2017 - With the rains of Hurricane Harvey still falling in Houston, the Astros have their three-game series with the Rangers relocated to the Trop...they play the first game of the series on this date, losing 12-2 to the Rangers.

## TODAY'S MEDIA SCHEDULE

Minute Maid Park will open to media today at 11 a.m...Astros pregame availabilities will be from 11 a.m.-12 p.m...the Astros will hit BP from 12:30-1:30 p.m. and the Angels from 1:30-2:30 p.m...between games, the Astros will make every effort to make manager Dusty Baker and select Astros players available via video conference.

LET'S PLAY TWO: The top two teams in the AL West will play two 7.0 -inning games today, with the first beginning at 3:10 p.m. and the second game beginning approx. 30-45 minutes following the final out of Game 1 ... with 29 games to go and trailing the A's by 4.5 games in the standings, the Astros will look to gain ground today behind RHP Lance McCullers Jr. in Game 1 and RHP Zack Greinke in Game 2.

LAST NIGHT'S STATEMENT: Last night, Astros players, along with support from A's players, decided to postpone their regularly scheduled Friday night game in an effort to raise awareness on racial inequality in our country...the Astros support the player's decision and are proud of our players' efforts to use their voices to drive necessary change.

SCHEDULE CHANGES: Last night's postponement added another wrinkle to this week's already altered schedule...the Astros hosted the Angels on Monday, then played the Angels in a doubleheader on Tuesday...the Astros were then off Wednesday and Thursday, as the city braced for a potential impact with Hurricane Laura...with last night's postponement, the Astros will play another doubleheader today.

DOUBLE DOUBLE: The Astros will be playing doubleheaders on consecutive game days for the first time since 1978 season, when the club played three straight doubleheaders from July 19-21...the Astros went 1-5 over those three days, going 1-3 against the Mets and 0-2 against the Phillies.

ASTROS DOUBLEHEADERS: Today will be the Astros 16th doubleheader since 2000, when Minute Maid Park opened...overall, the club has played 260 doubleheaders, including Tuesday's doubleheader, a split with the Angels...the Astros last swept a doubleheader on Sept. 29, 2018 at BAL and last lost a doubleheader on Sept. 9, 2017 at OAK.

A HOUSTON RARITY: Today's doubleheader is the third in Minute Maid Park history and prior to this week had only happened on one other occasion, Sept. 2, 2017 in a sweep of the Mets...that doubleheader came in the aftermath of Hurricane Harvey, which caused severe flooding and damage in the Houston area, forcing the Astros to relocate three games and postpone one.

## TUESDAY'S DOUBLEHEADER: The Astros and

 Angels split a doubleheader on Tuesday in Houston with the Astros taking the first game 6-3 and the Angels rebounding in the nightcap with a 12-5 win... Game 1 featured a five-run 1st inning for the Astros, who rode that to the win behind RHP Cristian Javier (3ER/5.2IP)...in Game 2, the Angels answered with a four-run 1st and scored in five of the seven innings en route to the win.RECENT 'STROS: The Astros have gone 11-5 in their last 16, which included an eight-game winning streak...that streak was their longest streak since also winning eight in a row from Aug. 1-10, 2019.

REMEMBERING JACKIE: The Astros will celebrate Jackie Robinson Day today in Game 1 of their doubleheader...as is customary, all players, managers, coaches, umpires and other on-field personnel will wear the Number 42 to honor Robinson's historic significance in ushering in necessary changes to MLB by breaking the color barrier in 1947.

HOME COOKIN': The Astros had their eight-game winning streak at Minute Maid Park snapped in Tuesday's nightcap...on the season, the Astros have gone 12-5 (.706) at home, which ties as the third-best home record in the AL...the Astros are 2-1 this homestand and went 7-1 (.875) on their last homestand, which was their best winning percentage for a homestand of eight-or-more games since posting a 10-1 (.909) mark on an 11-game stand from June 1-11, 1989 (Elias).

ON THE OFFENSIVE: The Astros lead the American League in runs per game (5.35), while ranking second in runs scored (166), third in doubles (62) and tied for third in extra-base hits (105)...they've done this by making contact, having struck out just once every 5.07 plate appearances, the best ratio in the AL...individually, OF Kyle Tucker leads the Majors in triples (5) and ranks tied for fourth in the AL in runs scored (25).

THE TUCKER TURRET: OF Kyle Tucker is hitting .412 (14×34) with a double, four triples, four home runs and 14 RBI in his last 11 games, which dates back to Aug. 16 vs. SEA...on the season, he leads the club with 23 RBI, 16 extra-base hits and an .879 OPS.

RECORD RUN: SS Carlos Correa has played 88 consecutive games at shortstop without an error, which is a franchise record... he has broken his own club mark, which had been 70 games, set Sept. 20, 2017-June 6, 2018... his current streak is the longest for a shortstop since Adeiny Hechavarria posted a 94-game errorless streak from July 31, 2017-June 29, 2018...the MLB record for shortstops is 110 games, set by Baltimore's Mike Bordick in 2002.

VS. THE A'S: The Astros and A's have played each other 142 times, splitting those contests evenly at 71 game apiece...historically, this series has been extremely streaky and remains that way with the Astros having lost six consecutive to the A's and nine of their last 11...prior to this 11-game downturn, the Astros had won 12 of 15 ...it's worth remembering, the Astros began this all-time series $5-25$ before running off season series victories over the A's in each of the last five seasons (2015-19).

LAST START - $8 / 21$ at SD: took the loss in Houston's $4-3$ defeat to the Padres at Petco Park...gave up 4 runs on 7 hits over 5.0 innings...walked 2 and struck out 2 on a season-high tying 97 pitches.
THE RETURN: the 2017 AL All-Star has made a successful recovery from Tommy John surgery, and will make his 7 th start of the season tonight.

- prior to 2020, his last regular season start in the Majors was on Aug. 4, 2018 at LAD (0ER/4IP)....missed the entire 2019 season.
- underwent Tommy John surgery on Nov. 6, 2018...suffered an elbow injury during his Aug. 4, 2018 start and was placed on the IL from Aug. 5 -Sept. 24.
- rehabbed the injury prior to undergoing surgery...returned for the 2018 postseason, in which he threw 5.0 innings of 1 -run relief across 5 postseason games between the ALDS vs. CLE and ALCS vs. BOS.
vs. OAK: last faced the A's on July 11, 2018 at Minute Maid Park...suffered his 2nd-career loss to the A's in that outing (6ER/4IP).
- the Astros have gone $4-1$ in his 5 starts against Oakland dating back to the 2017 season.
IN THE H: is making his 4 th start of the season at Minute Maid Park.
- has gone 2-0 with a 1.93 ERA (4ER/18.2IP) in 3 starts at the venue in 2020.
- in his career at Minute Maid Park, has gone $19-7$ with a 2.60 ERA (73ER/252.21P) in 42 starts.
- owns the 4th-best ERA by an Astro in Minute Maid Park history, behind Wilton Lopez (2.43), Justin Verlander (2.50) and Roger Clemens (2.55).

GROUND AND POUND: has been a groundball machine in his 6 starts this season...is tied for the American League lead in groundball to flyball ratio (3.87) with Framber Valdez, and leads the AL in groundball rate (63.7\%).

- his $63.7 \%$ GB rate is a career-best mark (previously $61.9 \%$ in 2017).

FIELDING HIS POSITION: leads all Major League pitchers in total chances (15) and putouts (10), while ranking T-6th among AL pitchers in assists (5).

NEW PITCH MIX: over his first 6 starts of the season, is throwing his changeup at a career-high rate ( $22.5 \%$ ) while throwing his curveball at a career-low rate (34.9\%)...is also throwing his sinker at a career-high rate ( $40.1 \%$ ).

- has given up just 3 hits on his 118 changeups this season (. 143 avg.).

SNAP DRAGON: coming into the season, no other starting pitcher in the Majors had thrown his curveball at a higher rate than McCullers Jr. since pitch data started being tracked in 2007 ( $44.5 \%$ ).

- famously threw 24 consecutive curveballs to close out Houston's Game 7 win over the Yankees in the 2017 ALCS, the 7th postseason save of at least 4.0 innings in MLB history, and first since Madison Bumgarner's 2014 World Series Game 7 performance.
COMMITTED TO HOUSTON: Lance and his wife Kara have stayed active in the Houston community throughout the the COVID-19 pandemic.
- teamed up with Joe Smith and Allie LaForce to start Project FRONTLINE, an initiative through Athletes + Causes that works to support restaurants and healthcare workers...the initiative provided meals to over 15,000 healthcare workers from close to $\$ 140,000$ in funds raised.
- made a commitment to the Houston Food Bank that provided 10,000 meals...also teamed up with the Correa Family Foundation in feeding workers at the ICU, emergency care and newborn/birth wings at Houston Methodist Hospital.

LAST START - 8/23 at SD: did not factor into the decision in Houston's $5-3$ loss...tossed a quality start, allowing 3 runs on 4 hits over 6.0 innings, striking out 4 with 2 walks.

- has his scoreless innings streak snapped at 16.1 innings pitched...gave up all 3 of his runs in the 4 th inning (his streak dated back to Aug. 12 vs. SF).
GREINKE DAY: the 6 -time All-Star and 36 -year-old right-hander is set to make his 7th start of the season, and the 454th start of his Major League career...currently ranks 2nd among active MLB pitchers in starts behind Justin Verlander (454).
- is coming off a 2019 season that saw him win his 2nd Silver Slugger award, and 6th Rawlings Gold Glove Award.
- is in his first full-season with the Astros....was acquired by the Astros along with cash considerations on July 31, minutes before the trade deadline... in exchange for Greinke, the Astros sent 4 prospects to Arizona: IF Seth Beer, RHP J.B. Bukauskas, RHP Corbin Martin and IF Joshua Rojas.
vs. OAK: will face the A's for the 2nd time this season, and his 4th time as a member of the Astros...in 3 starts against the A's with Houston, has gone 2-0 with a 0.47 ERA (1ER/19IP), 4 walks and 16 strikeotus.
- has gone 15.0 consecutive scoreless innings against the A's.... has tossed consecutive scoreless, 6.0 -inning starts against the club.
HOT START: ranks 4th in the American League in ERA behind Shane Bieber (1.35), Lance Lynn (1.59) and Kenta Maeda (2.21).
- ranks among the AL leaders in HR per 9.0 innings ( $0.00,1 \mathrm{st}$ ), walks per 9.0 innings ( $1.53,3 \mathrm{rd}$ ), WAR ( $1.4,3 \mathrm{3rd}$, Fangraphs), average exit velocity ( $85.3 \mathrm{mph}, 5 \mathrm{th}$ ), WHIP ( $0.91,5 \mathrm{th}$ ), opponent batting average (.203, 8th) and hard-hit ball rate ( $30 \%$, 10 th $)$.
- has gone his first 6 starts without receiving a losing decision.

KEEP IT INSIDE: has gone his first 6 starts in 2020 without allowing a HR.

- is the first Astros pitcher to not allow a homer over his first 6 starts of a season since 2015 (Dallas Keuchel)...the last to do so over his first 7 starts of a season was Wandy Rodriguez in 2009 ( 8 starts).
- last allowed a homer on Sept. 20, 2019 vs. LAA, his penultimate start of the 2019 season... has gone 45.2 consecutive innings without a homer, spanning 7 starts.
- marks the 4th-longest streak of consecutive starts without a HR in his career, his longest since going 8 straight during the middle of the 2015 season.
WITH THE 'STROS: has made 16 regular season starts for Houston since joining the club in July of 2019, going 9-1 with a 2.76 (30ER/98|P) and 81 strikeouts.
- since making his first start with Houston on Aug. 6, 2019, ranks among the top-5 AL pitchers in wins (4th), ERA (5th) and innings pitched ( T -4th).
- the Astros have gone 10-6 in his 16 starts.

TOP-25 WITHIN SIGHT: ranks 26th all-time in MLB history in strikeouts $(2,651)$ )..trails David Cone for 25th all-time $(2,668)$.
COOPERSTOWN BOUND?: is 1 of 3 pitchers in MLB history with at least 6 All-Star appearances and 6 Rawlings Gold Glove Awards, along with Greg Maddux and Bob Gibson.

- is 1 of 3 pitchers in MLB history who have won a Cy Young, Gold Glove and Silver Slugger...also Fernando Valenzuela and Orel Hershiser.
- is 1 of 12 pitchers in MLB history to record at least 1,000 strikeouts in both the American League and National League...also Nolan Ran, Randy Johnson, Gaylord Perry, Fergie Jenkins, Pedro Martinez, Jim Bunning, Cy Young, David Cone, A.J. Burnett, Dennis Martinez and Max Scherzer.
