# THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY OCT. 7

1981 - The Astros take a 2-0 lead in the NLDS vs. the Dodgers with a 1-0 win in the Astrodome...RHP Joe Niekro starts for Houston, going 8.0 scoreless...the game remains tied at 0-0 into the 11th before PH Denny Walling singles home 2B Phil Garner with two outs in the inning for a walkoff win.

**TODAY'S GAME 3:** The Astros and A's will continue their American League Division Series today at Dodger Stadium with Houston on the brink of advancing to the AL Championship Series for the fourth consecutive season...the Astros are no strangers to clinches at Dodger Stadium, having won Game 7 of the 2017 World Series at the venue.

**ON THE BRINK:** With a win today, the Astros would advance to their fourth straight ALCS, becoming the third team in AL history (since 1969) to accomplish this feat...the others were the 1998-2001 Yankees and the 1971-75 A's (five straight)...the last NL team to make four straight NLCS was the 2011-14 Cardinals.

**FOUR STRAIGHT:** The Astros have won all four of their postseason games, giving them their second-longest postseason win streak in club history...the 2017-18 Astros won five straight, Game 7 of the 2017 World Series and their first four games of the 2018 playoffs.

POSTSEASON APPEARANCES: This is the Astros 14th appearance in the postseason in club history in what is the 59th year of the franchise that began in 1962...this appearance gives Houston four straight years in the playoffs, the first time they've done so in franchise history...only the Yankees and Dodgers have also played in the last four postseasons...Houston has also made the postseason in five of the last six years.

**POSTSEASON EXPERIENCE:** This group of Astros has won a postseason series in four straight seasons (2017-20), leading all Major League teams in postseason games (48) and postseason wins (29) in that time frame...in both categories, the Astros top the Dodgers (39g, 23 wins) and Yankees (31g, 17 wins).

**IN THE DS:** The Astros have played in 11 Division Series in their history, winning five...since 2004, the Astros have won five of their last six Division Series.

**DÉJÀ VU:** Including this series, the Astros have started their last four ALDS with two consecutive wins...the Astros ended up dispatching the Red Sox in four games in 2017, the Indians in three games in 2018, and the Rays in five games last season...the Astros have just two postseason sweeps in their club history, the 2018 ALDS vs. CLE and this year's Wild Card Series vs. MIN.

AT THE HELM: Astros Manager Dusty Baker is the first manager in MLB history to take five different teams to the postseason, the Giants (1997, 2000, 2002), Cubs (2003), Reds (2010, 2012-13), Nationals (2016-17) and Astros (2020)...Baker's all-time record in the postseason is now 27-32.

THE ROAD GOES ON: Dating back to Sept. 21, the Astros have played 11 consecutive games away from Minute Maid Park, as this ongoing trip has taken them from Houston to Seattle to Arlington to Minneapolis and to Los Angeles...should the Astros advance to the ALCS, that series would start on Sunday and would be played in San Diego at Petco Park vs. the winner of the Rays and Yankees series.

TODAY'S STARTERS: The Astros will start RHP José Urquidy today, who started Game 2 of the Wild Card Series at MIN, tossing 4.1 innings and allowing one earned run...Urquidy will get his second look at the A's this season, also starting against them on Sept. 10 at OAK (2ER/6IP)...Urquidy will be opposed by LHP Jesús Luzardo, who lasted 3.1 innings in his Game 1 start for the A's in their Wild Card Series...Luzardo was tough on the Astros this season, going 1-0 with a 2.84 ERA (4ER/12.2IP) in two starts, both in Oakland.

YES WAY JOSÉ!: RHP José Urquidy has been nails in the postseason in his brief career, posting a 1-0 record and a 1.26 ERA (2ER/14.1IP) in five games (two starts)...he had his biggest postseason moment in Game 4 of the 2019 World Series at WSH, earning the win after tossing 5.0 shutout frames, allowing just two hits with no walks and four strikeouts.

YESTERDAY'S WIN: The Astros took a commanding 2-0 lead in this ALDS yesterday with a 5-2 win over the A's at Dodger Stadium...LHP Framber Valdez continued his breakout season with a 7.0 strong innings, allowing just two runs on five hits en route to the win... CF George Springer stayed hot, going 2x4 with two homers and three RBI for his second career multi-homer game in the postseason...C Martín Maldonado tacked on another run with a solo shot.

SPRING HAS SPRUNG: OF George Springer has gone 6x9 with a double, two HR and four RBI this series...other notes on the Astros outfielder:

- Springer has played in six postseason games at Dodger Stadium in his career, hitting .500 (13x26) with three doubles, five homers and nine RBI...he's recorded an RBI in five straight postseason games at the venue.
- Springer's five postseason homers at Dodger Stadium rank tied for second all-time, trailing only Reggie Jackson and his six postseason homers at the venue.
- Springer's 17 career postseason homers rank tied for seventh all-time...he surpassed Babe Ruth (15HR) yesterday and is now just one homer from tying Reggie Jackson (18 HR) and Mickey Mantle (18 HR) for fifth on MLB's all-time list.

**PEACOCK UNDERGOES SURGERY: RHP Brad Peacock**, a postseason staple for the Astros in his career, underwent arthroscopic surgery on his right shoulder yesterday...Peacock, who began the season on the injured list, was limited to just three appearances in 2020 due to shoulder soreness.

**BIAGINI CLEARS WAIVERS: RHP Joe Biagini**, who was DFA'd on Sept. 29, has cleared waivers and been outrighted to Triple A Round Rock...Biagini can now accept the assignment or elect free agency.

- became the 3rd Mexican-born pitcher in MLB history to start a game that clinched a postseason series victory for his ballclub...the only others to do it: Yovani Gallardo, who started the Brewers 2011 NLDS Game 5 win over the D-backs, and Fernando Valenzuela, who started the Dodgers 1981 NLCS Game 5 victory over the Expos.
- **TODAY'S START:** name is pronounced "urr-KEE-dee"...is set to make his 3rd-career postseason start, and 6th-career postseason appearance.
- with today's start, will become the first Mexican-born pitcher in MLB history to start multiple potential series clinching games in the postseason.
- the 25-year-old is the 2nd-youngest pitcher in Astros franchise history to start a potential series clinching game...only Lance McCullers Jr. did so at a younger age, as he started Game 4 of the 2015 ALDS vs. KC at 22 years old, and Game 7 of the 2017 World Series at LAD at 24 years
- POSTSEASON PERFORMER: has allowed just 2 runs in 14.1 career postseason innings pitched (1.26 ERA).
- allowed just 1 run in 10.0 postseason innings across 4 games during the 2019 playoffs (0.90 ERA).
- started Game 4 of the 2019 World Series at Nationals Park and led Houston to an 8-1 win with 5.0 scoreless frames...gave up just 2 hits with no walks and 4 strikeouts.
- became the 3rd Mexican-born pitcher to earn a win in the World Series, joining LHP Fernando Valenzuela (1981) and RHP Aurelio Lopez (1984).
- became the seventh rookie starter to post a scoreless start in the World Series in a 50-year span, joining RHP Walker Buehler (2018), RHP Yordano Ventura (2014), LHP Madison Bumgarner (2010), RHP Les Straker (1987) and RHP Gary Gentry (1969).
- 2020 SEASON: began the 2020 campaign on the Injured List due to a positive test for COVID-19...was away from Major League club during all of 2020 Summer Camp.
- was activated from the Injured List on Sept. 5 and went on to post a 2.73 ERA (9ER/29.2IP) across 5 starts.
- held the opposition to 2 runs-or-fewer in each of his 5 starts this season... ended the season with 4 consecutive quality starts, the longest quality start streak of his career.
- ranked 7th in the AL in September ERA (2.73) and 7th in September WHIP (1.01).
- RIGHT ON LEFT: gave up just 1 extra-base hit to left-handed hitters in 63 batters faced, while allowing a .136 (8x59) batting average and .377 OPS.
- among pitchers with 60 batters faced, posted the 3rd-best opponent OPS against left-handed hitters among all MLB pitchers (.377), behind only Mike Mayers (.310) and Devin Williams (.348).
- in his career, has held lefties to a .161 (22x137) average and .464 OPS. QUITE A RUN: over his last 9 Major League starts (including the postseason), dating back to Sept. 11, 2019, has gone 3-1 with a 1.98 ERA (11ER/50IP) with a .171 opponent batting average (30x175).

- recorded 25 hits during the 2019 postseason, the most by an Astros player in a single postseason in franchise history. fell one hit shy of the MLB record of 26 set by Pablo Sandoval in 2014.
- since the 2017 postseason, has more postseason homers (13) than all but one Major League player: George Springer (16)...has hit .297 (58x195) with 10 doubles, 13 HR, 30 RBI and a .913 OPS (.364 OBP/.549 SLG) since the 2017
