TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 3-team, 10-game, 10-day homestand tonight with the finale (1-2) of four games against the Oakland Athletics...will also face Los Angeles-AL (Aug. 4-6) and Colorado (Aug. 7-9) on this homestand...went 3-4 on a recently-completed road trip to Houston (1-3) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1)...tonight's game will be broadcast live on ROOT SPORTS NW, 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network.
ODDS AND ENDS...lost yesterday, are 3-2 in their last five games and 4-4 in their last 8 games...are playing their 10th (4-6) of 20 consecutive games to open the 2020 season...are next scheduled to have an off-day on Aug. 13.

- Moore is More - Dylan Moore has hit safely in 4 of his 5 games this season, including 3 games in which he has recorded an extra-base hit...Moore is 6 -for- 21 (.286) with 4 runs, 2 doubles, 1 home run and 3 RBI this season.
-Righting the Ship - Mariners pitchers have allowed 3 or fewer earned runs in each of their last 4 games, posting a 2.68 ERA ( 11 ER, 37.0 IP)...gave up at least 6 earned runs in each of their first 6 games ( $7 / 24-29$ ), allowing a 7.74 ERA ( $43 \mathrm{ER}, 50.0 \mathrm{IP}$ ).
-Work the Count - the Mariners rank 5th in the AL, averaging 3.97 pitches-per-plate-appearance... trail Tampa Bay (4.13), Oakland (4.10), Cleveland (4.10) and Minnesota (4.03).
- Bring the Bats - in wins, the Mariners are batting . 303 (43×142) this season, the 4th-highest average in the Majors in team wins...in losses, the Mariners are batting .196 (39x199), the 15th-best average in the Majors in team losses.
- 25 and under - 43 of the Mariners 82 hits this season have come from players 25 -years old or younger (Kyle Lewis-17, J.P. Crawford-12, Shed Long Jr.-9 and Evan White-5).
- Rule 5 Guy - RHP Yohan Ramirez (5th pick) is one of 5 players selected in the Major League phase of the 2019 Rule 5 Draft to break Summer Camp with the big league team...Ramirez has worked 5.0 scoreless innings across 3 relief appearances this season; he has struck out 8 and walked 5 while allowing only 1 hit.
10-FOR-10...Kyle Lewis has hit safely in each of the club's first 10 games this season...he is the 4th player in club history to hit safely in each of the Mariners first 10 games of a season, joining Joey Cora (1998), Endy Chavez (2009) and Dee Gordon (2018)...only Cora and Gordon have hit safely in the Mariners first 11 games of a season...Lewis is the first rookie to hit safely in 10 straight team games to start a season since Tampa Bay's Delmon Young in 2007 (12-game hit streak to start season)...via STATS Inc.
FOR STARTERS...Mariners starters have gone $2-1$ while posting a 0.75 ERA (2 ER, 24.0 IP) with 26 strikeouts and 6 walks over their last 4 games... have worked at least 6.0 innings in 3 of their last 4 games while allowing 2 or fewer earned runs....went 0-4 with a 10.55 ERA ( 25 ER, 21.1 IP) the first time through the rotation ( 6 games), highest ERA in the Majors during that span.
HOT START...Kyle Lewis leads the Major Leagues with 17 hits...Lewis' 17 hits are tied for the most by a Mariner in the team's first 10 games of a season in club history (also: Endy Chavez, 2009)...the club record for most hits in the team's first 11 games of a season is 19, set by David Segui in 1998 and matched by Ichiro Suzuki in 2005.
LET'S GO STREAKING...Kyle Lewis has hit safely in each of the first 10 games of the season (. $425 / 17 \times 40$, 7 R, 3 HR, 9 RBI, 4 BB)...recorded a multi-hit contest in 6 straight games from July 26-31...his 10-game hitting streak is tied with Dansby Swanson-ATL for the longest in the Majors this season...Lewis leads the Majors in hits (17), and multi-hit games (6), while ranking 3rd in times on base (21), 3rd in total bases (26), 5th in average (.425), 6th in on-base percentage (.477) and 13th in OPS (1.127).
TABLESETTER...J.P. Crawford has hit leadoff in each of the club's last 5 games...Crawford has reached base safely in 10 of his 23 plate appearances for a .435 on-base percentage over the Mariners last 5 games...he is 7 -for- $20(.350$ ) with 7 runs scored, 4 RBI, 2 walks, 2 stolen bases and 1 HBP in the last 5 games, having recorded a multi-hit game in 3 of the 5 contests...the Mariners are 3-2 in their last 5 games. OFF TO THE RACES ...the Mariners rank 2nd in the Majors with 10 stolen bases...trail only San Diego (14) while ranking ahead of Texas (8)...six different Mariners have recorded a stolen base this season: Shed Long Jr. (3), J.P. Crawford (2), Tim Lopes (2), Dylan Moore (1), Kyle Seager (1) and Mallex Smith (1)... the Mariners are one of three Major League clubs to have at least six players with 1 or more steals, joined by Cincinnati and San Diego.
YOUTH MOVEMENT ...the Mariners fielded the youngest Opening Day roster in the Majors with an average age of 27 years, 259 days (ages on 7/24)...ranked ahead of San Diego (27.349), Miami (28.017), Detroit (28.029) and Kansas City (28.047)...Seattle's roster includes just 5 players with at least 4 years of MLB service time and features 14 players with less than 1 year of MLB service.
MARINERS MILESTONES...Kyle Seager recorded his 600th run scored on Wednesday night against the Angels....becomes the 6th player in franchise history to score at least 600 runs as a Mariner, joining Edgar Martinez $(1,219)$, Ichiro Suzuki $(1,181)$, Ken Griffey Jr. $(1,113)$, Jay Buhner $(790)$ and Alex Rodriguez (627).
-Enters tonight's game with 199 career home runs... with his next homer, will become one of four Mariners in club history to reach 200 career home runs (Griffey Jr., 417; Martinez, 309; Buhner, 307).
- Enters tonight's game with 1,228 career hits, 27 shy of tying Jay Buhner $(1,255)$ for 4 th in club history.
- Among Mariners all-time club leaders, Seager ranks 4th in doubles, 4th in home runs, 4th in RBI, 4th in extra-base hits, 5 th in games, 5 th in hits, 6 th in runs scored and 6 th in walks.

24-year-old left-hander is making his 9th Major League start, his 2nd appearance of the season, his 13th career appearance and his 2nd career appearance against the Athletics, tonight at T-Mobile Park.

- Justus ("justice") Kane Sheffield...resides in Tullahoma, TN
- Acquired in trade from New York-AL along with Erik Swanson (rhp) and Dom Thompson-Williams (cf) in exchange for James Paxton (lhp) on Nov. 19, 2018.
- Has been a top-10 organizational prospect according to Baseball America since making his professional debut in 2014...entered the 2020 season as the Mariners No. 7 prospect (Baseball America).
- Made his Major League debut with the Yankees on Sept. 19, 2018 vs. Boston
- Has spent 6 minor league seasons in the Indians (2014-16), Yan kees (2016-18) and Mariners (2019-c) organizations...over his minor league career, has a strikeout-to-walk ratio of $2.63(640 \mathrm{~K}, 243 \mathrm{BB})$ while averaging 9.3 strikeouts-per-9.0-innings ( $640 \mathrm{~K}, 620.2 \mathrm{IP}$ ) and allowing only 0.70 home-runs-per-9.0-innings (48 HR, 620.2 IP).
