CLUNKER AT THE COLISEUM: The Royals suffered an 11-2 loss in Oakland yesterday to match their largest margin of defeat this season while losing for the seventh time in their last eight games...Jackson Kowar lasted just 1.1 innings in his second career start, in which he was charged with four runs on five hits and three walks, with one strikeout...Ronald Bolaños followed with 3.1 innings of one-run ball out of the bullpen, continuing an impressive showing since his June 3 recall...the Royals' offense stranded the bases loaded in the third and fourth innings vs. A's starter James Kaprielian, who allowed just two hits and four walks over 6.0 scoreless innings... Kelvin Gutierrez broke up Oakland's shutout bid with a two-run home run in the eighth inning, snapping a personal homer drought at 159 at-bats...Wade Davis was tagged for five runs in the bottom half, as the A's put the game out of reach to clinch the Royals' third straight winless series after winning four of their previous five

+ Hanser Alberto worked an eight-pitch walk as a pinch hitter in the seventh off Jesus Luzardo, his first walk since the seventh inning on Sept. 4, 2020 vs. the Yankees vs. Aroldis Chapman, snapping a streak of 185 consecutive plate appearances without a walk, which was the longest active streak in the Majors.

THE RUNNING ROYALS: The Royals flashed their team speed yesterday in Oakland as Jarrod Dyson and Nicky Lopez pulled off a double steal in the third inning off James Kaprielian, the club's seventh double steal of the season and first since May 15 at the White Sox...the Royals lead the American League with 46 steals in 63 games, one ahead of Texas (45) and four ahead of Tampa Bay (42)...the Royals lead the Majors with 1,351 stolen bases over the last 12 seasons (since 2010), 110 more than the next-closest team (San Diego) and 128 more than the next-closest American League team (Texas)...ten different Royals have stolen a base this season, including Whit Merrifield, who leads the Majors with 17, three more than Texas' Isiah Kiner-Falefa (14), + Merrifield is 17 -for-17 on steal attempts since being caught on his first try of the season, and his $94.4 \%$ rate is best in the Majors among qualifying players...his current rate would rank third among single-season totals in Royals history, trailing Alcides Escobar, who went 22 -for-22 in 2013, and Carlos Beltrán, who went 31 -for- 32 ( $96.9 \%$ ) in 2001...he is more than halfway to Beltrán's club record of 33 straight steals without being caught, a mark that extended over parts of three seasons from Sept. 28, 1999-Aug. 10, 2001.

+ A Royal has led the American League in stolen bases in three of the last four seasons, including Merrifield, who led the American League with 34 steals in 2017 and led the Majors with a careerhigh 45 steals in 2018...in 2019, Adalberto Mondesi-who has missed 56 of the Royals' 63 games this season due to injury-finished second in the Majors with 43 steals in just 102 games, but captured the Major League steals crown with 24 steals in the 2020-shortened season, eight more than anyone else

QUADRUPLE TRIPLE: Kelvin Gutierrez had two of the Royals' five hits in yesterday's loss, including a triple in the fourth and a two-run home run in the eighth, which snapped his HR drought at 159 at-bats, and marked the first game of his career in which he recorded multiple extra-base hits.... he is the third Royal to record a triple and a HR in a game this season, joining Hunter Dozier on May 3 vs. Cleveland and Andrew Benintendi on June 5 vs. Minnesota...the three such games are the most by any team this season, breaking a tie with the Rays and Reds ( 2 each), and the Royals have accounted for three of the 21 such games this season ( $14.3 \%$ ). + Gutierrez's triple was the Royals' 15th of the season, matching Detroit for the American League lead.

+ He has a hit in 11 of his last 13 games, including four straight games, in which he's batting 6-for-16 (.375)
RISPY BUSINESS: Since going a season-best 8-for-15 in scoring situations on June 4 vs. the Twins, the Royals are batting .184 ( 9 -for-49) with runners in scoring position, including .176 ( 6 -for-34) on this trip...they are O-for-their-last-15 in scoring situations since their last hit, a two-run HR by Jorge Soler in Thursday night's 6-1 win...for the season, the Royals are batting .247 in scoring situations, which ranks 15th out of all 30 teams

ROYAL RUNDOWN: The Royals are 30-33, which is a 10-game improvement through 63 games from 2019, when they started $20-43$, but is just one loss shy of matching their season-low mark of four games under 500, last done on May 16 (18-22)...their season to this point has been defined by four different stretches, which have shown two sides to this club...through May 1, the Royals led the Majors with a 16-9 record and held a 1.5-game lead over the White Sox in the American League Central Division...an 11-game losing streak ensued, dropping them to 16-20, which put them 6.5 games behind the White Sox for the division lead...the Royals snapped the skid on May 14, which began a 13-6 run through June 4 , a stretch in which the Royals played to the second-best record in the American League and outscored opponents 99-68 (+31)...that carried them to a 29-26 record-three games over .500-making them the just sixth team in the last 67 years, according to Elias, to fall below .500 thanks to an 11-game losing streak, only to return to above .500 later in that same season...following a five-game win streak, the Royals have now lost seven of their last eight games, in which they've been outscored 45-21 (-24), and they now sit in third place in the division standings, 9.5 games behind the White Sox.

+ According to Bally Sports Kansas City's Dave Holtzman, the Royals are the only team in the Major Leagues this season with two winning streaks of at least five games (April 21-26 and May 30-June 4) and two losing streaks of at least five games (May 2-13 and June 5-9).
VS. ATHLETICS: The Royals have lost 12 of their last 17 games vs. the Athletics, in which they've been outscored 97-50 (-47), including a 16-0 loss on June 1, 2018, a 19-4 loss on Aug. 26, 2019, and an 11-2 loss yesterday...they're 3-7 in their last 10 games at the Coliseum, and can do no better than a split in this four-game set, which will extend their streak to five straight winless series vs. the A's since their last win from Aug. 14-16, 2018, when they took two of three...after today, the Royals won't see the A's again until the penultimate homestand of the season, from Sept. 14-16 at Kauffman Stadium.

ON DECK: Following today's game, the Royals will fly back to Kansas City to begin a six-game homestand tomorrow night vs. the Tigers...the Royals will enjoy an off day next Thursday-which will break a streak of 14 games in 14 days-before welcoming the Red Sox to town for a three-game set next weekend...they Royals have won four of their five previous homestands this season, including a 4-2 mark on the last stay vs. the Pirates and Twins.

IRON MAN MERRIFIELD: Whit Merrifield is playing in his 371st consecutive game today, which is the longest active streak in the Majors, according to Elias...including today's game, he's 2,261 games shy of Cal Ripken Jr.'s Major League record of 2,632 straight games played...to catch Ripken, the 32 -year-old Merrifield would have to play another 14 -plus full seasons without missing a game...Merrifield's streak began on June 25, 2018, and he's appeared at six different positions during that span, including first base, second base, left field, center field, right field and designated hitter...his streak of 371 consecutive games played is just 50 shy of the Royals' record of 421 games set by Alcides Escobar from Sept. 26, 2015-July 7, 2018

LEFT-SIDE STORY: Southpaw Kris Bubic will make the start today for the Royals, marking the 29th game out of 64 (45.3\%) in which the Royals have started a left-handed pitcher this season...that's the sixth most such starts in the Majors, trailing only Toronto (43), Tampa Bay (35), Seattle (34), Oakland (32) and the Dodgers (30), and is the Royals' highest rate of lefty starts since 2012, when they started a southpaw in 74 of 162 games ( $45.7 \%$ ).

+ The Royals are 15-13 in games started by a left-handed pitcher this season-including 4-1 in Bubic's starts-and have won seven of the last 11 .
 vs. a team outside the American or National League Central Division....prior to his most recent start last Tuesday vs. the Angels, all 18 of his career outings ( 14 starts) came vs. Central Division teams...seven of his nine outings this season have come within the American League Central, the only other exception being a start on May 18 vs. Milwaukee, in which he allowed just one hit and two walks over 6.0 scoreless innings in a $2-0$ Royals win. + Bubic was born in Cupertino, Calif. and graduated from Archbishop Mitty High School, which is about 40 miles south of RingCentral Coliseum...he stayed close to home for college, attending Stanford, where he went 8-1 with a 2.62 ERA ( 25 ER in 86.0 IP) in 2018 for the Pac-12 champion Cardinal.

ON THE ROAD: Bubic is $1-1$ with a 5.06 ERA ( 9 ER in 15.0 IP ) in four road appearances ( 2 starts) this season, although six of the nine runs he's allowed came in his last start on Tuesday in Anaheim....he recorded a 2.25 ERA (3 ER in 12.0 IP) and .233 opponents' average ( 10 -for- 43 ) over his first three road outings, including a win on May 28 at Target Field, in which he held the Twins to one run over 6.0 innings...he's held opponents to two runs or fewer in six of his eight career road appearances, but he's just 1-3 away from Kauffman Stadium and the Royals are just 1-7 in his eight road outings.

## TOMORROW NIGHT'S STARTER: RHP BRAD KELLER (6-5, 5.75)

+ Brad will make his team-leading 14th start of the season and 71 st of his career ( 92 nd appearance) in tomorrow night's homestand opener vs. Detroit.
+ In his last start in Wednesday's series finale against the Angels in Anaheim, Keller was charged with the loss after allowing five runs on eight hits and a season-high tying four walks, with four strikeouts.... held the Angels scoreless through two outs in the third inning, but issued a walk and a single before a two-out, full-count double by Anthony Rendon broke the scoreless tie...scattered two singles and a walk through five innings, but was only able to record one out in the sixth as the Angels piled on three runs, punctuated by an RBI double by José Iglesias and a two-RBI single by Kean Wong....he was relieved by Kyle Zimmer, who stranded one inherited runner...snapped a stretch of five-straight starts in which the Royals won.
+ Induced a key double play in the second inning, the 56th double play he has induced since 2018, which leads the Majors over the last four years.
+ He'll face the Tigers for the second time this year, following his win on April 26 in Detroit in which he secured his first of three quality starts this season, allowing two runs on eight hits and two walks in 6.0 innings...in seven career starts ( 11 outings) vs. Detroit, he's $4-3$ with a 2.85 ERA ( 15 ER in 47.1 IP )...he's pitched at least 6.0 innings in six of his seven career starts vs. Detroit, including each of his last four, and has recorded five quality starts.
+ Despite going 2-2 with a 7.20 ERA (20 ER in 25.0 IP) in six home starts this year, the Royals have gone 4-2 in his games at Kauffman Stadium.


## MANAGER MIKE MATHENY

+ With a win on Opening Day vs. Texas, Mike Matheny-in his ninth season as a Major League manager-became the ninth active manager to win vs. all 30 teams, according to Elias, joining Dusty Baker (24th season), Bud Black (14th season), Terry Francona (21st season), Joe Girardi (13th season), AJ Hinch (8th season), Joe Maddon (18th season), Don Mattingly (11th season) and Bob Melvin (18th season).
+ Matheny was named the Royals' 17th full-time manager on Oct. 31, 2019 and has a 647-541 record over nine seasons as a manager, and his 647 wins are the ninth most among active managers...his . 545 lifetime win percentage as a manager ranks sixth among active skippers.
+ This is Matheny's second big league managerial stint, after leading the St. Louis Cardinals from 2012-2018, then serving as a Special Advisor to Player Development for the Royals during the 2019 campaign...he posted a winning record in each of his seven seasons with St. Louis, including a Major League-best 100 victories in 2015...Matheny led the Cardinals to the postseason in each of his first four seasons from 2012-15, becoming the first manager to do that in Major League history....under his leadership, the Cardinals were a Wild Card qualifier in 2012, before winning three-straight National League Central titles (2013-15) and winning the National League pennant in 2013.


## REPLAY SPECIALIST BILL DUPLISSEA

+ Royals' replay specialist Bill Duplissea was unsuccessful in his challenge of a play at the plate in the eighth inning Friday night, as replay official Tim Timmons could not definitively determine that Andrew Benintendi touched home before being tagged out on a play that would've given the Royals a one-run
lead...in the ninth inning, a crew chief review overturned an out call on Jarrod Dyson at second base.
+ He's challenged 102 calls since the start of 2018, and just four of them have been confirmed, including one a week ago today and one on May 13 in Detroit, which snapped a streak of 35 straight challenges without one being confirmed...he also had a streak of 48 straight without a confirmed from Sept. 27, 2017-April 9, 2019 + Duplissea is 8 -for-18 on challenges this season, but still owns a Majors-best $70.1 \%$ success rate (124-for-177) over the last six years (since 2016), well ahead of the Yankees, who rank second with a $64.6 \%$ overturn rate, and well above the Major League average, which is $44.2 \%$ this season through June 10
+ The Royals have finished in the top three in replay success rate in each of the last five seasons, including a 78.6 success rate in 2018, which is the best rate by any Major League team since 2016
+ Duper is in his 17th season with the Royals and serves as the replay coordinator and advance scout.

+ Took his second loss of the year Friday night after allowing the A's to walk-off on an Elvis Andrus single in the ninth inning, pitching in back-to-back games...the run he allowed in the ninth snapped a career-long 13.0-inning scoreless streak dating back to May 14 at Chicago (Game 1). + Recorded his second 2.0 -inning save of the season on June 3 vs. Minnesota (also April 15 vs. Toronto), becoming the only pitcher in the Majors this season with two six-out saves...he's the first Royal with two such saves in a season since Joakim Soria notched five in 2009.
+ Was named Royals Pitcher of the Month for May, after posting a 1.50 ERA and 23 strikeouts in May, the highest K/9 rate (17.3) in any single month in club history (min. 12.0 innings pitched), and is the first reliever to win the award since lan Kennedy won it in June 2019.
+ Barlow owns a $12.80 \mathrm{~K} / 9$ ratio this season ( 46 K in 32.1 IP ), the highest mark among relievers in the Majors (min. 30.0 IP ), which would be the seventh-highest mark by a reliever in franchise history...excluding the shortened 2020 season, it would rank fifth in Royals history.
+ Ronald covered 3.1 innings yesterday in Oakland, a career high as a reliever, allowing one run on two hits with two walks and four strikeouts. + On Tuesday night in Anaheim, he struck out his first five batters, becoming the third Royals reliever to strikeout five straight to begin a relief appearance, according to Bally Sports Kansas City's Dave Holtzman, joining Luke Hochevar on Sept. 10, 2013 and Scott Sullivan on May $30,2004$. + His outing on Tuesday was the first in which a Royals reliever had five straight strikeouts at any point since Jorge López on May 29, 2019. + Was recalled June 3, marking his second stint with the club this year, after serving as the 27 th Man for the doubleheader at the White Sox on May 14 . + He has pitched in four games (all starts) for Triple-A Omaha so far this season, going 0-1 with a 3.31 ERA ( 6 ER in 16.1 IP) with 16 strikeouts.
+ He was acquired on July 16,2020 from San Diego with outfielder Franchy Cordero (now with Boston) in exchange for left-handed pitcher Tim Hill.

+ Jake pitched a 1-2-3 seventh inning Friday night vs. the A's, recording one strikeout to Elvis Andrus and inducing two line outs...he has not allowed a hit to a left-handed hitter since April 21, as they are O-for-their-last 23 with nine walks since then against him.
+ His 14.0 scoreless inning steak is a career long, and is the fourth-longest active streak in the American League, according to Elias.
+ Brentz allowed just seven hits in May, holding opponents to a .137 average ( 51 at-bats), marking the second fewest hits and second lowest batting average allowed by a Royals reliever in May, trailing only Tom Gordon's .078 average (4-for-51) in May 1989 (min. 15.0 innings pitched). + He earned his first career win on May 18 vs. Milwaukee, recording the final out in the eighth to become the 329 th pitcher to win for the Royals. + He's pitched in 31 of the Royals' 63 games, one behind A's reliever Yusmeiro Petit for the Majors lead, and leads all MLB rookies.
+ Wad
+ Wade tied Mike Armstrong for 18th-most innings pitched in Royals history (215.1) by pitching the bottom of the eighth yesterday in Oak-
land...he allowed a career-high-tying five runs in a relief outing on five hits and one walk, including home runs to Skye Bolt and Matt Olson. He pitched 2.1 scoreless innings June 7 vs. the Angels, allowing just one hit with one walk and one strikeout...the seven outs matched the third-longest relief outing of his career in the regular season and was the longest since Sept. 1, 2012 at Toronto with the Rays (also 2.1 IP).

+ This is his third big league stint this year, including the first nine games of the season from April 1-14 and a three-day stint from May $28-30$.
$\boldsymbol{+}$ He was $2-1$ with a 4.44 ERA ( 13 ER in 26.1 IP ) over six starts with the Storm Chasers and struck out 26 batters with just six walks..he pitched last Tuesday in St. Paul against the Saints and covered 2.0 perfect innings, needing just 22 pitches to get through six batters.
+ He made three appearances in his first stint with the Royals this season, and pitched on May 29 at Minnesota, where he allowed three runs on four hits with three walks and six strikeouts in a $6-5$ Royals loss...he has 26 strikeouts in 23.2 innings in the Majors ( $9.89 \mathrm{~K} / 9$ ).
+ Became the third-youngest Royal to win on Opening Day (24.021), older only than Brad Keller (23.244 in 2019 ) and Yordano Ventura (23.307 in 2015).


# + Holland bounced back from a rough outing on Monday with a 1-2-3 ninth inning Thursday night, sealing the Royals' 6-1 victory in Oakland. 

 + Greg is $1-0$ with a 1.00 ERA (2 ER in 18.0 IP ) and nine saves in 17 career appearances vs. Oakland...Thursday snapped a streak of nine consecutive outings with a save vs. Oakland...according to Elias, Holland's streak was the third-longest run of consecutive appearances with a save vs. Oakland, trailing Francisco Rodríguez, who had 12 straight from 2007-08, and Brian Fuentes, who had 10 straight from $2009-10$.+ He has 154 saves with the Royals, fourth most in club history behind Soria (162), Dan Quisenberry (238) and Jeff Montgomery (304).

Santana's 1.95 ERA vs. the A's is the lowest in the history of the franchise (min. 30 starts vs. the A's)...the next lowest ERAs belong to Urban Shocker ( 2.15 ERA, 33 starts, 1920-27), Luis Tiant ( $2.23,38,1964-80$ ), Steve Barber (2.38, 34, 1960-73) and Whitey Ford ( $2.54,53$, 1950-67). + His appearance on April 20 vs . the Rays marked his first appearance out of the bullpen in 4,216 days, dating back to Oct. 4,2009 with the Angels
+ Josh spun a 1-2-3 eighth in yesterday's loss, inducing two fly outs around a strikeout of Chad Pinder...it was his first appearance at the Coliseum. + Ranks 11th in AL with an opponents' batting average of 160 ( 8 -for-50) against right-handed batters (min. 50 righties faced).
+ Yielded a home run on Tuesday to Angels' Taylor Ward, who bats right-handed...it was the first homer he allowed to a right-handed batter since a three-run shot by Edwin Encarnación on Sept. 6, 2020, snapping a streak of 63 consecutive right-handed batters without a home run. + He was reinstated from the 10-day Injured List June 6 after missing eight games with a left knee sprain.

+ Kyle hasn't pitched since dazzling over 1.2 innings Wednesday in Anaheim, entering in the sixth with one on and one out and striking out two
to end the threat...he pitched the seventh and spun a $1-2-3$ frame, adding two more strikeouts for a career-high four strikeouts on the night. + He was reinstated from the 10-day Injured List on May 18 after missing the previous 16 games with a left trapezius strain two hits with 11 strikeouts over nine scoreless appearances ( 9.2 IP ) since returning from the IL, including a save on May 25 at Tampa Bay.
