BAY BASEBALL: The Dodgers won their third straight game, doubling up the Rockies, 4-2, in the finale of their four-game set on Sunday afternoon. Los Angeles improved to 25-8 in their last 33 games against the Rockies, including five of their last seven wins at Coors Field. The Dodgers continue their seven-game road trip (3-1) with a three-game set against the American League West Champion Oakland Athletics. After the conclusion of the series and an off-day Thursday, the club will begin its 60th season of Dodger Baseball at Dodger Stadium on Friday at 1:10 p.m. against the Washington Nationals.

LA Through four games, the Dodger offense has been clicking, batting .329 (47-for-143) with 18 extra-base hits and 23 walks. The club leads the National League in BA, OBP (.424), slugging (.51) and OPS (.935).

LA Yesterday, **Julio Urias** twirled a gem, tossing a career-high 7.0 innings, allowing one run on three hits with six strikeouts against one walk. The southpaw recorded his first victory on the back of his changeup, which resulted in eight swing and misses and .000 batting average against (0-for-11) with four of six strikeouts on the change.

INTERLEAGUE SHOWDOWN: Last season, the Dodgers went 2-1 against the Oakland Athletics in their lone interleague bout from September 22-24. The Dodgers went on to sweep the Angels in the final series of the season to finish the season 16-4 in interleague play, which is tied for their best interleague mark in franchise history with the 2017 Dodgers, who also went 16-4 in interleague play. Since 2017, the Dodgers are 54-26 in interleague play and have not had a losing record in interleague play since 2012 when they went 6-9 in 2012. According to SportRadar, the Dodgers 16-4 mark was amongst the best all-time against a single division in the division era:

SEAGER SURGE: Dodger shortstop **Corey Seager** was stellar last year, slashing .307/.358/.585 while hitting 15 homers and driving in 41 in 52 games. For his efforts, Seager finished ninth in the NL MVP vote, but he saved his best for last, becoming the second Dodger in franchise history (**Orel Hershiser**) to win both the NLCS and World Series MVPs. In 18 Postseason games, Seager hit .328/.425/.746 and had the second-most home runs (eight), second-most runs scored (20), and second-most RBI (20) of any postseason in MLB history. In the World Series, Seager batted .400 (8-for-20) with two homers, five RBI and seven runs scored.

LA Seager picked up right where he left off in October this spring, batting .346 (18-for-52) with a Major League-high tying eight home runs and 16 RBI in 22 exhibition games.

LA The North Carolina native has reached base in 12 of his 16 plate appearances over the first three games, going 8-for-12 with four walks, three RBI, two doubles and four runs scored. According to SportsRadar, Seager became only the fifth player in National League history to reach base a dozen times in the first three games of the season:

LA In his career, Seager is 8-for-18 against the Oakland A's, recording three homers and six RBI in five games against the defending AL West Champions. He has hit safely in all five contests against the A's and has recorded an RBI in three of the five matchups. He ranks second in franchise history with three homers against the A's, trailing only Eric Karros (5).

SIMPLY THE BEST: The Dodgers won the seventh World Series in franchise history last year, going 43-17 during the 60-game season and then dispatching the Brewers (2-0), Padres (3-0), Braves (4-3) and Rays (4-2) in the Postseason to claim the crown. The club also won the NL pennant for the third time in four years.

LA With a franchise-best .717 winning percentage (43-17), the Dodgers posted the first .700+ win percentage season by an NL team since the 1909 Pirates (110-42, .724).

LA The Dodgers won a division title for the eighth consecutive year, something just two other teams have accomplished:

IT'S GONNA BE MAY: **Dustin May** will take the ball for his first start of the 2021 season. The 23-year-old Texas native went 3-1 in 12 games (10 starts) in 2020 while ranking among the NL leaders (min. 50.0 IP) in ERA (2.57, 8th), opponents' batting average (.220, T-13th) and WHIP (1.09, T-12th). He was the Dodgers' 2020 Opening Day starter vs. San Francisco after an injury sidelined Clayton Kershaw and became the first rookie to start LA's season-opener since **Fernando Valenzuela** in 1981.

LA In five games (four starts) during the Cactus League season, he went 3-0 with a 2.37 ERA (5 ER/19.0 IP) and 21 strikeouts against seven walks. He limited hitters to a .211 batting average.

LA He appeared in seven postseason games (three starts) during the Dodgers' run to a World Championship, going 1-0 with a 4.22 ERA (5 ER/10.2 IP) and 13 strikeouts.

MAGICAL MOOKIE: Dodger right-fielder **Mookie Betts** went 1-for-3 yesterday, recording his fourth run of the season and has hit safely in all three games he has played this year. Dating back to last season, the outfielder has hit safely in five straight games, batting .304 (7-for-23) with a run scored in six straight games. In his first campaign with the Boys in Blue, he slashed .302/.383/.570 and ranked among the NL leaders in hits (64, T-10th), runs (47, 4th), batting average (.292, 16th), OBP (.366, 17th), SLG (.562, 13th), steals (10, T-5th) and homers (16, T-3rd). Betts went 18-for-41 (.439) with runners in scoring position, the third best mark in the Majors, and was at his best late in games, posting a .343 (24-for-70)/.370/.643 slashline from the seventh inning and later.

LA The Dodgers are 35-10 when Betts hits leadoff and 33-6 when he scored a run.

LA In interleague play, he is a .308 (143-for-465) hitter with 86 runs, 21 homers, 83 RBI and 21 stolen bases. He is one of three players in the Major Leagues with a .300 batting average, 20+ homers and 20+ steals along with Mike Trout and Starling Marte.

BAUER HOUR: Friday night, Dodger right-hander and 2020 NL Cy Young Award winner **Trevor Bauer** made his Dodger debut, no-hit the Rockies through 6.0 innings, struck out 10 and picked up his first win of the season. Bauer recently announced a season-long giveback initiative – Ks for a Cause – to support local nonprofit organizations focused on STEM and/or youth programming in the greater L.A. area. Bauer will donate \$1,000 per strikeout throughout the regular season and each month, a different nonprofit organization will be designated. Bauer will fully fund the initiative through grants via the Los Angeles Dodgers Foundation. He will also highlight these organizations through a new content series on his YouTube Channel and with Ks for a Cause merchandise on his website. For the month of April, Bauer will support Think Together. Founded in 1997, Think Together partners with schools to deliver nationally recognized early learning programs, afterschool programs, student support services, and school improvement.

LA In his first season with Los Angeles in 2020, he batted .292 (64-for-219) with nine doubles, a triple, 16 home runs and 39 RBI... led the team in stolen bases (10) and tied with AJ Pollock for most home runs...

LA With his Game 6 homerun in the World Series, he became the ninth player in MLB history to homer in multiple World Series-clinching games...he is the second player to do it with two different teams (other: Reggie Jackson)

LA On August 13, 2020 he homered three times against the Padres, joining Hall-of-Famer Johnny Mize and Sammy Sosa as the only players in MLB history with six career three-homer games
