WHERE WE LEFT OFF: The Red Sox are coming off a 7-0 homestand, during which they out-scored the Yankees (3-0) and Royals ( $4-0$ ) by a combined 52-21 (+31)...In yesterday's series finale, they had 17 hits in a 15-1 win over KC.

STATE OF THE SOX: The Red Sox lead MLB in wins and own sole possession of the AL's best record (51-31, .622).
A The Sox are a season-high 20 games above .500 .
A The Sox have won their last 7 games, the AL's longest active win streak and the club's 2nd-longest of the season ( $9 \mathrm{G}, 4 / 5-14$ ).

HALFWAY HOME: This is the 14th time the Sox have won at least 51 of their first 82 games, having most recently done so in 2007 and 2018 (won World Series in both years).
A Under the 10-team playoff format from 2012-2019, 15 of 16 teams who won $51+$ of their first 82 games made the Postseason (all except the 2018 Mariners).

GIVE ME A BREAK: The Red Sox are closing out the first half by playing 19 games in 20 days ( $6 / 22-7 / 11$ )...They are in a stretch of 16 consecutive days with a game ( $8-2$ so far).
A The Sox will open the season's 2 nd half by playing a game on 18 consecutive days (7/15-8/1), all against AL East opponents (NYY-8, TOR-7, TB-3).

MONTH BY MONTH: The Red Sox went 17-10 (.630) in April, 15-11 (.577) in May, and 18-10 (.643) in June... The only other teams to win $15+$ games in each of those months were the A's, Dodgers, Giants, and Padres.

LONG DIVISION: The Red Sox lead the AL East by 3.5 games, matching their largest lead of the season.
A The Sox are 8-13 (.381) vs. AL West teams and 43-18 (.705) against all others.

A The Sox are 24-17 (.585) vs. teams that entered today with a winning record, MLB's 3rd-best mark.

HERE AND THERE: The Red Sox are an MLB-best 24-14 (.632) on the road...They have lost their last 3 series at Oakland Coliseum, going 3-8 in games from 2017-19.
A The Red Sox are 27-17 at home, including 27-14 (.659) since getting swept by BAL to begin the season...Their . 614 win \% at home ranks 3rd in the AL.

SLUMP BUSTERS: The Red Sox' longest losing streak of the season is 3 games ( 3 times)...They are 1 of only 2 teams without a losing streak of $4+$ games (also NYM).
A The last 2 seasons in which BOS never lost more than 3 straight games were 2013 and 2018 (wonWS both years).

LEADING OFF: Kiké Hernández has hit a leadoff HR in 3 of the Red Sox' last 5 games (Sunday, Monday, Thursday)... According to Elias, he is the only Red Sox player ever with 3 or more leadoff homers in a 5 -game span.

DOWN, NOT OUT: The Red Sox lead the majors with 28 come-from-behind wins this season...They are an MLBleading 24-12 (.667) in games decided by 1 or 2 runs.
A The Sox lead the majors in runs scored with 2 outs (178)...With RISP \& 2 outs, the Sox lead MLB in AVG (.285) and OPS (.881).

* The Sox lead MLB in 2-strike RBI (169), 20 more than any other team...Rafael Devers (34) and Xander Bogaerts (27) rank 1st and 2nd in MLB in 2-strike RBI.

ALL-STAR SOX: Xander Bogaerts and Rafael Devers have been named starters for the 2021 MLB All-Star Game... They would become the first Red Sox teammates ever to start the Midsummer Classic together at SS and 3B.

* All-Star Game pitchers and reserves will be announced Sunday at 5:30 p.m. ET.

LEFT SIDE...STRONG SIDE: This is Xander Bogaerts' 3rd All-Star selection (also 2016 \& '19), his 2nd fan-elected start (2016)...He would become only the 3rd Red Sox player to start multiple All-Star Games at SS, joining Rico Petrocelli (1967, '69) and Joe Cronin (1935, '37-39, '41).

A Devers will be making his All-Star Game debut, becoming the first Red Sox 3B to win the fan election since 2002 (Shea Hillenbrand)...He leads the majors with 69 RBI and ranks 2nd with 45 XBH.

MONSTER MASH: During their 7-game win streak, the Red Sox are batting .335 with a .981 OPS, 14 HR, and 14 doubles...They have scored 52 runs and struck out 45 times.

A The Red Sox have hit $4+$ HR an MLB-best 8 times this season, including in 3 of their last 5 games.
A The Sox lead MLB with 19 three-run homers.
A The Sox are an MLB-best 46-4 (.920) when scoring 4+ runs...They are 40-3 when scoring $5+$ runs, $34-1$ when scoring $6+$ runs, and $25-0$ when scoring $7+$ runs.

A Among AL closers, Matt Barnes ranks 1st in strikeout \% (45.4) and FanGraphs' WAR (1.8)...He also ranks 2nd in WHIP (0.83), opponent OPS (.479), FIP (1.67), opponent AVG (.165), and saves (18).
