THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY AUG. 7
1998 - LHP Randy Johnson makes his Astros home debut by blanking the Phillies, $9-0$, in a five-hit complete game with eight punchouts....a crowd of 52,071 is on hand for Johnson's debut, which ranks as the sev-enth-largest regular season home crowd in franchise history.

## TODAY'S MEDIA SCHEDULE

 Astros pregame availabilities will be from 5 -6 p.m. CT...the Astros will stretch at The Coliseum around 6 p.m. and hit $B P$ from 6:15-7:15 p.m.TONIGHT'S GAME: The Astros and Athletics will renew their rivalry tonight for the first of three games over the weekend between the top two teams in the AL West....RHP Zack Greinke, who went 2-0 against the A's as an Astro last season, will get the start tonight opposite RHP Chris Bassitt, who went 1-1 in three starts against the Astros in 2019.

FREE COVID TESTING AT MMP: Texas Governor Greg Abbott announced that the Astros and the Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM) have teamed up to open a free COVID-19 testing site at Minute Maid in Houston...the test, which is self administered, will be available beginning tomorrow and will be distributed from Minute Maid Park's Lot C...testing will run from 8 a.m. through 4 p.m. seven days per week....below are the full details:

- Testing will be free to all patients as all fees are covered by the state.
The site will feature eight drive-thru testing lanes and four walk-up testing lanes.
The testing site will have capacity to handle up to 2,000 tests per day.
With contact-free testing, all patients will administer their own painless, oral test swab and collection.
- Spanish-speaking staff will be available at the site.
- Patients will be notified of test results within 72-96 hours or sooner.
No healthcare provider is required for test administration.
Appointments can be booked online at Texas.curativeinc.com, but walkups will also be accommodated.

IN THE DUGOUT: Last week, the Astros exercised the 2021 contract options for Manager Dusty Baker, third base coach Gary Pettis and pitching coach Brent Strom...Baker, who managed career game number 3,500 on Opening Day, was named the 19th manager in franchise history on Jan. 29 in what is his fifth managerial position in his storied career...he currently ranks 15th all time in managerial wins with 1,869, immediately trailing Hall of Famer Bill McKechnie $(1,896)$ on that all-time list.

IN THE BOX: The 2020 season is the first under Astros General Manager James Click, who was named the 13th GM in club history on Feb. 3...Click joined the Astros from Tampa Bay, where he served as the Rays VP of Baseball Operations.

ABOUT LAST NIGHT: The Astros lost a tight ballgame last night, dropping a 5-4 decision at Arizona on a walkoff double by RF Cole Calhoun...the Astros entered the 9th with a one-run lead after a two-run, go-ahead homer by 3B Alex Bregman in the 8th... RHP Brandon Bielak put the Astros in position to win in what was his first Major League start, tossing 5.0 scoreless innings, allowing just two hits...2B Jose Altuve picked up his first three-hit game of the season, going $3 \times 4$ with a double, a home run and a stolen base.

SPRINGER UPDATE: OF George Springer exited last night's game after three at-bats with a right wrist strain, injured on a diving catch in center field... Springer is considered day-to-day.

RECENT ROSTER MOVES: Yesterday, the Astros officially signed RHP Chase De Jong to a minor league contract...De Jong has joined the club in Oakland as a member of the Taxi Squad...to make room for De Jong in the Astros Player Pool, RHP Austin Pruitt was transferred to the 45-day IL....additionally, OF Chas McCormick has been added to the club's Taxi Squad, joining De Jong, RHP Bryan Abreu, IF Jack Mayfield and $C$ Michael Papierski in the five-man group.

I FIND THAT OFFENSIVE: The Astros lead the Majors in runs per game (5.92), while leading the AL in runs (71) and OBP (.346), and ranking second in OPS (.780) and SLG (.434)...LF Michael Brantley and SS Carlos Correa have led the way, with Brantley ranking second in the AL in average (.389) and OBP (.463) and Correa leading the AL in OBP (.471) and ranking third in average (.386).

UP THE CHARTS: OF George Springer hit his 163rd career homer on Wednesday, which ties him with OF Cesar Cedeño for sixth on the Astros all time list: HOME RUNS IN ASTROS HISTORY

ON BASE BREGS: 3B Alex Bregman has reached base safely in 44 consecutive road games and is 12 games from tying his own franchise record for this, a 56 -game streak set in the 2018 season.

PLUG AND PLAY: Despite injuries and limited MLB experience on the Astros pitching staff, the club has combined for a 4.39 ERA (55ER/112.2IP), with the bullpen posting a 3.47 ERA (22ER/57IP), good for sixth in the AL...the Astros 15 -man pitching staff currently includes 10 rookie pitchers, with Astros rookies combining for a remarkable 2.29 ERA (16ER/62.2IP).

TAYLOR TERRIFIC: LHP Blake Taylor has began his career with six scoreless appearances, tossing 8.2 innings and allowing just five hits with 10 strikeouts.. acquired in the OF Jake Marisnick trade with the Mets this offseason, Taylor made the club out of camp despite spending most of his time in 2019 at Class A.. in his short Astros career, Taylor remains scoreless even when counting the seven appearances he made in Spring Training and Summer Camp (0ER/8IP).

- was perfect through the first 5.0 innings of the game, before giving up 3 hits and 2 runs in the 6 th inning.
GREINKE DAY: the 6 -time All-Star and 36 -year-old right-hander is set to make the 450th start of his Major League career...ranks 2nd among active MLB pitchers in starts behind Justin Verlander (454).
- is coming off a 2019 season that saw him win his 2nd Silver Slugger award, and 6th Rawlings Gold Glove Award.
- is set for his first full-season with the Astros...was acquired by the Astros along with cash considerations on July 31, minutes before the trade deadline...in exchange for Greinke, the Astros sent 4 prospects to Arizona: IF Seth Beer, RHP J.B. Bukauskas, RHP Corbin Martin and IF Joshua Rojas.
vs. OAK: went $2-0$ in his 2 starts against the A's in 2019 after joining the Astros...gave up 1 run in 13.0 innings pitched for a 0.69 ERA.
- last pitched at Oakland Coliseum on Aug. 18, 2019, when he recorded his 200th career victory (1ER/7IP)...became the 115th pitcher in MLB history to reach 200 career wins.
WITH THE 'STROS: has made 12 regular season starts for Houston since joining the club in July of 2019, going 8-1 with a 3.27 (26ER/71.2IP) and 58 strikeouts...the Astros have gone $8-4$ in his 12 starts.
- made 5 postseason starts for the Astros during their 2019 pennant run, going $0-2$ with a 4.68 ERA (13ER/25IP) and 25 strikeouts.
- started Game 3 of the ALDS at TB ( 6 ER/3.2IP), Game 1 of the ALCS vs. NYY (3ER/6IP), Game 4 of the ALCS at NYY (1ER/4.1IP), Game 3 of the World Series at WSH (1ER/4.2IP) and Game 7 of the World Series vs. WSH (2ER/6.1IP).

- is 1 of 3 pitchers in MLB history who have won a Cy Young, Gold Glove and Silver Slugger....also Fernando Valenzuela and Orel Hershiser.
- is 1 of 12 pitchers in MLB history to record at least 1,000 strikeouts in both the American League and National League...also Nolan Ran, Randy Johnson, Gaylord Perry, Fergie Jenkins, Pedro Martinez, Jim Bunning, Cy Young, David Cone, A.J. Burnett, Dennis Martinez and Max Scherzer.
