## Oakland Athletics (50-39) at Texas Rangers (34-53)

WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers lost to the Tigers on Wednesday, 5-3, and club has a 1-2 record to begin this 7-day, 6-game homestand against DET (1-2) and OAK (3 G) leading into the All-Star break...club has lost 3 of 4,4 of 6 , and 5 of 8 , but has a $7-5$ record in last 12 G beg. $6 / 25$, including a season-best $4-\mathrm{G}$ winning streak from 6/25-29.. club has also captured 8 of 14 and 9 of the last 16 games... team's 9-7 (.563) record beg. 6/21 is 14 th-best in MLB...prior to this span, the Rangers went just $7-28$ from 5/10-6/20 and 3-19 from 5/25-6/20.

- At 34-53 (.395), Texas has the 4th-lowest win pct. in MLB (ARI-.281, 25-64; BAL-.326, 28-58; PIT-.372, 32-54)...current record marks fewest wins through 87 G since 1985 (3255, .368)...team reached 17 games under .500 after win on Sat. at SEA, which matched team's best since 6/13 (25-41)... Texas has been season-high 21 G under .5003 x (last at 2748 on $6 / 24$ )...reached season-best at $.500(18-18)$ on $5 / 9$.

BETTER OF LATE: Since being swept in a 3-G series by Minnesota from $6 / 18-20$ to extend club losing skid to 6 games, the Rangers have gone 9-7 (.563) over the team's last 16 G beginning $6 / 21$, posting a +15 run differential ( $83-$ 68) over that span...team's .563 winning pct. over that span ranks 9th-best in A.L., 14th-best in MLB.

IN THE STANDINGS: Texas has been in 5 th place in the A.L. West for the last 42 days...since $5 / 25$, club has gone from 6.0 GB to 19.5 GB behind 1st place HOU, the 2nd-largest deficit in A.L. (25.0 GB--BAL) and T3rd-largest in MLB (30.5 GB-ARI, 19.5 GB--PIT)...Texas reached season-high 20.0 GB on $6 / 24$, largest deficit since end of 2019 ( 29.0 GB )...have been in 4th or 5th place on all but one day since $4 / 9$ (T3rd on $5 / 23$ ).

SERIES STUFF: Texas is 9-17-2 in 28 overall series in 2021, including 2-2-1 in last 5 series after going 0-7-2 in previous 9 series...team is $5-7-2$ at home and $4-10-0$ on the road...TEX has gone 2-4-2 in last 8 series at home...TEX has gone 8-20 (.286) in series openers this season, including a 6-8 mark at Globe Life Field...team has dropped each of last 2 series openers, but is still $3-2$ over last 5 openers since 6/21.

AT HOME: The Rangers are 21-23 (.477) at Globe Life Field in 2021, 3rd-lowest home win pct. in A.L...club has won 4 of 6,5 of 8 , and 6 of last 10 in Arlington...have a 19-19 record at this facility since a $2-4$ start...team's all-time record at GLF stands at an even 37-37...TEX is playing 21 of team's final 32 G before AS break at Globe Life Field (8-10 in span).

VS. OAKLAND: Texas leads the season series with Oakland, 4-games-to-3, going 2-2 from 6/21-24 at Globe Life Field and 2-1 last week (6/29-7/1) at the Coliseum, the Rangers' first series win at OAK since 2016 (2-1, 9/23-25/16)...the 2 teams' have alternated wins and losses through the first 7 meetings of '21, combining for an equal amount of runs (34-34) in those contests...the Rangers are 7-10 (.412) against the A's since the start of last season, with 5 of the 7 wins coming at GLF (5-6)...in addition, Texas has lost 10 of 15 and 16 of last 24 G vs. Oakland in Arlington dating to $7 / 23 / 18$...the Athletics hold a slight edge (388-380) in the all-time series, though the Rangers have a 202-184 advantage in games played in Texas...this series continues a stretch over which TEX plays 10 of $19 \mathrm{G}(52.6 \%)$ against the Swingin' A's.

IN THE DIVISION: The Rangers have gone 13-21 (.382) against opponents from the A.L. West this season, including an $8-5$ mark here at Globe Life Field...Texas has won 5 of its last 10 divisional matchups dating to $6 / 21$ : vs. OAK (2-2), at OAK (2-1), at SEA (1-2)...TEX is $7-2$ in last 9 home $G$ vs. the A.L. West, incl. a 3-0 sweep of the Astros from 5/21-23.

ROSTER MOVE: LHP John King has been placed on the 10-day Injured List, retroactive to July 7, with left shoulder inflammation...he we will be eligible to return from the IL on July 17...Texas has recalled OF Jason Martin from Round Rock (AAA) for his 3rd big league stint of the season: $5 / 26-$ 6/20 and 6/27-28...Martin has batted . 162 (6-37) with 1 HR and 4 RBI in 21 G/7 GS with the Rangers in 2021.

THE GALLO SHOW: Joey Gallo drove in all 3 of Texas' runs in Wednesday's 5-3 loss against the Tigers, launching a pair of solo home runs on the same day it was announced he would be competing in the 2021 T-Mobile Home Run Derby at Coors Field next week...it was his 12th career multi-homer game and club-high 4th of 2021 (all 2-HR games): $5 / 8 \mathrm{vs}$. SEA, $6 / 26$ vs. $\mathrm{KC}, 6 / 29$ at OAK...the 4 multi-HR G are already tied for Gallo's most in a single season (also 2017), as he is one of just 6 players in MLB with 4+ multi-HR efforts in 2021: 5-WAS' Kyle Schwarber, 4-Gallo/LAA's Jared Walsh/SD's Fernando Tatis Jr./BAL's Cedric Mullins/DET's Eric Haase.. additional notes on Gallo's recent exploits:

- The 2 HR were his 9th and 10th in his last 10 G , becoming the first player in WSH/TEX franchise history with as many as 10 HR over a span of $10 \mathrm{G}(6 / 26-7 / 7)$ )...he is the 2nd to pull the trick in MLB over the last 2 seasons, as Kyle Schwarber recently hit 12 HR over a 10-G span from 6/19-29. - Has established a new career high with 23 HR prior to the All-Star break, surpassing his previous pre-ASB high of 22 HR in 2018...Gallo is just the 9th Ranger ever with at least 23 HR before the break, 1st since Josh Hamilton tied the club record with 27 HR in 2012.
- Gallo has posted a .324/.468/.824/1.292 (24-74) batting line with $12 \mathrm{HR}, 23 \mathrm{RBI}$ and $20 \mathrm{BB} / 27 \mathrm{SO}$ in his last 22 games (begin. 6/12)...his ranks among A.L. leaders over that span: on-base pct. (1st), BB (T1st), slugging pct. (2nd), OPS (2nd), HR (2nd), RBI (T3rd)...his 1.9 fWAR (FanGraphs) during that stretch is 2 nd-highest among MLB position players to only SD's Fernando Tatis Jr. (2.0).

THE SHOT HEARD 'ROUND THE GLOBE: Joey Gallo's 2nd home run on Wed. vs. DET was measured at 462 ft . according to Statcast...per Baseball Savant, the blast was T5th-farthest HR Gallo has ever hit, longest since a $467-\mathrm{ft}$. shot on $4 / 30 / 19$ vs. PIT at Globe Life Park...it was also the 2nd-longest HR in Globe Life Field history (regular or postseason) and longest ever by a Ranger...the only longer HR at this venue was hit by OAK's Sean Murphy on 9/11/20 ( 464 ft ).

RED-HOT HEIM: Ever since recording his 1st career 3-hit game on $6 / 12$ at LAD, Jonah Heim has been one of the most productive offensive backstops in the A.L...the switch-hitter has slashed $.340 / .380 / .574 / .954$ (16-47) with 7 XBH (2 HR $5 \mathrm{2B}$ ) and $3 \mathrm{BB} / 4 \mathrm{SO}$ over 14 G since that date, including a . 326 BA (14-43) against RHP...Heim ranks among A.L. catchers over the span (min. 50 PA ) in BA (1st), doubles (T1st) and OPS (2nd)...his 20 "hard hit" batted balls (95+ mph EV) in that period are 4th-most among A.L. backstops: 39-KC's Salvador Perez, 24-NYY's Gary Sanchez, 21-DET's Eric Haase.

SCORING CHANGE: In the bottom of the 4th inning of Texas' $7-3$ win on Sat. at SEA, Charlie Culberson reached 3rd base on what was originally scored an error by right fielder Mitch Haniger...following a change made by MLB this morning, Culberson will now be credited triple on the play, his 3rd hit in that contest ( 3 -for- 4 ) and 2 nd 3 B of '21 (also $6 / 5 \mathrm{vs}$. TB).

SHORTS: Texas is 3-10 (.231) when playing on Friday's this season...TEX pitchers have posted $10+$ K's in each of last 3 G, matching team's longest such streak of '21 ( $4 x$, last $5 / 9$ 11)...Ryan Coe, who has served as the Eastern Crosschecker for the Texas Rangers scouting department for the last 9 seasons, has accepted the Head Baseball Coach position at Kennesaw State University in Georgia.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER

## \#24 Jordan Lyles, RHP <br> (4-5, 4.98)

TONIGHT: The 30 -year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 18 th appearance/17th start of the season in tonight's series opener against Oakland...is in the midst of one of his best stretches as a Ranger, posting a 3.77 ERA (24 ER/57.1 IP) over his last $10 \mathrm{G} / 9 \mathrm{GS}$ to drop his season figure from 7.09 to 4.98 , lowest since $4 / 20$ (4.64), but still 5 th-highest among A.L. qualifiers... has produced quality starts in 2 straight and 3 of his last 4 turns through the rotation, as his 6 QS in 2021 are 3rd-most among TEX pitchers (12-Gibson, 7-Foltynewicz, 6-Lyles)...will work on extra 5 days' rest after firing a career-high 124 pitches in the Rangers' $7-3$ win on Sat. at SEA (see "Last Start")...leads Rangers and ranks T9th in A.L. w/ 10 GIDP...90.1 IP is a pre-All-Star break career high (prev. 80.2 IP in 2013)... his 4 wins, 4.98 ERA, and 7.3 strikeouts per 9 innings rate are all substantial improvements from last season ( 1 win, 7.02 ERA, 5.6 SO/9)...signed a 2-year free agent contract on 12/13/19 and is in the final year of his deal with Texas. allowed the most runs (49) in MLB in 2020 and would have posted highest ERA (7.02), but was just short of qualifying...has had an 11-year MLB career with HOU (2011-13), COL (2014-17), SD (2017-18), MIL (2018, 2019), PIT (2019), and TEX (2020-21)...was a starter in first 5 MLB seasons (2011-15) before working primarily in relief from 2016-18...a native of South Carolina, was originally selected by HOU in the supplemental first round (38th overall) of the 2008 June draft and made MLB debut with the Astros at age 20 in $2011 \ldots$ Texas is $8-8$ in his 16 starts.

RECENT SUCCESS: Has gone $3-3$ with a 3.77 ERA ( 24 ER/57.1 IP), 2.26 SO/ BB ratio ( $43 \mathrm{SO} / 19 \mathrm{BB}$ ) and .266 opp . $\mathrm{BA}(58-218$ ) over his last $10 \mathrm{G} / 9 \mathrm{GS}$... has posted $6.0+$ IP with 2 -or-fewer runs allowed in each of his last 3 outings/2 starts (19.0 IP/5 R-ER total), T2nd-longest such streak of his career (5 straight, 4/19$5 / 10 / 14$ ) and T2nd-longest by a Ranger in '21: Kyle Gibson (5 straight, 4/7-29).

LAST START: Earned his 2nd win in as many starts after firing a career-high 124 pitches in the Rangers' $7-3$ victory on Sat. at SEA ( 6.0 IP, 5 H, 2 R-ER, 2 BB, 6 SO, 124 pitches/ 80 strikes), a win that snapped Texas' 13 -G losing streak at T-Mobile Park...was the highest single-game pitch count reached by a TEX hurler since Mike Minor on 9/26/19 vs. BOS (126)...recorded 6 strikeouts, his most since season-high 8 on 5/28 at SEA...only runs allowed via bases-loaded walk to Ty France (3rd inn.) and solo HR by Kyle Seager (5th inn.)...1st time he has posted wins in back-to-back outings as a Ranger, as he has produced wins in 3 straight appearances just twice in his career: 5/11-23/19 w/ PIT and 8/23-9/3/19 w/ MIL.

VS. OAKLAND: Has gone 2-0, 2.84 (10 ER/31.2 IP) in $5 \mathrm{G} / 3 \mathrm{GS}$ in career vs. OAK, his lowest ERA against any A.L. West club...tonight's outing will be his 1 st start and 2nd app. opposite the A's in 2021, as he produced a 6.0-inn. relief outing in the Rangers' $13-6$ defeat on $6 / 22$ vs. OAK ( $5 \mathrm{H}, 2$ R-ER, 1 BB, 3 SO, 78 pitches/47 strikes), a game started by Taylor Hearn ( 0.2 IP, 4 R-ER)...was the longest relief outing by a TEX pitcher this season and the 2nd-longest of Lyles' career ( 7.0 IP on $9 / 11 / 20$ vs. OAK)...tonight's scheduled A's starting pitcher, Cole Irvin, earned the win for Oakland in that June contest (5.0 IP, 4 R-3 ER).

AT HOME: Lyles has been slightly worse at home (2-1, 5.14 ERA) than on the road $(2-4,4.84)$ this season...the Rangers are 4-1 in his last 5 starts in Arlington dating back to the beginning of May, with Lyles recording a 2-0 record and 3.72 ERA (12 ER/29.0 IP) in those outings...opponents have batted .314/.366/.473/.839 (53$169)$ at GLF vs. .261/.319/.489/.808 (49-188) on the road in 2021.

BY THE NUMBERS: Ranks T9th in A.L. with 10 GIDP despite having the A.L.'s 3rd-lowest ground ball pct. (35.0)...approaching career high of 12 GIDP set in 2014 w/ COL...has the 2nd-highest opp. BA in the A.L. (.286) with reverse splits, RHB at .310 (65-210) and LHB at .252 (37-147)...opponents are batting .330 (29-88) w/ 13 XBH ( $6 \mathrm{HR}, 7 \mathrm{2B}$ ) when leading off an inning...opp. BA by time thru lineup: 1st (.303), 2nd (.299), 3rd (.253), 4th (0-1)...run support avg. (5.98) is highest among Rangers...has allowed 3-R-or-less in 12 of 16 starts

2021: Club-record 12 straight outings w/ at least one HR from 9/6/20-5/6/21... on $4 / 10$ vs. SD, induced a career high-tying 3 GIDPs ( $2 x$, also $5 / 5 / 15 \mathrm{vs}$. TEX w/ COL)...earned the win in his season debut on $4 / 4$ at KC (5.2 IP, 2 R-ER), posting $8+$ strikeouts and no walks for just the 2nd time in his career (also 7/27/12 vs. PIT)...also marked 1st outing of 8+ SO and no BB by a Ranger since Kolby Allard on $8 / 24 / 19 \mathrm{vs}$. CWS (6.1 SHO IP, $0 \mathrm{BB}, 8 \mathrm{SO}$ )...one of the highlight moments of his Rangers career came on $5 / 17$ vs. NYY, as Lyles and the Texas offense pinned a loss on Gerrit Cole in Rangers' 5-2 victory (W, 6.0 IP, 1 R-ER)...has produced $6.0+$ IP in 3 consecutive starts twice in 2021, 6/22-current and $5 / 17-28$, 1st instance(s) since 3 in a row, 5/5-17/19 w/ PIT...exited in position to win starts on $4 / 15$ at TB (leading $4-3$ ), $6 / 2$ at COL (leading $3-2$ ), and $6 / 8 \mathrm{vs}$. SF (leading $4-2$ ), but was left with no decision each time...surrendered career-high 4 HRs on 6/16 at HOU in slugfest that featured a combined 8 long balls by both clubs $(6-\mathrm{HOU}$, 2-TEX)...pitched out of the bullpen while still carrying the workload of a starter on $6 / 22$ vs. OAK, the longest relief outing by a Ranger in 2021...season-high 7.0 IP on $6 / 27$ vs. KC to match his longest outing in a Texas uniform (3rd time)...threw career-high 124 pitches on $7 / 3$ at SEA ( 6.0 IP, 2 R-ER), highest single-game pitch count by a TEX hurler since Mike Minor on 9/26/19 vs. BOS (126).
