LEADING OFF: Today, the Angels play the fifth game (1-3) on a nine game road trip to San Francisco (0-2), Oakland (1-1; Aug. 21-23) and Houston (Aug. 24-27)...Angels went 3-5 on last homestand against the Athletics (2-1), Dodgers (0-3) and Giants (1-1)...Angels won back-to-back games for the first time this season during first two games of last homestand... LAA went 2-4 on last road trip to Seattle (2-1) and Texas (0-3); the Seattle series marked first series win of the year.

SO FLETCH: David Fletcher has hit safely in 25 of 28 games this season and in 20 of his last 21...Had career-best hit streak snapped at 16 games Tuesday afternoon at Angel Stadium...It stands as the longest streak in the A.L. this season.

RENDON RAKING: Anthony Rendon is batting .489 (23/47) during his current 12 game hit streak (tied for second longest streak of career)...Homered in five of the eight games on last homestand, including a career-best streak of four straight from Aug. 10-14...Recorded an extra-base hit in seven straight games during last homestand, which tied for the third longest streak in Angels history.

LEAGUE LEADERS: Mike Trout is tied for the American League lead with 10 home runs (Fernando Tatis Jr. leads MLB with 12 HR)...Anthony Rendon ranks third in the A.L. in OBP (.454) and is also tied for second in the American League with 20 walks this season...David Fletcher is tied for second in the A.L. in hits (37).

CATCHING A-ROD: With his RBI single in the 6th inning Wednesday night at San Francisco, Albert Pujols recorded his 2,086th career RBI, which tied Alex Rodriguez for second place on the ELIAS all-time RBI list (since the RBI became an official stat in 1920)...Hank Aaron is atop the leaderboard with 2,297 career RBI.

RELYING ON THE LONG BALL: Angels rank fourth in the American League with 42 home runs...Angels have scored 70 of 127 runs this season on home runs (55.2%).

VS. ATHLETICS: Oakland leads season series 5-4...A's won three of four in the opening series of the year at the Oakland Coliseum and Angels won two of three at The Big A last week...Halos went 6-13 vs. A's in 2019, dropping the season series for the first time since 2013...Since 2014, Angels hold a 65-58 advantage in the head-to-head series.

STRAIGHT A'S: Mike Trout owns a career .303 (168/555) average against Oakland with 38 home runs and 97 RBI (149 G)...His 38 HR vs. A's lead all active players...Since 2000, only Adrian Beltre (41) has more homers vs. Oakland than Trout... David Fletcher is a lifetime .333 (38/114) hitter against the A's...In his 28 career games vs. Oakland as a hitter, Shohei Ohtani owns a .290 average (31/107) with seven home runs and 21 RBI.

ZOOMIN' WITH THE SCHOLARS: Thursday morning, Angels manager Joe Maddon met with college students from the Angels Scholars program via Zoom...The group consisted of juniors and seniors at various universities and Joe took questions and offered advice to the students.

IN THE COMMUNITY: Yesterday morning, the Angels Baseball Foundation will be volunteering with Project HERO at a clothing drive at Salk Elementary School in Anaheim; Angels have also donated 300 Junior Angels Kids Club backpacks, 300 tote bags and 600 masks (kids & adults)

TAXI SQUAD: The Angels taxi squad for the current road trip includes: RHP Jaime Barria, RHP Luke Bard, C José Briceño, RHP Kyle Keller, and INF Elliot Soto.

GOING TO WILLIAMSPORT: Major League Baseball announced today that the Angels will face the Indians in the 2021 Little League Classic on Aug. 22, 2021 at Historic Bowman Field in Williamsport, PA...Cleveland will serve as the home team for the game, where the crowd will be filled with players and families of the participating Little League Baseball World Series teams, as well as local Williamsport youth baseball and softball organizations.

SLOW START: The Angels are just 9-19 after their first 28 games of the season, which is tied for the fewest victories through 28 games in franchise history (also started 9-19 in 1961)...The fewest victories the Angels have had through 29 games is 10 (started 10-19 in 1961 and 1976).

PLAY OF THE WEEK: Monday, David Fletcher was recognized by Major League Baseball for making the "Play of the Week" for making a backhanded stop before delivering an off-balance throw across the diamond to retire Mookie Betts.

RECENT ROSTER MOVES: Friday, the Angels reinstated INF Andrelton Simmons from injured list and placed C Max Stassi on injured list...Thursday, the Angels recalled LHP José Suarez from the Alternate Training Site and optioned RHP Jaime Barria to the Alternate Training Site...Tuesday, the Angels recalled RHP Jaime Barria from the Alternate Training Site and optioned OF Taylor Ward to the Alternate Training Site.

DEALIN' BUNDY: Through five starts this season, Dylan Bundy ranks third in the American League with a 0.80 WHIP and a .164 opponent batting average (19/116)...Ranks fifth with 38 strikeouts, seventh with a 2.48 ERA (32.2 IP - 9 ER) and ninth with 32.2 innings pitched.

MACHINE PRODUCTION: Albert Pujols ranks in the Top 10 all-time in several offensive categories, including: doubles (7th; 664), home runs (6th; 659), RBI (T2nd (ELIAS); 2086), extra-base hits (5th; 1339) and total bases (5th; 5890).

(1963) The Angels set a club record by turning six double plays in a 17-0 win at Washington; (2001) Bengie Molina set new club record by collecting a hit in nine-straight at-bats, Aug. 20-23 (previous club record was eight-straight hits); (2012) The Angels overcame a 6 run deficit to defeat Boston 14-13 in 10 innings and complete a sweep of the Red Sox in the highest scoring extra-inning game ever at Fenway Park.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER - RHP DYLAN BUNDY

3-2, 2.48 ERA

In two career games at the Oakland Coliseum, is 2-0 with a 2.84 ERA (12.2 IP - 4 ER)

- **TODAY'S GAME:** Making sixth start of the season and third on the road...Third start of 2020 vs. Athletics...Is in sixth Major League season and first with Angels.
- **LEAGUE LEADER:** Ranks third in the American League with a 0.80 WHIP and a .164 opponent batting average (19/116)...Ranks fifth with 38 strikeouts, seventh with a 2.48 ERA (32.2 IP - 9 ER) and ninth with 32.2 innings pitched.
- **EARLY QUALITY:** Registered a quality start in each of his first four starts for the Angels, becoming the first pitcher to do so in his first four games in an Angels uniform since Andrew Heaney (first six starts) in 2015... First right-hander to do so in his first four games with LAA since Jered Weaver (9) in 2006.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Earned the win in last start on Tuesday vs. Oakland after tossing seven shutout innings allowing four hits and one walk with 10 strikeouts...
- Has registered 10 strikeouts in consecutive starts for the second time in career (also, Aug. 7 & 12, 2017)
- **THE CG IN SEATTLE:** Earned the win on Aug. 6 at Seattle after tossing his third career complete game, allowing one earned run on four hits with no walks and 10 strikeouts...Marked the first complete game for an Angels pitcher since Andrew Heaney on June 5, 2018 vs. Kansas City...Per ELIAS, it marked his third CG victory with 10+ strikeouts and no more than five baserunners (via hit, walk or HBP) since 2017...The only other Major League pitcher with three such games since 2017 is **Corey Kluber** (also three).
- **MAKING A GOOD FIRST IMPRESSION:** Earned the win in Angels debut on July 25 at Oakland after tossing 6.2 innings and allowing one earned run on three hits with no walks and seven strikeouts...Exited game with 4-0 lead in 7th inning, but a bequeathed runner would score in the inning...Became the third pitcher to toss 6+ innings and allow four-or-fewer baserunners in his Angels debut, joining Don Lee (June 8, 1962) and Shohei Ohtani (April 1, 2018)...All three accomplished the feat against the Athletics.
- **DOWN IN THE THREE HOLE:** Has held opponents batting third in the order to a .202 (60/297) average for his career...Opposing hitters in the third batting order position are 0-for-15 this season.
- **KEEP IT IN THE YARD:** In his career, Bundy is 23-9 with a 1.84 ERA (269 IP - 55 ER) in games where he does not allow a home run (59 games, 38 starts), compared with a 18-38 record and 6.50 ERA (378 IP - 273 ER) when yielding at least one homer (73 games, 70 starts).
- **VS. OAKLAND:** In seven career games (six starts) against the Athletics, is 4-1 with a 3.49 ERA (38.2 IP - 15 ER) and 53 strikeouts...In his two starts against the A's this year, is 2-0 with a 0.66 ERA (13.2 IP - 1 ER), 17 strikeouts and one walk...Worked seven scoreless innings in last start vs. A's on Aug. 11 at Angel Stadium.
- **AT OAKLAND COLISEUM:** In two career starts at the Coliseum, is 2-0 with a 2.84 ERA (12.2 IP - 4 ER)...This season is 1-0 with a 1.35 ERA (6.2 IP - 1 ER)...Prior to this season, only previous start at the ballpark came on Aug. 12, 2017 for Baltimore (W; 6 IP, 7 H, 3 ER, 3 BB, 10 SO).
- **A NEW ANGEL:** Acquired by Angels from Baltimore on Dec. 4, 2019 in exchange for RHP Kyle Bradish, RHP Isaac Mattson, RHP Kyle Brnovich and RHP Zach Peek.
- **2019 IN REVIEW:** In 2019, led Orioles pitchers in starts (30), strikeouts (162), and innings pitched (161.2)... Posted a 9.02 strikeouts per nine innings rate, marking his second-straight year with more strikeouts than innings pitched...Recorded at least 150 strikeouts for a third consecutive season, becoming first Orioles pitcher to strike out 150+ batters in three straight campaigns since Daniel Cabrera (2005-2007).
- **CAREER NOTES:** Made Major League debut for Baltimore Sept. 23, 2012 at 19 years, 313 days old...Native of Tulsa, OK...Originally selected by Orioles in first round (fourth overall) in 2011 First-Year Player Draft... Ranked as Orioles #1 prospect according to *Baseball America*, from 2012-16.
