RHP Dane Dunning (2-0, 3.97 ERA in 2020) vs. RHP Mike Fiers (6-3, 4.58 ERA in 2020) AL Wild Card |Game \#3 • Thursday, October 1 • 2:10 p.m. CT • Oakland Coliseum


- The No. 7 seed Chicago White Sox conclude the American League Wild Card Series on the road this afternoon with the deciding Game 3 against No. 2 seed Oakland, the AL West division champions
- Rookie RHP Dane Dunning is scheduled to open the game for the White Sox, who with a victory today will advance to the AL Division Series, where they would face No. 6 seed Houston at Dodger Stadium in Los Angeles.
- The White Sox have qualified for the postseason for the 10th time in franchise history and first since 2008 ... the Sox tied Cleveland for second-place in the AL Central, 1.0 game behind the division-champion Minnesota Twins.
- They were the first team to clinch a postseason bid when they defeated Minnesota, 4-3, on 9/17 at Guaranteed Rate Field.


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- The White Sox are playing the first postseason "win-or-gohome" game in franchise history and first overall since Game 163 of the 2008 season when they defeated Minnesota, 1-0, to win the American League Central title.
- Dane Dunning is scheduled to become the third rookie in Sox history to start a postseason game, joining Jason Bere (Game 4, 1993 ALCS ) and Dickey Kerr (Games 3 and 6, 1919 World Series). - Tim Anderson become the seventh player in MLB history to collect three-plus hits in each of his first two career postseason games, and first since St. Louis's Jim Edmonds in 2000.
- Yasmani Grandal is the first player in White Sox history to homer in each of his first two postseason games with the club, and third overall to homer in back-to-back games in the playoffs following Paul Konerko (10/14-15) and Joe Crede (10/16-22) in 2005. Grandal has homered in three straight postseason games dating back to the 2019 NL Wild Card Game, driving in six runs.
- Rick Renteria is looking to join Ozzie Guillen (three in 2005), Clarence Rowland (1917) and Fielder Jones (1906) as the only managers in Sox history to win a postseason series.


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- A late-inning rally was not enough to overcome a 5-0 deficit as the White Sox suffered a 5-3 loss at Oakland, evening the ALWC series at one game apiece.
- Trailing, 5-0, entering the eighth, Yasmani Grandal hit a tworun homer off Liam Hendriks to cut the deficit to 5-2 ... the Sox loaded the bases off Hendriks in the ninth on two-out singles by rookie Nick Madrigal and Tim Anderson and a walk by Yoán Moncada ... Grandal walked to force in Madrigal, but José Abreu, who led MLB with 60 RBI, grounded out to second base to end the game.
- Grandal drive in all three White Sox runs, Tim Anderson went 3-5 with a run scored, and Madrigal was 2-4 with a run scored but also made a pair of errors at second base.
- Dallas Keuchel suffered the loss, allowing five runs (three earned) on six hits over 3.1 IP ... Keuchel did not issue a walk and struck out four but gave up two home runs, matching his sesaon total in 63.1 IP entering the start.
- Jimmy Cordero (2.2 IP), Dylan Cease (1.0) and rookie Codi Heuer (1.0) combined for 4.2 scoreless IP in relief.

- The White Sox bullpen has thrown 6.2 scoreless IP in the series.
- The Sox are 1-14 (.071) with RISP in this series (15 LOB).
- Lucas Giolito (Game 1) became the second Sox starter to throw 7.0-plus IP and allow one run or less and two hits or less in the postseason, joining Ed Walsh in Game 3 of the 1906 World Series vs. the Cubs.
- Giolito became the fifth pitcher in MLB history (first White Sox)
to be perfect through 6.0 IP of a postseason start.
- Adam Engel became the first player in White Sox history to homer in his first carer postseason at-bat ... Engel also is the first Sox player with an extra-base hit in his first two career postseason plate appearances, and the first AL player since Tampa Bay's Evan Longoria in Game 1 of the 2008 ALDS vs. the White Sox.


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- The White Sox have qualified for the playoffs for the first time since 2008, but four members of the AL Wild Card roster have postseason experience ... Edwin Encarnación leads with 34 games, followed by Yasmani Grandal (33), Jarrod Dyson (19), and Dallas Keuchel (12).
- Encarnación and Grandal have played in each of the last five postseasons, and Keuchel has appeared in four of the last five Dyson (Kansas City, 2015) and Keuchel (Houston, 2017) have been part of World Series championship clubs.

- The A's lead the all-time series, 317-290, including a 167-138 edge at Oakland Coliseum.
- Oakland won the 2019 series, 5-1, sweeping a three-game series at the Coliseum from 7/12-14 by a combined 21-5 margin and winning two of three in Chicago from 8/9-11.
- Sox hitting coach Frank Menechino played in 308 games for Oakland from 1999-2004, including six postseason games.
- Five members of the A's ALWC roster either were drafted by or played in the White Sox organization: RHPs Chris Bassitt, Frankie Montas, Joakim Soria and J.B. Wendelken and INF Marcus Semien.


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- José Abreu is attempting to become the fourth player (fifth time) in Sox history to be named American League MVP, joining Nellie Fox (1959), Dick Allen (1972) and Frank Thomas (1993-94).
- Abreu led the major leagues with 60 RBI and ranks among the AL leaders in numerous other categories (see box at right).
- Some of Abreu's notable accomplishments in 2020:
- Would join Minnesota's Zoilo Versalles (1965) and Oakland's Jose - Became the first player to lead the AL in RBI in back-to-back seasons since Boston's David Ortíz in 2005-06.
- Became the fourth player in history to lead the AL in hits and RBI (STATS) ... joined Boston's Jim Rice in 1978 (213 H/139 RBI), Boston's Carl Yastrzemski in 1967 ( $189 \mathrm{H} / 121 \mathrm{RBI}$ ) and the Yankees' Lou Gehrig in 1931 ( 211 H/184 RBI).
- Is the second player (third time) in Sox history to lead the AL in RBI, the fourth (seventh time) to lead in hits, the fourth (fifth time) to lead in total bases and the sixth (eighth time) to lead in slugging percentage.
- Was the only player to rank in the Top 5 of the following categories in the AL: hits (1st, 76), RBI (1st, 60), slugging percentage (1st, .617), extra-base hits (1st, 34), total bases (1st,
average (4th, 317) and OPS ( 5 th, 987 )
- Was on a 162 -game pace to hit 51 home runs with 162 RBI, which would break the franchise records of 49 and 152 set by Belle in 1998.
$\bullet$ Is hitting $.325 / .38 / .600$ (142-437) with 29 home runs and 106 RBI in 111 games dating back to $8 / 5 / 19 \ldots$ his 106 RBI during that span are 18 more than any other player in MLB.


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- Rick Renteria, who guided the White Sox to their first postseason appearance since 2008, is attempting to become the seventh manager in franchise history to be named American League Manager of the Year.
- Renteria, in his fourth season at the helm, would join Chuck Tanner (1972), Tony La Russa (1983), Jeff Torborg (1990), Gene Lamont (1993), Jerry Manuel (2000) and Ozzie Guillén (2005) as previous Sox recipients of the honor.
- Chicago's +. 136 increase in winning percentage from 2019 was the largest in the AL and the third-largest in baseball behind San Diego (+.185) and Miami (+.165).

- The White Sox went 17-13 (.567) on the road, tied for the fifth-best record in the major leagues and their best mark since 2005 (18-10).
- The White Sox went 7-0 at Kansas City, marking the second time in franchise history they have gone 7-0 or better on the road against a team


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- The White Sox led the American League lead with 96 home runs in 2020, a franchise record through 60 games ... they were on a 162-game pace to hit 259 homers, which would have broken the franchise record of 242 set in 2004.
- The Sox, Atlanta, Dodgers and Philadelphia were the only teams in baseball to feature five players with 10-plus homers. - The White Sox hit five-plus homers in a game five times in 2020, tying the club record set in 2003 and the most in the majors in 2020 (the Dodgers ranked second with four such games).


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- The White Sox led the American League in home runs, slugging percentage (.453) and run differential (+60) and ranked second in average (.261), runs scored (306) and OPS (.779) in 2020. - The Sox led the AL in home runs for the first time since 2008 (235), slugging for the first time since 2006 (.464) (235) and run differential for the firs time since $2000(+139)$.

- The White Sox ranked sixth in the major leagues with a 3.81 ERA, which was be their lowest mark since 2005 (3.61) ... the starting rotation ranked eighth in the majors with a 3.85 ERA, which was its lowest mark since 2005 (3.75).

- The 25-year-old, right-hander is scheduled to make his first postseason appearance... made seven starts during the regular season, including three vs. teams with a winning record, four at home and three on the road ... entered the 2020 season rated by MLB.com as the No. 6 prospect in the White Sox organization and by Baseball America as the No. 8 prospect in the Sox system.
- Was the ninth White Sox player to make his major-league debut in 2020 and is one of 12, joining RHP Zack Burdi, LHP Garrett Crochet, LHP Bernardo Flores Jr., RHP Matt Foster, OF Luis González, RHP Codi Heuer, RHP Jimmy Lambert, 2B Nick Madrigal, C Yermín Mercedes, OF Luis Robert and RHP Jonathan Stiever.
- Missed the entire 2019 season after undergoing Tommy John surgery in March 2019.
- Went a combined 6-3 with a 2.71 ERA (26 ER/86.1 IP), 100 strikeouts and a 235 (77-328) opponents average over 15 starts between Class A Winston-Salem and Class AA Birmingham.
- Has gone 17-13 with a 2.74 ERA ( $81 \mathrm{ER} / 266.0$ IP), 300 strikeouts and a 229 (230-1,006) opponents average in 49 starts over three career minor-league seasons in the Washington (2016) and White Sox organizations (2017-18).
- Was acquired by the White Sox from Washington with RHP Lucas Giolito and RHP Reynaldo López in exchange for OF Adam Eaton (12/7/16).

- Left the game with the Cubs leading, 5-2, in the fourth inning ... threw 64 pitches ( 32 strikes) ... the Sox scored five runs in the fourth and two in the sixth on their way to a 9-5 victory over the Cubs.

- Dickey Kerr went 2-0 with a 1.42 ERA (3 ER/19.0 IP) in two starts in the 1919 World Series.


## 2020 HIGHLIGHTS

- Struck out 35 batters over his first seven career appearances, tied with John Danks (2007) and Dylan Cease (2019) for the second-most in franchise history ... Jason Bere struck out 38 over his first seven career appearances in 1993.
- Became the sixth White Sox rookie to not allow a hit in at least 5.0 IP on $8 / 30$ against Kansas City, and first since Wilson Álvarez's no-hitter on 8/11/91 at Baltimore ... became the first rookie with at least 5.0 hitless IP within his first two starts since Alvarez in1991 ... became the sixth White Sox starter ever to throw between 5.0-8.2 hitless IP, and first since Reynaldo López on 8/25/19 vs. Texas (5.0 IP).
