### #7 CHICAGO WHITE SOX (1-0) AT #2 OAKLAND A'S (0-1)

LHP Dallas Keuchel (2020: 6-2, 1.99 ERA) vs. RHP Chris Bassitt (2020: 5-2, 2.29 ERA)

#### WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The No. 7 seed Chicago White Sox continue the American League Wild Card Series on the road this afternoon with Game 2 against No. 2 seed and AL West division champion Oakland.
- LHP Dallas Keuchel is scheduled to start for the White Sox, who with a victory today will advance to the AL Division Series, where they would face either No. 3 seed Minnesota or No. 6 seed Houston at Dodger Stadium in Los Angeles.
- The White Sox have qualified for the postseason for the 10th time in franchise history and first since 2008 ... the Sox tied Cleveland for second-place in the AL Central, 1.0 game behind the division-champion Minnesota Twins.
- They were the first team to clinch a postseason bid when they defeated Minnesota, 4-3, on 9/17 at Guaranteed Rate Field.

#### TODAY'S STORYLINES

- The White Sox are looking to record back-to-back postseason road wins for the first time since 2005 (six) ... the Sox also are in position to record the third postseason sweep in franchise history (2005 ALDS vs. Boston and 2005 World Series vs. Houston).
- Rick Renteria is looking to join Ozzie Guillen (three in 2005), Clarence Rowland (1917) and Fielder Jones (1906) as the only managers in Sox history to win a postseason series.
- Dallas Keuchel is 4-2 with a 3.47 ERA (23 ER/59.2 IP) in 12 career postseason games (11 starts) and 6-6 with a 3.06 ERA (48 ER/141.1 IP) in 22 career games (20 starts) against Oakland.
- José Abreu has 20 combined home runs this season and 199 for his career, regular and postseason combined.

#### YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- Lucas Giolito combined with three relievers on a three-hitter, and Adam Engel and José Abreu homered to lead Chicago to a 4-1 win at Oakland in Game 1 of the AL Wild Card series.
- Giolito, making his postseason debut, held the A's to one run on two hits over 7.0 IP with one walk and eight strikeouts ... he retired the first 18 batters in order before allowing a leadoff single to Tommy La Stella in the seventh inning ... Giolito became the fifth pitcher in MLB history (first White Sox) to be perfect through 6.0 IP of a postseason start.
- Engel hit a solo homer off Jesús Lizardo in the second, and Abreu hit a two-run shot in the third to give the Sox a 3-0 lead ... Tim Anderson went 3-4 with a run scored, and Yasmani Grandal added a solo shot in the eighth to extend the lead to 4-0.
- Evan Marshall (Hold; 0.2 IP), Aaron Bummer (Hold; 0.1) and Alex Colomé (SV; 1.0) combined for 2.0 scoreless IP in relief.
- All four White Sox pitchers and eight of the nine members of the starting lineup (minus Grandal) made their playoff debuts.
- The Sox played their first playoff game since Game 4 of the 2008 ALDS vs. Tampa Bay on 10/6/08 in Chicago, and recorded their first playoff win since Game 3 of that 2008 ALDS.

#### MORE FROM GAME 1

- Lucas Giolito was attempting to join Philadelphia's Roy Halladay (2010) as the only pitchers in MLB history to throw no-hitters in the same regular and postseason.
- Giolito became the second Sox starter to throw 7.0-plus IP and allow one run or less and two hits or less in the postseason, joining Ed Walsh in Game 3 of the 1906 World Series vs. the Cubs.
- His eight strikeouts tied Britt Burns (Game 4, 1983 ALCS) and Eddie Cicotte (Game 3, 1917 WS) for the second-highest total in Sox playoff history, behind only Walsh's 12 in 1906 (Game 3).
- Adam Engel became the first player in White Sox history to homer in his first career postseason at-bat ... Engel also is the first Sox player with an extra-base hit in his first two career postseason plate appearances, and the first AL player since Tampa Bay's Evan Longoria in Game 1 of the 2008 ALDS vs. the White Sox.
- Tim Anderson joined Rudy Law (1983), Ted Kluszewski and Jim Landis (1959) and Shano Collins (1917) as the only players in Sox history to record 3-plus hits in his postseason debut.
- The Sox defeated Jesús Lizardo after going 14-0 vs. lefty starters during the regular season, the first team in MLB history to finish a season undefeated against either handed starter.

#### BEEN THERE, DONE THAT

- The White Sox have qualified for the playoffs for the first time since 2008, but four members of the AL Wild Card roster have postseason experience ... Edwin Encarnación leads with 34 games, followed by Yasmani Grandal (33), Jarrod Dyson (19), and Dallas Keuchel (12).
- Encarnación and Grandal have played in each of the last five postseasons, and Keuchel has appeared in four of the last five ... Dyson (Kansas City, 2015) and Keuchel (Houston, 2017) have been part of World Series championship clubs.

#### WHITE SOX VS. OAKLAND A'S

- The A's lead the all-time series, 317-290, including a 167-138 edge at Oakland Coliseum.
- Oakland won the 2019 series, 5-1, sweeping a three-game series at the Coliseum from 7/12-14 by a combined 21-5 margin and winning two of three in Chicago from 8/9-11.
- Sox hitting coach Frank Menechino played in 308 games for Oakland from 1999-2004, including six postseason games.
- Five members of the A's ALWC roster either were drafted by or played in the White Sox organization: RHPs Chris Bassitt, Frankie Montas, Joakim Soria and J.B. Wendelken and INF Marcus Semien.

#### JOSÉ! JOSÉ! JOSÉ! JOSÉ!

- José Abreu is attempting to become the fourth player (fifth time) in Sox history to be named American League MVP, joining Nellie Fox (1959), Dick Allen (1972) and Frank Thomas (1993-94).
- Abreu led the major leagues with 60 RBI and ranks among the AL leaders in numerous other categories (see box at right).
- Some of Abreu's notable accomplishments in 2020:
  - Would join Minnesota's Zoilo Versalles (1965) and Oakland's Jose Canseco (1988) as the only Cuban natives named league MVP.
  - Became the first player to lead the AL in RBI in back-to-back seasons since Boston's David Ortiz in 2005-06.
  - Became the fourth player in history to lead the AL in hits and RBI (STATS) ... joined Boston's Jim Rice in 1978 (213 H/139 RBI), Boston's Carl Yastrzemski in 1967 (189 H/121 RBI) and the Yankees' Lou Gehrig in 1931 (211 H/184 RBI).
  - Is the second player (third time) in Sox history to lead the AL in RBI, the fourth (seventh time) to lead in hits, the fourth (fifth time) to lead in total bases and the sixth (eighth time) to lead in slugging percentage.
  - Was the only player to rank in the Top 5 of the following categories in the AL: hits (1st, 76), RBI (1st, 60), slugging percentage (1st, .617), extra-base hits (1st, 34), total bases (1st, 148), home runs (2nd, 19), average (4th, .317) and OPS (.987).
  - Was on a 162-game pace to hit 51 home runs with 162 RBI, which would break the franchise records of 49 and 152 set by Belle in 1998.
  - Is hitting .325/.38/600 (142-437) with 29 home runs and 106 RBI in 111 games dating back to 8/5/19 ... his 106 RBI during that span are 18 more than any other player in MLB.

#### FOLLOW THE LEADER

- Rick Renteria, who guided the White Sox to their first postseason appearance since 2008, is attempting to become the seventh manager in franchise history to be named American League Manager of the Year.
- Renteria, in his fourth season at the helm, would join Chuck Tanner (1972), Tony La Russa (1983), Jeff Torborg (1990), Gene Lamont (1993), Jerry Manuel (2000) and Ozzie Guillén (2005) as previous Sox recipients of the honor.
- Chicago's +.136 increase in winning percentage from 2019 was the largest in the AL and the third-largest in baseball behind San Diego (+.185) and Miami (+.165).

#### ROAD WARRIORS

- The White Sox went 17-13 (.567) on the road, tied for the fifth-best record in the major leagues and their best mark since 2005 (18-10).
- The White Sox went 7-0 at Kansas City, marking the second time in franchise history they have gone 7-0 or better on the road against a team.

#### LONG BALL LOGISTICS

- The White Sox led the American League lead with 96 home runs in 2020, a franchise record through 60 games ... they were on a 162-game pace to hit 259 homers, which would have broken the franchise record of 242 set in 2004.
- The Sox, Atlanta, Dodgers and Philadelphia were the only teams in baseball to feature five players with 10-plus homers.
- The White Sox hit five-plus homers in a game five times in 2020, tying the club record set in 2003 and the most in the majors in 2020 (the Dodgers ranked second with four such games).

#### SOUTH SIDE HITMEN

- The White Sox led the American League in home runs, slugging percentage (.453) and run differential (+60) and ranked second in average (.261), runs scored (306) and OPS (.779) in 2020.
- The Sox led the AL in home runs for the first time since 2008 (235), slugging for the first time since 2006 (.464) (235) and run differential for the first time since 2000 (+139).

#### PITCHING PROWESS

- The White Sox ranked sixth in the major leagues with a 3.81 ERA, which was be their lowest mark since 2005 (3.61) ... the starting rotation ranked eighth in the majors with a 3.85 ERA, which was its lowest mark since 2005 (3.75).

KEUCHEL AT A GLANCE

- Is scheduled to make his 13th career postseason appearance and 12th start this afternoon.
Ranked third in the major leagues with a 1.99 ERA (14 ER/63.1 IP) in 2020, trailing only Cleveland's Shane Bieber (1.63) and Cincinnati's Trevor Bauer (1.73) ... his 1.99 ERA is the sixth-lowest by a White Sox starting pitcher since 1920 and the lowest since Wilbur Wood posted a 1.91 mark in 1971.
Allowed three runs or less in all 11 of his starts, including four runs four times and no runs twice.
Agreed to terms on a three-year, \$55.5-million contract on 12/30/19, which includes a club option for 2023 ... pitched for Atlanta in 2019 after spending his first seven seasons with Houston (2012-18).
Is a two-time American League All-Star (2015, '17) and four-time Rawlings Gold Glove Award winner (2014-16, '18).
Has recorded a sub-3.00 ERA three times in his career and has thrown 200.0-plus IP three times.
Won the AL Cy Young Award and finished fifth in the Most Valuable Player Voting in 2015 after going 20-8 with a 2.48 ERA (64 ER/232.0 IP) and 216 strikeouts over 33 starts with Houston.
Is one of just nine pitchers in baseball (three left-handers) since 2015 to win 20-plus games in a season.
Originally was selected in the seventh round in 2009 out of Arkansas, where he was teammates with Sox catcher James McCann in 2009.

NO SUBSTITUTE FOR EXPERIENCE

- Owens a career 4-2 record with a 3.47 ERA (23 ER/59.2 IP), 52 strikeouts and a .234 (52-222) opponents average in 12 career appearances (11 starts) in the postseason (2015, '17-19).
His 11 postseason starts since 2015 are tied for third in the major leagues, his 59.2 IP rank fourth and his four victories are tied for seventh.
Was a member of the 2017 World Series Champion Astros ... started Games 1 and 5 of the Fall Classic against the Dodgers.

BETTER WITH AGE

- Lowered his numbers from 2019 in numerous categories, including ERA (3.75 to 1.99), opponents average (.265 to .218), WHIP (1.37 to 1.09), HR/9.0 IP (1.28 to 0.28) and walks per 9.0 IP (3.12 to 2.42).

FAST STARTER

- Posted a 0.67 ERA (4 ER/54.0 IP) in innings 1-5 this season and a 9.64 mark (10 ER/9.1 IP) in innings 6-8 ... did not give up a run in the first two innings (22.0 IP).

FINISHING MOVE

- Went 3-0 with a 1.06 ERA (4 ER/34.0 IP) and 26 strikeouts over his final six starts of the season, including a 1-0 record with a 0.45 ERA (1 ER/20.0 IP) over four starts in September ... threw 11.0 consecutive scoreless IP from 9/6-24.

KEEP IT IN THE YARD

- His average of 0.28 homers per 9.0 IP (2 HR/63.1 IP) in 2020 was the best in the major leagues and the third-best by a Sox pitcher since 1950, behind only Ken Brett (0.22 in 1976) and Dennis Lamp (0.28 in 1981).

2020 NOTES OF INTEREST

- Was on the 10-day injured list from 9/7-18 with back spasms ... left his start on 9/6 at Kansas City after 5.0 scoreless IP (49 pitches) ... earned the win on 8/21 at the Cubs (1 ER/8.0 IP), his longest outting since 5/7/18 at Oakland (also 8.0) ... carried a three-hit shutout into the eighth ... carried a one-hit shutout into the sixth on 8/16 vs. St. Louis ... earned the win in his Sox debut on 7/25 vs. Minnesota (2 ER/5.1 IP) ... retired the first nine batters and faced 16 through 5.0 IP.

GROUND AND POUND

- Since making his major-league debut in 2012, ranks second among all major-league pitchers in both ground ball percentage (59.4) and ground ball/fly ball ratio (2.97) ... those marks also are fourth-best in the majors since the stats were first tracked in 1987.
Ranked second in the AL behind Houston's Framber Valdez in ground balls induced (114), ground ball percentage (53.3) and GB/FB ratio (2.74).
His 67.3 groundball rate in 2017 was the fourth-best, single-season mark in the majors since 1987, trailing three seasons produced by RHP Derek Lowe (67.7 in 2006, 67.7 in 2003 and 63.3 in 2002).
Led the majors in groundball rate in 2018 (54.7) and 2014 (64.4), and ranked second in 2015 (62.3).

LIMITING THE LEFT SIDE

- Has limited left-handers to a .225 (247-1,096) average during his career, the fourth-best mark among active lefty starters ... lefties hit .171/.244/.171 (7-41) with no extra-base hits in 2020 ... ranked among the AL leaders in opponents slugging percentage (1st), OPS (2nd, .415), average (4th) and on-base percentage (9th) vs. left-handed batters this season.
Held lefties to a .145 (16-110) average in 2017, the best mark among major-league starters.

CY YOUNG PEDIGREE

- Won the American League Cy Young Award and finished fifth in the Most Valuable Player voting in 2015 after going 20-8 with a 2.48 ERA and 216 strikeouts over 33 starts with Houston.
Is the first former Cy Young Award winner to pitch for the White Sox since Jake Peavy in 2013 (won with San Diego in 2007).

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE

- Is 47-31 with a 3.05 ERA (237 ER/700.1 IP) in 111 career games (105 starts) at home, compared to 43-42 with a 4.17 ERA (308 ER/665.0 IP) in 111 games (108 starts) on the road.
Went 3-1 with a 1.60 ERA (7 ER/39.1 IP) over seven road starts in 2020 ... his 1.60 ERA led the AL and ranked second in the majors behind Bauer (1.60).
Went 15-0 with a 1.46 ERA (21 ER/129.1 IP) and 139 strikeouts at home during the 2015 regular season, while winning his only home postseason start in the ALDS vs. Kansas City.
Became the first pitcher in MLB history to finish a season undefeated at home with at least 15 wins, breaking the record held by Boo Ferris and Tex Hughson, who both went 13-0 for the Red Sox in 1946.

The A's are hitting .238/.292/.352 (127-534) ... has made 15 quality starts, including a complete-game victory on 7/30/14 (1 ER/9.0 IP).
Has not faced Oakland since 8/29/18 at Houston's Minute Maid Park when he allowed three runs on eight hits over 6.0 IP of a ND ... his last start in Oakland came on 8/18/18 when he gave up five runs on nine hits over 5.2 IP in a losing effort ... threw 9.0 scoreless IP in a ND on 4/24/15 at Oakland.

- The White Sox postseason bullpen is comprised of nine pitchers (five right-handers and four lefties).
- Relievers went 17-10 with a 3.76 ERA (100 ER/239.1 IP), 13 saves, 32 holds and a .228 (207-908) opponents average over 59 games in the regular season.
