LEADING OFF: Happy Birthday to Angels radio broadcaster Terry Smith!!!...Today, the Angels play the fourth (3-0) of six games on road trip against the Arizona Diamondbacks (3-0) and Oakland Athletics (June 14-16)...Angels went 5-2 on last homestand against the Seattle Mariners (2-2) and Kansas City Royals (3-0)...Angels went 3-3 on last road trip to the Bay Area against Oakland (2-2) and San Francisco (1-1).

BACK ON TRACK: Angels have won season-high six straight games, which is their longest streak since April 5-10, 2019 and are back above .500 for the first time since May 1 (13-12)... Halos have also won 11 of last 14 games and 14 of last 19... With a win today, Angels would have first seven game win streak since April 8-14, 2018.

<u>PLAYER OF THE WEEK:</u> Today, Max Stassi was named the American League Player of the Week for June 7-13...For the week, he batted .455 (10/22) with nine runs scored, three doubles, three home runs, eight RBI and a 1.478 OPS and led the Majors with 22 total bases...Stassi has also recorded an extra-base hit in six consecutive starts, which is a new franchise record for catchers.

ALL-STAR BALLOT UPDATE: Major League Baseball released the first balloting update today for the 2021 All-Star Game... Mike Trout led all A.L. outfielders and ranked second overall in the A.L. with 706,503 votes...Shohei Ohtani currently leads the designated hitter vote with 526,608 votes...Jared Walsh currently ranks fourth among A.L. first basemen and is 15,284 votes behind third place (Yuli Gurriel) for a spot in Round 2 of voting...Kurt Suzuki and Anthony Rendon rank fifth at catcher thand third base respectively, while David Fletcher is sixth among second basemen.

AGAINST SOUTHPAW STARTERS: Angels have won nine of last 11 games vs. left-handed starters after losing seven of first nine games against lefty starters.

<u>VS. OAKLAND:</u> Today's game marks the eighth (3-4) of 19 meetings this season between the Angels and A's (10 at Angel Stadium & nine at the Coliseum)...Angels lost two of three meetings at Angel Stadium May 21-23 and split a four game series at the Coliseum May 27-30.

AGAINST THE A's: In 40 career games against the A's, David Fletcher is batting .331 (46/139) with nine doubles, one home run and 13 RBI...Shohei Ohtani has hit eight career home runs against the A's, which is his second most against any opponent (has 9 HR vs. Texas).

SCORING CHANGE: An official scoring change has been made to the Angels game on June 6 vs. Seattle...In the 1st inning J.P. Crawford advanced to second on what was originally ruled a wild pitch...The play has been changed to a passed ball and the run scored against Patrick Sandoval is now unearned.

RAISELMANIA: Raisel Iglesias converted his 11th save of the season Saturday afternoon at Arizona...Dating back to 2019, Iglesias has stranded his last 22 inherited runners.

FOUR SCORE: Angels are 31-9 when scoring 4+ runs this season and are 2-23 when scoring three-or-fewer.

Jared Walsh ranks fifth in the American League in slugging percentage (.556), is tied for seventh with 30 extra-base hits and is eighth in OPS (.918).

TROUT TO THE IL: On May 18, the Angels placed OF Mike Trout on the injured list with a right calf strain...An estimated return to play is 6-8 weeks from the time of the injury...At the time of his IL placement, he led the Majors in OBP (.466) and OPS (1.090) and ranked fourth (led A.L.) in slugging percentage (.624).

Earned first win of season in last start on June 7 vs. KC, snapping 10 start winless streak

- TODAY'S GAME: Making 12th start of the season and sixth on the road...Second start of 2021 vs. Oakland...Is in seventh Major League season and second with Angels.
- <u>SUPPORT ME:</u> Has received an average of 2.53 runs of support per nine innings this season, which is lowest rate in the American League (min. 50 IP)...LAA scored sevens for Bundy in his last start, but scored three total runs while Bundy was in the game across his previous seven starts (32.1 IP).
- BACK IN THE WIN COLUMN: Earned win in last start on June 7 vs. Royals, which snapped career-high streak of 10 straight starts without a winning decision.
- LAST TIME OUT: Earned the win in last start on Monday vs. Kansas City after tossing 5.2 innings and allowing two earned runs on six hits with no walks and two strikeout.
- "K" NOTES: Recorded 700th career strikeout on April 19 at Texas (vs. Joey Gallo)...Tallied 10 strikeouts in me start on April 6 vs. Houston, which marked ninth career 10+ strikeout game and fourth as a member of Angels.
- THREE AND OUT: Has held opponents batting third in the order to a .207 (71/343) average for his career. Opposing hitters in the third batting order position were 3-for-31 (.097) last season, but they are 8-for-30 (.267) this year.
- KEEP IT IN THE YARD: In his career, is 25-13 with a 2.21 ERA (313.1 IP 77 ER) in games where he does not allow a home run (67 games, 46 starts), compared with a 20-41 record and 6.48 ERA (423.2 IP 305 ER) when yielding at least one homer (82 games, 79 starts)...Has allowed eight home runs across his last four starts; Allowed five total HR in 2020 (11 starts).
- <u>VS. OAKLAND:</u> In nine career games (eight starts) against the Athletics, is 4-1 with a 4.05 ERA (46.2 IP 21 ER) and 61 strikeouts...Allowed four runs in 2.1 innings in first start vs. A's this season on May 23 at Angel Stadium...In his three starts against the A's last year, was 2-0 with a 1.40 ERA (19.1 IP - 3 ER), and 23 SO.

- <u>OPENING DAY STARTER</u>: Made second career Opening Day start (first with the Angels after previously getting the nod in 2018 with Baltimore)...Became the Angels sixth different Opening Day starter in the last seven ears (2020-Andrew Heaney, 2019-Trevor Cahill, 2018 & 2016-Garrett Richards, 2017-Ricky Nolasco, 2010-15-Jered Weaver).
- **2020 RECAP:** Finished ninth in American League Cy Young Award voting, receiving a third place vote and two fifth place votes... Ranked among A.L. leaders with six wins (T4th), a 1.04 WHIP (5th), a .208 (51/245) batting average against (6th), a 3.29 ERA (65.2 IP - 24 ER) (9th) and 72 strikeouts (T9th)...Recipient of 2020 Nick Adenhart Award, which is voted on by Angels players to recognize the top pitching performer.
