TOO MANY LONGBALLS: SF pitchers have allowed 30 home runs this year, tied with the Mets for the second-most in the Majors...only the Diamondbacks have allowed more homers (43)...the Giants have allowed a home run in 16-consecutive games, the longest such streak in franchise history (Stats, LLC).

ALL ABOUT DONNIE: IF Donovan Solano, who has missed the last two games with abdominal soreness, enters today's game with a career-best 15 -game hitting streak. he's hitting 458 ( 27 -for-59) overall this season, the second-highest batting average among all Major League players behind Colorado's Charlie Blackmon (.472)

MORE ON SOLANO: Solano's .458 batting average ranks among a couple franchise legends when looking at highest averages through a team's first 20 games of a season in the San Francisco era (since 1958) ...Solano's 358 batting average since the start of the 2019 season is the highest in the Majors when using a minimum of 250 plate appearances (Stats, LLC).
BELT'S 1,000 GAMES AT FIRST: On Wednesday at Houston, 1B Brandon Belt played in his 1,000th career game at first base....he's the seventh player in Giants franchise history to appear in 1,000+ games at first base with the team, joining Willie McCovey (1,775), Bill Terry (1,579), J.T. Snow (1,137), Will Clark $(1,124)$, Fred Merkle $(1,040)$ and Roger Connor $(1,002)$ (thanks to Elias and Darin Stephens for this note)

ONE RUN GAMES: The Giants are 5-1 in one-run games this year, after going an MLB-best 38-16 (.704) in one-run contests last season...their 43-17 (.717) record in one-run games since last year is the best in MLB....according to Stats, LLC, the last MLB team to win at least 70\% of its one-run games over a twoseason span was the Pittsburgh Pirates in 1908-1909 (66-25, .725).

## ON THIS DATE: AUGUST 14, 2011

The Giants erupted for four HRs in support of Ryan Vogelsong's 10th win in a 5-2 victory over the Marlins. The first homer, hit by Cody Ross in the 3rd inning off Chris Volstad, was a two-run shot that broke a record string of 21 consecutive solo homers by Giants batters since July 6th.

## NEW BULLPEN DIMENSIONS

In an effort to increase player safety and enhance fan engagement, the Giants created new bullpens at Oracle Park, which are located on either side of The Garden, just below the left field and centerfield bleachers.

Is in his first season as the skipper of the Giants after being named the 39th manager in club history on November 12, 2019.

- Spent the 2018 and 2019 seasons as the skipper of the Philadelphia Phillies, going 161-163 (.497) in his two seasons.
The 2020 campaign marks his fourth season managing and his third at the Major League level...he managed Class A Greenville in the Boston Red Sox organization in 2007.
Prior to joining the Phillies, Kapler was the Director of Player Development for the Dodgers from November 2014 until being hired by Philadelphia in October 2017
- From 2015-2017, the three seasons Kapler was at the helm of the Dodgers Player Development, the Dodgers minor league affiliates went a combined 1,299-1,128 (.535)...the .535 winning pct. was fourth-best among MLB teams in that time
- Had a 12-year career as a player from 1998-2010, suiting up for Detroit (1998-99), Texas (2000-02), Colorado (2002), Boston (2003-06), Milwaukee (2008) and Tampa Bay (2009-10) ...a former 57th-round pick in 1995, Kapler hit . 268 over his 1,104 career games.

TODAY'S OUTING: 34 -year-old will be making his fifth start of 2020 and his first vs. Oakland since 2018...tonight's start marks his third career outing vs. the Athletics.
LAST TIME OUT: Carried a no-hitter into the 6th inning last time out before Kiké Hernández tripled to open the 6th on a ball that Hunter Pence lost in the lights...LA went on to score four times in the 6 th with three coming on a Justin Turner HR off Cueto... Cueto was removed following the Turner HR and it was revealed postgame that he was dealing with a blister on his right big toe.
INTERLEAGUE WIZARD: Cueto owns a 2.76 ERA in 34 career Interleague starts...according to Stats LLC, Cueto's 2.76 Interleague ERA is the fifth-lowest among active pitchers (min. 150ip) behind LAD's Clayton Kershaw (2.26), CIN's Trevor Bauer (2.42), WAS's Max Scherzer (2.65) \& NYY's Gerrit Cole (2.70).

MR. 300: Cueto's last start also marked his 300th career outing in the Majors, tying him with Francisco Liriano for eighth-most among players born in the Dominican Republic... his start tonight will give him sole possession of eighth-place on that list....Joaquin Andújar is 7th with 305 career starts...Cueto is one of 16 active pitchers overall to reach the 300 -start milestone and was the first to do so in a Giants uniform since Matt Cain in 2016 (Stats LLC).

THROW EM FOR A CURVE: According to Statcast, Cueto threw 30 curveballs in his outing vs. Los Angeles last time out.. in total, Cueto's curveball usage increased significantly in 2020 with the righty throwing the pitch a total of 95 times so far this season... that's more than he's thrown it in the previous five seasons combined ( 56 curveballs from 2015-2019) ...according to Statcast pitch data, it's been his second-most used pitch this season behind his four-seam fastball ( 111 total pitches) just ahead of his changeup ( 89 pitches)

DH RULE: National League games will include the use of the designated hitter for the first time in history.

EXTRA-INNINGS: An extra-innings rule will begin each extra inning with a runner on second base. The batter (or a substitute for the batter) who leads off an inning shall continue to be the batter who would lead off the inning in the absence of this extra-innings rule.

EXTRA-INNINGS PART TWO: The runner placed on second base at the start of each half-inning shall be the player (or a substitute for such player) in the batting order immediately preceding that half-inning's leadoff hitter. By way of example, if the number five hitter in the batting order is due to lead off the tenth inning, the number four player in the batting order (or a pinchrunner for such player) shall begin the inning on second base. However, if the player in the batting order immediately preceding that half-inning's leadoff hitter is the pitcher, the runner placed on second base at the start of that half-inning may be the player preceding the pitcher in the batting order. Any runner or batter removed from the game for a substitute shall be ineligible to return to the game, as is the case in all circumstances under the OBR.

FOR THE ERA: For purposes of calculating earned runs, the runner who begins an inning on second base pursuant to this rule shall be deemed to be a runner who has reached second base because of a fielding error, but no error shall be charged to the opposing team or to any player.

## PROCEDURES FOR HEALTH \& SAFETY

NO SPITTING: Spitting is prohibited (including but not limited to, saliva, sunflower seeds or peanut shells, or tobacco) at all times in Club facilities (including on the field). Chewing gum is permitted.

FOR PITCHERS: Pitchers may carry a small wet rag in their back pocket to be used for moisture in lieu of licking their fingers.

LARGER DUGOUT: Clubs must provide expanded dugout and bullpen space at their ballparks.

PHYSICAL DISTANCING: Players, umpires, and other onfield personnel should practice physical distancing to the extent possible within the limitations of competition and the fundamentals of baseball. Examples of ways in which physical distancing can be incorporated without disrupting the basics of the game include:
-When the ball is out of play, fielders are encouraged to retreat several steps away from the baserunner.

- If the batter is in the batter's box and the catcher needs to stand to relay signs to the infielders, the catcher can step onto the grass towards the mound to give the signs before assuming his position behind home plate.
- First and Third Base Coaches should remain in or behind the Coach's Box and shall not approach a baserunner, fielder or umpire on-field.
- Players on opposite teams should not socialize, fraternize, or come within six feet of each other before the game, during warmups, in between innings, or after the game.
- There will be no pregame exchange of lineup cards. Instead, each Club will input their lineup card into a mobile application provided by MLB.


## REVISED PROCEDURES FOR TRANSACTIONS

ROSTERS: MLB rosters were reduced from 30 players to 28 starting yesterday and will remain at that number for the rest of the regular season and postseason.

TAXI SQUAD: A Club is permitted to carry up to five additional Taxi Squad players from its Club Player Pool on all road trips with the Major League team. If the Club elects to carry five additional players, at least one must be a player whose designated position prior to the season is catcher. Players on the Taxi Squad are permitted to workout with the Major League Club but are not permitted to be in uniform and in the dugout during games. Upon the conclusion of each road trip, players on the Taxi Squad will return to the Alternate Training Site

THREE-BATTER MINIMUM: The new three-batter minimum rule will require the starting or any relief pitcher to pitch to a minimum of three batters, including the batter then at bat (or any substitute batter), until such batters are put out or reach base, or until the offensive team is put out, unless the substitute pitcher sustains injury or illness.

SUSPENDED GAMES: If weather forces a game to be cut short before it becomes official, it will be contineud where it left off at a later date rather than started from scratch.

UNSPORTSMANLIKE: Prohibitions against unsportsmanlike conduct will be strictly enforced to prevent unnecessary physical contact and support physical distancing between individuals on the playing field. In this respect, players and managers should maintain physical distancing from all umpires and opposing players on the playing field whenever possible. Players or managers who leave their positions to argue with umpires, come within six feet of an umpire or opposing player or manager for the purpose of argument, or engage in altercations on the field are subject to immediate ejection and discipline, including fines and suspensions.

EXPANDED POSTSEASON: MLB announced the 2020 Postseason will expand to 16 teams, beginning with eight best-of-three Wild Card Series preceding the Division Series... the higher seeded team will host all three games, which will cut down on travel...the first round will be best-of-3, followed by best-of- 5 and best-of- 7 rounds in the LCS \& World Series.

WEAR A MASK!: All non-playing personnel must wear face coverings at all times in the dugout and bullpen.

GOING THROUGH A LOT OF BASEBALLS: Any baseball that is put in play and touched by multiple players shall be removed and exchanged for a new baseball. After an out, players are strongly discouraged from throwing the ball around the infield.

NEW SAFEY PROTOCOLS: MLB and and the players association (MLBPA)agreed to new safety protocols designed to reduce the risk of additional outbreaks within the game:

- Players and staff must wear face coverings that cover the mouth and the nose at all times while at the ballpark other than while on the field of play itself. This new mandate includes the dugout and bullpen.
- In order to minimize time spent together indoors, home teams must provide outdoor covered spaces for the visiting team. Home teams must also provide appropriate spaces that allow for social distancing during rain delays.
- Traveling parties must be reduced to absolutely essential personnel.
- Players and team personnel must wear face coverings at all times at team hotels other than in each person's individual hotel room.
- A member of a road team, whether player or staff, must inform the team compliance officer if he or she wishes to leave the team hotel for any reason.
- Home team players and staff members are now prohibited from going to bars, lounges, malls or other places in which larger groups gather.

TRADE DEADLINE: Aug. 31 will be the 2020 Trade Deadline and Sept. 15 will be the 2020 Postseason eligibility deadline.

THE IL: Standard Injured List placements will be for either 10 days or 45 days, with the latter replacing 60. A COVID-19 Related Injured List will allow for placements that will not require a confirmed positive test for COVID-19. A player may be placed on the COVID-19 Related IL based on a positive test for COVID-19, confirmed exposure to COVID-19, or if a player exhibits symptoms requiring self-isolation for further assessment.
