WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers lost to the Mariners yesterday, 4-1, finishing with a $0-5$ record on the 5 -day, 5 -game road trip to SD (0-2) and SEA (0-3)...at 10-17 (.370), team has 4th-lowest win pct. in the A.L. and 5th-lowest in MLB.. the 17 losses rank T4th-most in A.L./MLB...the 10-17 start matches fewest wins through 27 G in the past 12 seasons beg. 2009 (also 10-17 in 2018), as club opened 2008 with a 9-18 mark...TEX has dropped a season-high 8 straight, the longest active losing streak in MLB and one of the 3 longest slides in MLB in 2020 ( 9 G by BOS, 8/10-18; and DET, 8/11-20)....only other TEX drought of 8+ G since start of 2015 was 0-8 span from 7/13-22/19...team has had just 7 losing streaks of $9+G$ in team history, last being a 0-9 stretch from 5/30-6/8/03 (chart on page 251 of TEX media guide)...current 0-8 streak followed a season-best 4-G win streak from 8/11-15, which was longest winning span since a 4-G sweep from 9/5-8/19 at BAL...team had a 10-9 record after win on $8 / 15$ at COL, just 2 nd time with a winning record all season (also 1-0 after Opening Day win vs. COL), but has dropped 8 straight since reaching above .500 and is now a season-high 7 G under.

IN THE STANDINGS: Texas has lost 5.0 games in the A.L. West standings during current 8-G losing streak, remaining in 3rd place and now a season-high 9.0 GB of 1st-place Oakland for the 1st time...club has been in 3rd in each of the last 8 days after spending previous 5 days in 2nd place...the Rangers have gone 14 straight days without gaining ground in the division, last doing so with a win on $8 / 11$ vs. SEA.

SERIES STUFF: Rangers enter this homestand having lost 3 consecutive series vs. SD ( $0-2$ ), at SD ( $0-2$ ), and at SEA ( $0-3$ ), counting for 3 of the 4 instances in which TEX has lost all games of a series in 2020 (also 0-3 from 8/4-6 at OAK).. club is now 3-6-1 overall in series in '20...1st time to lose 3 straight series since going 0-4-0 from 9/13-26/19...current drought was preceded by 3 straight series wins from 8/7-16, 1st time to win 3 in a row since 5/14-22/19

- TEX is 2-2-1 in home series this season, going 2-1-1 in last 4 series at Globe Life Field entering this homestand.

AT HOME: Despite dropping both games in a brief 2-G homestand last week (8/17-18 vs. SD), TEX has gone 2-2 in last 4 home ames and won 6 of last 9 in Arlington...current 6-3 span comes after a $1-3$ start at the new Globe Life Field, as club's 7-6 (.538) home mark ranks T7th in the A.L...the 7 home wins rank T6th in the A.L...team has a -11 run diff. at home (47-58) and a -35 mark on the road (54-89)...Rangers finished with a $45-36$ (.556) record in the final year at GLP in 2019, 7th-best mark in the A.L.

TOUGH DRAW: Entering this week, the Rangers' two opponents in this homestand have the top two records in MLB, as OAK is an A.L.-best 20-9 (.690) and LAD is a MLB-leading 22-8 (.733)...they are the only teams in MLB with $20+$ wins.

THE SWINGIN' A'S: The Rangers are scheduled to host the A's for 7 games in a span of 21 days here at GLF from 8/24$9 / 13$, wrapping up the season series...TEX is $0-3$ vs. OAK, osing all 3 G at the Coliseum from 8/4-6...Rangers are 1-10 in last 10 G vs. A's dating to 2019, losing 3 in a row since lone win in that span 9/22/19 at OAK...since the start of 2018, TEX is 12-29 (.293) vs. the A's, 2 nd-lowest win pct. against any A.L. opponent in that span (4-10, . 286 vs. BOS)...in Arlington, team had a $3-6$ record vs. A's in 2019, losing last 4 in a row...team lost 10 of last 13 at Globe Life Park vs. A's.

SHE'S THE ONE: Texas scored a single run yesterday at SEA, and team has scored one-or-zero runs in 2 straight for he 1st time since 9/15-17/19...while TEX remains one of 6 MLB clubs that has yet to be shut out in 2020 (also BOS, CHC, HOU, LAD, SF), offense has now scored exactly one run in 5 G in '20, T2nd-most in MLB: 6-SEA, 5 -TEX/ARI/PIT.

ROSTER MOVES: This afternoon, the Rangers activated C Robinson Chirinos from the 10-day IL and recalled OF Leody Taveras from the Alt. Site...club has also placed RHP Jesse Chavez on the 10-day IL with a sprained left big toe and designated INF/OF Rob Refsnyder for assignment.

LANCE TIME: Lance Lynn enters tonight's start ranking among A.L. leaders in ERA (2nd, 1.37), opp. BA (2nd, .146), opp. OPS (2nd, .478), innings (2nd, 39.1), and WHIP (3rd, $0.814)$...those ranks in MLB by category: IP (2nd), opp. BA (3rd), ERA (4th), WHIP (4th), opp. OPS (4th)...Lynn also owns one of the $39-$-inning complete games in the A.L. this season (8/14 at COL)

- Most figures for Lynn are lower in his 3 home starts at Globe Life Field, as he has gone 2-0, 1.06 (2 ER/17.0 IP) with a .123 opp . BA and $12.18 \mathrm{SO} / 9$ in this new facility...the only runs against Lynn in Arlington this season both came in his last home start on 8/9 vs. LAA on a 2-R HR by Tommy La Stella ahead of a Mike Trout PA in the 5th inning.
- Lynn has started 4 of the Rangers' 10 wins, and posted quality starts in the 2 games Texas eventually lost after his exit...according to FanGraphs, Lynn's 1.2 WAR figure is 8th among qualifying MLB pitchers in '20.
- Lynn has averaged 3.20 runs of support per 9 innings, 5th-lowest figure in the A.L. and 9th-lowest in MLB.
- Enters tonight's start having thrown at least 100 pitches in 30 consecutive starts, a span reaching back to last May... it is the longest such streak by a Ranger since pitches were first tracked in 1988...last longer span in MLB was by DET's Justin Verlander, 62 in a row from 3/31/11-9/2/12.

BRINGING THE OFFENSE: With Jeff Mathis hitting a solo HR for the Rangers' lone run yesterday at SEA, he joined Jose Trevino in composite catcher batting totals of a . 474 BA (9-19), 2 HR, 3 2B, 4 RBI, 4 R, and just 3 strikeouts on the 5-G road trip...rest of team batted . 145 (22-152) with 4 HR, 4 $2 \mathrm{~B}, 12 \mathrm{RBI}$ on the trip

TAKE ME HOME: After totaling 3 hits on the 5-G road trip, Nick Solak returns to Arlington, where he has batted .333/.435/.385/.819 (13-39) this season, leading all Rangers in BA, OBP, and hits at the new Globe Life Field....he has reached safely in 10 of 12 at home in ' 20 , with 6 walks agains just 4 strikeouts while going 3 -for-3 in steal attempts.

LUCKY SEVEN: Tonight begins a span in which regular weekday night games in Arlington will have 7:05 p.m. CT starts for the remainder of the campaign...the change from 8:05 p.m. CT starts was announced on Aug. 11...the Rangers requested the earlier starting times for the convenience of fans watching and listening to games on television and radio as well as to accommodate the teams...TEX had a 3-3 record in the 8:05 starts at Globe Life Field.

ON THE SPOT: Jonathan Hernandez retired all 3 batters faced yesterday at SEA, his 1st outing since Wed. at SD over 10 appearances in August, Hernandez has a 2-0 record with a 0.71 ERA ( 1 ER/12.2 IP), as opponents have slashed .105/.146/.158/.304 (4-38) with one XBH (3B) and 2 BB/15 SO to the tune of a 0.47 WHIP.

FALLING DOWN: Texas has allowed first-inning runs in 4 straight and 10 of 27 overall in '20...team has trailed at the end of 67 of $74(90.5 \%)$ innings during the $8-\mathrm{G}$ losing skid, holding a lead at the end of just one frame in that span: 1-0 lead after 2 inn. on Wed. at SD.

SHORTS: Yesterday's season-low 2:14 time of game was the shortest for any Rangers contest since a season finale on 9/30/18 at SEA, another game at T-Mobile Park that also lasted exactly $2: 14 \ldots$ with the $4-1$ loss yesterday, Rangers now have MLB-low run differential of -46 (101 for, 147 against).. on $8 / 24 / 12$ vs. MIN, Adrián Beltré hit for his 2nd career cycle

## TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER

## \#35 Lance Lynn, RHP

(3-0, 1.37)
TONIGHT: The 33 -year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 7 th start of the season in the homestand opener against Oakland...ranks among MLB leaders in most key pitching categories (see "Among the Leaders") and enters tonight's start w/ the 2nd-lowest ERA (1.37) in the A.L. behind CLE's Shane Bieber (1.11)...will be working on regular 4 days' rest after he did not factor in the decision despite an "ultra" quality start in the Rangers' 6-3 loss in 10 innings on Wed. at SD (7.0 IP, 2 R-ER)...has allowed 2 -or-fewer runs in all 6 starts, logging $6.0+$ IP in 5 of $6 \ldots$...recorded his 100 th career win on $8 / 9 \mathrm{vs}$. LAA...is in his 2 nd season with Texas after posting a career year in 2019, earning a fifth place finish in the A.L. Cy Young Award voting...recorded the 3rd-highest single-season strikeout total in team history (246) and one of the highest pitching WAR figures ever by a Ranger ( 7.6 rWAR )...signed a three-year contract with TEX as a free agent on $12 / 18 / 18 \ldots$..is one of 11 Major League pitchers with at least seven 10 -win campaigns since 2012 , and one of just nine to post 7 seasons of $29+$ starts in that same span...was a rookie in the Cardinals' World Championship season of 2011, defeating the Rangers in Game 3 of the World Series in Arlington...was a 1st round pick of STL in 2008 after pitching 3 seasons at the University of Mississippi...Texas is $4-2$ in his 6 starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has amassed 1.8 wins above replacement (base-ball-reference.com), most among Rangers, 3rd-most among pitchers, and T5th among all players in MLB (2.4-LAD's Mookie Betts, 2.2-CLE's Shane Bieber, 2.0SD's Fernando Tatis Jr., 2.0-ATL's Max Fried, 1.8-Lynn/TB's Brandon Lowe).

- Also ranks among MLB leaders in IP (2nd, 39.1), opp. BA (3rd .146), quality starts (T3rd, 5), ERA (4th, 1.37), opp. OPS (4th, .478), WHIP (4th, 0.81), SO (T9th, 42), and wins (T10th, 3).

LAST START: Will be working on regular 4 days' rest after he did not factor in the decision despite an "ultra" quality start in the Rangers' 6-3 loss in 10 innings on Wed. at SD (7.0 IP, 8 H, 2 R-ER, 0 BB, 6 SO 2 HR, 111 pitches/71 strikes)... allowed solo HRs to Jurickson Profar and Fernando Tatis Jr. and exited trailing 2-1 after receiving one run of support for the 3rd time in 6 starts...Joey Gallo's game-tying solo HR in the 9th inn. forced extras, and Texas took the lead in the 10th before Manny Machado hit a walk-off grand slam off Rafael Montero...was Lynn's 2nd straight start of 7.0+ IP with 2-or-less R allowed and zero BB, the 1st Ranger to accomplish the feat since Colby Lewis (2 straight, 5/14-20/16)

VS. OAKLAND: Has gone 2-1, 4.67 (14 ER/27.0 IP) in $5 \mathrm{G} / \mathrm{GS}$ career vs. OAK (all since start of '19), incl. 2-0, 2.28 ( $6 \mathrm{ER} / 23.2 \mathrm{IP}$ ) in last $4 \mathrm{G} / \mathrm{GS} .$. will be making 2nd start against A's in '20, as he took ND on 8/4 at OAK (6.1 IP, 1 R-ER), a 5-1 Texas defeat.

IN ARLINGTON: Lynn is 2-0 with a 1.06 ERA (2 ER/17.0 IP) and $9 \mathrm{BB} / 23 \mathrm{SO}$ thru his 1 st $3 \mathrm{G} / \mathrm{GS}$ at Globe Life Field, with the Rangers winning all 3 games... opponents are batting . 123 (7-57) w/ 3 XBH (HR, 2 2B)...Lynn is 12-1, 3.15 (42 ER/120.0 IP) in 19 G/GS in Arlington since the start of 2019, T2nd-most home wins during that span (14-Gerrit Cole, 12-Lynn/Max Fried/Sonny Gray)...Texas is 14-5 in those 19 starts.

2020: Is averaging an MLB-high 107.8 pitches per game...opposing batters are 1 -for-23 (.043) w/ RISP, incl. 0-for-22 to start the year before an infield single by Josh Naylor on Wed. at SD...run support average is 5th-lowest in A.L., 2nd-lowest on staff (2.76-Mike Minor)...Jose Trevino has caught 3 starts (0-0, 1.20 ERA), and Robinson Chirinos (1-0, 0.73 ERA) and Jeff Mathis (2-0, 2.25 ERA) have each caught 2 starts.

THE PITCH: Lynn has posted at least 100 pitches in each of his 1 st 6 starts to begin the year, most 100-pitch outings in MLB in 2020 (Max Scherzer has 4)... dating back to 5/21/19, he has thrown 100+ pitches in 30 straight starts, the longest such streak by a Ranger since pitches were 1st tracked in 1988 and the longest span in MLB since DET's Justin Verlander (80 in a row from 6/27/10-9/2/12).

GO THE DISTANCE: Lynn posted a 2-hit complete game in the club's 3-2 win over the Rockies on $8 / 14$ at Coors Field ( 9.0 IP, 2 H, 2 R-1 ER, 0 BB, 6 SO, 110 pitches/73 strikes)...held the Rox hitless ( $0-24$ ) in innings 2-9 after COL took a 1-0 lead on a pair of singles in the opening frame...some notes on Lynn's feat:

- Marked just 8th CG of 2-or-fewer hits in a 9-inning game in Coors Field history, 1st since COL's Chad Bettis on 9/5/16 vs. SF...just 5th instance by an opponent, 3rd in last 25 years by an opponent, the others by a pair of former Rangers: SEA's Kevin Millwood (5/18/12) and HOU's Roy Oswalt (9/6/08).
- Was the 1st CG of 2-or-fewer hits by a Ranger since Colby Lewis on 6/16/16 at OAK $(2 \mathrm{H})$, which was the final win of Lewis' career.

SCORELESS START: Lynn opened the 2020 season with a span of 18.0 consecutive scoreless innings, still the longest scoreless streak in the Majors this year. according to Elias Sports Bureau, it is T2nd-longest scoreless streak to start a season in Rangers history, longest since Jon Matlack's club-record 19.0-inning scoreless span to open 1980.

2020 \& CAREER SPLITS




GRAND OPENING: Celebrated the opening of Globe Life Field by spinning one of the most dominant performances by an Opening Day starter in club history on $7 / 24$ vs. COL (W, 6.0 IP, 2 H, 0 R, 4 BB, 9 SO, 108 pitches/ 64 strikes)...the 9 SO matched TEX record for a season opener, as he became just the 4th TEX pitcher to reach that mark on O.D...was just the 3rd instance of a TEX starter tossing at least $6.0+$ SHO IP on Opening Day, joining Charlie Hough on 4/4/89 vs. DET (CG SHO) and Jon Matlack on 4/10/80 vs. NYY (9.0 SHO IP, TEX won 1-0 in 12 inn.).

2019: In his 1st season with the Rangers, finished among A.L. leaders in innings (T4th, career-high 208.1), starts (T5th, 33), ERA (7th, 3.67), opp. BA (7th, .243), and WHIP (7th, 1.22)...turned in the 5th-most quality starts (20) in the A.L., including 8 straight from 5/10-6/19, one shy of the Texas club record done 6 times (single-season or multiple seasons)...had 16 games with $7.0+$ IP, 3rd-most in MLB (19-Jacob deGrom, 17-Justin Verlander) and tied with Cole Hamels (2016) and Yu Darvish (2013) for the most such starts by a Texas pitcher in the last 8 campaigns...opponents slashed $.243 / .300 / .290 / .689 \ldots$ opposition batted .230 (43-187) w/ RISP...led MLB with career-high 18 wild pitches...threw 1st-pitch strikes $62.6 \%$ of PA's, 2nd-best figure of his career ( $63.2 \%$ in 2013).

[^0]:    The 32 -year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 6 th start of the season tomorrow in the 2 nd meeting of this 4-G set with Oakland...Rangers have 7 QS in '20: 5-Lynn, 2-Gibson...has posted the 14th-highest ground ball rate ( $49.4 \%$ ) among A.L. starters (min. 20.0 IP )...will work on regular 4 days' rest after allowing season-high 5 R-ER in Texas' walk-off $8-7$ loss to the Padres in San Diego on Thurs. (ND, $5.0 \mathrm{IP}, 6 \mathrm{H}, 5 \mathrm{R}$-ER, $3 \mathrm{BB}, 3 \mathrm{SO}, 90$ pitches/ 51 strikes)...permitted just one run on 3 hits through the first 4.0 innings, but San Diego opened the 5th w/ 1B, FO, 1B, BB to set the table for Eric Hosmer's one-out grand slam, as the Rangers became the first club in MLB history to surrender slams in 4 straight $G$...exited after the 5 th frame trailing, $2-5$, but avoided the loss when Danny Santana hit a $3-R 2 B$ in the 7 th, leveling the score at $5-5 . .$. Texas would go on to lose in extras on a walk-off $1 B$ by Jake Cronenworth, the team's 5 th defeat on this current 8 -G losing streak...owns a 3 -2 record and 3.92 ERA (18 ER/41.1 IP) over 7 career G/GS against the A's, including $6.0 \mathrm{IP} / 3 \mathrm{R}$-ER in the Rangers' $6-4$ defeat at Oakland Coliseum on $8 / 5$ (ND, $6.0 \mathrm{IP}, 4 \mathrm{H}, 3 \mathrm{R}$-ER, $2 \mathrm{BB}, 9 \mathrm{SO}, 2 \mathrm{HR}, 103$ pitches/66 strikes)... 9 strikeouts and 103 pitches were both season highs...all runs allowed came on homers by Matt Olson ( $2 R$ ) and Ramón Laureano (solo)...exited with a $4-3$ lead, but did not factor into the decision after the Texas bullpen surrendered 3 unanswered runs on HR by Austin Allen ( $2 R$ ) and Olson (solo) over the last 3 frames...will be making his 3rd straight and 4th road start of ' 20 , posting a 5.19 ERA ( $10 \mathrm{ER} / 17.1 \mathrm{IP}$ ) in those outings compared to 3.86 ( $4 \mathrm{ER} / 9.1 \mathrm{IP}$ ) in 2 GS at Globe Life Field...signed a 3 -year contract thru 2022 on 12/6/19 after spending the 1st 10 years of his pro career in the Minnesota organization...tied a career high with 13 wins for the A.L. Central Division champion Twins last season despite being bothered much of the season by an ulcerative colitis condition, pitching in relief to close the year....won 65 games for the Twins over the last 6 seasons with 10 -or-more victories 5 times in that span and has recorded 6 consecutive years of 25 -or-more starts...is one of 7 A.L. pitchers to post at least 5 10-win seasons from 2014-19...selected by the Twins in the first round (22nd overall) of the 2009 June draft out of the University of Missouri...Rangers are 1-4 in his starts.
