-29 with a 4.38 ERA (226 ER, 441.1 IP), while making a pair of Opening Day starts (2017-18)...had his 2018 campaign cut short by Tommy John Surgery on July 30.

 Signed with Chicago-NL as a free agent on December 23, 2018.

 Spent most of the season on the Injured List as he recovered from Tommy John.

- Made two appearances in Chicago-NL's farm system, covering 3.0 innings and allowing 1 ER on 3 hits with 6 strikeouts on Aug. 22 and Sept. 1.

SPRING TRAINING 1.0...Graveman threw 4.0 scoreless innings over two outings

Spring Training in February/March...he threw 2.0 scoreless innings, allowing only 1 hit and 1 walk on Feb. 25 at Milwaukee...threw 2.0 scoreless innings at CHC on 3/1, walking 1 and striking out 3.

SUMMER CAMP...Graveman only made two appearances in Summer Camp at T-Mobile Park, but he was excellent, going 2-0 with a 1.29 ERA (1 ER, 7.0 IP) with a team-best tying 13 strikeouts (also: Justus Sheffield)...in his last outing on July 21, he struck out 8 batters over just 4.0 innings pitched.

<u>VS. OAKLAND</u>...Graveman will be facing his former team for the first time in his career...he spent 2015-18 with the A's, going a combined 23-29 with a 4.38 ERA (215 ER, 441.1 IP)...he made 2 Opening Day starts for Oakland in 2017 and 2018...from 2015-18, was top-3 in wins (3rd, 23), winning percentage (2nd, .442), starts (2nd, 78), complete games (T1st, 3), innings pitched (2nd, 441.1) and strikeouts (3rd, 282) among qualifying Athletics pitchers.

THE LONG ROAD BACK...Graveman's last Major League pitch was thrown on May 11, 2018 as a member of the Oakland Athletics in Yankee Stadium...upon throwing his first pitch today, he will have completed a track of 807 days (2 years, 2 months and 16 days) between Major League appearances...for comparison purpsoes, in Mariners history, 807 days would rank as the 4th-longest span between pitching appearances for Seattle. RECOVERY...missed all of the 2019 season recovering from Tommy John surgery... performed by Dr. Keith Meister on July 30, 2018...suffered the original injury (right forearm strain) on May 27, 2018 while pitching for Oakland's Triple-A affiliate in Nashville...had been 1-5 with a 7.60 ERA (29 ER, 34.1 IP) over 7 starts with Oakland prior to being optioned on May 15.

VS. AL WEST...from 2015-2018, while Graveman pitched for Oakland, he was one of just 12 pitchers to record at least 200.0 IP against the American League West (236.1)...his 41 starts over that span were tied with Cole Hamels for the 4th-most, trailing only Dallas Keuchel (54 GS), Félix Hernández (50 GS) and Martín Pérez (45 GS).

LEFT IS RIGHT, RIGHT IS LEFT... over his 5-year career, Graveman has limited righties to a .287/.327/.470 slash line (254x886) with 83 extra-base hits and 144 strikeouts while left-handed hitters have slashed .268/.338/.405 (236x880) with 71 extra-base hits and 149 strikeouts.

DAY 'N' NITE...in day games, Graveman has allowed 53 extra-base hits while hitters have recorded a .285 batting average (162x568)...he is 8-9 over 28 games (26 starts) in day games with a 4.83 ERA (77 ER, 143.1 IP)...conversely, in night games, the right-hander has went 15-21 with a 4.28 ERA (146 ER, 306.2 IP) and has held batters to a .274 batting average (328x1198).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER: LHP JUSTUS SHEFFIELD (0-1, 12.00 ERA)

24-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 2nd start of 2020 tomorrow night in the series finale against Oakland...2020: Made his season debut in his last start on July 28 at Los Angeles-AL...took the loss after allowing 4 runs on 3 hits and 4 walks over just 3.0 innings in a 10-2 Mariners defeat...VS. OAK: It will be his second start against the Athletics in his career, the other being his 2019 season finale on Sept. 27...in that effort, he did not factor into the decision despite allowing just 1 run on 5 hits over 5.0- innings pitched in a 4-3 Mariners win...2019: Pitched in 8 Major League games in 2019 (7 starts), posting a 5.50 ERA (22 ER, 36.0 IP) with 37 strikeouts to 18 walks...CAREER: Was originally selected by the Cleveland Indians in the 1st round (31st overall) out of Tullahoma High School (TN)...has appeared in parts of 2 Major League seasons with the New York Yankees (2018) and Mariners (2019-c) going 0-2 with a 6.26 ERA (29 ER, 41.2 IP) with 25 walks and 39 strikeouts in 12 career games (8 starts).


