WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers won the club's last game on Sun. at SF, 9-5, avoiding a sweep in the series finale... team is 1-2 to begin this 6-game, 7-day initial road trip to SF (1-2) and OAK (3 G)...Texas has dropped 2 of 3 and 5 of the past 7 G since winning on Opening Day, 7/24 vs. COL... enter tonight seeking 1st win streak of 2020...team was season-low 3 G under .500 with loss on Sat., needing a win tonight to avoid matching that low point...team has opened at 3-5 for 3rd time in 4 years (also 2017-18; went 5-3 in 2019)... opened 3-6 in 2018, 5-4 in 2019 after 9 G...club has not been at the .500 mark since a 1-1 record after loss on 7/25 vs. COL...team is in 3rd place in the A.L. West, 2.0 games behind 1st place Oakland.

SERIES STUFF: Texas is 0-2-1 in its 1st 3 series of the season, 1st time to go without a series win this late into a campaign since 2018 (opened 0-3-1)...have won consecutive series finales to avoid sweeps...last series win came in final series of 2019, taking 2 of 3 from NYY in the last games at Globe Life Park from 9/27-29...TEX was 5-15-6 in road series in '19, losing final 2 road series since last win from 9/5-8 at BAL (4-0).

ON THE ROAD: Texas has opened with a 1-2 road record in 2020...marks 3rd straight year to go winless in 1st road series (0-2-1 in that span) since taking 2 of 3 in Anaheim to begin the 2017 road slate...Rangers finished 33-48 (.407) on the road in 2019 for a 2nd straight season, T9th in A.L. and T21st in MLB...beginning June 29, team was 15-27 (.357) in final 42 away games in '19, 3rd-lowest win pct. in A.L.

TAKE THE BAY BRIDGE: This is the Rangers' 1st road trip of the season, with a series this past weekend at SF followed by 3 G in Oakland this week...this is the Rangers' 3rd such visit to Northern California (playing Giants/A's back-to-back), the others were from 8/20-26/18 and 6/4/10/12...it is the 1st of those 3 visits in which the 1st series has been at SF.

FIRST SERIES VS. A.L. OPPONENT: This week's 3-game set begins a span in which Texas plays 3 straight A.L. West opponents, the club's 1st games vs. A.L. teams in 2020...the Rangers played COL/ARI/SF in its 1st 3 series, becoming the 1st team in MLB history with 3 different opponents in their 1st 3 series and each opponent being from the oppostie league (credit Elias Sports Bureau).

<u>VS. OAKLAND:</u> This 3-G series marks the 1st of 3 series against the A's in '20, the others taking place in Arlington from 8/24-27 (4 G) and 9/11-13 (3 G)...Rangers won final meeting of last season on 9/22/19 at OAK, which snapped a 7-game losing streak to the A's...team went 6-13 overall vs. OAK in 2019, including 3-7 at the Coliseum...Rangers are 7-22 at the Coliseum since the start of 2017, going 0-7-2 in the 9 series here in that span...last series win at this historic facility was when club took 2 of 3 from 9/23-25/16...OAK leads the all-time series, 378-373, with a 200-176 advantage here at the Coliseum.

COVE BLAST: Shin-Soo Choo has hit home runs in each of his 2 games on this road trip, including a blast on Sunday into McCovey Cove (also HR'd Friday, DNP on Saturday)...he is the only Ranger to hit HR in consecutive games in 2020, 1st time he has done that since 7/12-13/19 vs. HOU...his splash hit on Sunday was the 50th ever by an opponent at Oracle Park, the 1st by an opposing team since Rougned Odor did it on 8/24/18 off Will Smith.

EARLY RUNS: Texas has scored in the 1st or 2nd inning in each of the 1st 3 G of this trip, something the team did just once over the 1st 5 contests in '20...offense is batting .370 (10-27) w/ 4 BB and 6 R over 1st 2 innings on this trip... Rangers have scored 1st in 6 of the 1st 8 games this year, going 3-3 in such games.

<u>GALLO'S GREAT:</u> Joey Gallo posted a season-high 3 hits on Sun. at SF, including a decisive 3-run home run to the deepest part of the park in the 7th inning...Gallo has now homered in each of the Rangers' 1st 3 series, and he ranks among A.L. leaders in XBH (T3rd, 6), HR (T4th, 3), and RBI (T10th, 8)...Gallo has 6 BB/7 SO through the 1st 8 games... he has a 4-G hit streak, longest by a Ranger in '20.

GALLO VS. LHP: Each of Gallo's 3 HR this season have come against left-handed pitchers, as he has gone 4-for-12 with 3 HR, a 2B, and 2 BB vs. lefties in '20 (1.595 OPS)...he has 26 HR vs. LHP since the start of 2018, the 4th-highest total by any MLB batter in that span and the most by any LH hitter in that period (LAD's Cody Bellinger has 24).

LYNN GOES FOR 100 (AGAIN): After nearly landing his 100th win in his last start on Wed. vs. ARI, Lance Lynn will make another attempt in tonight's start...would be the 23rd active ML pitcher to surpass 100 career wins, most recently accomplished by Mike Leake (6/21/19 vs. BAL w/ SEA)...only 10 pitchers have ever reached the triple-digit wins mark as a member of the Rangers with only 3 doing so since 2000:

- Chan Ho Park 5/22/05 vs. HOU (7.0 IP, 6 H, 0 R, 0 BB, 2 SO) - Cliff Lee - 8/6/10 at OAK (8.0 IP, 7 H, 1 R-ER, 0 BB, 8 SO)
- Cilii Lee 8/6/10 at OAK (6.0 IP, 7 H, 1 R-ER, 0 BB, 8 SO) - Yovani Gallardo - 8/27/15 vs. TOR (5.1 IP, 3 H, 0 R, 3 BB, 2 SO)

ROLL ON: The Texas offense posted season highs in runs (9), walks (7), and hits (9-tied) in Sunday's win at SF, as the club has compiled its top offensive showings in the past 2 series finales...the Rangers offense had just 3 strikeouts on Sunday, fewest since 7/5/19 at MIN (also 3 SO), and this after 11+ K's in each of the 1st 2 G of the Giants series...Texas had not produced a game with 7+ BB and 3 SO-or-less since 9/4/15 at LAA (8 BB/2 SO).

• Batters went 3-for-6 with 3 BB with RISP on Sunday, matching most hits w/ RISP in a game in '20...team had gone 2-for-15 with RISP over 1st 2 G of the series.

HERNÁNDEZ AGAIN: Jonathan Hernández was credited with a relief win for a 2nd consecutive appearance on Sunday, as his 2.0 SHO IP helped maintain the Rangers' late 4-run lead...he is the 1st member of the TEX pitching staff with 2 wins, and his 2 relief wins are tied for the ML lead with 5 other pitchers, all of whom are with clubs in the A.L./N.L. West...Hernández has been scoreless in 3 of his 4 outings, with 8 K's in 5.0 IP.

STRONG STARTERS: With Kolby Allard allowing one run in 4.0 IP in his season debut on Sunday, the Texas rotation continues to rank among the best in the A.L...TEX starters rank among tops in league in opp. BA (1st, .189), SLG (1st, .337), OPS (1st, .559), and ERA (2nd, 2.95)...the rotation has allowed an MLB-low one HR in '20, a Wilmer Flores blast off Mike Minor on Friday night.

WHEN I LOOK AT THE TELEVISION: Take note that MLB. TV is offering the Tuesday and Thursday games of this series as a "Free Game of the Day".

SHORTS: Today marks the 10th anniversary of Rangers Baseball Express LLC, led by co-chairmen Ray Davis and Bob Simpson, submitting the high bid for the club in a United States Bankruptcy Court auction held on August 4-5, 2010 in Fort Worth, Texas. The new ownership group was approved in a unanimous vote of MLB owners on August 12, 2010... beginning today, Rangers are scheduled to play 26 games over the next 27 days through 8/30.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER

#35 Lance Lynn, RHP (1-0, 0.00)

TONIGHT: The 33-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 3rd start of 2020 in tonight's series opener in Oakland...enters tonight's contest with 99 career wins (see front page for additional notes)...will be working on extra 5 days' rest after taking ND in Rangers' come-from-behind 7-4 win on Wed. vs. ARI... Lynn has 17 K's over 12.0 scoreless inn. spanning his 2 starts in 2020...is in his 2nd season with Texas after posting a career year in 2019, earning a fifth place finish in the A.L. Cy Young Award voting...recorded the 3rd-highest single-season strikeout total in team history (246) and one of the highest pitching WAR figures ever by a Ranger (7.6 rWAR)...signed a three-year contract with TEX as a free agent on 12/18/18...is one of 11 Major League pitchers with at least seven 10-win campaigns since 2012, and one of just nine to post 7 seasons of 29+ starts in that same span...was a rookie in the Cardinals' World Championship season of 2011, defeating the Rangers in Game 3 of the World Series in Arlington...was a 1st round pick of STL in 2008 after pitching 3 seasons at the University of Mississippi.

DOMINANT FIRST TWO STARTS: Lynn started each of the Rangers' 1st 2 wins in '20, posting 17 K's over 12.0 scoreless inn. spanning his 2 starts...according to baseball-reference.com (Stathead), Lynn is the only pitcher in the modern era (since 1901) with multiple starts of 6.0+ SHO IP and 8+ SO over his team's 1st 5 G of a season...last Ranger to do that in back-to-back starts at any point was Yu Darvish (4/19-24/13)...the only ML pitchers with multiple qualifying starts in '20 that have yet to allow a run are Lynn (12.0 IP) and CLE's Shane Bieber (14.0 IP).

LAST START: Posted 6.0 SHO IP in club's come-from-behind 7-4 last at-bat win on Wed. vs. ARI (ND, 6.0 IP, 1 H, 0 R, 2 BB, 8 SO, 102 pitches/72 strikes)...1st Ranger with 6.0+ $\stackrel{\cdot}{\mathrm{SHO}}$ IP, allowing one or zero hits, since Cole Hamels on 5/11/18 at HOU (6.0 IP, 1 H, 0 R)...he exited Wed. in position for his 100th career win before the D-backs tied the game in the 7th...only baserunners allowed came in a 30-pitch 3rd inning, when he issued both walks and gave up a single to Jon Jay, but stranded the bases loaded...opposing starter was Madison Bumgarner, a rematch of Game 1 of the 2012 NLCS, when Lynn's St. Louis Cardinals defeated Bumgarner's San Francisco Giants, 6-4...Lynn did not factor into the decision (3.2 IP, 5 H, 4 R-ER, 2 BB, 3 SO), while Bumgarner took the loss (L, 3.2 IP, 8 H, 6 R-ER, 1 BB, 2 SO, 2 HR)

VS. OAKLAND: Made 1st 4 career starts vs. OAK in 2019: 2-1, 5.66 (13 ER/20.2 IP)...3 of those starts came at the Coliseum: 2-1, 6.75 (11 ER/14.2 IP)...took loss in 1st start at the Coliseum on 4/23/19 (3.1 IP, 9 H, 8 R-ER), then went 2-0, 2.60 (5 ER/17.1 IP) over last 3 starts vs. A's last year...has won each of last 2 starts at the Coliseum, last on 9/22/19 (5.1 IP, 2 R-ER).

ON THE ROAD: Will be making his 1st road start of the season tonight...went 6-10, 3.84 (45 ER/105.1 IP) in 17 road starts in 2019, allowing 3-runs-or-less in 13 of those 17 outings...had a slightly higher road WHIP (1.253 vs. 1.184) and gave up twice as many HR (14 vs. 7) in away games vs. in Arlington, but had better SO/9 (11.8 vs. 9.4)...had a 4.96 RS avg. on the road, 6.64 RSA at home.

GRAND OPENING: Celebrated the opening of Globe Life Field by spinning one of the most dominant performances by an Opening Day starter in club history last Fri. vs. COL (W, 6.0 IP, 2 H, 0 R, 4 BB, 9 SO, 108 pitches/64 strikes)...the 9 SO matched a Ranger record for a season opener, as he became just the 4th TEX pitcher to reach that mark on O.D...the others: Nolan Ryan on 4/8/91 vs. MIL, Colby Lewis on 4/6/12 vs. CWS, and Matt Harrison on 3/31/13 at HOU... was just the 3rd instance of a TEX starter tossing at least 6.0 scoreless inn. on Opening Day, joining Charlie Hough on 4/4/89 vs. DET (CG SHO) and Jon Matlack on 4/10/80 vs. NYY (9.0 SHO IP, TEX won 1-0 in 12 inn.).

SPRING TRAINING / SUMMER CAMP: Posted a 8.10 ERA (6 ER/6.2 IP) over 2 starts in 'A' games this spring...had .344 opponent batting average and 1.80 WHIP...last spring start was in Texas' 7-4 win over the Rockies in Surprise on 3/4 (ND, 4.0 IP, 7 H, 4 R-ER, 0 BB, 4 SO, 1 HR)...made 3 starts in intrasquad games during Summer Camp, pairing a 6.32 ERA (11 ER/15.2 IP) with 19 SO/2 BB...finished 3rd on the team in innings (22.2-Kluber, 19.1-Minor, 15.2-Lynn) and strikeouts (33-Minor, 28-Kluber, 19-Lynn)...threw 4.0-inn./65-pitch sim game on 7/2, the day prior to 1st official camp workout.

2019: In his 1st season with the Rangers, finished among A.L. leaders in innings (T4th, career-high 208.1), starts (T5th, 33), ERA (7th, 3.67), opp. BA (7th, .243), and WHIP (7th, 1.22)...turned in the 5th-most quality starts (20) in the A.L., including 8 straight from 5/10-6/19, one shy of the Texas club record done 6 times (single-season or multiple seasons)...had 16 games with 7.0+ IP, 3rd-most in MLB (19-Jacob deGrom, 17-Justin Verlander) and tied with Cole Hamels (2016) and Yu Darvish (2013) for the most such starts by a Texas pitcher in the last 8 campaigns...club was 17-16 in his 33 starts...opponents slashed .243/.300/.290/.689, including .219/.264/.393/.658 by RHB and .267/.332/.386/.718 by LHB...opposition batted .230 (43-187) w/ RISP...led MLB with career-high 18 wild pitches... threw 1st-pitch strikes 62.6% of PA's, 2nd-best figure of his career (63.2% in 2013).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Despite missing all of 2016, ranks 12th in wins (97) and 18th in strikeouts (1286) among all ML pitchers since start of 2012...has a 3.60 ERA in that span, 24th-lowest in MLB among hurlers with at least 800.0 IP... most seasons of 10+ wins beginning 2012: 8—Zack Greinke, Max Scherzer; 7 Gio Gonzalez, J.A. Happ, Clayton Kershaw, Jon Lester, Lance Lynn, Rick Porcello, Chris Sale, Stephen Strasburg, Justin Verlander,
