## Texas Rangers (30-48) at Oakland Athletics (47-33)

RHP Mike Foltynewicz (1-7, 5.40) vs. RHP James Kaprielian (4-1, 2.86)

WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers open a 6-game roadtrip this evening that includes 3 contests eaxh in Oakland and Seattle...Texas swept a 3 -game weekend series from KC to match its longest winning streak of 2021, the 4th time, last $5 / 21-23$...it is the 4th longest current winning streak in MLB: 6--MIL; 4--BOS/LAD...team's last longer winning streak was 4 consecutive wins, 8/11-15/20...last defeat was $6 / 24$ vs. OAK...the Rangers have won 4 of 5 and 5 of the last 7 games and finished its longest homestand of 2021 at 5-5 with MIN (0-3), OAK (2-2), and KC (3-0).

- Over the longer span, Texas has lost 8 of 13,12 of 19, 21 of 29, and 30 of last 42 G...club's $8-15$ (.348) June mark is 3rd lowest in A.L. and team's $8-21$ (.276) record since $5 / 25$ is 3rd-lowest in MLB over that span, better than only ARI (.125, $4-28)$ and BAL (250, 8-24) ..season-long 9-G losing skid from 5/25-6/3 was T5th-longest drought in TEX history and longest slide since 0-9 span from 5/30-6/8/03.
- At 30-48 (.385), Texas has the 4th-lowest win pct. in MLB (ARI-.275, 22-58; BAL-.316, 25-54); PIT-.377, 29-48).. T2nd-fewest wins in TEX history after 78 G (28-50 in 1973; 30-48 in 1985/2003/2021)...club has been season-high 21 G under . $5003 x$ (last at 27-48 on Thurs.)...reached season high point at . 500 (18-18) on 5/9.

IN THE STANDINGS: Texas has been in 5th place in the A.L. West for the last 33 days...current $8-21$ span has dropped club from 6.0 GB to 17.5 GB behind 1st place HOU, the 4th-largest deficit in MLB (29.0 GB--ARI; 23.0 GB--BAL; 18.5 GB--COL)...Texas has gained 2.5 games in the standings the last 4 days after reaching season-high 20.0 GB on $6 / 24$, largest since end of '19 (29.0 GB)...have been in 4th or 5th place all but one day since $4 / 9$ (T3rd after win $5 / 23$ vs. HOU).

SERIES SWEEP: The 3 wins over KC marks the 2nd time this season that the Rangers have won all games of a series: $3-0$ vs. HOU, $5 / 21-23$, also at Globe Life Field...Texas has a split and win in its last 2 series after going 0-7-1 in its previous 8 series since that sweep of HOU .

- The Rangers are 8-15-2 in 25 overall series in 2021, 5-6-2 at home and 3-9-0 on the road
- The Rangers outscored the Royals, 21-5 in winning all 3 games by at least 3 runs...club had not accommplished that margin of victory in each game of a 3-game sweep since $8 / 14-16 / 17$ vs. DET with wins by scores of $6-2,10-4$, and 12-6.

ON THE ROAD: The Rangers have lost 3 straight and 19 of 20 away from home beginning $5 / 10$, snapping a 16 -game losing streak on 6/12 at LAD...that was their 1st victory since $5 / 6$ at MIN... that matched the longest road losing streak in franchise history with 16 straight road defeats by the expansion Washington Senators in their 1st season, 8/3-9/8/61.

- Texas has lost its 7 away series entering this 3 -game set in OAK since going 3-1 at MIN, 5/3-6...the club dropped its final 7 road series in 2020 after going 2-1 at COL, 6/14-16.
- The Rangers are 10-27 (.270) overall on the road in 2021 the 3rd lowest winning percentage in MLB to COL at . 162 (631) and ARI at . 227 (10-34)...It matches the Rangers' fewes victories after 37 road games with 1973 (10-27/10-28).

VERSUS OAKLAND:The Rangers will play 19 of their final 91 games (21\%) against the A's, a span that began with a 2-2 split in the year's 1st meeting, 6/21-24 at Globe Life Field.. Texas is just 6-16 vs. OAK beginning 7/27/19 and 12-31 starting $7 / 23 / 18$.

- Here ar the Oakland Coliseum, the Rangers have dropped 3 in a row since winning on 9/22/19, have lost 7 of 8 beginning $7 / 27 / 19$, and are $7-25$ since the start if 2017, $0-8-2$ in 10 series in that span...all-time, the A's have advantages of 387-278 overall and 203-176 in Oakland.
- Texas is $10-18$ vs. A.L. West Division clubs this season, losing 10 of the last 12 G beginning $5 / 25$...club is 2-13 in A.L. West parks, dropping 12 straight since a win on $4 / 21$ at LAA.

ANOTHER GARCIA GAME-WINNER: Adolis Garcia's 1st inning triple on Sunday, produced his 10th game-winning RBI of 2021, tying CWS' Jose Abreu, TOR's Vladimir Guerrero, Jr., and CLE's Jose Ramirez for 2nd most in MLB, one behind WAS' Kyle Schwarber...Nomar Mazara led Texas with 10 GWRBI in 2019, and the last Ranger with more in a season was Jurickson Profar (13) in 2018...Garcia also has 14 go-ahead RBI, T6th most in the A.L...over his last 8 games, he has a slash line of $.370 / .455 / .852$ (10-27) with 3 HR, 2 2B, 1 3B, and 8 RBI...he is T3rd in the A.L. with 20 homers and T4th with 55 RBI , the highest totals of any outfielder.

- García is one of the 9 MLB All-Star Ballot Finalists among A.L. OF for the 3 starting spots in the $7 / 13$ Midsummer Classic at COL...Phase 2 fan voting, which is available exclusively online at texasrangers.com and MLB.com and via mobile devices continues through Thursday at 1:00 pm CT with the All-Star starters announced at 8:00 p.m. CT that evening..

GALLO GETS IT GOING: Joey Gallo was 3 -for-6 with 3 HR, 7 RBI, and 3 BB in the final 2 games of the KC series...Gallo has 5 HR in his last 8 G and 7 HR in June are T7th in the A.L. - Gallo leads the Majors both in overall walks (61) and in BB in June (22)...in franchise history only 3 other players have had as many as 61 BB in their 1st 74 games of a season: 78--Toby Harrah, 1985; 70--Frank Howard, 1970; 61--Mickey Tettleton, 1995.

A FEW HITS GETS IT DONE: The Rangers' $4-1$ victory on Sunday was recorded with the benefit of just 4 hits...Texas entered that game with an 0-11 record when the team produced 4 or fewer hits in 2021...it was the club's 1st win with 4 or fewer hits since a $1-0$ victory on $9 / 16 / 20$ at $\mathrm{HOU}(4 \mathrm{H})$... it marked the 1st time that the Rangers have scored at least 4 runs with 4 or fewer hits in a win since 6/11/17 at WAS, when the club had 4 hits in a $5-1$ victory...that game will be remembered for the pitching matchup as Austin BibensDirkx allowed one run in 7.0 innings to outduel Nats ace Max Scherzer (3 R-2 ER/7.1 IP).

BACK-TO-BACK QUALITY: The outings by Kyle Gibson (7.0 IP, $2 \mathrm{H}, 0 \mathrm{R}$ ) and Jordan Lyles ( $7.0 \mathrm{IP}, 7 \mathrm{H}, 1 \mathrm{R}-\mathrm{ER}$ ) in the last 2 games vs. KC marked the 1st time Rangers' starters have worked at least 7.0 IP and allowed one or fewer runs in consecutive games since 3 in a row in 2019: 6/26 (Mike Minor) and 6/27 (Ariel Jurado) at DET and 6/28 (Lance Lynn) at TB...in fact, the Texas rotation had gone 22 G without a 7.0-inning performance prior to Gibson start on Saturday... the starters have a $2.61 \mathrm{ERA}(9 \mathrm{ER} / 31.0 \mathrm{IP}$ ) in the last 5 G to lower their season ERA from 4.76 to 4.59 .

KENNEDY CLOSES: lan Kennedy earned his 1st save since $6 / 4$ in Sunday's victory....he has 13 saves in 14 tries in 2021, a $92.9 \%$ success rate that is the best in the A.L. among relievers with at least 12 save tries...Kennedy has worked 4.0 scoreless innings in his last 4 appearances

MEDICAL UPDATE: DH Sam Huff was 0 -for-3 with a BB in his 1st game on rehab assignment for the ACL Rangers (Rookie) on Monday night...OF David Dahl continues his rehab assignment at Frisco (AA) on Tuesday....has combined for a ,407 (11-27) average with 1 HR and 8 RBI in 7 G between Round Rock (AAA) and Frisco...OF Willie Calhoun had surgery today to repair a fractured ulna bone in his left forearm... surgery was performed by Dr. Paul Hovis in Arlington...RHP Hunter Wood had an internal brace procedure performed on his right elbow by Dr. Keith Meister on Monday in Arlington... he is expected to be sidelined a minimum of 8 months.

SHORTS: Isiah Kiner-Falefa had been successful on his last 9 SB tries before he was CS in 6th inning on Sunday...Texas is $0-10$ in the 1 st game following an off-day in 2021... Texas batters have fewer than 10 strikeouts in 9 straight games, the team's longest such span since $12 \mathrm{G}, 8 / 24-9 / 7 / 18$.

## TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER <br> \#20 Mike Foltynewicz, RHP <br> (1-7, 5.40)

TONIGHT: The 29-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 16 th start of the season in tonight's road trip opener at the Coliseum... has a 4.91 ERA (6ER/11.0 IP) over his last 2 starts, but is $0-2,9.35$ ( $18 \mathrm{ER} / 17.1 \mathrm{IP}$ ) in 4 G/GS in June to raise season ERA from 4.31 to 5.40 , the highest qualifying ERA in MLB...has allowed an A.L.-high 41 extra-base hits and 18 home runs (tied), and has league's T6th-most losses (team-high 7)...will pitch on extra 5 days' rest after taking no decision in Rangers' $5-3$ win on Wed. vs. OAK at Globe Life Field, as he is facing A's in consecutive outings after just $2 \mathrm{G} / 1$ GS vs. OAK in his career prior to last week...averaging a career-best 2.14 walks per 9 innings, lowest mark among Texas starters, 8th in A.L., and well below his career average ( $3.03 \mathrm{BB} / 9$ )... has 6 quality starts, 2nd-most on club behind Kyle Gibson (12)...was signed as a free agent to a one-year contract on 2/10/21...made just one start for ATL in 2020 while spending the remainder of the season at the Braves Alternate Training Site...made 20+ starts for the Braves in 4 consecutive seasons from 2016-19... set career bests with 13 wins, 202 strikeouts, and a 2.85 ERA while being selected as an N.L. All-Star in 2018...has registered career-low 6.30 SO/9 in 2021 after he entered the year averaging $8.59 \mathrm{SO} / 9$ in his career...was acquired by Braves in January 2015 after making his Major League debut with HOU in 2014...was the 19th overall player selected in the 1st round of the 2010 MLB Draft by the Astros out of Minooka (IL) High School... Texas is 5-10 in his 15 starts, losing 4 of 5 and 7 of last 9 .

LAST START: Took ND despite quality start in Rangers' late $5-3$ win on Wed. vs. OAK (ND, 6.0 IP, $6 \mathrm{H}, 2$ R-ER, $0 \mathrm{BB}, 5 \mathrm{SO}, 1 \mathrm{HR}, 88$ pitches/59 strikes)... it was his 6th quality start, 1st QS in 4 tries in June...exited with a 2-1 lead after allowing a solo HR to Sean Murphy followed by Elvis Andrus 2B to open the 7th, but Spencer Patton would take a blown save when inherited runner scored...TEX offense scored in each of its final 5 innings at the plate, with Adolis García (2 HR) and Nate Lowe (HR) providing most of the damage.

VS. OAKLAND: Is $1-0,1.88$ ( $3 \mathrm{ER} / 14.1 \mathrm{IP}$ ) in $3 \mathrm{G} / 2 \mathrm{GS}$ vs. OAK in his career. will be facing A's for a 2nd consecutive start (see above), this after just 2 previous app. vs. OAK in his career...his only prior appearance at the Coliseum was a start with ATL on 6/30/17 at OAK (W, $8.0 \mathrm{IP}, 1 \mathrm{H}, 1$ R-ER, $4 \mathrm{BB}, 8 \mathrm{SO}, 119$ pitches)... took a no-hitter into the 9th inning of that game, but Matt Olson broke up the no-hit bid with a solo HR to lead off the 9th, although Foltynewicz still earned the win in matchup with Sonny Gray (8.0 IP, 1 R-ER).

- Has gone 1-1, 3.14 (15 ER/43.0 IP) in 7 starts against the A.L. West this season...with tonight's start, he will have faced each divisional opponent twice in 2021

AT A LOSS: His team-high 7 losses are T6th-most in A.L....has most starts (15) of any MLB pitcher with one or zero wins (LAA's Dylan Bundy is 1-7 in $14 \mathrm{G} / \mathrm{GS}$ )... winless in career-high 10 straight starts ( $0-4$ ), the longest single-season span by a Ranger since Martin Perez (11, 4/29-9/28/18)...enters the day with the lowest run support average ( $3.15 \mathrm{RS} / 9 \mathrm{IP}$ ) in the A.L. among qualifiers, 5th-lowest in MLB (PIT's Tyler Anderson is MLB-low 2.53 RS/9 IP).

ON THE ROAD: Has gone 0-3, $7.40(20 \mathrm{ER} / 24.1 \mathrm{IP})$ in his 5 road starts, taking losses in 3 straight...was $0-1,4.00$ ( $8 \mathrm{ER} / 18.0 \mathrm{IP}$ ) over his 1 st 3 away outings making 2 quality starts - but has allowed 13 R -12 ER over 6.1 IP in his last 2 road starts, both blowout losses...Rangers have totaled 5 R of support over 24.1 IP on road this season ( $1.85 \mathrm{RS} / 9$ )...has fared better in 10 home starts (1-4, 4.53 ERA, .795 opp . OPS) compared to his 5 road outings ( $0-3,7.40 \mathrm{ERA}, 1.035 \mathrm{opp}$. OPS).

2021: Has allowed an A.L.-high 41 extra-base hits and 18 home runs (tied), and has A.L.'s 2nd-highest opp. BA at 292 (BOS' Garrett Richards has .301 opp. BA)...opponents are batting .256 (21-82) with runners in scoring position...opp. BA by time thru batting order: 1st (.277), 2nd (.336), 3rd (.236)... 41 of 93 hits allowed have gone for extra bases ( $222 \mathrm{~B}, 18 \mathrm{HR}, 3 \mathrm{~B}$ )....has received one or zero runs in support in 7 of 15 starts... 25 of $49 R$ allowed have come via HR...started the Rangers' home opener on $4 / 5$ vs. TOR (L, 4.0 IP, 4 R-ER)...took the loss on $4 / 11$ vs. SD ( $7.0 \mathrm{IP}, 2 \mathrm{H}, 1 \mathrm{R}-\mathrm{ER}$ ), the 1st Texas pitcher to ever lose in Arlington when posting 7.0+ IP, 2-or-fewer H and just one run...earned 1st win as a Ranger on $4 / 27$ vs. LAA ( 5.1 IP, 1 R-ER), his 1 st win in 585 days (last $9 / 20 / 19 \mathrm{vs}$. SF w/ ATL- 8.0 IP, 0 R)...took ND despite quality start on $5 / 2$ vs. BOS ( 6.0 IP, 2 R-ER) as Rangers' 3-run 8th propelled a comeback win...permitted a career high-tying 8 runs on 6/11 at LAD (2.2 IP, 8 R-7 ER), most by any Texas pitcher in 2021.

2020: Opened the season with the Braves and sustained a $14-5$ loss in lone start on $7 / 27$ at TB ( $3.1 \mathrm{IP}, 4 \mathrm{H}, 6$ R-ER, $4 \mathrm{BB}, 3 \mathrm{SO}, 3 \mathrm{HR}$ )....was designated for assignment the following day and assigned outright to ATL's Alternate Training Site in Gwinnett on $7 / 30 \ldots$ spent the final 2 months of the season there and became a free agent on 11/2/20.


2018 ALL-STAR: Was selected to N.L. All-Star Game after going 7-5, 2.66 in 18 games to open the season...tossed a scoreless 4th inning in ASG on $7 / 17$ at WSH...was the 1st pitcher in Braves franchise history (since 1876) to reach 200 strikeouts and have an opponents' average under .200...was 1st ATL hurler with $200+$ strikeouts since Javier Vázquez in 2009 (238).

TEAM PITCHING: The staff has allowed just 1 R-ER in 18.0 IP in the last 2 G with a 2.60 ERA ( $13 \mathrm{ER} / 45.0 \mathrm{IP}$ ) in last 5 G to lower season ERA from 4.71 to 4.57 , 10 th in A.L. and lowest since $6 / 9(4.53)$...has a 5.05 ERA ( $110 \mathrm{ER} / 196.0 \mathrm{IP}$ ) last 22 G to rise from 4.38 ...among A.L. clubs, have allowed the 2 nd most hits (707), 2nd-highest opp. BA (.264), T4th-most HR (100), and T2nd-fewest strikeouts (631)...staff hass issued just 8 BB in 45.0 in last 5 G...no HR allowed in last 3 G, longest sreak since 4 G, 5/18-21...road ERA of 5.39 is 2nd highest in MLB (5.60--COL), 7.29 ( 47 ER58.0 IP) over last 7 G.

STARTERS: Kyle Gibson and Jordan Lyles combined to allow 1 R-ER in 14.0 IP in the last 12 G with each working $7.0 \mathrm{IP} . .$. no Texas starter had pitched as many as 7.0 IP in the previous $22 \mathrm{G} . .$. rotation has a $2.61 \mathrm{ERA}(9 \mathrm{ER} / 31.0 \mathrm{IP})$ in last 5 G to drop from 4.76 to 4.59 , 10th in A.L. and lowest since $6 / 15$ (4.58)...starters have a 4.99 ERA ( $41 \mathrm{ER} / 74.0 \mathrm{IP}$ ) in last 15 G to rise from $4.50 \ldots$ club is T6th in quality starts (26), 12 for Kyle Gibson... of the 26 quality starts, 20 have not resulted in a win for the starting pitcher, 10 in a row prior to last $2 \mathrm{G} . .$. starters' 16 wins are 2nd-fewest in A.L. (BAL-12).
RELIEVERS: Bullpen has worked 4.0 SHO IP the last 2 G and had a 3.69 ERA ( $16 \mathrm{ER} / 39.0 \mathrm{IP}$ ) on the 10-G homestand to drop season ERA from 4.68 to 4.55 , 11 th in A.L...one-or-zero runs allowed in 7 of last $9 \mathrm{G} \ldots$...has $5.45 \mathrm{ERA}(90 \mathrm{ER} / 148.2 \mathrm{IP}$ ) last 39 G to rise from season-low 3.68 ...bullpen is 15 -for- 26 $(57.7 \%)$ in save tries, 3rd lowest percentage in A.L. with just 3 saves in last 11 oppoertunities...relievers other than lan Kennedy (13-14) are 2-12 in save opportunities...bullpen has decision in 11 of the team's last 19 victories.
