LAA was 2-5 on last homestand against the Tampa Bay Rays ( $0-4$ ) and Los Angeles Dodgers (1-1).

WELCOME BACK FANS!: Friday, the Angels announced Angel Stadium will return to full capacity beginning June 17 vs. Detroit...Single game tickets for all remaining regular season home games will go on sale to the general public on Friday, May 28th at 9:00 a.m. PT...Registered users on Angels.com will have access to a special presale beginning Thursday, May 27th at 9:00 a.m...Beginning on June 17th, in accordance with the updated California and MLB health guidelines, guests will be required to wear a mask unless they are prepared to provide proof of full vaccination or a recent negative Covid test...A complete listing of protocols and stadium policy information is available at angels.com/protocols.

EACH MIND MATTERS: May is Mental Health Awareness Month...Angels players will wear green bracelets today to help raise awareness for mental health and well-being... Today's Rally Monkey giveaway item is sponsored by the Orange County Health Care Agency and features a green ribbon on the monkey's jersey to help promote mental health awareness...Please visit EachMindMatters.org for more information.

RO SHOW: Friday night, Jose Rojas registered his first two career outfield assists...He was the first Angels outfielder with multiple assists in a game since Justin Upton on April 18, 2018 vs. Boston...Rojas also has hit 11 doubles, which is tied for the most in Angels history after 32 career games (also, Howie Kendrick and John Doherty).

ROSTER MOVES: Yesterday, the Angels reinstated RHP Junior Guerra from the injured list...Following Friday night's game, LHP Dillon Peters was optioned to Triple-A Salt Lake.

WINS AND LOSSES: Angels have fallen to a season-low eight games under . 500 (19-27).... Halos look to avoid being swept for a second time this season (swept by Rays in four game series May 3-6)...LAA stayed at or above . 500 through their first 18 games of a season for the first time since 2005, but have been under .500 since May 3.

FOUR SCORE: Angels are $18-8$ when scoring $4+$ runs this season and are 1-19 when scoring three-or-fewer.

## LEAGUE LEADERS:

Shohei Ohtani leads the Majors in extra-base hits (28) and total bases (104) ... He is tied for second in the Majors (leads A.L.) with 14 home runs and three triples...He's also sixth in slugging (.619), tied for seventh in runs scored (32) and is tied for eighth in RBI (34).

Jared Walsh ranks eighth in the American League in batting average (.318) and OPS (.943), is tied for eighth in hits (50) and is 10th in RBI (32).

THAT'S RIGHT: Angels have recorded 15 of their 19 wins this season in games against a right-handed starting pitcher... Halos are 4-10 this season when the opposing primary pitcher is left-handed ( $4-7$ vs. left-handed starters; plus three games where left-handed primary pitcher followed a right-handed starter).

hOo-ray goose: This week, Phil Gosselin earned his Bachelor's Degree in Economics from the University of Virginia...Gosselin remains the Cavaliers all-time single-season hits leader (100 in 2010) and ranks seventh in school history in career doubles (50) and ninth in career stolen bases (48).

GLOVE HURTS: Angels have made a Major League leading 38 errors this season, but have gone errorless in nine of last 13 games.... Halos are 4-16 when committing an error in 2021... LAA has had five games this season with $3+$ errors (most in Majors)... Halos committed 36 errors during 60 -game 2020 season.
Vs. OAKLAND: Today's game marks the third (0-2) of 19 meetings this season between the Angels and A's (10 at Angel Stadium \& nine at the Coliseum)...Angels look to avoid being swept by A's in a three-game series for the first time since Sept. 4-5, 2019 at the Coliseum...Last time A's swept threegame series at Angel Stadium was April 9-11, 2013.
AGAINST THE A's: In 35 career games against the A's, David Fletcher is batting $.320(40 / 125)$ with seven doubles, one home run and 10 RBI...Shohei Ohtani has hit eight career home runs against the A's, which is tied for his most against any opponent (also has 8 HR vs. Texas).
