STREAK STOPPER: The Royals rallied with three-spots in the seventh and eighth innings last night en route to a 6-1 win over the American League West-leading Athletics, snapping their five-game losing streak...the Royals were held to two hits through the first six innings and trailed 1-0 heading into the seventh, when fou of the first five batters reached, including a game-tying RBI double by Hunter Dozier and a go-ahead two-run single by Kelvin Gutierrez....with two outs in the eighth, the Royals recorded three consecutive extra-base hits including a solo home run by Andrew Benintendi, a double by Salvador Perez and a two-run home run by Jorge Soler, the 100th of his career...the late offensive surge made a winner out of Mike Minor, who allowed just one run-a solo HR by Jed Lowrie-on three hits and one walk over 7.0 innings, with eight strikeouts., Minor combined with Scott Barlow (1.0 IP) and Greg Holland (1.0 IP) to retire the final 13 batters following a walk to Elvis Andrus in the fifth to snap an eight-game stretch in which the Royals had allowed 5.5 runs $/$ game

+ Gutierrez's two-run single in the seventh gave the Royals their first lead since the fifth inning las Saturday vs. Minnesota, snapping a streak of 46 innings in which they either trailed (38) or were tied (8)
+ The HR by Benintendi and Soler in the eighth marked the Royals' first multi-HR frame since Aug. 29, 2020 when Maikel Franco's three-run HR \& Ryan McBroom's pinch-hit HR sparked a five-run seventh in Chicago
+ Eight of the nine Royals in the lineup recorded a hit, the only exception being Whit Merrifield, who went O-for-5 to snap a 10-game hit streak, in which he went 15-for-41 (.366) with five extra-base hits.
+ The Royals have won seven of their last nine series-opening games dating back to May 14 in Chicago
LET THE KIDS PLAY!: Tonight's starter Brady Singer (24) will be the first of three Royals starting pitchers this weekend who are under the age of 25, coming before tomorrow's starter Jackson Kowar (24) and Sunday's starter Kris Bubic (23)...in addition to Brad Keller (25) and Daniel Lynch (24), the Royals have had five different pitchers 25 or younger make a start this season, which is tied for the third most in the Majors, trailing only Miami (7) and Seattle (6)...including Singer's start tonight, 35 of the Royals' 62 games this season have been started by a pitcher 25 of younger (56.5\%), which trails only the Marlins, who have started a pitcher 25 or younger in 48 of 63 games ( $76.2 \%$ )...since May 16 -the day before Danny Duffy was placed on the 10 -day Injured List-the Royals have started a pitcher 25 or younger in 16 of their last 22 games ( $72.7 \%$ ), a stretch in which they're 12-10

SOLER EXTENDS LONG-ARMED LEAD: Jorge Soler reached via catcher interference in the seventh inning last night and scored the go-ahead run on Kelvin Gutierrez's two-run single...it marked Soler's 11th career catche interference-all since 2019-extending his Major League lead during that time to four more than Tommy La Stella (7)...Soler's total is also a franchise record, now eight more than the previous career mark held by Mike Macfarlane and Alex Gordon (3 each)...Soler leads the Major Leagues this season with six instances of reaching on a catcher interference, which puts him on pace for 16, a number that would shatter the singleseason Major League record, according to Elias, currently held by Jacoby Ellsbury in 2016 (see chart to right)

+ Soler has 11 of the 54 catcher interference's (20.4\%) in Royals history, including 11 of the last 14 since 2019
+ Soler also hit his 100th career HR last night, 73 of which have come with the Royals....he's the 16th Cuban-born player to reach the 100-HR milestone and he's one of three active players on that list, joining fellow countrymen José Abreu (209) and Yasmani Grandal (159)...Soler has homered twice in his last four games-a stretch in which he's slugging .833-on the heels of an 11-game homer drought

A ROYAL ROLLER COASTER: The Royals' season to this point can be broken into four separate stretches that tel two very different stories...through May 1, the Royals led the Majors with a 16-9 record and held a 1.5 -game lead over the White Sox in the American League Central Division...an 11-game losing streak ensued, dropping them to 16-20, which put them 6.5 games behind the White Sox for the division lead...the Royals snapped the skid on May 14, which began a 13-6 run through June 4, a stretch in which the Royals played to the second-best record in the American League and outscored opponents 99-68 (+31)...that carried them to a 29-26 record-three games over .500 -making them the just sixth team in the last 67 years, according to Elias, to fall below .500 thanks to an 11-game losing streak, only to return to above . 500 later in that same season...the Royals then lost five straight games before snapping that skid last night, and they will look to begin a new winning streak tonight in Oakland

+ According to Bally Sports Kansas City's Dave Holtzman, the Royals are the only team in the Majors this season with two winning streaks of at least five games and two losing streaks of at least five games.

VS. ATHLETICS: The Royals continue this seven-game West Coast trip with the second of four games in Oakland tonight vs. the A's...the Royals have split their last six matchups vs. Oakland dating back to Aug. 28 2019, after going 2-7 in the previous nine dating back to the start of 2018...they entered this series with a 4-10 record vs. the A's since their last series win from Aug. 14-16, 2017, when they took two of three at the Coliseum

The Royals began this road trip with three games in Anaheim earlier this week, the first of which marked their first game on the West Coast since ending a three-game set in Oakland on Sept. 18, 2019, 628 days prior...that snapped a streak of 126 games played in either the Central or Eastern time zone, including the last nine games of 2019, all 60 games last season and the first 57 games this season.

MIGHTY IN THE ‘PEN: The Royals’ bullpen has recorded a 2.38 ERA ( 25 ER in 94.2 IP ) over the last 27 games since May 12, which ranks third in the Majors, trailing only the Cubs (1.50) and Rays (2.28)...Jake Brentz (13.0 IP), Scott Barlow (12.0) and Kyle Zimmer (9.2 IP) have combined for 34.2 scoreless innings during this stretch, holding opponents to a .074 average ( 8 -for-108) with 45 strikeouts ( $11.7 \mathrm{~K} / 9$ ) while going 3-0 with two saves and nine holds.

+ Zimmer's scoreless streak actually goes back to April 23 to mark a run of 12 scoreless outings ( 12.1 IP ) in which he's allowed two hits in 37 at-bats.
+ Brentz has not allowed a hit to a left-handed batter since a Kevin Kiermaier single on April 21, marking an O-for-23 stretch with nine walks since.
+ Barlow is the only pitcher in the Majors with two six-out saves this season (April 15 vs. Toronto and June 3 vs. Minnesota), and he's the first Royal with multiple six-out saves in a season since Joakim Soria had five in 2009...Barlow is one of four Royals with multiple saves of any kind this year, joining Greg Holland, Josh Staumont and Zimmer, making the Royals one of three teams with four pitchers who have saved multiple games joining the Rays and Tigers...six different Royals have at least one save, matching the Rays, Blue Jays, Reds and Dodgers for the Major League lead.

NO MINOR FEAT: Ryan O'Hearn was optioned to Triple-A Omaha on May 28, and in 11 games with the Storm Chasers since, he's batting .400 ( 18 -for- 45 ) with nine home runs and 20 RBI , the last two of which lead Minor Leaque Baseball over the last 13 days...he's recorded three multi-homer efforts in his last six games, including two home runs in each of the last two games..in last night's 16-9 win in St. Paul, O'Hearn went 4-for-5 with two HR and six RBI

+ Right-handed pitcher Jake Newberry - who was designated for assignment on Monday-has cleared waivers and has been assigned to Omaha.
IRON MAN MERRIFIELD: Whit Merrifield is playing in his 369th consecutive game tonight, which is the longest active streak in the Majors, according to Elias...including tonight's game, he's 2,263 games shy of Cal Ripken Jr.'s Major League record of 2,632 straight games played...to catch Ripken, the 32 -year-old Merrifield would have to play another 14 -plus full seasons without missing a game...Merrifield's streak began on June 25, 2018, and he's appeared at six different positions during that span, including first base, second base, left field, center field, right field and designated hitter. his streak of 369 consecutive games played is just 52 shy of the Royals' record of 421 games set by Alcides Escobar from Sept. 26, 2015-July 7, 2018.

BRADY SINGER is making the 13th start of his sophomore season, after making a team-high 12 starts as a rookie in 2020...this is the first career start vs. the Athletics for Singer, who was selected 18th overall by the Royals in the 2018 First-Year Player Draft.

TOUGH LOSS TO TWINS: Singer suffered a 2-1 loss last Sunday vs. the Twins, in which he allowed just two runs on a season-high-tying eight hits and three walks in 5.2 innings, with seven strikeouts...he allowed three hits in the third, including an RBI double by Miguel Sanó on a play in which the trail runner was tagged out 7-5 o end the frame...he erased a pair of singles in the fourth with an inning-ending double play, but allowed the first three to reach in the fifth, loading the bases before striking out Alex Kirilloff and Sanó...with two outs, he plunked Trevor Larnach to drive in the game-winning run...Brady got two quick outs in the sixth before issuing a single and a walk and exited in favor of Kyle Zimmer, who stranded both runners Singer recorded just one clean inning and yielded 11 base runners in 5.2 innings, but held Minnesota to $2-$ for-7 with runners in scoring position...it was
 LEAD SINGER: Brady made his Majors debut in the Royals' second game last season and has not missed a start since...he leads Royals pitchers in starts (24), innings (123.1) and strikeouts (123) since the start of last season, with two more starts and 7.2 more innings than Brad Keller and 18 more strikeouts than Danny Duffy...among all pitchers who have made their debut since last season, Singer ranks first in starts and inning and ranks third in strikeouts, trailing only Trevor Rogers (128) \& Cristian Javier (125).

OFF KEY: Singer went $5-4$ with a 3.13 ERA ( 24 ER in 69.0 IP), 205 opponents' average (52-for-254) over a 13-start stretch from May 10, 2020-May 22, 2021, but he's allowed 13 runs ( 12 ER) over his last three starts ( 14.0 IP ), including a career-high six earned runs over 2.2 innings on May 27 at Tropicana Field, five runs (4ER) in 5.2 innings on June 1 vs. Pittsburgh and two runs in 5.2 innings last Sunday vs. the Twins

- After allowing six extra-base hits in his first nine starts (45.0 IP) this season he's surpassed that with seven extra-base hits over his last three starts (14.0 IP)

GREATEST HITS: There have been 175 batted balls off Singer this season, and just six of them have qualified as barrels, a term defined by Statcast as "a batted ball with the perfect combination of exit velocity and launch angle"...Singer's $3.4 \%$ barrel rate is the lowest in the Majors (min. 50.0 IP), and the next-closest American League pitcher is Kyle Gibson (4.5\%)...just 60 of the 175 batted balls vs. Singer-34.3\%-have had an exit velocity of 95 mph or greater, the eighth-lowest mark in the AL (min. 50.0 IP).

The average exit velocity vs. Singer is just 87.3 mph , which is the fifth-lowest mark in the American League (min. 50.0 IP), higher only than Ryan Yarbrough (84.9), John Means (86.4), Dallas Keuchel (86.5) and Corey Kluber (87.2).

Singer has not faced an Oakland batter
he's held right handers to a .287 slugging percentage, which is tied for the fourth-lowest mark in the American League (min. 110 BF), trailing José Berríos (.271), Lance Lynn (.272) and Gerrit Cole (.286).
SIDE SESSION: Brady has allowed 13 extra-base hits in 12 starts this season, and urrendered 2020, when Edwin Encarnación hit a two-run shot for the White Sox, and Brady has faced 171 consecutive right-handed batters without allowing a homer since..h

UNFAMILIAR FOE: Brady facing a new opponent for the third time in his last four starts, after making all 12 starts as a rookie last season vs. Centra Division teams, and making six straight starts vs American League Central foes from April 24-May 22...the only non-Central Division teams he's faced have been Texas on April 4, the Angels on April 12, Toronto on April 18 and Tampa Bay on May 27...he's 0-3 in his four previous starts vs. non-Central Division teams, and four of his seven career wins have come vs. Detroit, and the other three have been over Minnesota, Cleveland and Pittsburgh.

ROAD WARRIOR: Brady is $3-4$ with a 4.13 ERA ( 28 ER in 61.0 IP) in 12 career road starts, and he's held opponents to a 214 average ( 48 -for- 224 )...he's allowed two runs or fewer in seven of his 12 road starts, and had a run of 19.0 consecutive scoreless innings on the road from Aug. 29,2020 -April $24,2021$.

+ Singer recorded eight strikeouts and allowed no more than three hits in three straight road starts from Sept. 10, 2020-April 24, 2021, which was the longest such stretch in Royals history...he went 3-0 with a 0.43 ERA ( 1 ER in 21.0 IP) and . 087 opponents' average ( 6 -for- 69 ) during that run becoming the second pitcher in the last 40 years (since 1982) to win three straight road starts in which he recorded at least eight strikeouts and no more than three hits allowed, joining Pedro Martinez, who did it from April 10-May 7, 2005 with the Mets, but he allowed seven runs during his stretch
$\boldsymbol{H}$ He began his career with eight straight road starts in which he pitched at least 5.0 innings and allowed no more than five hits, which was the longest such run to begin a career since at least 1901, and was the longest run at any point in a career in Royals history...that streak was snapped in Minnesota on April 30, when he exited after the second inning when a comebacker struck his foot and caromed into the glove of Carlos Santana, who threw to second for an inning-ending double play...the Royals have lost his last four road starts after going 6-2 in his first eight.


## TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP JACKSON KOWAR (0-1, 54.00)

+ Jackson will make his second career start and first vs. the Athletics in the third game of a four-game set tomorrow at RingCentral Coliseum
$\boldsymbol{+}$ In his Major League debut on Monday in Anaheim, he was dealt the loss after allowing four runs in 0.2 innings...exited with one on and two out after throwing 39 pitches in favor of Ervin Santana, who stranded the inherited runner...recorded the first out on two pitches before allowing the next four to go walk, RBI single, walk and RBI single...the next batter recorded an RBI groundout before another RBI single forced him out of the game.. three of his 39 pitches were wild, making him the first Royal with three wild pitches in one inning since the late Yordano Ventura on May $20,2014$. Kowar became the ninth different pitcher to start a game for the Royals this season and he's the fifth different starting pitcher this year who is 25 or younger...he was the 43 rd pitcher to start for the Royals in his Major League debut and second this season, joining Daniel Lynch on May 3. Went 5-0 with a 0.85 ERA ( 3 ER in 31.2 IP) and a .165 opponents' average (18-for-109) in six starts at Triple-A Omaha to begin this season, including a win in each of his first five starts...his ERA, wins and 0.88 WHIP lead all Triple-A pitchers, while his 41 strikeouts rank tied for fourth.


## MANAGER MIKE MATHENY

+ With a win on Opening Day vs. Texas, Mike Matheny-in his ninth season as a Major League manager-became the ninth active manager o win vs. all 30 teams, according to Elias, joining Dusty Baker (24th season), Bud Black (14th season), Terry Francona (21st season), Joe Girardi (13th season), AJ Hinch (8th season), Joe Maddon (18th season), Don Mattingly (11th season) and Bob Melvin (18th season). Matheny was named the Royals' 17th full-time manager on Oct. 31, 2019 and has a 647-539 record over nine seasons as a manager, and his 647 wins are the ninth most among active managers...his .546 lifetime win percentage as a manager ranks sixth among active skippers.
$\boldsymbol{+}$ This is Matheny's second big league managerial stint, after leading the St. Louis Cardinals from 2012-2018, then serving as a Special Advisor to Player Development for the Royals during the 2019 campaign...he posted a winning record in each of his seven seasons with St. Louis, including a Major League-best 100 victories in 2015...Matheny led the Cardinals to the postseason in each of his first four seasons from 2012-15, becoming the first manager to do that in Major League history...under his leadership, the Cardinals were a Wild Card qualifier in 2012, before winning three-straight National League Central titles (2013-15) and winning the National League pennant in 2013


## REPLAY SPECIALIST BILL DUPLISSEA

+ Royals' replay specialist Bill Duplissea got a call overturned in last night's game, when he correctly noticed that Jorge Soler's bat was interfered with by the catcher, resulting in a catcher interference. He's challenged 101 calls since the start of 2018, and just four of them have been confirmed, including one last Sunday and one on May 13 in Detroit, which snapped a streak of 35 straight challenges without one being confirmed...he also had a streak of 48 straight without a confirmed from Sept. 27, 2017-April 9, 2019 Duplissea is 8 -for-17 on challenges this season, but still owns a Majors-best $70.5 \%$ success rate (124-for-176) over the last six years (since 2016), well ahead of the Yankees, who rank second with a $64.6 \%$ overturn rate, and well above the Major League average, which is $44.2 \%$ this season through June 10
+ The Royals have finished in the top three in replay success rate in each of the last five seasons including a 78.6 success rate in 2018, which is the best rate by any Major League team since 2016
+ Duper is in his 17th season with the Royals and serves as the replay coordinator and advance scout

# Pitched a 1-2-3 eighth last night in Oakland, notching one strikeout of Stephen Piscotty...he's in the midst of a career-long 12.0-inning scoreless 

 streak dating back to May 14 at Chicago (Game 1), in which he's allowed four hits in 39 at-bats for a .103 average, and has 20 strikeouts ( $15.0 \mathrm{~K} / 9$ ) Recorded his second 2.0-inning save of the season on June 3 vs . Minnesota (also April 15 vs . Toronto), becoming the only pitcher in the Majors this season with two six-out saves...he's the first Royal with two such saves in a season since Joakim Soria notched five in 2009 .+ Was named Royals Pitcher of the Month for May, after posting a 1.50 ERA and 23 strikeouts in May, the highest K/9 rate (17.3) in any single month in club history (min. 12.0 innings pitched), and is the first reliever to win the award since lan Kennedy won it in June 2019.
+ Barlow owns a $13.06 \mathrm{SO} / 9$ ratio this season ( 45 K in 31.0 IP ), the highest mark among relievers in the Majors (min. 30.0 IP ), which would be the fifth-highest mark by a reliever in franchise history...excluding the shortened 2020 season, it would rank fourth in Royals history.
- Owns a 0.84 ERA ( 1 ER in 10.2 IP) with 14 strikeouts in seven career appearances vs. the A's, but the Royals are 2-5 in those games.

+ Ronald fired 2.0 innings in relief of Kris Bubic Tuesday night vs. the Angels and began his outing by recording five consecutive strikeouts before finishing it with a pop out to shortstop by Juan Lagares...via Bally Sports Kansas City’s Dave Holtzman, he became just the third Royals reliever to begin an appearance with five consecutive strikeouts, joining Luke Hochevar on Sept. 10, 2013 and Scott Sullivan on May $30,2004$. + He also became the first Royals reliever with five consecutive strikeouts in an outing since Jorge López on May 29,2019 at the White Sox. + Was recalled June 3, marking his second stint with the club this year, after serving as the 27 th Man for the doubleheader at the White Sox on May 14 + He has pitched in four games (all starts) for Triple-A Omaha so far this season, going O-1 with a 3.31 ERA ( 6 ER in 16.1 IP) with 16 strikeouts. + He was acquired on July 16, 2020 from San Diego with outfielder Franchy Cordero (now with Boston) in exchange for left-handed pitcher Tim Hill
+ Jake pitched a scoreless seventh inning on Tuesday night vs. the Angels, pitching around a single, a walk and a balk...he has not allowed a hit to a left-handed hitter since April 21, as they are O-for-their-last 23 with nine walks since then against him
