ROAD TRIP FINALE: The Dodgers notched three homers en route to their fifth straight win and second straight over the Oakland Athletics as they won 5-1 on Tuesday night at the Oakland Coliseum. Los Angeles seeks the sweep as they will conclude their first road trip (5-1) of the season with a winning mark and two series wins. After an off day on Thursday, the Dodgers return home to receive their World Championship rings and begin their 60th season of Dodger Baseball at Dodger Stadium at 1:10 p.m. against the Washington Nationals.

⚾ Through six games, the Dodger have recorded five double digit hit outputs and are batting .327 (72-for-220) with 27 extra-base hits and 33 walks on the season. The club leads the National League in BA, OBP (.420) and is second in OPS (.947) and slugging (.532).

⚾ **Clayton Kershaw** was brilliant last night, firing 7.0 innings, allowing one run on four hits with eight strikeouts. After allowing two of the first three batters to reach base, he retired 20 of the next 22 batters he faced with eight coming via the strikeout. He recorded his first career win against the A's last night and now has a win against 24 of the 29 MLB clubs.

⚾ Offensively, **Max Muncy** continued to haunt his former mates, clubbing a two-run homer in the top of third inning to give the Dodgers a 3-1 lead. **Edwin Ríos** and **Mookie Betts** added solo homers to push the lead to the final tally of 5-1. After leading the Majors in homers in 2020 with 118, the Dodgers now have six players with a homer this season.

INTERLEAGUE SHOWDOWN: The Dodgers improved to 4-1 in their last five games against the Athletics and are now 8-1 in their last nine interleague games. Last season, the Boys in Blue went 16-4 in interleague play, which is tied for their best interleague mark in franchise history with the 2017 Dodgers, who also went 16-4 in interleague play. Since 2017, the Dodgers are 56-26 in interleague play and have not had a losing record in interleague play since 2012 when they went 6-9 in 2012. According to SportRadar, the Dodgers 16-4 mark was amongst the best all-time against a single division in the division era:

SEAGER SURGE: Dodger shortstop **Corey Seager** was stellar last year, slashing .307/.358/.585 while hitting 15 homers and driving in 41 in 52 games. For his efforts, Seager finished ninth in the NL MVP vote, but he saved his best for last, becoming the second Dodger in franchise history (**Orel Hershiser**) to win both the NLCS and World Series MVPs. In 18 Postseason games, Seager hit .328/.425/.746 and had the second-most home runs (eight), second-most runs scored (20), and second-most RBI (20) of any postseason in MLB history. In the World Series, Seager batted .400 (8-for-20) with two homers, five RBI and seven runs scored.

⚾ Seager picked up right where he left off in October this spring, batting .346 (18-for-52) with a Major League-high tying eight home runs and 16 RBI in 22 exhibition games.

⚾ The North Carolina native failed to reach base for the first time all season, but has reached base in 14 of his 27 plate appearances over the first five games, going 9-for-22 with five walks, six RBI, three doubles and four runs scored.

⚾ In his career, Seager is 9-for-28 against Oakland, recording three homers and nine RBI in seven games against the defending AL West Champions. He has hit safely in six of the seven contests against the A's and has recorded an RBI in four of the seven matchups. He ranks second in franchise history with three homers against the A's, trailing only Eric Karros (5).

SIMPLY THE BEST: The Dodgers won the seventh World Series in franchise history last year, going 43-17 during the 60-game season and then dispatching the Brewers (2-0), Padres (3-0), Braves (4-3) and Rays (4-2) in the Postseason to claim the crown. The club also won the NL pennant for the third time in four years.

⚾ With a franchise-best .717 winning percentage (43-17), the Dodgers posted the first .700+ win percentage season by an NL team since the 1909 Pirates (110-42, .724).

⚾ The Dodgers won a division title for the eighth consecutive year, something just two other teams have accomplished:

MAGICAL MOOKIE: Dodger right-fielder **Mookie Betts** clubbed his first homer of the season and went 2-for-5, recording his sixth run of the season and he has hit safely in all five games he has played this year. Dating back to last season, the outfielder has hit safely in seven straight games, batting .313 (10-for-32) with a run scored in eight straight games. In his first campaign with the Boys in Blue, he slashed .302/.383/.570 and ranked among the NL leaders in hits (64, T-10th), runs (47, 4th), batting average (.292, 16th), OBP (.366, 17th), SLG (.562, 13th), steals (10, T-5th) and homers (16, T-3rd). Betts went 18-for-41 (.439) with runners in scoring position, the third best mark in the Majors, and was at his best late in games, posting a .343 (24-for-70)/.370/.643 slashline from the seventh inning and later.

⚾ The Dodgers are 37-10 when Betts hits leadoff and 35-6 when he scores a run. In interleague play, he is a .308 (146-for-474) hitter with 88 runs, 22 homers, 84 RBI and 23 stolen bases. He is one of three players in the Major Leagues with a .300 batting average, 20+ homers and 20+ steals along with Mike Trout and Starling Marte.

BLAZING BAUER: 2020 NL Cy Young Award winner **Trevor Bauer** will get the ball for his second start of the season after carrying a no-hitter into the seventh inning in his last start on Friday at Coors Field. The righty would end up giving up four runs on three hits in 6.1 innings to record his first win as a Dodger. The big off-season acquisition went 5-4 with a 1.73 ERA (14 ER/73.0 IP) and 100 strikeouts in 11 starts, finishing 10th in the NL MVP voting after leading the NL in ERA, complete games (2), shutouts (2), ERA+ (276), WHIP (0.795) and hits per nine innings (5.1) with the Reds. Bauer, who attended Hart High School in Santa Clarita, was originally drafted by the Arizona Diamondbacks with the third overall selection in the 2011 First-Year Player Draft out of UCLA. He is the only Bruin in school history to win the Cy Young Award and is one of three players to win the Cy Young and the Golden Spikes Award (**David Price** and **Tim Lincecum**). Bauer will make his ninth career start against the Athletics and is 1-4 with a 3.72 ERA (19 ER/46.0 IP) and 52 strikeouts against 20 walks. He will look for his first win of his career at the Oakland Coliseum as he is 0-3 with a 3.25 ERA (10 ER/27.2 IP) and 29 strikeouts in five career starts in Oakland.

⚾ On Friday, Bauer announced a season-long giveback initiative – Ks for a Cause – to support local nonprofit organizations focused on STEM and/or youth programming in the greater Los Angeles area. Bauer will donate \$1,000 per strikeout throughout the regular season and each month, a different nonprofit organization will be designated. Bauer will fully fund the initiative through grants via the Los Angeles Dodgers Foundation (LADF) and will also partner with LADF to evaluate potential partner organizations and to work with receiving organizations. Bauer will also highlight these organizations through a new, dedicated content series on his YouTube Channel and with Ks for a Cause merchandise on his website. For the month of April, Bauer will support Think Together. Founded in 1997, Think Together partners with schools to deliver nationally recognized early learning programs, afterschool programs, student support services, and school improvement. Specifically, Bauer's donation will help fund afterschool STEM and robotics programming for middle school students in southeast Los Angeles.

- Made his Dodger debut last Friday in Colorado, allowing four runs on three hits with 10 strikeouts in 6.1 innings to pick up the victory in the Dodgers' 11-6 win...walked two and threw 96 pitches...did not allow a hit in his first 6.0 innings for the Dodgers in his debut for the team, becoming the third pitcher to throw 6.0 no-hit innings in his debut with the Dodgers since the team moved to Los Angeles in 1958 (source: Elias Sports Bureau)...the others were Greg Maddux on August 3, 2006 at Cincinnati (6 IP) and Ross Stripling on April 8, 2016 at San Francisco (7.1)...Stripling did it in his MLB debut
- Finished Spring Training 1-2 with a 4.24 ERA (11 ER/23.1 IP) in six games (five starts)

2020 NOTES:

- Became the first Reds pitcher to win the National League Cy Young Award.
- Was voted by his peers the Players Choice Award for Outstanding Pitcher in the National League.
- In voting of the Cincinnati chapter of the BBWAA, became the first player since RHP Johnny Cueto in 2014 to receive in the same season the Ernie Lombardi Award as the Reds' Most Valuable Player and the Johnny Vander Meer Award as the team's Outstanding Pitcher.
- Was named to Baseball America's All-MLB first team and the All-MLB first team.
- Led the National League in ERA (1.73), WHIP (0.79), opponents' batting average (.159), fewest hits per 9 innings (5.06), shutouts (2) and complete games (2, tied) while ranking second in strikeouts (100, Jacob deGrom 104) and strikeouts per 9 innings (12.33, deGrom 13.77).
- Was the National League's Pitcher of the Month for September (5GS, 2-2, 1.29, 35.0 IP, 46K)...led the NL in ERA and finished just 2 strikeouts behind leader Aaron Nola of the Phillies...was his first monthly award
- Established modern club records for strikeouts through the first 3 (32), 4 (41), 5 (49), 6 (54), 7 (61), 8 (71), 9 (83), 10 (88) and 11 starts (100) of a season...his 100 strikeouts through 11 starts also is a modern franchise record for strikeouts through the first 12 starts of a season.

- In 2020 became the first pitcher in Reds history to win the National League's Cy Young Award in voting of the national chapter of the Baseball Writers' Association of America...finished 10th in the MVP voting
- Was voted by his peers the 2020 Players Choice Award for Outstanding Pitcher in the National League
- Was named to Baseball America's 2020 All-MLB first team and the 2020 All-MLB Team
- In 2020 became the first player since RHP Johnny Cueto in 2014 to receive in the same season the Ernie Lombardi Award as the Reds' Most Valuable Player and the Johnny Vander Meer Award as the team's Outstanding Pitcher in voting of the Cincinnati chapter of the BBWAA
- While pitching for the Indians in 2018 was an American League All-Star and finished sixth in the BBWAA's Cy Young Award voting
- Was the National League's Player of the Month for September 2020
- While with the Indians in 2017 (17 wins, 196 strikeouts), teamed with Corey Kluber (18 wins, 265 strikeouts) and Carlos Carrasco (18 wins, 226 strikeouts) to become the first trio in Major League history with at least 17 wins and 190 strikeouts each
- Was selected by the Diamondbacks in the first round (3rd overall) of the June 2011 first-year player draft, while UCLA teammate RHP Gerrit Cole was taken first (Pirates)...was the first time a college baseball program had two players selected within the first 3 picks of the same draft since 1978, when Arizona State's Bob Horner (Braves) and Hubie Brooks (Mets) were taken first and third, respectively
