RALLY FALLS SHORT: The Royals suffered a 4-3, walk-off loss in Oakland last night to mark their sixth loss in the last seven games...the Royals trailed 3-0 in the seventh inning, when they strung together three straight hits to begin the frame, including a solo home run by Salvador Perez...a second run scored on a fielder's choice E6 and the Royals loaded the bases with two outs for Whit Merrifield, who lined out to second base to end the threat... Salvy hit another solo shot in the eighth off former teammate Jake Diekman-his second of the night-and with two outs, Hunter Dozier singled to center which gave Andrew Benintendi a chance to score the go-ahead run from first, but he was thrown out 8-3-2, a ruling that was upheld after being reviewed by Tim Timmons in New York...the Royals threatened again in the ninth, as they had Jarrod Dyson on second base with no outs, but went strikeout, strikeout, flyout to leave the go-ahead run stranded...in the bottom half, Scott Barlow-who needed just eight pitches to record three outs in the eighth-yielded a one-out double to Matt Chapman, followed by an intentional walk to set up the potential game-ending double play...but on a $2-2$ pitch, Elvis Andrus lined a base hit to right field, to drive in the game-winning run and mark the Royals' fourth walk-off loss of the season

+ The Royals went 0-for-10 with runners in scoring position-including 0-for-3 in the ninth-to mark their most hitless at-bats in scoring situations since Aug. 31, 2019 vs. Baltimore, when they went O-for-11 in a $7-5$ win...since going a season-best 8 -for-15 in scoring situations on June 4 vs. the Twins, the Royals are batting .200 ( 9 -for-45) in scoring situations, including 6 -for- 30 through the first five games of this trip.
+ The walk-off loss spoiled a quality start by Brady Singer, who allowed three runs on five hits and one walk over 6.0 innings, with seven strikeouts...all of the damage came from three straight extra-base hits in the fourth, when Oakland went double, RBI double, two-run home run in a span of seven pitches to put the Royals in a 3-0 hole...Singer had retired nine of 10 prior to that and retired eight of nine after.
+ The winning run charged to Barlow was the first run he allowed in a month, snapping a career-best 13.0-inning scoreless streak, to mark the first loss charged to a Royals reliever since May 26 at Tampa Bay, when Tyler Zuber allowed the automatic runner to score the winning (unearned) run in the 10th.
- The Royals are 9-10 in one-run games this season-one shy of Texas (7-11) for the most such losses among American League teams-and have lost 10 of their last 13 one-run decisions after starting the season 6-0.

SALVY MAKING A SPLASH: Salvador Perez recorded his ninth career multi-home run game last night, including the game-tying shot in the eighth inning...that's tied for the third-most multi-homer games in franchise history, trailing only George Brett (17) and Mike Sweeney (16)...three of those nine games have come this season, matching Aaron Judge, Vladimir Guerrero Jr., Fernando Tatis Jr., Jesse Winker and Eric Haase for the Major League lead, and he's just one shy of the Royals record for multi-homer games in a season, trailing Jorge Soler (2019), Sweeney (2005), Jermaine Dye (1999) and Steve Balboni (1985). all three of Salvy's multi-homer efforts have come in the last 10 games since June 1, a stretch in which he's batting . 333 (13-for-39) with six homers, matching Haase for the Major League lead...according to Elias, he's the second Royal with three multi-HR efforts in a 10-game span, joining Hunter Dozier in August 2019 + With solo HR in the seventh and eighth last night, Salvy became the first Royal to hit multiple HR in the seventh inning or later of a game since Mike Moustakas hit a grand slam in the seventh and a three-run shot in the ninth en route to a single-game club record nine RBI in a 14-6 win on Sept. 12, 2015 at Baltimore.

+ Perez leads the team with 16 homers-six more than anyone else-and is tied for third in the American League, trailing only Guerrero Jr. (19) and Shohei Ohtani (17)...he's on pace for 42 HR, which would mark the second-highest single-season HR total in franchise history, trailing only Soler's 48 HR in 2019. + Salvy has 27 HR since the start of 2020, a stretch in which his $14.5 \mathrm{AB} / \mathrm{HR}$ ratio ranks fifth in the Majors (min. 375 AB), trailing Tatis Jr. (11.59), José Ramírez (13.97), Adam Duvall (14.3) and Matt Olson (14.45)
+ Over his last 162 games dating back to July 7, 2018, Perez is batting .285 with 43 HR and 121 RBI.
ROYAL RUNDOWN: The Royals are 30-32 through the first 62 games of the season, with 100 games remaining on the schedule...through May 1, the Royals led the Majors with a 16-9 record and held a 1.5 game lead over the White Sox in the American League Central Division...an 11-game losing streak ensued, dropping them to 16-20, which put them 6.5 games behind the White Sox for the division lead...the Royals snapped the skid on May 14, which began a 13-6 run through June 4, a stretch in which the Royals played to the second-best record in the American League and outscored opponents 99-68 (+31)...that carried them to a 29-26 record-three games over .500-making them the just sixth team in the last 67 years, according to Elias, to fall below .500 thanks to an 11-game losing streak, only to return to above .500 later in that same season.. the Royals have lost six of their last seven-following a five-game winning streak-including four of five to begin this seven-game West Coast trip. According to Bally Sports Kansas City's Dave Holtzman, the Royals are the only team in the Major Leagues this season with two winning streaks of at least five games (April 21-26 and May 30-June 4) and two losing streaks of at least five games (May 2-13) and June 5-9).
VS. ATHLETICS: The Royals continue this seven-game West Coast trip with the third of four games in Oakland today vs. the A's...the Royals have won three of their last seven matchups vs. Oakland dating back to Aug. 28, 2019, after going 2-7 in the previous nine dating back to the start of 2018...they entered this series with a 4-10 record vs. the Athletics since their last series win from Aug. 14-16, 2017, when they took two of three at the Coliseum.
+ The Royals began this road trip with three games in Anaheim earlier this week, the first of which marked their first game on the West Coast since ending a three-game set in Oakland on Sept. 18, 2019, 628 days prior...that snapped a streak of 126 consecutive games played in either the Central or Eastern time zone, including the last nine games of the 2019 season, all 60 games last season and the first 57 games this season.

MAJOR HR IN THE MINORS: There have been 28 minor leaguers who have at least nine homers this year, and seven of the 28 ( $25 \%$ ) are in the Royals' organization, including Vinnie Pasquantino (11), Ryan O'Hearn (10), Nick Pratto (10), Bobby Witt Jr. (10), Gabriel Cancel (9), Ryan McBroom (9) and MJ Melendez (9)...Pasquantino's 11 HR leads High-A players, Pratto and Witt Jr.'s 10 are tied for third at Double-A and O'Hearn's 10 are tied for second at Triple-A.

+ O'Hearn was optioned to Triple-A Omaha on May 28, and in 12 games with the Storm Chasers since, he's batting .396 (19-for-48) with 10 home runs and 21 RBI, the last two of which lead Minor League Baseball over the last 14 days...he's recorded three multi-homer efforts in his last seven games, and has homered in each of his last three games, a stretch in which he's batting . 667 ( 8 -for-13) with five homers, nine RBI and a 2.436 OPS.

IRON MAN MERRIFIELD: Whit Merrifield is playing in his 370th consecutive game today, which is the longest active streak in the Majors, according to Elias...including today's game, he's 2,262 games shy of Cal Ripken Jr.'s Major League record of 2,632 straight games played...to catch Ripken, the 32 -year-old Merrifield would have to play another 14 -plus full seasons without missing a game...Merrifield's streak began on June 25, 2018, and he's appeared at six different positions during that span, including first base, second base, left field, center field, right field and designated hitter...his streak of 370 consecutive games played is just 51 shy of the Royals' record of 421 games set by Alcides Escobar from Sept. 26, 2015-July 7, 2018.

JUNE 12 IN ROYALS HISTORY: On this date in 1973, Frank White made his Major League debut as a defensive replacement at shortstop in Baltimore.. he went on to play his entire 18 -year career in Kansas City, in which he won a franchise-high-tying eight Rawlings Gold Gloves at second base, a mark that was an American League record at his position at the time...his number 20 was retired and he was inducted into the Royals Hall of Fame in 1995. On this date in 1999, Joe Randa recorded his 10th straight at-bat with a hit, a streak that spanned four games and included a 5 -for- 5 effort on June 9...that record was challenged by Adalberto Mondesi last September, when he recorded a hit in nine straight at-bats, falling one shy of Randa's mark.

JACKSON KOWAR is making his second career start following his Major League debut in the first game of this road trip on Monday night in Anaheim vs. the Angels. he was selected by Kansas City with the 33rd pick in the 2018 First-Year Player Draft, which the Royals received as compensation for Lorenzo Cain signing with Milwaukee.

DUBIOUS DEBUT: Kowar suffered the loss in the Royals' 8-3 defeat on Monday in Anaheim, in which he was charged with four runs on three hits, two walks and three wild pitches while recording just two outs...he recorded the first out on two pitches before allowing the next four to reach on a walk, an RBI single by Anthony Rendon, a walk and an RBI single by Max Stassi...the next batter, José Iglesias, drove in a run on an RBI groundout before Juan Lagares' RBI single...he exited after 39 pitches in favor of Ervin Santana, who stranded the inherited runner and pitched 4.0 innings in relief.

+ Three of his 39 pitches were wild, making him the first Royal to record three wild pitches in one inning since the late Yordano Ventura on May 20, 2014 (5th inning)
+ Kowar was charged with four runs in 0.2 innings in his Majors debut, after holding opponents to three runs in his first six starts (31.2 IP) in the minors.
+ The loss was his first since Aug. 30, 2019 vs. Double-A Frisco, 647 days prior.
TOP OF THE CLASS: Kowar is the fifth player selected by the Royals in the 2018 Draft to make his Majors debut, joining Brady Singer (18th), Daniel Lynch (34th), Kris Bubic (40th) and Kyle Isbel ( 3 rd round)...according to Elias, the 2021 Royals are the fourth team in the last 27 seasons-since $1995-t o$ have four different homegrown pitchers from the same class start a game in the same season, joining the 2018 Cardinals, 1995 White Sox and 1995 Mets (see chart above).
$\boldsymbol{+}$ Since the first year of the Draft in 1965, there have been 14 instances of a team selecting at least four pitchers in the first round... according to ESPN Stats \& Info, the Royals are the first of those teams to have four first-round picks from the same draft class pitch for them in the Majors.

LET THE KIDS PLAY!: Kowar (24) is the second of three Royals starting pitchers this weekend who are 25 years or younger, following Brady Singer (24) last night and coming before tomorrow's starter Kris Bubic (23)...in addition to Brad Keller (25) and Daniel Lynch (24), the Royals have had five different pitchers 25 or younger make a start this year, which is tied for the third most in the Majors, trailing Miami (7) and Seattle (6)...including Kowar's start today, 36 of the Royals' 63 games this season have been started by a pitcher 25 of younger (57.1\%), which trails only the Marlins, who have started a pitcher 25 or younger in 48 of 64 games entering today ( $76.2 \%$ )...since May 16 -the day before Danny Duffy was placed on the 10-day Injured List-the Royals have started a pitcher 25 or younger in 17 of their last 23 games ( $73.9 \%$ ), a stretch in which the club is $12-11$ and those pitchers are $6-5$.

NO MINOR FEAT: Jackson went 5-0 with a 0.85 ERA (3 ER in 31.2 IP) and a .165 opponents' average (18-for-109) in six starts at Triple-A Omaha to begin this season, including a win in each of his first five starts...he didn't allow a run over his last 15.0 innings, a stretch in which he allowed just five hits and four walks with 17 strikeouts...his 0.85 ERA led all Triple-A pitchers at the time of his promotion to the Majors, and ranked third among all minor league pitchers, and his five wins were tied with four others for the minor league lead...he struck out 41 batters in 31.2 innings (11.7 K/9) and has not allowed a HR.

SPRING FLING: Kowar made six appearances (3 starts) with the Royals in Spring Training, going 2-2 with a 10.80 ERA (14 ER in 11.2 IP)...of the 14 runs he allowed, 11 of them came in two appearances, and he pitched to a 3.00 ERA ( 3 ER in 9.0 IP) in his other four outings, including 2.0 scoreless innings in his spring debut on March 1 at Cleveland and 3.0 scoreless innings on March 21 vs. the Rockies, and earned the win in both appearances.

## TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP KRIS BUBIC (1-1, 3.32)

+ Kris will make his sixth start (10th appearance) of 2021 and the 16th start (20th appearance) of his career tomorrow at Oakland, his first against them.
+ Bubic allowed a career-high four home runs in his last start on Tuesday at the Angels, earning his first loss of the season, in which he was charged with six runs on six hits and four walks over 4.0 innings, with four strikeouts...he allowed a two-run homer to Shohei Ohtani in his 42-pitch first inning, but followed that with an eight-pitch second, retiring the Angels in order....he allowed four hits over the third and fourth innings, including a double and a two-run home run by Max Stassi in the third, and solo home runs by José Iglesias and Justin Upton in the fourth...he has allowed six home runs over his last three starts after not allowing any homers over his first six games (2 starts) this season.
+ In five starts, Kris is $1-1$ with a 4.26 ERA ( 12 ER in 25.1 IP ), .255 opponents' average ( 25 -for- 98 ), 22 strikeouts and 11 walks ( $2.00 \mathrm{~K} / \mathrm{BB}$ ratio, $7.82 \mathrm{~K} / 9.0$ IP)...in four relief appearances, he owns a 1.42 ERA ( 2 ER in 12.2 IP), 186 ( 8 -for- 43 ) average and 10 strikeouts to seven walks ( $1.43 \mathrm{~K} / \mathrm{BB}, 7.11 \mathrm{~K} / 9.0 \mathrm{IP}$ ).
+ In four road outings (2 starts), Bubic has a 5.06 ERA ( 9 ER in 16.0 IP ), but six of those nine runs came in his last start on Tuesday in Anaheim.


## MANAGER MIKE MATHENY

+ With a win on Opening Day vs. Texas, Mike Matheny-in his ninth season as a Major League manager-became the ninth active manager to win vs. all 30 teams, according to Elias, joining Dusty Baker (24th season), Bud Black (14th season), Terry Francona (21st season), Joe Girardi (13th season), AJ Hinch (8th season), Joe Maddon (18th season), Don Mattingly (11th season) and Bob Melvin (18th season).
+ Matheny was named the Royals' 17th full-time manager on Oct. 31, 2019 and has a 647-540 record over nine seasons as a manager, and his 647 wins are the ninth most among active managers...his . 545 lifetime win percentage as a manager ranks sixth among active skippers.
+ This is Matheny's second big league managerial stint, after leading the St. Louis Cardinals from 2012-2018, then serving as a Special Advisor to Player Development for the Royals during the 2019 campaign.... he posted a winning record in each of his seven seasons with St. Louis, including a Major League-best 100 victories in 2015...Matheny led the Cardinals to the postseason in each of his first four seasons from 2012-15, becoming the first manager to do that in Major League history...under his leadership, the Cardinals were a Wild Card qualifier in 2012, before winning three-straight National League Central titles (2013-15) and winning the National League pennant in 2013.


## REPLAY SPECIALIST BILL DUPLISSEA

+ Royals' replay specialist Bill Duplissea was unsuccessful in his challenge of a play at the plate in the eighth inning last night, as replay official Tim Timmons could not definitively determine that Andrew Benintendi touched home before being tagged out on a play that would've given the Royals a one-run lead...in the ninth inning, a crew chief review overturned an out call on Jarrod Dyson at second base.
+ He's challenged 102 calls since the start of 2018, and just four of them have been confirmed, including one last Sunday and one on May 13 in Detroit, which snapped a streak of 35 straight challenges without one being confirmed...he also had a streak of 48 straight without a confirmed from Sept. 27, 2017-April 9, 2019
$\boldsymbol{+}$ Duplissea is 8 -for-18 on challenges this season, but still owns a Majors-best $70.1 \%$ success rate (124-for-177) over the last six years (since 2016), well ahead of the Yankees, who rank second with a 64.6\% overturn rate, and well above the Major League average, which is $44.2 \%$ this season through June 10
+ The Royals have finished in the top three in replay success rate in each of the last five seasons including a 78.6 success rate in 2018 , which is the best rate by any Major League team since 2016.
$\boldsymbol{+}$ Duper is in his 17th season with the Royals and serves as the replay coordinator and advance scout.

+ Took his second loss of the year last night after allowing the A's to walk-off on an Elvis Andrus single in the ninth inning, pitching in back-toback games...the run he allowed in the ninth snapped a career-long 13.0-inning scoreless streak dating back to May 14 at Chicago (Game 1). Recorded his second 2.0-inning save of the season on June 3 vs . Minnesota (also April 15 vs . Toronto), becoming the only pitcher in the Majors this season with two six-out saves...he's the first Royal with two such saves in a season since Joakim Soria notched five in 2009 .
+ Was named Royals Pitcher of the Month for May, after posting a 1.50 ERA and 23 strikeouts in May, the highest K/9 rate (17.3) in any single month in club history (min. 12.0 innings pitched), and is the first reliever to win the award since lan Kennedy won it in June 2019.
+ Barlow owns a $12.80 \mathrm{~K} / 9$ ratio this season ( 46 K in 32.1 IP ), the highest mark among relievers in the Majors (min. 30.0 IP ), which would be the seventh-highest mark by a reliever in franchise history...excluding the shortened 2020 season, it would rank fifth in Royals history.
+ Ronald fired 2.0 innings in relief of Kris Bubic Tuesday night vs. the Angels and began his outing by recording five consecutive strikeouts, before finishing it with a pop out to shortstop by Juan Lagares...via Bally Sports Kansas City's Dave Holtzman, he became just the third Royals reliever to begin an appearance with five consecutive strikeouts, joining Luke Hochevar on Sept. 10, 2013 and Scott Sullivan on May 30, 2004.
+ He also became the first Royals reliever with five consecutive strikeouts in an outing since Jorge López on May 29, 2019 at the White Sox.
+ Was recalled June 3, marking his second stint with the club this year, after serving as the 27th Man for the doubleheader at the White Sox on May 14 + He has pitched in four games (all starts) for Triple-A Omaha so far this season, going 0-1 with a 3.31 ERA ( 6 ER in 16.1 IP) with 16 strikeouts.
+ He was acquired on July 16, 2020 from San Diego with outfielder Franchy Cordero (now with Boston) in exchange for left-handed pitcher Tim Hill.


## \#59 JAKE BRENTZ | LHP

#### Abstract

$\boldsymbol{+}$ Jake pitched a 1-2-3 seventh inning last night vs. the A's, recording one strikeout to Elvis Andrus and inducing two line outs...he has not allowed a hit to a left-handed hitter since April 21, as they are O-for-their-last 23 with nine walks since then against him. + His 14.0 scoreless inning steak is a career long, and is the fifth-longest active streak in the American League, according to Elias. + Brentz allowed just seven hits in May, holding opponents to a . 137 average ( 51 at-bats), marking the second fewest hits and second lowest batting average allowed by a Royals reliever in May, trailing only Tom Gordon's .078 average (4-for- 51 ) in May 1989 (min. 15.0 innings pitched). + He earned his first career win on May 18 vs. Milwaukee, recording the final out in the eighth to become the 329 th pitcher to win for the Royals. + He's pitched in 31 of the Royals' 62 games, one behind A's reliever Yusmeiro Petit for the Majors lead, and leads all MLB rookies.


+ Wade allowed one run on one hit, one walk with one strikeout Wednesday against the Angels, and has yielded a run in six of his last 11 outings... he has pitched 214.1 innings in relief for Kansas City, 1.0 inning shy of tying Mike Armstrong for 18th-most in franchise history.
+ He pitched 2.1 scoreless innings Monday vs. the Angels, allowing just one hit with one walk and one strikeout...the seven outs matched the third-longest relief outing of his career in the regular season and was the longest since Sept. 1, 2012 at Toronto with the Rays (also 2.1 IP).
$\boldsymbol{+}$ Davis is looking to pitch at the Coliseum for the first time since April 15, 2016, and has a save in his last four outings vs. the A's since June $28,2015$. + He is holding left-handed batters to a .194 batting average (7-for-36) this season with just two extra-base hits ( 2 HR) and 12 strikeouts.
+ His save on April 1 was his 48th as a Royal, one shy of Steve Farr for ninth on the all-time list and two behind Mike MacDougal for eighth.

+ Carlos was recalled from Triple-A Wednesday to mark his third big league stint this year, including the first nine games and a three-day stint in May. $\boldsymbol{H}$ He is $2-1$ with a 4.44 ERA ( 13 ER in 26.1 IP ) over six starts with the Storm Chasers and has struck out 26 batters with just six walks..he pitched Tuesday in St. Paul against the Saints and covered 2.0 perfect innings, needing just 22 pitches to get through six batters.
+ He made three appearances in his first stint with the Royals this season, and last pitched in the Majors on May 29 at Minnesota, where he allowed three runs on four hits with three walks and six strikeouts in a 6-5 Royals loss...he has 24 strikeouts in 22.1 innings in the Majors ( $9.7 \mathrm{~K} / 9$ ). + Became the third-youngest Royal to win on Opening Day (24.021), older only than Brad Keller (23.244 in 2019) and Yordano Ventura (23.307 in 2015)
+ In his debut last Sept. 1, he became the eighth known Royal to make the jump from Class-A to the Majors, according to RHOF Director, Curt Nelson.

+ Holland bounced back from a rough outing on Monday with a 1-2-3 ninth inning Thursday night, sealing the Royals' 6-1 victory in Oakland.
