WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers lost last night, 6-4, as the team has a 1-4 record entering the finale of this 6-game, 7 -day road trip to SF (1-2) and OAK ( $0-2$ )... Texas has dropped 2 straight, 4 of 5 , and 7 of the past 9 G since winning on Opening Day, $7 / 24$ vs. COL...team is now season-low 4 G under .500 for the 1 st time...team has opened at $3-7$, fewest wins after season's 1st 10 G since 2006 (3-7)... Texas won next game in 2006, and Rangers have not began a season at $3-8$ since 2002, needing a win today to avoid that distinction...club has not been at the . 500 mark since a 1-1 record after loss on $7 / 25$ vs. COL...team is T4th place in the A.L West, season-high 4.0 games behind 1st place Oakland.

GOOD THINGS IN THREES?: Entering today, Texas has won back-to-back series finales to avoid sweeps, putting up the team's best offensive performances in those 2 games.. Rangers are 2-1 in series finales, with offense batting . 235 with $6.0 \mathrm{R} / \mathrm{G}$ and 5 HR in those 3 contests...in the Rangers' other 7 contests, team has batted .176 with 2.0 R/G and 4 HR .

SERIES STUFF: After securing a series loss here in Oakland, Texas is $0-3-1$ in its 1 st 4 series of the season, 1st time to go without a series win this late into a campaign since 2018 (opened 0-3-1)...last series win came in final series of 2019, taking 2 of 3 from NYY in the last games at Globe Life Park from 9/27-29...TEX was 5-15-6 in road series in ' 19.

- Rangers have not been swept in 2020...in 2019, team los all games of a series on 8 occasions, last on $9 / 17-18$ at HOU ( $0-2$ ) and last instance of $3+$ games coming $9 / 13-15$ vs. OAK (0-3)

VS. OAKLAND: Rangers are $0-2$ vs. OAK in ' 20 ...this $3-\mathrm{G}$ series marks the 1 st of 3 series against the A's in ' 20 , the oth ers taking place in Arlington from 8/24-27 (4 G) and 9/11-13 (3 G)...Rangers are 1-9 in last 10 G vs. A's dating to 2019... team went 6 -13 overall vs. OAK in 2019, including 3-7 at the Coliseum...after last night's loss, Rangers are 7-24 at the Coliseum since the start of 2017, now at 0-8-2 in the 10 series here in that span...last series win at this facility was from 9/23-25/16 (2-1)...OAK leads the all-time series, 380-373, with a 202-176 advantage here at the Coliseum.

- This is the Rangers' 1st series against an A.L. team in 2020, 1st of 3 straight series vs. A.L. West foes...the Rangers played COL/ARI/SF in its 1 st 3 series, becoming the 1 st team in MLB history with 3 different opponents in their 1 st 3 series and each opponent being from the oppostie league (credit Elias Sports Bureau).

ON THE ROAD: Texas has opened with a 1-4 road record in 2020...team began 2019 with records of 1-4 and then 2-9 in away games...this marks 3rd straight year to go winless in 1st road series ( $0-2-1$ in that span)...Rangers finished $33-48$ (.407) on the road in 2019 for a 2nd straight season, T9th in A.L. and T21st in MLB...beg. June 29, team was 15-27 (.357) in final 42 away games in '19, 3rd-lowest win pct. in A.L.

HEADED HOME: The Rangers are scheduled to fly back to the DFW Metroplex after today's game and begin a 6-day, 6 -game homestand with a series opener against the Angels on Friday night...marks 1st meeting of 2020 with the Halos, who were scheduled to be the opponent for the first-ever regular season game at Globe Life Field in the original schedule (home opener would have been $3 / 31$ )...Texas went 10-9 against the Angels in 2019, winning the season series for the 3rd time in the last 4 seasons...Angels visit Arlington twice in the 60-G season (also 3 G, 9/8-10) and Rangers visit Anaheim once: $4 \mathrm{G}, 9 / 18-21$.

ELVIS IN (NO) DOUBLE TROUBLE: Elvis Andrus doubled in the 3rd inning last night for his 300th career two-base hit....he is just the 5th player in franchise history to accumulate 300+ career doubles, joining Michael Young (415), Iván Rodríguez (352), Rafael Palmeiro (321) and Juan Gonzalez (320).

ROSTER MOVES: Following last night's game, the Rangers optioned both C Jose Trevino and RHP Luke Farrell to the Alternate Training Site ahead of this morning's deadline for dropping the active roster from 30 to 28 players.

YOU KNOW HOW TO TAKE THE RESERVATION...: Th Rangers took the lead twice in last night's loss, the 5th time in 7 defeats for the club to have the lead at some point...Texas has had the lead in each of the 4 losses on this road trip.

CHOO AGAIN: Shin-Soo Choo hit the first pitch of last night's game for a home run, his 2nd leadoff HR of both the season and this road trip (also Fri. at SF)...he joins MIN's Max Kepler and NYY's DJ LeMahieu as the only ML batters with multiple leadoff HR this season (all w/ 2)...other notes on Choo

- He now has 25 leadoff HR with Texas, 2nd-most in club history to Ian Kinsler (29)...he has now hit the last 13 leadoff HR by any Ranger.
- Each of his last 3 leadoff HR have come on a game's first pitch (last 9/22/19 at OAK), and he now has 9 first-pitch leadoff HR in his career
- With 36 career leadoff HR after last night's blast, he is now tied for the MLB lead in that category since the start of 2012 (also George Springer and Charlie Blackmon)
- Choo's 4 career leadoff HR at the Oakland Coliseum are the most by an opposing batter in this historic venue's history...just 4 other batters (all OAK players at some point) have had 4 -or-more at this park: Rickey Henderson (25), Coco Crisp (10), Bert Campaneris (4) and Matt Joyce (4).

BACK-TO-BACK?: Choo hit last night's first pitch for a home run after Tuesday night's game had ended on a home run (grand slam)...according to STATS LLC, it marked just the 3rd time since pitches were first tracked in 1988 that back-to-back pitches in a single series have been a walkoff and leadoff HR...the others: BAL at LAA (Sept. 5-6, 2006) and ATL at MIN (Aug. 5-6, 2019).

START ME UP: Last night's effort by Kyle Gibson was the 4th quality start for the Texas rotation in 2020, the 1st by a starter other than Lance Lynn...the Rangers' 4 QS are T2nd-most (also CWS/SEA) in the A.L. to CLE w/ 11 (yes, 11)...rotation still has just a single win (Lynn on Opening Day) despite ranking among A.L. leaders in opp. BA (1st, .183), SLG (1st 291), OPS (1st, .575), and ERA (3rd, 2.94)...starters have an A.L.-low 3.31 run support average (RS/9).

TOUGH GO: The Rangers have seen blown saves in 2 of the last 3 games, and took a walkoff defeat in the other contest in that span...relievers have allowed $3+$ runs in 6 consecutive contests, and now have an A.L.-high 6.75 relief ERA.

HI-LO: Batters went 1 -for-final-18 last night after plating 3 runs in the 4th inning...Choo's HR to open the game marked the 4th time in the 1st 5 contests on this road trip for the Rangers to score in the 1st or 2nd inning.

WHEN I LOOK AT THE TELEVISION: Today's game, which will be on FSSW+, will be offered by MLB.TV as a "Free Game of the Day"...the game will also air in limited markets on MLB Network.

SHORTS: Mike Minor had the A.L.'s 8th-lowest day ERA in 2019 at 3.20 ... his lone career day start against the A's came here at the Coliseum on $8 / 22 / 18$, earning win with 6.0 SHO IP in a 4-2 Texas victory...Joey Gallo in 4 day games in 2020: 438/.526/1.063 (7-16) with 3 HR and 7 RBI....Nick Solak in 4 day games this season: 357 (5-14)...last night's 13 K's by the pitching staff matched a season high...Rangers' team batting average has not been above .200 at the end of any game in ' $20 \ldots$...pitching staff has allowed 8 HR in the past 3 G , this after permitting just 3 HR over the 1st 7 contests...this is the Rangers' 3rd-ever Northern California road trip involving back-to-back series against the Giants and A's.

TODAY: The 32-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 3rd start of the season today in the final contest of this 6-game road trip through the Bay Area... needs 5 strikeouts to reach 1000 for his career...would join 16 other active LHP with $1000+$ career SO...will pitch on 5 days' rest due to Monday's off day...was dealt a loss after he allowed 6 R-ER over 5.2 IP in the Rangers' road opener on Friday at SF, a 9-2 defeat for Texas....has gone 2-4, 5.65 (23 ER/36.2 IP) over 9 G/6 GS in his career against Oakland, including 0-3, 9.56 (17 ER/16.0 IP) vs. the A's last season....a first-time All-Star in 2019, Minor posted the best year of his career en route to earning Rangers Pitcher of the Year honors from the Dal-las-Fort Worth chapter of the BBWAA...recorded career highs in wins (14), innings (208.1), and strikeouts (200) last season in his 2nd year with the Rangers... over 2 seasons with Texas in 2018-19, his totals rank among American League leaders in innings ( 7 th, 365.1), WHIP (11th, 1.188), and wins (T11th) ...after signing with Texas prior to 2018, returned to a starting role for the first time since 2014 following one season in the Kansas City bullpen in 2017...is in the 3rd year of a three-year contract that he signed with the Rangers on 12/6/17...did not make a ML appearance in 2015-16 following surgery for a torn labrum in his left shoulder on $5 / 13 / 15 \ldots$ was $38-36,4.10$ in 111 games/110 starts for ATL from 2010-14 ... from the 2012 All-Star break through 2014 season, ranked 11 th in N.L. with a 3.52 ERA (min. 70 starts)...was selected by Atlanta as the 7 th overall selection in the 2009 June draft out of Vanderbilt U...Rangers are 0-2 in his 2 starts.

IT STARTS AT THE TOP: Minor and Lance Lynn - this year's Opening Day starter - formed one of the best starter duos in Rangers history in 2019, combining for 30 wins, 65 starts, 416.2 innings, and 446 strikeouts...the pair became the 2nd duo in Rangers history to surpass 200 innings and 200 strikeouts in the same season, joining Nolan Ryan/Bobby Witt in 1990...the only other teammates to each clear 200 innings in 2019 were Houston's Gerrit Cole/Justin Verlander and Washington's Stephen Strasburg/Patrick Corbin...additional notes on the Minor/ Lynn tandem can be found on page 139 of the Texas Rangers Media Guide.

LAST START: Took his 2nd loss in as many starts on Friday at SF $5.2,9 \mathrm{H}, 6$ R-ER, 2 BB, 3 SO, 1 HR, 98 pitches/ 64 strikes)...carried a 2-1 lead into the 5 th inning before allowing 2 -out, 3 -run HR to Wilmer Flores....was knocked out of the game with 2 outs in the 6th after a pair of run-scoring hits by Chadwick Tromp and Mauricio Dubon extended the Giants' lead to $6-2 \ldots$. .SF batters were 4 -for-15 through the 4th inn., and 5 -for-10 w/ 2B, HR, and 2 BB during the 5th and 6th frames.

VS. OAKLAND: Went 0-3, 9.56 (17 ER/16.0 IP) in $3 \mathrm{G} / \mathrm{GS}$ against Oakland last year to ballon his career ERA against the club to 5.65 ( 23 ER/36.2 IP)...prior to 2019, had posted a 2-1 record and 2.61 ERA ( 6 ER/20.2 IP) across 6 G/2 GS vs. the Athletics from 2014-18.... has suffered losses in 3 straight starts against the A's dating back to last season, including his most recent outing at The Coliseum on 9/20/19 (L, 5.0 IP, 7 H, 6 R-ER, 4 BB, 3 SO, 2 HR)....Rangers were blanked, $8-0$, and mustered just 2 hits....Minor's 4 walks matched his season high ( 3 x )... surrendered HRs to Chad Pinder (3-R) and Mark Canha (1-R).

ON THE ROAD: Has permitted 6 R-ER in last 2 road starts dating back to 9/20/19 at OAK (5.0 IP, 6 R-ER), but is still 8-7, 3.30 ( $44 \mathrm{ER} / 120.0 \mathrm{IP}$ ) on the road since the start of last season...opponents have batted .231/.260/.404/.694 in 18 away G/GS over that same span against .261/.329/.386/.715 in $16 \mathrm{G} / \mathrm{GS}$ at home.... has $5.0+\mathrm{IP}$ in 23 straight road starts since 7/15/18 at BAL ( 2.2 IP ).

SPIN ZONE: According to data provided by Baseball Savant, each of Minor's 3 primary offerings rank among the top 10 in MLB (min. 100 pitches thrown) for highest average spin rate this season...owns the 4th-highest avg. spin rate among 4-seam fastballs ( 2613 RPMs ), 6th-highest among changeups ( 2288 RPMs), and 8th-highest among sliders ( 2793 RPMs)...since the start of 2018 (his 1st season w/ TEX), has posted the highest avg. spin rate on 4 -seam fastballs (2602 RPMs) among big league hurlers to throw at least 15004 -seamers in that span.

SPRING TRAINING/SUMMER CAMP: Worked 7.2 scoreless innings over 2 G/ GS in 'A' games during spring training, holding opp. 2-for-24 (.083)...started the club's penultimate Cactus League game on $3 / 10$ at CWS before camp was halted...posted a 1.86 ERA (4ER/19.1 IP) over 4 intrasquad starts during Summer Camp, with final outing coming on $7 / 19 \ldots$...averaged 15.4 SO per 9 IP, incl. fanning 10 of 15 BF in camp debut on $7 / 4 \ldots$ allowed lone HR to Yadiel Rivera on $7 / 9$.

STRIKEOUTS: Ranked 10th in A.L. in both SO (200) and SO/9 (8.64) in 2019. reached 200 K 's for the 1st time, producing a career-high 4 double-digit strikeout games, this after entering 2019 with 4 such games in his entire career... career-high 13 K's on 4/27 at SEA, tying the Texas club record for K's by a LHP in a game accomplished twice previously: Jamie Moyer on $4 / 8 / 89$ vs. TOR and Cliff Lee on $7 / 27 / 10$ vs. OAK....marked highest SO total by a Ranger in 2019, most for Texas since Yu Darvish fanned 15 on 8/12/13 at HOU.
