WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox (35-25) lost seven of their last eight regular-season games and nine of 12 as they open the American League Wild Card playoff series this afternoon at Oakland.
- RHP Lucas Giolito is scheduled to start for the White Sox, who tied Cleveland for second-place in the American League Central, 1.0 game behind the division-champion Minnesota Twins.
- The Sox own the No. 7 seed in the AL playoffs ... if the Sox advance to the ALDS, they will play either No. 1 seed Tampa Bay or No. 8 seed Toronto at Dodger Stadium in Los Angeles.
- The White Sox have qualified for the postseason for the 10th time in franchise history and first since 2008 ... they were the first team to clinch a postseason bid when they defeated Minnesota, 4-3, on 9/17 at Guaranteed Rate Field.

TODAY'S STORYLINES

- The White Sox are playing their first playoff game since Game 4 of the 2008 ALDS vs. Tampa Bay on 10/6/08 in Chicago.
- After a 1-4 start to the season, the Sox went 34-21 (.618) over their last 55 games ... they were 10-11 after being swept by St. Louis in a doubleheader on 8/15 at home, but went 25-14 (.614) over the final 39 games to secure the postseason bid.
- The Sox were in first place for 24 days, were a season-high 16 games over .500 (three times) and led the division by as many as 3.0 games (four times).
- The White Sox went 17-13 on the road in 2020, tied with Cleveland for the second-best road record in the American League, but they have lost five straight games away from home.

ROSTER MOVES

- Prior to today's game, the White Sox finalized their 28-player ALWC roster by reinstating INF/OF Leury García from the 45-day injured list and designating RHP Alex McArae for assignment
- The Sox 28-man ALWC roster includes 13 pitchers (eight RHP), three catchers, seven infielders and five outfielders.

BEEN THERE, DONE THAT

- The White Sox have qualified for the playoffs for the first time since 2008, but six members of the AL Wild Card roster have postseason experience ... Edwin Encarnación leads with 34 games, followed by Yasmani Grandal (33), Jarrod Dyson (19), Dallas Keuchel (12) and Reynaldo López (one).
- Encarnación and Grandal have played in each of the last five seasons, and Keuchel has appeared in four of the last five ... Dyson (Kansas City, 2015) and Keuchel (Houston, 2017) have been part of World Series championship clubs.

JOSÉ! JOSÉ! JOSÉ! JOSÉ!

- José Abreu is attempting to become the fourth player (fifth time) in Sox history to be named American League MVP, joining Nellie Fox (1959), Dick Allen (1972) and Frank Thomas (1993-94).
- Abreu led the major leagues with 60 RBI and ranks among the AL leaders in numerous other categories (see box at right).
- Some of Abreu's notable accomplishments in 2020:
 - ◆ Would join Minnesota's Zoilo Versalles (1965) and Oakland's Jose Canseco (1988) as the only Cuban natives named league MVP.
 - ◆ Became the first player to lead the AL in RBI in back-to-back seasons since Boston's David Ortiz in 2005-06.
 - ◆ Became the fourth player in history to lead the AL in hits and RBI (STATS) ... joined Boston's Jim Rice in 1978 (213 H/139 RBI), Boston's Carl Yastrzemski in 1967 (189 H/121 RBI) and the Yankees' Lou Gehrig in 1931 (211 H/184 RBI).
 - ◆ Is the second player (third time) in Sox history to lead the AL in RBI, the fourth (seventh time) to lead in hits, the fourth (fifth time) to lead in total bases and the sixth (eighth time) to lead in slugging percentage.
 - ◆ Was the only player to rank in the Top 5 of the following categories in the AL: hits (1st, 76), RBI (1st, 60), slugging percentage (1st, .617), extra-base hits (1st, 34), total bases (1st, 148), home runs (2nd, 19), average (4th, .317) and OPS (5th, .987).
 - ◆ Was on a 162-game pace to hit 51 home runs with 162 RBI, which would break the franchise records of 49 and 152 set by Belle in 1998.
 - ◆ Is hitting .325/.38/.600 (142-437) with 29 home runs and 106 RBI in 111 games dating back to 8/5/19 ... his 106 RBI during that span are 18 more than any other player in MLB.

SOUTHPAW SUCCESS

- The White Sox went 14-0 vs. left-handed starters in 2020, becoming the first team in MLB history to go undefeated during an entire season against either handed starters (STATS).
- The Sox batted .285/.364/.523 (126-442) with 27 homers vs. left-handers this season ... they ranked among the MLB leaders vs. lefties in slugging percentage (1st, .523), average (2nd), OPS (2nd, .887), on-base percentage (2nd) and homers (T4th, 27).
- The Sox .887 OPS vs. lefties is the second-highest by any team in a season since at least 1974 (STATS), trailing only the 2020 Detroit Tigers (.891).

WHITE SOX VS. OAKLAND A'S

- The A's lead the all-time series, 317-290, including a 167-138 edge at Oakland Coliseum.
- Oakland won the 2019 series, 5-1, sweeping a three-game series at the Coliseum from 7/12-14 by a combined 21-5 margin and winning two of three in Chicago from 8/9-11.
- Sox hitting coach Frank Menechino played in 308 games for Oakland from 1999-2004, including six postseason games.
- Four members of the A's ALWC roster either were drafted or played in the White Sox organization: RHPs Chris Bassitt, Frankie Montas and J.B. Wendelken and INF Marcus Semien.

FOLLOW THE LEADER

- Rick Renteria, who guided the White Sox to their first post-season appearance since 2008, is attempting to become the seventh manager in franchise history to be named American League Manager of the Year.
- Renteria, in his fourth season at the helm, would join Chuck Tanner (1972), Tony La Russa (1983), Jeff Torborg (1990), Gene Lamont (1993), Jerry Manuel (2000) and Ozzie Guillén (2005) as previous Sox recipients of the honor.
- Chicago's +.136 increase in winning percentage from 2019 was the largest in the AL and the third-largest in baseball behind San Diego (+.185) and Miami (+.165).

LONG BALL LOGISTICS

- The White Sox led the American League lead with 96 home runs in 2020, a franchise record through 60 games ... they were on a 162-game pace to hit 259 homers, which would have broken the franchise record of 242 set in 2004.
- The Sox, Atlanta, Dodgers and Philadelphia were the only teams in baseball to feature five players with 10-plus homers.
- The White Sox hit five-plus homers in a game five times in 2020, tying the club record set in 2003 and the most in the majors in 2020 (the Dodgers ranked second with four such games).

SOUTH SIDE HITMEN

- The White Sox led the American League in home runs, slugging percentage (.453) and run differential (+60) and ranked second in average (.261), runs scored (306) and OPS (.779) in 2020.
- The Sox led the AL in home runs for the first time since 2008 (235), slugging for the first time since 2006 (.464) (235) and run differential for the first time since 2000 (+139).

PITCHING PROWESS

- The White Sox ranked sixth in the major leagues with a 3.81 ERA, which was be their lowest mark since 2005 (3.61) ... the starting rotation ranked eighth in the majors with a 3.85 ERA, which was its lowest mark since 2005 (3.75).

GRAB SOME BENCH

- The White Sox set a franchise record by averaging 8.93 strikeouts per 9.0 IP (523 SO/527.0 IP) in 2020, breaking the mark of 8.42 set by the 2015 club.
- Lucas Giolito ranked second in the American League with behind Cleveland's Shane Bieber with a franchise-record 12.07 strikeouts per 9.0 IP (97 SO/72.1 IP), eclipsing the previous standard of 11.82 set by Chris Sale in 2015 ... Giolito also owns the third-best single-season mark of 11.62 in 2017.

NOTHING AVERAGE ABOUT TA

- Tim Anderson attempted to become the 15th player (19th time) in history to lead the American League in average in back-to-back seasons, the first since Houston's José Altuve in 2016-17 and the first in White Sox history to accomplish the feat.
- Anderson finished second in the American League behind the Yankees' DJ LeMahieu (.364) with a .322 average after leading the majors in 2019 with a .335 mark.
- Ty Cobb (1907-15, '17-19), Ted Williams (1941-42, '47-48) and Rod Carew (1972-75, '77-78) are the only players in history to lead the AL in average over two separate stints.
- Is hitting .331/.357/.514 (234-706) with 43 doubles, 28 home runs, 77 RBI and 126 runs scored in 172 games since the start of the 2019 season ... his .331 average during that span ranks second in the major leagues behind DJ LeMahieu (.336).

REMEMBERING FARMIO

- The White Sox are wearing a patch this season in honor of Ed Farmer, who worked as the club's radio broadcaster for nearly 30 years before passing away on 4/1 at age 70.
- A native of Evergreen Park, Ill. and graduate of St. Rita High School in Chicago, Farmer concluded his 29th full season in the Sox radio booth in 2019, and 14th handling play-by-play.

GIOLITO AT A GLANCE

- Is scheduled to make his first career postseason start ... made 12 starts during the regular season, including seven vs. teams with a winning record, eight vs. postseason teams and five on the road.
● Allowed three earned runs or less in each of his last seven starts (five quality), going 3-1 with a 2.62 ERA (13 ER/44.2 IP), .147/.211/.263 slash line, just five homers allowed and 65 strikeouts.
● Is scheduled to make his 30th career start on five days rest ... has gone 10-13 with a 4.58 ERA (87 ER/171.0 IP) lifetime.
● Is 11-3 with a 2.82 ERA (38 ER/121.1 IP), .208/.269/.361 slash line, 1.05 WHIP, 161 strikeouts and 14 homers allowed in 19 road starts (14 QS) since 2019 ... his only loss in his last 11 road starts since 2019 came on 9/11/19 at Atlanta (4 ER/6.0 IP).
● His 97 strikeouts were the most by a White Sox through his first 12 appearances of a season since LHP Chris Sale in 2015 (105).
● Was named AL Player of the Week for 8/24-30 (no-hitter on 8/25).
● Is 31-28 with a 4.33 ERA (225 ER/467.2 IP), 484 strikeouts, a 1.20 WHIP, .218/.301/.393 slash line and 66 homers allowed in 80 career starts (45 QS) with Chicago ... made his Sox debut on 8/22/17.

LAST START

- Received a ND in his final regular season start on 9/23 at Cleveland ... allowed two runs on four hits, including one home run, with three walks and 11 strikeouts in 6.0 IP.
● Surrendered runs in the second (solo HR to Carlos Santana) and sixth ... allowed just two hits and zero runs in the other four frames.
● Left the game with Cleveland winning, 2-1, after throwing a career-high 119 pitches (76 strikes) ... the Sox tied the game in the eighth but Jordan Luplow hit a game-ending HR in the ninth (3-2 win).
● Owned a 50.0 first-pitch strike percentage, and a 34.9 swing-and-miss percentage (22 whiffs/63 swings) vs. 24 batters ... threw 64 four-seam fastballs (93.6 mph avg; 96.2 mph max), 31 changeups (81.3 avg; 83.2 max) and 24 sliders (84.8 avg; 87.2 max).

POSTING PUNCHOUTS

- Ranked second in the American League with 97 strikeouts and 12.07 strikeouts per 9.0 IP, both behind Cleveland's Shane Bieber (122 strikeouts; 14.20 strikeouts per 9.0 IP).
● His seven starts with eight-plus strikeouts are tied with the Yankees' Gerrit Cole for the third-most in the AL this season behind Bieber (12) and Tampa Bay's Tyler Glasnow (eight).
● His 9.31 strikeouts-per-9.0 IP mark (484 SO/467.2 IP) with the Sox is the third-best in club history (minimum 450.0 IP) behind LHPs Chris Sale (10.09) and Matt Thornton (9.44).
● Has recorded nine career starts with 10-plus strikeouts, including a career-high 13 on 8/11/19 vs. Oakland, 8/20/20 vs. Detroit and 8/25/20 vs. Pittsburgh (no-hitter).

LACK OF THE LONG BALL

- Allowed just eight homers this season, tied for eighth-fewest in the American League (min. 60.0 IP) ... teammate Dallas Keuchel allowed the fewest home runs with just two.
● Surrendered just five home runs since the fifth inning on 8/4 at Milwaukee, a span of 63.2 IP ... recorded a 29.0 homerless IP streak from the fifth on 8/4 through the second inning on 8/31 at Minnesota, the second-longest of his career (30.1 IP from 5/2-23/19).

ROUGH ROUTE FOR RIGHTIES

- Limited right-handers to a .190/.254/.295 (19-97) slash line in 2020 ... ranked among American League leaders vs. righties in slugging pct. (4th), OPS (6th, .549), average (7th), and on-base pct. (9th).
● Fifteen of his 20 hits allowed vs. right-handers in 2020 were singles (also two doubles and three homers) ... surrendered a home run to a right-hander in three of his last five starts: Miguel Sanó on 8/31 at Target Field, Bubba Starling on 9/5 at Kauffman Stadium and Byron Buxton on 9/16 in Chicago.
● Has allowed just one home run to a right-hander (Buxton) at Guaranteed Rate Field over his last 84 batters faced ... prior to Buxton, the last right-hander to homer in Chicago was Hunter Dozier on 9/12/19.

MINNESOTA ... NOT SO NICE

- Is 0-2 with a 7.36 ERA (12 ER/14.2 IP), 15 strikeouts, five home runs and an .803 OPS in three starts vs. Minnesota this season ... has allowed four-plus runs and two home runs twice.
● By comparison, is 4-1 with a 2.50 ERA (16 ER/57.2 IP), 82 strikeouts and just three homers allowed in his other nine starts vs. Cleveland (3x), Detroit (2x), Kansas City, Milwaukee, Pittsburgh and St. Louis.

NO HITS AND NO CHANGE

- Threw his first career no-hitter on 8/25 vs. Pittsburgh.
● Issued one walk with a career-high tying 13 strikeouts (101 pitches/74 strikes) ... walked Erik González on four pitches to lead off the fourth inning for the only baserunner ... James McCann was the catcher.
● Was the first Sox to face one over the minimum since Jeff Samardzija on 9/21/15 at Detroit (one-hitter).
● Below is additional information and notable accomplishments from his no-hitter:
○ Marked the 19th in White Sox history, second-most in MLB history behind the Dodgers (26).
○ Was the 305th in MLB history (regular and postseason combined), and first since Houston's Justin Verlander on 9/1/19 at Toronto (STATS LLC) ... also was the first of the 2020 season.P.
○ The last by a White Sox was Philip Humber's perfect game on 4/21/12 at Seattle ... the last by a Sox at Guaranteed Rate Field was Mark Buehrle's perfect game on 7/23/09 vs. Tampa Bay.
○ Minnesota's Francisco Liriano recorded the last no-hitter at Guaranteed Rate Field on 5/3/11.
○ Was the youngest White Sox since LHP Wilson Álvarez (21 years old) on 8/11/91 at Baltimore.
○ His 13 strikeouts were the most by a White Sox ... Humber previously held the mark with nine.
○ It was the first by a White Sox vs. a National League team.
○ Joined Sandy Koufax as only pitchers ever with 13-plus strikeouts and less than 105 pitches.
○ His 30 swing and misses were the most in a no-hitter since Nolan Ryan (31) in 1990.
○ At 6-foot-7, became the tallest pitcher since the Angels' Jered Weaver (also 6-foot-7) on 5/2/12 vs. the Twins.

OPENING HONORS

- Was the White Sox Opening Day starter, just the fourth right-hander since 2000 to start the opener for the Sox, following James Shields (2018), Jeff Samardzija (2015) and José Contreras (2007).
● At 26.010 years old, was the sixth-youngest OD starter for the Sox since 1996 following Mark Buehrle (2002; 23.009), Chris Sale (2013; 24.002), Buehrle (2003; 24.008), Sale (2014; 25.001) and Buehrle (2004; 25.013).
● Was the sixth different pitcher in as many years to start the opener, joining Samardzija, Sale (2016), LHP José Quintana (2017), Shields and LHP Carlos Rodón (2019).

- Is scheduled to make his third career start vs. Oakland and first at the Oakland Coliseum ... is 1-1 with a 4.15 ERA (6 ER/13.0 IP), 21 strikeouts, a .240/.283/.420 (12-50) slash line with two homers lifetime.
● Has allowed homers to current A's Matt Olson and Robbie Grossman.
● Suffered the loss in his last start on 8/11/19 at Guaranteed Rate Field after allowing two runs on five hits with a career-high tying 13 strikeouts over 6.0 IP ... worked 7.0 IP and surrendered four runs with eight strikeouts in a wwin on 6/22/18 in Chicago.

CAREER INFORMATION

- Was acquired with RHPs Reynaldo López and Dane Dunning from Washington for OF Adam Eaton on 12/7/16 ... selected by the Nationals in the first round (No. 16) of the 2012 draft (was committed to UCLA).
● Went 0-1 with a 6.75 mark (16 ER/21.1 IP) in six games (four starts) with Washington in 2016 ... made his MLB debut as a 21-year-old starter with the Nationals on 6/28/16 vs. the Mets (4.0 scoreless IP).
● Underwent Tommy John surgery in September 2012.
● Was teammates with St. Louis' RHP Jack Flaherty and Atlanta's LHP Max Fried at Harvard-Westlake (Calif.) High School.

PROBABLE GAME 2 STARTER: LHP DALLAS KEUCHEL

- LHP Dallas Keuchel (6-2, 1.99 ERA) is scheduled to make his 12th career playoff start and second in the Wild Card round (2015 with HOU).
● Ranked among the American League leaders in ERA (2nd), opp. OPS (3rd, .556), groundball rate (3rd, 53.3) and WHIP (8th, 1.09).
● Allowed two runs or less 10 times and one or less six times over his 11 outings in 2020 ... owns a 0.45 ERA (1 ER/20.0 IP) with 16 strikeouts and a .586 opponents OPS over four starts since 9/1.
● Is 4-2 with a 3.47 ERA (23 ER/59.1 IP), .234/.296/.405 slash line, 52 strikeouts and eight homers allowed in 12 career games (11 GS/4 QS) in the postseason with Houston (2015, '17-18) and Atlanta (2019).
