**LEADING OFF:** Today, the Angels play the second game (1-0) of an eight game homestand against the Oakland Athletics (1-0; Aug. 10-12), Los Angeles Dodgers (Aug. 14-16) and San Francisco Giants (Aug. 17-18)...LAA went 2-4 on last road trip to Seattle (2-1) and Texas (0-3)...The Seattle series marked first series win of the year...Angels went 2-4 on last homestand vs. Mariners (1-2) and Astros (1-2).

**MORE HISTORY FOR TROUT:** Last night, **Mike Trout** recorded his 20th career multi-HR game, which tied Angels Hall of Famers **Tim Salmon** and **Vladimir Guerrero** for the most such games in Angels history.

**ON FIERs:** Several Angels have had career success against tonight's A's starter **Mike Fiers**: **David Fletcher** owns a .636 (7/11) average...**Mike Trout** is hitting .387 (12/31) with five HR and 13 RBI; the 5 homers are the most Fiers has allowed to any opposing hitter...**Shohei Ohtani** has a .545 (6/11) average with two doubles.

**DAD STRENGTH:** Since returning to the Angels lineup following the birth of his son, **Mike Trout** is batting .375 (15/40) with 11 runs scored, one double, six home runs and 10 RBI in nine games.

**VS. ATHLETICS:** Oakland leads the 2020 season series 3-2 after winning three of four in the opening series of the year at the Oakland Coliseum...Halos went 6-13 vs. A's in 2019, dropping the season series for the first time since 2013...Since 2014, Angels hold a 63-56 advantage in the head-to-head series.

**SLOW START:** Angels are just 6-11 through the first 17 games of the season...If Angels do not win today, the six wins would match club record for fewest victories after 18 games (1961, 1976, 2002 & 2012).

**STRAIGHT A's:** **Mike Trout** owns a career .304 (164/540) average against Oakland with 37 home runs and 90 RBI (145 G)...His 37 HR vs. A's lead all active players...Since 2000, only **Adrian Beltre** (41) and **Mark Teixeira** (38) have more homers vs. Oakland than Trout...**David Fletcher** is a lifetime .326 (31/95) hitter against the A's...In his 25 career games vs. Oakland as a hitter, **Shohei Ohtani** owns a .299 average (29/97) with seven home runs and 21 RBI.

**RECENT ROSTER MOVES:** Yesterday, the Angels designated RHP **José Rodríguez** for assignment and reinstated LHP **José Suarez** from the injured list and optioned him to the Alternate Training Site...Saturday, the Angels recalled LHP **Patrick Sandoval** to make the start on the mound and optioned RHP **Luke Bard** to the Alternate Training Site.

**DYLAN'S DAY:** Tonight marks **Dylan Bundy's** first start since Thursday afternoon at Seattle when he tossed his third career complete game (W; 9 IP, 4 H, 1 ER, 0 BB, 10 SO), and his first since May 24, 2018 at Chicago White Sox...Marked the first complete game for an Angels pitcher since **Andrew Heaney** on June 5, 2018 vs. Kansas City and first on the road since **Jered Weaver** on June 19, 2016 at Oakland...Per ELIAS, it was his third CG victory with 10+ strikeouts and no more than five baserunners (via hit, walk or HBP) since 2017...The only other major-league pitcher with three such games since 2017 is **Corey Kluber** (also three).

**LOOKING FOR A SERIES WIN:** After taking the opening game of the series last night, the Angels are seeking their first series win at Angel Stadium since taking three of four against the White Sox from Aug. 15-18, 2019...Last three-game series win at The Big A was a three-game sweep of the Mariners, July 12-14, 2019.

**LEAGUE LEADING OFFENSE:** Angels lead the American League with 28 home runs in 2020 and their 82 runs scored are tied with Houston for the A.L. lead...76 walks are tied for league lead with Cleveland and Oakland.

**MACHINE PRODUCTION:** **Albert Pujols** ranks in the Top 10 all-time in several offensive categories, including: doubles (7th; 662), home runs (6th; 659), RBI (3rd (ELIAS); 2083), extra-base hits (5th; 1337) and total bases (5th; 5881).

**FISH FEED:** **Mike Trout** ranks in the top five in Angels history in several offensive categories and is just nine home runs away from becoming the franchise's all-time home run leader.

**DYNAMIC DUO:** Last Tuesday night in Seattle was the 47th time that **Mike Trout** and **Albert Pujols** have homered in the same game for the Angels...That is the most by any pair of teammates in Angels history and the most among all active sets of teammates (Colorado's **Nolan Arenado** and **Trevor Story** are second with 33 games). (ELIAS)

**RACK UP(TON) THE NUMBERS:** Last Wednesday night, **Justin Upton** hit the 300th home run of his career and became the ninth active player with 300+ career homers: (**A. Pujols**, **M. Cabrera**, **E. Encarnacion**, **N. Cruz**, **R. Braun**, **R. Cano**, **J. Bruce** & **G. Stanton**)...Upton could also reach some additional milestones in 2020: He needs eight more runs to reach 1,000 and three more stolen bases to reach 150.

**425 AND COUNTING:** Last Tuesday night, **Justin Dunn** became the 425th different pitcher that **Albert Pujols** has homered against in his career, which is second-most all-time...Trails only **Barry Bonds** who homered off of 449 different pitchers (*ESPN Stats & Info*).

**SHORTENED SEASON:** 2020 represents the fifth officially shortened season in Angels history and the 10th season playing fewer than 162 games...The four previous officially shortened seasons were due to player strikes:

1972	– 155 games
1981	– 110 games
1994	– 115 games
1995	– 145 games

*The Angels had an additional five seasons where postponed games were not made up: Halos played 161 games four times (1963, 1967, 1975, 1996) and 160 games in 1980.*

## THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

### August 11

(1996) George Arias, Randy Velarde and Chili Davis all homered in the sixth inning, tying a club mark, in the Angels' 6-5 win over Kansas City; (1975) Angels swipe six bases in the 8-1 win vs. NYY – matching the club record for a nine inning game; (1997) Angels snap Red Sox' 11-game winning streak with a 7-3 victory. (2018) Francisco Arcia became the first Angels position player to pitch in over 25 years and tossed one scoreless inning.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER - RHP DYLAN BUNDY

2-1, 2.08 ERA

Tossed third career complete game in last start on Thursday at Seattle

- TODAY'S GAME:** Making fourth start of the season and second at home...Second start of 2020 vs. Mariners...Is in sixth Major League season and first with Angels.
- EARLY QUALITY:** Has registered a quality start in each of his first three starts for the Angels, becoming the first pitcher to do so in his first three games in an Angels uniform was Andrew Heaney (first six starts) in 2015...First right-hander to do so in his first three games with LAA since Joel Pineiro in 2010...Last righty to reach a four game streak was Jered Weaver (9) in 2006.
- LAST TIME OUT:** Earned the win in last start on Thursday at Seattle after tossing his third career complete game, allowing one earned run on four hits with no walks and 10 strikeouts...Marked the first complete game for an Angels pitcher since Andrew Heaney on June 5, 2018 vs. Kansas City.
- MORE ON THE CG:** Per ELIAS, Thursday marked his third CG victory with 10+ strikeouts and no more than five baserunners (via hit, walk or HBP) since 2017...The only other major-league pitcher with three such games since 2017 is **Corey Kluber** (also three).
- MAKING A GOOD FIRST IMPRESSION:** Earned the win in Angels debut on July 25 at Oakland after tossing 6.2 innings and allowing one earned run on three hits with no walks and seven strikeouts...Exited game with 4-0 lead in 7th inning, but a bequeathed runner would score in the inning...Became the third pitcher to toss 6+ innings and allow four-or-fewer baserunners in his Angels debut, joining Don Lee (June 8, 1962) and Shohei Ohtani (April 1, 2018)...All three accomplished the feat against the Athletics.
- DOWN IN THE THREE HOLE:** Has held opponents batting third in the order to a .205 (60/292) average for his career...Opposing hitters in the third batting order position are 0-for-10 this season.
- KEEP IT IN THE YARD:** In his career, Bundy is 22-9 with a 1.89 ERA (262 IP - 55 ER) in games where he does not allow a home run (58 games, 37 starts), compared with a 18-37 record and 6.47 ERA (374 IP - 269 ER) when yielding at least one homer.
- VS. OAKLAND:** In six career games (five starts) against the A's, is 3-1 with a 4.26 ERA (31.2 IP - 15 ER) and 43 strikeouts...Earned the win in Angels debut vs. A's on July 25 at the Coliseum (6.2 IP, 3 H, 1 ER, 0 BB, 7 SO).
- AT ANGEL STADIUM:** Tonight marks second start at The Big A as a member of the Angels...Is 1-2 with a 6.85 ERA (23.2 IP - 18 ER) in five career games (four starts) at the ballpark...Owns a 0-1 record and 4.50 ERA (6 IP - 3 ER) this season after his first home start on July 30...In four games (three starts) at Angel Stadium, while pitching for Baltimore, went 1-1 with a 7.64 ERA (17.2 IP - 15 ER) and 17 strikeouts.
- CACTUS LEAGUE LEADER:** Made four starts during Cactus League play, going 3-1 with a 1.59 ERA (11.1 IP - 2 ER)...At the time of the shutdown, led Cactus League with 16 strikeouts, tied for the league lead in wins (3) and led all qualified pitchers in ERA.
- A NEW ANGEL:** Acquired by Angels from Baltimore on Dec. 4, 2019 in exchange for RHP Kyle Bradish, RHP Isaac Mattson, RHP Kyle Brnovich and RHP Zach Peek.
- 2019 IN REVIEW:** In 2019, led Orioles pitchers in starts (30), strikeouts (162), and innings pitched (161.2)...Posted a 9.02 strikeouts per nine innings rate, marking his second-straight year with more strikeouts than innings pitched...Recorded at least 150 strikeouts for a third consecutive season, becoming first Orioles pitcher to strike out 150+ batters in three straight campaigns since Daniel Cabrera (2005-2007).
- GETTING SETTLED:** Last season, pitched to a 6.30 ERA (30 IP - 21 ER) in the first inning, compared with a 4.44 ERA (131.2 IP - 65 ER) after the first frame.
- CAREER NOTES:** Made Major League debut for Baltimore Sept. 23, 2012 at 19 years, 313 days old...Native of Tulsa, OK...Originally selected by Orioles in first round (fourth overall) in 2011 First-Year Player Draft...Ranked as Orioles #1 prospect according to *Baseball America*, from 2012-16.
